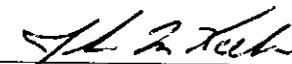

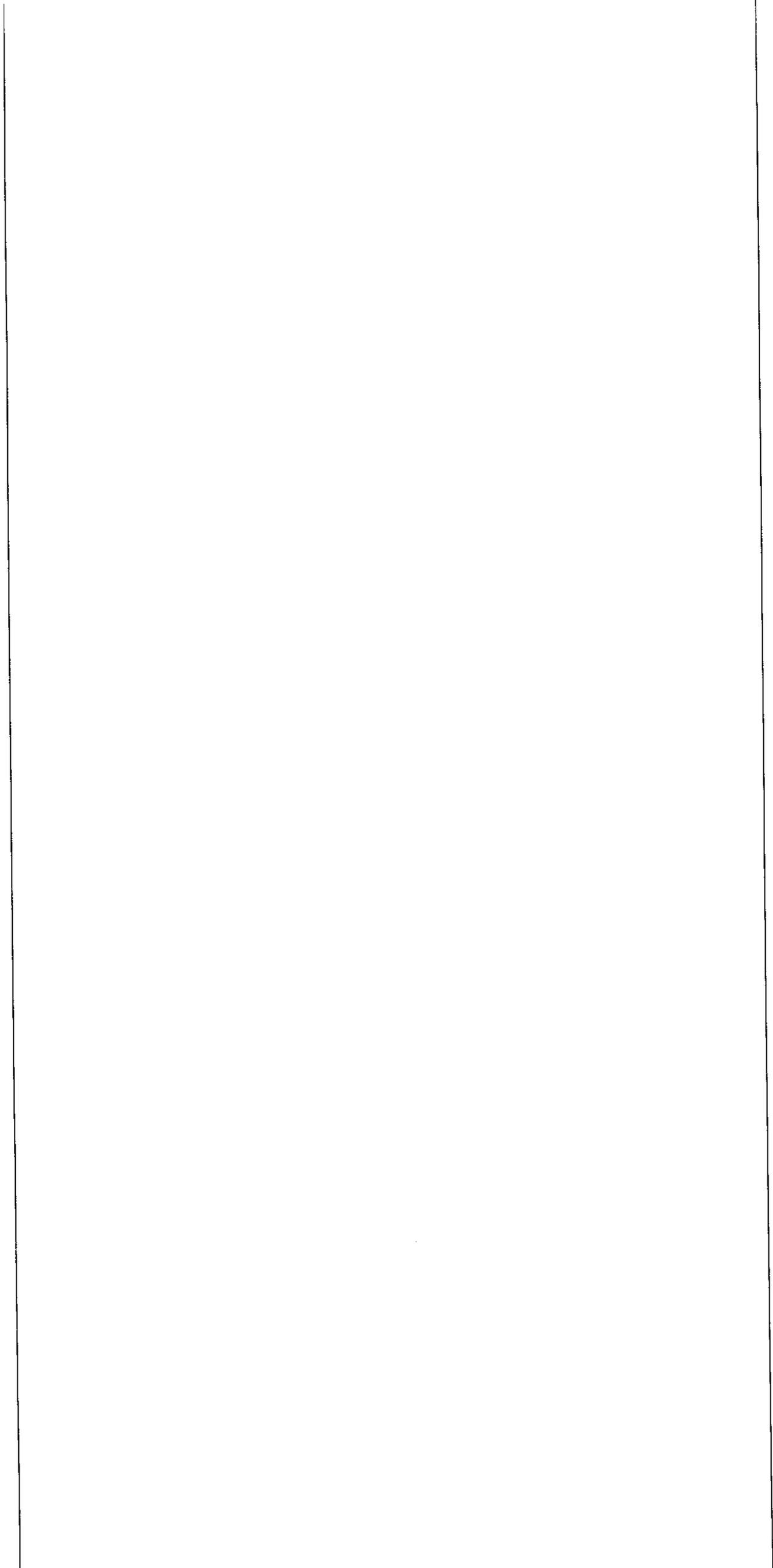

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**PROCEEDINGS OF MEETING OF NEW JERSEY TURNPIKE AUTHORITY
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS**

