In accordance with the provisions of the 1991 Turnpike Revenue Bond Resolution (as adopted on August 20, 1991, as amended and restated on September 26, 1991, and as further amended and restated on November 22, 1991), Section 718, HNTB Corporation as the Authority's General Consulting Engineer submits this progress report for the third quarter 2017 for active projects comprising the Authority's Capital Improvement Program for the Turnpike and Parkway road systems and facilities. Specifically, the projects included are those that were identified in the Authority's \$7 billion Capital Improvement Program that was adopted by the Authority on October 10, 2008 with minor modifications thereto from time to time. Financing for the \$7 billion Capital Improvement Program has been provided through revenue bonds that have been or will be issued from 2009 through 2018 (or later).

A more detailed summary of the revenue bond sales is provided in Section E of the attached report. In addition, the disposition of funds within the Construction Fund is presented in tabulations contained herein. General commission actions that are germane to the Authority's operations or which may directly influence Capital Improvement Program projects are also reported.

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A. INTRODUCTION

This Quarterly Report details the progress of New Jersey Turnpike Authority projects financed through the sale of revenue bonds. Funds so derived are deposited in the Authority's Construction Fund. As prescribed in the 1991 Turnpike Revenue Bond Resolution (as adopted on August 20, 1991, as amended and restated on September 26, 1991, and as further amended and restated on November 22, 1991), Section 718, Progress Reports, this report is directed to members of the Authority, Trustees, and Bondholders who have been identified by the Authority to apprise them as to the disposition of new monies raised by the issuance of revenue bonds and the status of the projects funded by the bond proceeds.

New money raised by bond sales is intended to fund new Authority projects, or complete Authority projects that were initiated under a prior bond sale. These projects are of a nature that adds to the capital assets of the Authority.

The \$7 billion Capital Improvement Program (CIP) was adopted by the Authority on October 10, 2008. The Authority's CIP is comprised of 35 projects. These projects provide for system expansion, safety and operational improvements, and maintaining the road systems and facilities state of good repair. Financing for the CIP has been provided through revenue bonds that have been or will be issued from 2009 through 2018 (or later).

There are a number of active projects in the CIP that trace their financial origin to bond sales from 2000 to 2005; these funds have been spent. Currently, the entire CIP is funded with the proceeds from revenue bond sales from 2009 to 2018 (or later); the anticipated final bond issuance was the Series 2017 Turnpike Revenue Bond Resolution.

In this report, the status of each project comprising the CIP is presented in tabular form outlining the budgeted amount, the amount spent and committed and the amount necessary to complete each project. A chart is included which compares the planned and actual quarterly and cumulative expenditures for each project in the construction fund.

The report chronicles Commission actions that occurred during the report period which have a bearing on the progress of projects, such as awards for legal, insurance, and engineering services, property acquisitions, and construction contracts. In addition, Commission actions that affect general Authority operations are reported because they may impact the delivery of the CIP. Also presented is a description of any action by an external regulatory agency such as the NJ Department of Environmental Protection (hereinafter referred to as NJDEP), or any other party for that matter, which occurred during the report period that affected, in any manner, the cost or timely prosecution of any project. The content of this report is based on information received from the Authority's Executive Office, Finance Department, Engineering Department, and Maintenance Department.

Where funds provided by a bond sale are insufficient to complete a specific project, or funding is needed prior to a bond sale, the Authority may use other sources such as proceeds of bond anticipation notes and reserve funds derived from revenues. Also, there are projects in the CIP in which funding participation by other agencies is expected as part of an inter-party agreement or memorandum of understanding; these projects are reported on herein.

B. COMMISSION ACTIONS

The following is a summary of Commission actions relating to construction fund projects during the past quarter.

July 25, 2017

39021036

Final Design and Permitting for the Replacement of the Southbound Great Egg Harbor and Drag Channel bridges, Structure Nos. 28.0S and 28.5S

Authorized Order for Professional Services (OPS) No. P3407 Supplement B, in the amount of \$863,125 to Hardesty & Hanover, LLC. Supplement B will provide for additional design services which were not anticipated and outside the scope of the original OPS for design of Contract No. P100.251, and will compensate Hardesty & Hanover, LLC for services requested by the authority for the replacement of 11 structural steel spans over the Great Egg Harbor Bay at Structure No. 28.0N on an expedited basis under Contract No. P100.300.

39018001 Construction Management and Inspection Service Mainline Interchange 6 to 9 Widening Program

Authorized OPS No. T3200 Supplement C, in the amount of \$860,000 to AECOM/GPI/PB a joint venture. Supplement C is for unanticipated additional construction management and inspection services necessary to finalize and close-out the New Jersey Turnpike Interchange 6 to 9 Widening Program.

