SCHEDULE

Construction began late 2015; move-in date was late 2018; dedication was spring 2019



- Newark Station is one of three road stations maintained by Troop D of the New Jersey State Police on the New Jersey Turnpike. It is located just inside entrance at Interchange 14.

- The New Jersey

Turnpike Authority included the new Newark Station in its \$500 million Facilities Improvement Program. The old station was outdated and in poor condition. NJTA Commissioners approved the construction contract for the station in September 2015.

- In all, four new road stations were included in the Facilities Improvement Program, two on the Turnpike and two on the Garden State Parkway. The other new stations were Moorestown on the Turnpike and Bloomfield and Galloway on the Parkway.
- The new station was dedicated to the memory of the five Newark Station troopers who have been killed in the line of duty during the 68-year history of the Turnpike. The dedication ceremony was held on March 29, 2019