Tuesday, June 25, 2019

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Chair Diane Gutierrez-Scaccetti called the meeting of the Authority's Board of Commissioners (the Board) into session in the Executive Boardroom of the Authority's Headquarters Building at 1 Turnpike Plaza in Woodbridge, New Jersey, at 9:04 A.M.

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PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

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PRESENT

CHAIR COMMENTS

Chair Gutierrez-Scaccetti acknowledged the loss of former Chairman Joseph Simunovich who served during the McGreevy administration and was here during the consolidation of the Turnpike and Parkway Roadways. Gutierrez-Scaccetti said she was privileged to be there as they laid him to rest yesterday along with many others who loved and cared for him. Gutierrez-Scaccetti stated when Joe became Chair of the board I was very frightened of him because he was a very formal man with an extraordinary history in politics and business and successful in all that he pursued. Gutierrez-Scaccetti acknowledged she is very privileged to sit in the seat that former Chairman Simunovich sat in all those years ago. Gutierrez-Scaccetti further acknowledged Frank McDermott who was the Chair in 1994, acknowledging they were both gentleman and they were family men. Chair Gutierrez-Scaccetti also wanted to remember those who led this extraordinary agency, Mr. Flanagan who was the Executive Director for 26 years and his daughter Patricia Stefanile, Esq. who also worked at the Authority. Gutierrez-Scaccetti said they shaped who this agency is at some level. Gutierrez-Scaccetti stated former Chairman Simunovich said the biggest thing he did was consolidate these two roadways and we should honor him by making sure we are truly consolidated and act as one agency. Gutierrez-Scaccetti further noted the power of these two roads together is unmatched and it was former Chairman Simunovich's leadership that got us here. Chair Gutierrez-Scaccetti said she will honor their memory and be the Chair that the former Chairman Simunovich and Chairman McDermott would have expected her to be had they been here to cheer her on.

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PUBLIC COMMENT

Murray Bodin

Mr. Bodin spoke to the Board about the removal of E-ZPass readers and gantry's. Bodin said that the NJTA is wasting money by keeping the E-ZPass readers and gantry's. Mr. Bodin advised he is getting charged by plate readers in other states.

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CHAIR COMMENTS

Chair Gutierrez-Scaccetti told Bodin the Board appreciates your comments, however you may not see the elimination of transponders, it remains the cheapest way to collect tolls and guarantee payments. Gutierrez-Scaccetti stated you may see the removal of toll booths that is certainly the way we are all going, however, Gutierrez-Scaccetti noted toll by plate is a very expensive way to process tolls.

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LAW

Director of Law Robert Carroll requested approval of item numbers 154-06-2019 through 156-06-2019. Moved are the items as follows:

154-06-2019

In a memorandum dated June 7, 2019, **Authorization to Declare Surplus portions of New Jersey Turnpike Parcels 599X-1 and 599X-2 in Section 6, as Surplus to the Authority's Needs and to transfer these parcels to Conrail, Amount: \$1,360,000.00 (Revenue to the Authority,** was approved.

New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the "Authority") owns Parcel Nos. 599X-1 and 599X-2 consisting of approximately 1.625 acres of vacant land located within the New Jersey Turnpike right-of-way at the rear of 156-202 Blanchard Street in the City of Newark, County of Essex. Conrail contacted the Authority seeking to purchase portions of these parcels consisting of approximately 1.077 acres (the "Property") and to create two (2) aerial easements totaling approximately 1.135 acres over the Property and a portion of Authority right-of-way. The parcels to be purchased in fee are designated on Conrail's plans as parcels 1A and 1B; the two (2) aerial easements are designated as parcels E1C and E1D.