General

Authorized establishing a Revenue Funded Construction Account within the Construction Fund. This fund establishes budget for three major bridge repair projects. The major bridge repairs consist of the Passaic River Bridge on the Garden State Parkway and the Laderman and Washington Bridges on the New Jersey Turnpike. The funding source will be derived from debt service savings to be achieved from the fixed rate funding of all or a portion of the Authority's Series 2009E, 2009H, 2009I, and 2013A Bonds. The debt service savings will flow to the General Reserve Fund. Also included in the authorization is the approval for transfer of \$25 million per year (2019 to 2022) from the General Reserve Fund to the new Revenue Funded Construction Account to provide funding for the three-aforementioned major bridge repair projects which have a combined estimated cost of \$100 million.

Authorized to adopt and implement an updated New Jersey Turnpike Authority billboard program policy for the purpose of generating additional non-toll revenue. The policy has been revised to allow billboards to be constructed and maintained on the Authority's right-of-way from the northern terminus, including the Hudson County Newark Bay Extension, to Interchange 6. Billboards may not be constructed and maintained on any portion of the right-of-way of the Garden State Parkway.



August 22, 2017

39003035 Design Services for Interchange 145 Improvements

Authorized OPS No. P3367 Supplement B, in the amount of \$1,300,000, to Greenman-Pedersen, Inc for additional design services that includes work to implement one way tolls at GSP Interchange 145 (demolition of the northbound exit toll plaza, rehabilitation of the southbound toll plaza facilities and associated geometric improvements); updates to jurisdictional agreements with the municipality; full depth pavement reconstruction on sections on Oraton Parkway impacted by the proposed construction contract detour routes, and additional post design services for the toll plaza work.

39013027 Design Services for Interchange 14A Improvements

Authorized OPS No. T3371 Supplement B, in the amount of \$350,000, to Gannet Fleming, Inc. This supplement will provide for additional post design services including closure of two underground storage tanks identified during construction, redesign of ground improvements due to unknown piles supporting the Authority-acquired Millions property, and design evaluation of as-built conditions at various structures.

Law

Authorized settlement of tax appeal litigation for New Jersey Turnpike Authority V. Township of Monroe. This matter involves a property tax appeal filed by the Authority involving the Brookland Site property in Monroe that was purchased by the Authority to help satisfy the environmental permit requirements for the Turnpike 6 to 9 Widening project. Under the settlement, the Authority will not pay any taxes on the property, but will transfer the property to Monroe at no cost, to enable Monroe to use the property as permitted by the conservation easement filed on the property. The settlement requires the Authority to replace the sewer pump station that services the Molly Pitcher Service area in Monroe at an estimated construction cost of \$800,000 in exchange for the township to forego the Authority's tax debt.

September 19, 2017 (Special Board Meeting)

General

Approved the Series 2017 A Turnpike Revenue Bond Resolution which authorizes issuance of up to \$779.375 million of Turnpike Revenue Bonds. These bonds include up to \$600 million of new money bonds, and up to \$179.375 million of refunding bonds. The \$179.375 million of refunding bonds will be used to refund the Series 2013D-3, Series 2013E-3, and Series 2014B-3 bonds. These bonds are floating rate note bonds which have a mandatory tender on January 1, 2018 and must be refinanced on or before that date to avoid an escalation in interest costs.

<u>September 26, 2017</u>

39005013 Design Services for Facilities Improvement Program-Turnpike North

Authorized OPS No. T3462, Supplement A, in the amount of \$800,000, to Michael Baker Jr., Inc. This supplement will provide for additional design services related to Turnpike Maintenance District 4 (Hightstown), 6 (Elizabeth) and 9 (Jersey City) for preparation of unanticipated supplemental



documents for the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs (DCA), environmental testing and analyses due to unforeseen site conditions, post design services for attendance at construction meetings as a result of an extended construction duration and additional shop drawings reviews, and extensive coordination related to the installation of the proposed water main at Turnpike Maintenance District 4.

39005013 Design Services for Facilities Improvement Program-Parkway North

Authorized OPS No. P3460 Supplement B, in the amount of \$830,000, to T.Y. Lin International. This supplement will provide for environmental remediation design services required at Parkway Maintenance District 7 (Clifton) including the removal and environmental clean-up of three previously unknown underground storage tanks discovered during construction of the maintenance district. Additionally, design services at Parkway Maintenance District 5 (Telegraph Hill) are included for the renovation of the existing print shop building and two pre-engineered metal buildings requested by the Maintenance Department.

