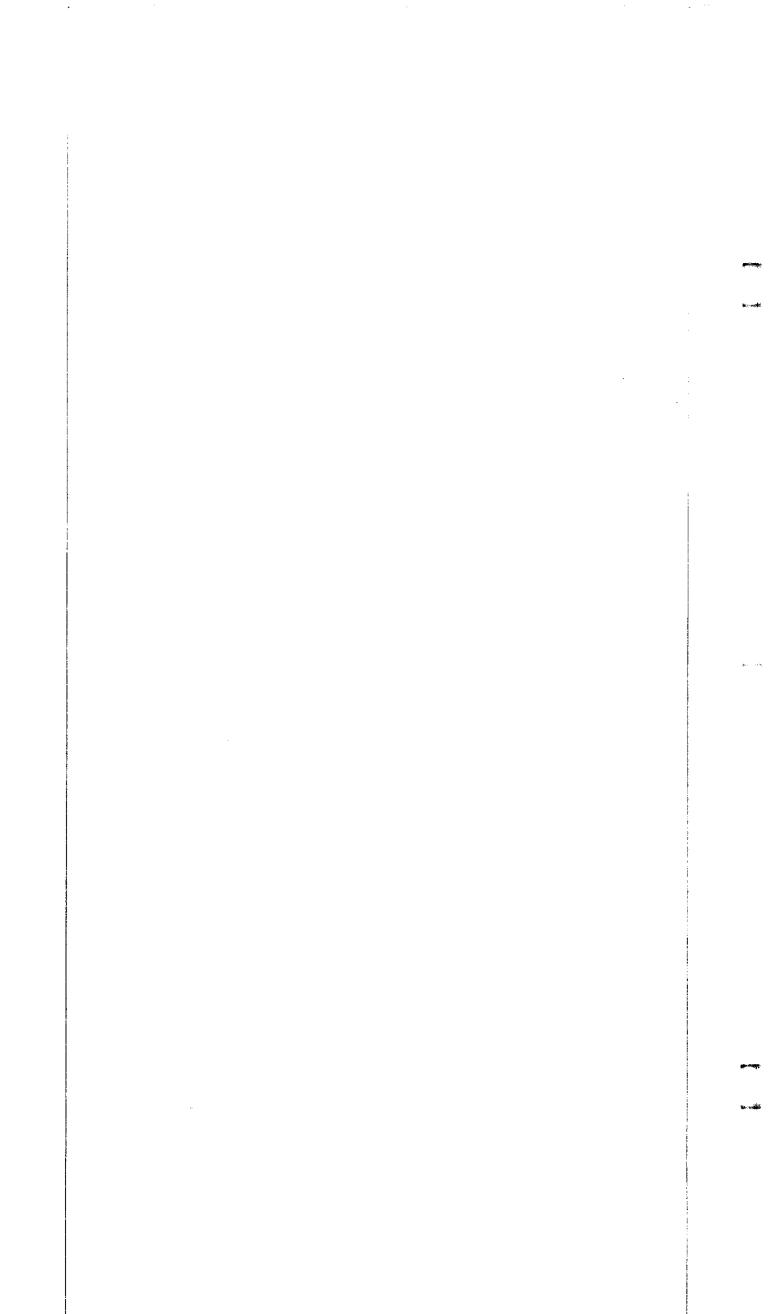

Acting Executive Director O'Hern requested approval of item numbers 040-02-2018 through 042-02-2018. Moved are the items as follows:

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### 040-02-2018

In a memorandum dated February 9, 2018, <u>Request to (i) Declare Parcel 34 as</u> <u>Surplus to the Authority's Needs, and (ii) Authorize the Executive Director to Transfer</u> <u>Parcel 34 and Related Easements to the New Jersey Department of Transportation</u> ("NJDOT"), Amount: \$0.00, was approved.

Parcel 34, as designated by NJDOT, (the "Property") is located in the Township of Middle, County of Cape May, and consists of approximately 77 square feet of vacant land in the Authority right of way between the Garden State Parkway and State Route 9. NJDOT has approached the Authority and requested that the Authority convey the Property and an adjacent sight triangle easement and temporary construction easement to NJDOT to facilitate an NJDOT construction project.