In accordance with the Authority's regulations for the sale of surplus property, N.J.A.C.

19:9-2.6, the Law Department has circulated information regarding the Property to the Chief Engineer, the Director of Maintenance, the Director of Operations, the Chief Information Officer (ITS), and the Authority's Engineering Consultant, HNTB Corporation, for review. Each has reviewed information regarding the Property and all have certified that the Authority no longer requires the Property and does not see any future use of the Property by the Authority. Conrail has offered \$1,360,000 to purchase portions of the Property and create two (2) easements over Authority right-of-way. The Law Department and the Authority's Real Estate Consultant have reviewed this offer and determined that it provides fair market value for the Property.

Accordingly, it is recommended that authorization be given to declare the Property surplus to the Authority's needs. It is further recommended that the Executive Director be authorized to take any steps necessary to sell portions of Parcels 599X-1 and 599X-2 to Conrail for the fair market value of \$1,360,000, in accordance with the Authority's regulations for the sale of Surplus Property, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.6. It is further recommended that the Authority's Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any such other documents and take any such other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization.

155-06-2019

In a memorandum dated June 10, 2019, **New Jersey State Police ("NJSP") Request for Authorization for Direct Online Access to the E-ZPass Vector System Database**, was approved.

The NJSP Troop D, pursuant to N.J.S.A. §27:23-34.3, have access to E-ZPass Vector System Database information for use in their official duties; however, such access is currently limited to business hours of the Authority. In order to enable NJSP more timely and efficient information for official use, they have requested direct online access to the E-ZPass Vector System Database subject to certain restrictions. This access would replace the long utilized but limited and burdensome system of using inter-agency telephone communications and would improve efficiency and accuracy of E-ZPass information review. The proposed new protocol would be the subject of a 1-year pilot program governed by a strict set of Guidelines limiting access to NJSP Supervisory Officers, establishing specifications and restrictions for the use of learned information and enabling effective oversight and monthly audit of all such access. The Departments of Law, Finance, ITS and General Counsel DeCotiis have reviewed and approved the methodology and these materials have also been reviewed and edited by The GAU and the representatives of the NJ Division of Criminal Justice. After such reviews the Executive Director is recommending implementation for the Board's approval.

Accordingly, it is requested that Board of Commissioners delegate to the Executive Director the authority to enter into an Agreement with the NJSP to provide police services to the Authority, in accordance with the terms set forth above. It is further recommended that the

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Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any such other documents and take any such other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization.

156-06-2019

In a memorandum dated June 1, 2019, **Authorization to Settle Formal Workers' Compensation Matter – Joseph Cieri v. New Jersey Turnpike Authority, Budget Code: 10-870-405070, Amount: \$108,000.00,** was approved.

Petitioner Joseph Cieri was a Parkway Division Mechanic I, hired February 1992 and retired effective June 1, 2017 with a PERS Early Retirement. This recommended settlement will resolve a formal Claim Petition filed in 2014.

The petitioner is represented by the law firm of Gill & Chamas, located in Woodbridge, NJ. The Authority is defended by Special Counsel Anne M. Hammill-Pasqua, Esq. of Capehart & Scatchard, P.A., located in Mt. Laurel, NJ. The matter is venued in the district office of Freehold before the Honorable Judge Leslie Berich.

The total settlement award is \$108,000.00.

The Law Department has reviewed this matter and agrees with the recommendation of the Special Counsel, the Authority's third-party workers' compensation administrator and the Authority's Benefits Manager. Authorization is, therefore, requested to allow Special Counsel to settle this matter for the sum of **\$108,000.00**.

This settlement will be payable under Account No. 10-870-405070.