Contract No. P300.253, (Pierson-South State II, A Joint Venture, LLC) provides for the widening of the Garden State Parkway mainline from MP 34.5 to 38.0, including construction of 10-foot wide left shoulders and 12-foot wide right shoulders, an additional travel lane in both directions, and improvements to Interchanges 36, 37 and 38. The contract includes bridge widening and/or replacement, culvert lengthening and/or replacement, new overhead sign structures, drainage improvements, stormwater management facilities, signing and striping, lighting and other miscellaneous work necessary to complete the contract.

At the July 28, 2015 Commission Meeting, the Authority entered into Agreement No. 119-15 with the South Jersey Transportation Authority (SJTA), which operates the Atlantic City Expressway (ACE). The ACE crosses over the Garden State Parkway at Interchange 38. The SJTA requested that the Authority construct a full deck replacement of ACE's Bridge No. 20EB, and a widening and full deck replacement of ACE's Bridge No. 20WB. Under the terms of the agreement, the SJTA will be responsible for the design, permitting and utility work necessary, and the Authority will be responsible for the cost



of construction, construction supervision and project management. The work will be performed as a Change Order to Contract No. P300.253 in an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000.

E. STATUS OF CONSTRUCTION FUNDS

Construction funds are derived from the sale of revenue bonds. At its October 10, 2008 meeting, the New Jersey Turnpike Authority Board of Commissioners authorized a \$7 billion Capital Improvement Program (CIP) to fund major improvements on the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway. A summary of the CIP bonding follows and is presented in the below table. The total value of the bonds issued under the CIP exceeds the \$7,000,000,000 value attributed to construction project funding due, in part, to proceeds applied to capitalized interest, deposits to the debt reserve fund, and related insurance costs.

In April 2009, the Authority issued its \$375,000,000 Turnpike Revenue Bonds, Series 2009 E and \$1,375,000,000 Turnpike Revenue Bonds, Series 2009 F (Federally Taxable - Issuer Subsidy - Build America Bonds) (respectively, the "Series 2009 E Bonds" and the "Series 2009 F Bonds" and, collectively, the "Series 2009 E and F Bonds") under the Resolution to initially fund the costs of the CIP. In December 2010, the Authority issued its \$1,850,000,000 Turnpike Revenue Bonds, Series 2010 A (Federally Taxable - Issuer Subsidy - Build America Bonds) (the "Series 2010 A Bonds", together with the Series 2009 F Bonds, the "Build America Bonds") under the Resolution to further fund costs of the CIP. In addition, the Authority has also issued its \$1,400,000,000 Turnpike Revenue Bonds, Series 2013 A (the "Series 2013 A Bonds"), its \$1,000,000,000 Turnpike Revenue Bonds, Series 2014 A (the "Series 2014 A Bonds") and its \$750,000,000 Turnpike Revenue Bonds, Series 2015 E (the "Series 2015 E Bonds") to further fund costs of the CIP. In January 2017, the Authority issued its \$600,000,000 Turnpike Revenue Bonds, Series 2017 A (the "Series 2017 A Bonds") to further fund costs of the Capital Improvement Program. The Authority anticipates issuing one additional Series of Non-Refunding Bonds under the Resolution over the next 12 to 18 months, in an aggregate principal amount of approximately \$525,000,000, in order to further fund the remaining costs of the CIP, and to fund deposits to the Debt Reserve Fund, capitalized interest on such Non-Refunding Bonds and costs of issuance required in connection with the issuance of such Non-Refunding Bonds.

The following tabulations, current as of the last day in the report quarter, indicates the current budget for each project. The "Budget" column indicates funds to be supplied by the construction fund only. Certain projects in the tabulation are also expected to receive funds from reserve funds, sources which



are derived from revenues. "Committed" indicates the amount of funds obligated through existing agreements and unexpended portion of ongoing contracts. The amounts appearing in the tabulation for "Committed" and "Spent" were obtained from the Authority's Finance Department.

Two separate tabulations are presented; the first tabulation indicates the status of funds supplied by bond sales and the second tabulation presents a comparison between the planned expenditures and the actual expenditures, quarterly and cumulatively, for the 35 projects comprising the \$7 billion CIP. The planned values were supplied by the Engineering Department.

In terms of amount spent, the CIP is 86 percent complete as of the close of the quarter; in terms of elapsed time (based on commencement of the program January 2008 and anticipated completion December 2018), the program is 88 percent complete.