In accordance with the Authority's Regulations for Surplus Property, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.6,

the Law Department has circulated information regarding the Property to the Chief Engineer, the Director of Maintenance, the Director of Operations, Chief Information Officer, and the Authority's Engineering Consultant, HNTB Corporation, for review. Each has reviewed the information regarding the Property and all have certified that the Authority no longer requires the Property and does not see any future use of the Property by the Authority. Accordingly, it is recommended that authorization be given to declare the Property surplus to the Authority's needs.

Under a 2008 agreement between the Authority and NJDOT, real property transfers between the parties shall be at no cost provided the property is valued at less than \$250,000 and the property is to be used solely for transportation purposes. NJDOT has provided the Authority with a valuation of the Property and related easements in the amount of \$700. As such, this agenda item seeks authorization for the Executive Director to execute all documents necessary to transfer Parcel 34 and the related easements to the NJDOT at no cost, as the Property is valued under this \$250,000 limit. Under the Authority's Regulations for Surplus Property, disposition of surplus property to a public or governmental entity is an exception to the public bidding requirement for surplus property. See N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.6(b)(5).

Accordingly, it is recommended that authorization be given to declare Parcel 34 surplus to the Authority's needs. It is further recommended that the Executive Director be authorized to take any steps necessary to transfer Parcel 34 and the related easements to the NJDOT. It is further recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any such other documents and take any such other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization.

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#### 041-02-2018

In a document dated February 9, 2018, <u>Request to (i) Declare Parcel RX1E-1 as</u> <u>Surplus to the Authority's Needs, and (ii) Authorize the Executive Director to Enter into a</u> <u>Memorandum of Agreement with the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey to</u> <u>Facilitate the Port Street Improvement Project, Amount to Authority: \$66,200.00</u>, was approved.

New Jersey Turnpike Authority Parcel RX1E-1 is located along Port Street and the Newark Bay-Hudson County Extension ("NBHCE") in the City of Newark, County of Essex, consisting of approximately 1.82± acres of land in the Authority right-of-way (the "Property"). In accordance with the Authority's Regulations for Surplus Property, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.6, the Law Department has circulated information regarding the Property to the Chief Engineer, the Director of Maintenance, the Director of Operations, Chief Information Officer, and the Authority's Engineering Consultant, HNTB Corporation, for review. Each has reviewed the information regarding the Property and all have certified that the Authority no longer requires the Property and does not see any future use of the Property by the Authority. Accordingly, it is recommended that authorization be given to declare the Property surplus to the Authority's needs.

It is further recommended that the Executive Director be authorized to convey the Property to the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey ("PANYNJ") under a memorandum of agreement with the Authority ("Agreement"). PANYNJ is undertaking a construction project (the "Project") to improve safety and traffic flow efficiency and replace the PANYNJ ramp attached to the Port Street Bridge that involves structural modifications which cross over the New Jersey Turnpike near Interchange 14. The Project will also replace a portion of the Port Street Bridge where it crosses over Corbin Street, Newark, New Jersey, a portion of the Port Authority New Jersey Marine Terminal's Marine Terminal Highway and reprofile, regrade, and repave a portion of the north/south roadway that intersects the northern edge of Outer Port Street and continues north passing beneath the NBHCE.

PANYNJ and Authority staff have negotiated this Agreement to define certain conveyances and obligations between PANYNJ and the Authority as they relate to the Project, including reimbursement of certain costs to the Authority. The Agreement provides for the conveyance of certain permanent and temporary property interests for parcels located in the City of Newark, County of Essex from the Authority to PANYNJ, specifically, Parcel RX1E-1 for \$57,000 and construction and maintenance easements for \$9,200. Under the Authority's Regulations for Surplus Property, disposition of surplus property to a public or governmental entity is an exception to the public bidding requirement for surplus property. <u>See N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.6(b)(5)</u>.