Deputy Chief Engineer-Construction Michael Garofalo requested approval of item numbers 158-06-2019. Moved is the item as follows:

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ORDER FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES (OPS)

158-06-2019

In a document dated May 31, 2019, **Recommendation to Issue Supplement C to Order**

for Professional Services No. T3371, New Jersey Turnpike, Gannett Fleming, Inc., Design Services for Interchange 14A Improvements, Budget Code: 39013027, R-150076, Original OPS Amount: \$22,950,000.00, Amount of Supplement A: \$2,935,000.00, Amount of Supplement B: \$ 350,000.00, Amount of Supplement C: \$290,000.00, Revised OPS Amount: \$26,525,000.00, was approved.

This Order for Professional Services was approved at the September 2012 Commission Meeting in the amount of \$22,950,000.00 to provide for final design services for the Interchange 14A Improvements.

Supplement A in the amount of \$2,935,000.00 provided for design services for various out of scope work that was unknown and not anticipated at the time of the original OPS. The additional services included: 1) design of a temporary shoulder use lane control system to facilitate the Pulaski Skyway Project and maintain regional mobility; 2) design efforts for toll plaza rehabilitation saving over \$20 million in construction costs compared to the originally scoped new toll plaza; 3) permit modifications to account for revised NJDEP Superstorm Sandy flood elevations; 4) design of four additional sign structures from two other Authority contracts to avoid contractor overlap and 5) extensive public outreach, municipality coordination, right of way support documentation and unanticipated Bayonne Municipal Utilities Authority utility design work.

Supplement B provided for post design services for various out of scope work that could not have been known at the time of the original OPS and Supplement A. The additional post design services included closure of two (2) unknown underground storage tanks identified during construction, redesign of ground improvements due to unknown piles supporting the Authority acquired Millions property and design evaluation of as-built conditions at various structures.

Supplement C will provide for additional post design services to address the closure of four (4) additional unanticipated underground storage tanks that were discovered during construction and to perform the required soil and groundwater remediation as well as monitoring and reporting to NJ Department of Environmental Protection required to fully satisfy regulatory permitting. This Supplement also includes professional services to prepare additional right-of-way and as-built documentation requested by the Authority to facilitate the transfer of ownership and jurisdiction to NJ Department of Transportation, Bayonne and Jersey City.

It is, therefore, recommended that Supplement C to Order for Professional Services No. T3371 be issued to Gannett Fleming, Inc. not to exceed the amount of \$290,000.00 with compensation on the same basis as the original Order for Professional Services. The addition of this amount increases the total authorized fee from \$26,235,000.00 to \$26,525,000.00. The original contract was procured pursuant N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1 et seq. and N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8.

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ORDER FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES (OPS)

157-06-2019

In a document dated June 3, 2019, **Recommendation to Issue Order for Professional Services No. P3753, Garden State Parkway, Dewberry Engineers Inc., Design Services for Contract No. P300.535, Operational Improvements at PNC Bank Arts Center Ramps, RM-150074, Budget Code: 39200010, Funding Allocation: \$1,075,000.00 FY 2019, \$680,000.00 FY 2020, \$35,000.00 FY 2021, Amount: \$1,790,000.00**, was approved.

This Order for Professional Services of preliminary and final design engineering services for intersection improvements at the PNC Bank Arts Center exit ramps from the Garden State Parkway. Additional improvements also include reconfiguring the East/West PNC Service Road; overhead lane control system upgrades, roadway and parking lot lighting, and other ancillary activities.

This assignment is classified as a "Simple Project" based on the scope of work being clearly defined and not likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost not exceeding \$2,000,000.00. The solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and twenty-eight (28) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Codes: A253 – Signalized Intersections, A500 – Traffic Control Systems and D491 Transportation Planning: Alternatives Analyses. Nine firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of April 24, 2019.