Accordingly, it is requested that the Board of Commissioners delegate to the Executive Director the authority to declare the Property surplus to the Authority's needs and convey the Property in accordance with the terms set forth above and to execute the Memorandum of Agreement with PANYNJ pursuant to the terms outlined above. It is further recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any such other documents and take any such other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization, including the payment of closing and recording costs for the property transfers contemplated therein.

The Authority maintains Excess Liability and Public Officials and Employment Practices Liability insurance policies which will expire on March 15, 2018.

WillisTowersWatson ("Willis"), the broker of record for these lines of insurance, sought renewal quotations for each of the coverages indicated above. The quotations were reviewed by staff and with the Authority's insurance and risk management consultant, Hanover Stone Partners, LLP ("Hanover Stone"). Following discussion and analysis, it is recommended that each of the insurance coverages be renewed as follows:

# (1) <u>Excess Liability Insurance – (Self-Insured General Liability and Automobile</u> Liability Insurance Program) (March 15, 2018 to March 15, 2019)

The Authority maintains \$100 million of Excess Liability Insurance above its \$2 million self-insured retention ("SIR") for General Liability claims and its \$5 million SIR for Automobile Liability claims. The Excess Liability insurance is structured in four (4) layers of \$25 million each.

Willis marketed the program with at least fifteen (15) carriers (AIG; Great American; XL Catlin; Liberty Mutual; Zurich; Navigators; Chubb; QBE; Everest Re; Starr; Travelers; Allianz; Swiss Re: Markel; and AWAC) for renewal quotations for coverage on the various layers of the program, requesting the same terms and conditions as the current policies. Six (6) carriers declined to quote due to their lack of appetite for this type risk or other reasons. Three (3) carriers reviewed the risk and advised that their quote would not be competitive to the current program. The six (6) remaining carriers quoted premiums indicated below, including one (1) carrier that quoted a premium which was higher and less attractive than the remaining quotes.

Willis was successful in achieving a renewal of the program upon the same terms and conditions as the expiring coverage, with the following insurers at the following premium amounts:

The premiums indicated above, along with the mandatory New Jersey Property Liability Insurance Guaranty Association ("PLIGA") surcharge not to exceed \$5063, results in a total premium amount of \$848,913, a 5.24% increase in premium from the current premium. It is recommended that the Authority renew the Excess Liability Program with the underwriters and in the amounts set forth above, for a total aggregate premium, including PLIGA, not to exceed \$848,913.

# (2) Public Officials and Employment Practices Liability Insurance (March 15, 2018 to March 15, 2019)

The Authority maintains Public Officials and Employment Practices Liability Insurance

with National Union Fire Insurance Company of Pittsburgh, PA ("AIG") with a limit of \$20 million, along with an excess policy with Ironshore Indemnity Inc. ("Ironshore") that provides an additional

As in prior years, AIG continued to insist upon using a new policy form that provided reduced coverage in a number of areas. Willis approached a number of underwriters for renewal quotations for coverage with the same terms and conditions as set forth in the current policies. Willis provided two alternative quotations from other underwriters for the primary layer which were not competitive with the incumbent.

\$10 million aggregate and limit, both of which will expire on March 15, 2018.

After much negotiation, AIG agreed to retain the same policy form and secured a renewal premium upon the same terms and conditions as the expiring coverage from AIG for the primary layer and Ironshore Indemnity Inc., ("Ironshore") for the excess layer. With respect to the primary layer, AIG quoted a renewal premium of \$260,928, which is no increase to the current premium, and which would result in a mandatory PLIGA surcharge not to exceed \$1,566 resulting in a total premium amount of \$262,494. With respect to the excess layer, Ironshore quoted a renewal premium of \$76,500, the same as the current premium, and which would result in a mandatory PLIGA surcharge not to exceed \$459 resulting in a total premium amount of \$76,959. It is recommended that the Authority renew the Public Officials and Employment Practices Liability insurance with the underwriters and in the amounts set forth above, for a total aggregate premium, including PLIGA, not to exceed \$339,453, the same as the current year's total premium.

It is therefore requested that the Executive Director be authorized to place and renew the insurance policies and coverages as outlined above. It is further requested that the Executive Director be authorized to take all such actions and to execute all such documents, after review by Hanover Stone, and with the recommendation of the Law Department, to effectuate the authority set forth above.

# PUBLIC BID SOLICITATIONS-AWARD OF CONTRACTS \*\*\*\*\*\*\* 043-02-2018

In a document dated February 9, 2018, <u>Recommendation to Award Contract No.</u> <u>P200.454, Garden State Parkway, A.E. Stone, Inc., Roadway Resurfacing, Milepost 0 to 126,</u> <u>Cape May, Atlantic, Burlington, Ocean, Monmouth and Middlesex Counties (2018), RM-</u> <u>138000, Budget Code: 080C00026, Amount: \$15,938,000.00,</u> was approved.

This contract will provide for the resurfacing of asphalt surface course pavement along the Northbound and Southbound roadways which includes shoulders, interchange ramps and toll plazas along with other incidental improvements at various locations between Milepost 0 and 126 on the Garden State Parkway in Cape May, Atlantic, Burlington, Ocean, Monmouth and Middlesex Counties, New Jersey. All work is expected to be completed in 2018.

Four bid proposals were received on February 7, 2018 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal in the amount of \$15,938,000.00 may be compared to the second low bidder in the amount of \$16,051,111.00. The low bid was 35% lower than the Engineer's Estimate. The Engineer's Estimate was prepared to capture a recent increase in the price of asphalt and fuel as seen in contracts in the northern part of the state. The bids were significantly lower than the Engineer's Estimate due to the bidders' proximity to the project and increased available hours of work associated with the southern part of the Garden State Parkway. The low bidder, A.E. Stone, Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. P200.454 be awarded to the low bidder, A.E. Stone, Inc. of Egg Harbor Township, New Jersey, in the amount of \$15,938,000.00. This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

In a document dated January 30, 2018, <u>Recommendation to Award Contract No.</u> <u>T200.458, New Jersey Turnpike, South State, Inc., Rehabilitation of Concrete Median</u> <u>Barrier, Milepost 0 to 122, Salem, Gloucester, Burlington, Mercer, Middlesex, Union, Essex,</u> <u>Hudson and Bergen Counties, RM-137198, Budget Code: 030C00002, Amount:</u> <u>\$3,896,279.70,</u> was approved.

This contract will provide for removal and replacement of concrete median barrier

exhibiting moderate to severe deterioration at various locations along the New Jersey Turnpike roadway from Milepost 0 to 122 in Salem, Gloucester, Burlington, Mercer, Middlesex, Union, Essex, Hudson and Bergen Counties. All work is expected to be completed in 2018.

Six bid proposals were received on January 23, 2018 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal in the amount of \$3,896,279.70 may be compared to the second low bidder in the amount of \$4,498,632.40. The bids were significantly lower than the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$5,194,300.00 likely due to discounted pricing of major items of work due to the relatively large quantities involved in the contract. The low bidder, South State, Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. T200.458 be awarded to the low bidder, South State, Inc. of Bridgeton, New Jersey, in the amount of \$3,896,279.70. This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

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### **ORDER FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES (OPS)**

In a document dated February 5, 2018, <u>Recommendation to Issue Order for</u> <u>Professional Services No. A3657, New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway, M&J</u> <u>Engineering P.C., Supervision of Construction Services for Contract Nos.: T200.458,</u> <u>Rehabilitation of Concrete Median Barrier, Milepost 0 to 122, And P200.469, Rehabilitation</u> <u>of Concrete Median Barrier, Milepost 80 to 84, RM-137411, Budget Code: 030C00002,</u> <u>Funding Allocation: \$1,400,000.00 FY 2018, \$290,000.00 FY2019, Amount: \$1,690,000.00,</u> was approved.