Subsequent to the scoring of EOIs by the Review Committee, Fee Proposals were requested from the three highest technically ranked firms. The firms in the order of ranking are: 1) Dewberry Engineers Inc.; 2) Stantec Consulting Services, Inc; and 3) Gannett Fleming, Inc. The fee submitted by Dewberry Engineers Inc. has been reviewed, negotiated and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. P3753 be issued to the firm of Dewberry Engineers Inc. of Bloomfield, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$1,790,000.00. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum

multiplier of 2.68 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. The award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. These professional services were procured, and the recommended firm was selected, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seq., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

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PUBLIC BID-AWARD OF CONTRACTS

161-06-2019

In a document dated June 7, 2019, **Recommendation to Award Contract No. A500.525-1, New Jersey Turnpike & Garden State Parkway, A.M.E., Inc., On-Call HVAC Controls Repairs on the New Jersey Turnpike from MP 0 to MP 122, and on the Garden State Parkway from MP 0 to MP 172.4, RM – 147701, Budget Code: 080C07117, Amount: \$4,000,000.00**, was approved.

The work performed under this contract consists of on-call HVAC repairs at all Authority owned facilities on the New Jersey Turnpike from MP 0 to MP 122, and on the Garden State Parkway from MP 0 to MP 172. The on-call repairs will be as directed by the Engineer, by Work Orders, for a term of two (2) years with two (2), one (1) year options to renew and a total contract limit of \$4,000,000.00.

Three (3) bid proposals were received on 5/7/2019 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal of 2.50% may be compared to the Engineer's Estimate of 12.50%. These percentages represent a weighted average mark-up on the Contractor's time and materials cost of performing the work. AME has previously performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. A500.525-1 be awarded to the lowest bidder, A.M.E. Inc., of Fairfield, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$4,000,000.00. This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. Bids were procured and authorization is being sought to award this contract in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

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040C07021, Amount: \$ 488,500.00, was approved.

Under this contract, vendor will supply one (1) catch basin / sewer cleaning vehicle for use by the Maintenance Department. The truck is replacing an older model that that has reached its life expectancy, and will be sold as surplus if feasible. The bid was fully advertised and the seven (7) vendors listed in the Authority's database for the referenced commodity were notified of the procurement. In a memorandum dated June 14, 2019, **Authorization to Enter into Agreements with the New York Giants, New York Jets and Rutgers University for E-ZPass Advertising**, was approved.

This agenda item is a request to enter into three separate agreements for E-ZPass advertising at NY Giants, NY Jets, LLC and Rutgers University sporting events for the 2019 and 2020 seasons. This initiative will advertise and promote the NJ E-ZPass concept as an easier and more efficient means of travel throughout the New Jersey area. In 2018, the NJTA promoted this concept on a limited basis at MetLife Stadium for two professional football events which proved to be successful.

The professional football event advertising package will consist of outside and inside stadium advertising for all 2019 pre-season and regular season home games. Specifically, advertising messages around the perimeter of the stadium, on over 2000 video monitors in and around the inside of the facility and radio spots throughout each event. Additionally, an E-ZPass Promotional Day will be scheduled to include on site interaction with patrons to further explain and promote the advantages of the E-ZPass concept. The cost for each advertising package is \$ 120,000 for a total of \$240,000.

The Rutgers University advertising package will consist of promotions for the 2019 football season and the 2019-2020 Rutgers wrestling and men's and woman's basketball seasons. Specifically, advertising will consist of video board exposure, radio initiatives and social media promotions. Additionally, an E-ZPass Promotional Day will be scheduled to further endorse the E-ZPass concept. The total cost for this project is \$120,000.

Accordingly, approval of these agreements is respectfully requested in the total amount of \$360,000. It is further recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute all documents relative thereto.

On motion by Treasurer DuPont and seconded by Commissioner Diaz the Board unanimously approved item number 174-06-2019; and authorized or ratified, as presented, the recommendations contained therein; and received and filed the memoranda.

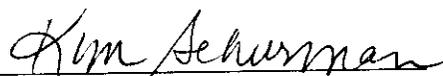