This Order for Professional Services provides supervision of construction services for Contract Nos.: T200.458, Rehabilitation of Concrete Median Barrier, Milepost 0 to 122 on the Turnpike roadway and P200.469, Rehabilitation of Concrete Median Barrier, Milepost 80 to 84 on the Garden State Parkway. These services include construction inspection, material testing, record keeping, preparation of payment estimates and other service required to ensure compliance with the contract documents.

This assignment is classified as a "Simple Project" based on the scope of work being

clearly defined and not likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost not exceeding \$2,000,000.00. The solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and fifty-three (53) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Code: B-153, Roadway Construction Inspection. Four firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of November 29, 2017.

Subsequent to the scoring of EOIs by the Review Committee, Fee Proposals were requested from the top three technically ranked firms. The firms in the order of ranking are: 1) M&J Engineering, P.C.; 2) Michael Baker International, Inc. and 3) Omsum Engineering, LLC. The fee submitted by M&J Engineering, P.C. has been reviewed and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. A3657 be issued to the firm of M&J Engineering, P.C. of Ridgefield Park, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$1,690,000.00 allocated as follows: \$1,400,000.00 in FY 2018 and \$290,000.00 in FY 2019. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.35 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. The award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. These professional services were procured, and the recommended firm was selected, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seq., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

This Order for Professional Services provides supervision of construction services for Contract Nos.: P200.454, Roadway Resurfacing, Milepost 0 to 126 (2018) on the Garden State Parkway; T200.457, Roadway Resurfacing, Milepost 0 to 122 (2018) on the New Jersey Turnpike; and P200.478, Roadway Resurfacing, Milepost 0 to 172 (2018) on the Garden State

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Parkway. These services include construction inspection, material testing, record keeping, preparation of payment estimates and other service required to ensure compliance with the contract documents.

This assignment is classified as a "Complex Project" since the scope of work is not clearly defined and likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost exceeds \$2,000,000.00. The solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and forty-eight (48) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Codes: B-153, Roadway Construction Inspection and B-154, Roadway Resurfacing Inspection. Two firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of December 21, 2017.

This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.45 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. The award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. These professional services were procured, and the recommended firm was selected, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seg., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

This Order for Professional Services provides design services for twenty-nine (29) site specific VMS locations on the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway. Services will include sign foundation design, removal of existing VMS and associated control systems, removal of existing sign structures, ITS equipment installation, electrical and communication services, permits and other related design services.

This assignment is classified as a "Complex Project" since the scope of work is not clearly defined and likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost exceeds \$2,000,000.00. The solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and twenty-nine (29) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Codes: A250 – Fully Controlled Access Highways, and A500 – Traffic Control Systems. Four firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of December 4, 2017.

The Authority's regulation N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8.3(e) provide that for Complex Projects, "If only three or four EOIs have been deemed complete by the Authority, these firms shall receive the RFP and the Review Committee will not conduct an evaluation of the EOIs...". The Review Committee recommended that we proceed directly to the RFP phase of the procurement and solicit Technical and Fee Proposals from the four firms which submitted complete EOIs: TYLin International, AECOM, Arora and Associates, P.C. and Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. This Order for Professional Services was issued at the June 2011 Commission Meeting to provide for design services and preparation of contract documents for two construction contracts for bridge deck reconstruction on the Parkway between Mileposts 121 and 163. This was the first phase of the Parkway bridge deck reconstruction program.

Supplement A compensated TranSystems Corporation for additional design services and preparation of contract documents for the superstructure replacement for Parkway Bridge Nos. 150.3, 153.0S and 153.1N as requested by the Authority. These bridges were inspected and load rated due to severe deterioration in the concrete beams, resulting in the bridges being structurally deficient. The superstructure replacement and repairs for those bridges are included in Contract No. P100.233, which is currently under construction.

Supplement B compensated TranSystems Corporation for additional design services required in the preparation of contract documents associated with the following: the superstructure replacement for Bridge Nos. 124.3SO and 124.8NO. The original scope of work required deck replacement only. This supplement covers additional Maintenance and Protection of Traffic alternates and traffic modeling for Bridge Nos. 124.3 SO, 124.8NO and 143.2 to address unanticipated operational concerns of the Operations and Tolls departments during construction. Also included is the request by the Authority to incorporate bearing replacement at Bridge No. 129.7 based on results of a preliminary seismic vulnerability assessment performed under OPS No. A3356.

Supplement C compensated TranSystems Corporation for additional post-design services. These services were required to accommodate the extended construction contract completion dates of Contract Nos. P100.233 and P100.297 (note Contract No. P100.297 replaced P100.237 due to milepost changes in the contract), which primarily were a result of delays encountered by the contractors. The delays were primarily due to unanticipated field conditions encountered by the contractors which resulted in Changes of Plans (COP) for superstructure and substructure repairs and bearing replacements. The work performed for the COPs typically had to be performed before the main work in the Contract could be continued. The contractors also encountered unanticipated delays due to the complexities of the various forms of Accelerated Bridge Construction (ABC) techniques utilized on various bridges in the Contracts.

As a result of the delays experienced by the contractors for both contracts, an extended construction duration of up to seven (7) months was anticipated.

In order to provide adequate post-design support for the remainder of Contract No. P100.233 and Contract No. P100.297, additional funding for post-design services is required for attendance at field project progress meetings with construction supervision staff, local and county officials, and contractor Requests for Information (RFI). Unanticipated services will also provide for changed field conditions that required a Change of Plan.

Supplement D will provide for post-design services to complete the remaining work in the contract's further extended anticipated completion date resulting from changed field conditions encountered and changes to address post-bid Contract changes. These new services include: resolution of utility conflicts and drainage improvements at Bridge No. 130.6; the addition of grading/paving requests by the City of Irvington and design of monitoring wells for the Authority at Bridge Nos. 144.7, 153.0S and 153.1N; and, development of Authority requested MPT plan revisions and correction of contractor installed out-of-tolerance precast deck panels at Bridge No. 143.2

It is, therefore, recommended that Supplement D to Order for Professional Services No. P3358 be issued to TranSystems Corporation not to exceed the amount of \$128,000.00, with compensation on the same basis as the original Order for Professional Services. The addition of this amount increases the total authorized fee from \$7,267,000.00 to \$7,395,000.00. The original contract was procured pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8.

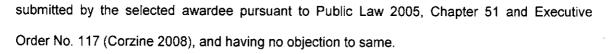

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# **COMMISSIONER'S COMMENTS**

Chair Gutierrez-Scaccetti announced that Robert Quirk, Director of Toll Collections, will be retiring on March 1, 2018 after 39 ½ years of service with the Authority. She stated that Quirk started as a toll collector and worked his way up to being Director of Toll Collection.

Bagpipers from the Friendly Sons of Shillelagh entered the Board Room and began to play in honor of Quirk. Treasurer DuPont thanked Quirk for his service and told him to remember today's special farewell with so many attendees as the embodiment of the love and respect his staff had for him.

Commissioner Diaz thanked Quirk for always helping him over the past 10 years he has been on the Board. He commended Quirk for his leadership. Commissioner Diaz told Quirk to enjoy his well-deserved retirement.

Vice Chairman Gravino thanked Director of Tolls Quirk for taking him on tours of the Turnpike toll collection operations. Vice Chairman Gravino said that it has been a pleasure working with Quirk.

Commissioner Minella commented that he is from Jersey City and that he had worked with Quirk's family on local issues in Jersey City in the 1970's. Commissioner Minella said he had a long professional and friendly relationship with Quirk and his family. He said Quirk should be proud to have so many people attend today's Board meeting to wish him well in his retirement.

Chair Gutierrez-Scaccetti commented that she is happy for Quirk and his wife as they enter the next chapter of their lives. She wished them good health and said there are no goodbye's, it is just until we meet again.

Chair Gutierrez-Scaccetti announced that John Pagliarulo will become Acting Director of Toll Collection and that will be formalized on next month's personnel agenda. She also stated that Ann Christine Monica will be Acting General Counsel.
