In accordance with the provisions of the 1991 Turnpike Revenue Bond Resolution (as adopted on August 20, 1991, as amended and restated on September 26, 1991, and as further amended and restated on November 22, 1991), Section 718, HNTB Corporation as the Authority's General Consulting Engineer submits this progress report for the Second Quarter 2019 for active projects comprising the Authority's Capital Improvement Program for the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway road systems and facilities. Specifically, the projects included are those that were identified in the Authority's \$7 billion Capital Improvement Program (\$7B CIP) that was adopted and approved by the Authority's Board of Commissioners (Board) on October 10, 2008 with minor modifications thereto from time to time. Financing for the \$7B CIP has been provided by revenue bonds issued from 2009 through 2019.

A more detailed summary of the revenue bond sales is provided in Section E of the attached report. In addition, the disposition of funds within the Construction Fund is presented in tabulations contained herein. General Board actions that are germane to the Authority's operations or which may directly influence any of the Capital Improvement Program projects are also reported.

1. INTRODUCTION

This Quarterly Report details the progress of New Jersey Turnpike Authority projects financed through the sale of revenue bonds. Funds so derived are deposited in the Authority's Construction Fund. As prescribed in the 1991 Turnpike Revenue Bond Resolution (as adopted on August 20, 1991, as amended and restated on September 26, 1991, and as further amended and restated on November 22, 1991), Section 718, Progress Reports, this report is directed to members of the Authority, Trustees, and Bondholders who have been identified by the Authority to apprise them as to the disposition of new monies raised by the issuance of revenue bonds and the status of the projects funded by the bond proceeds.

New money raised by bond sales is intended to fund new Authority projects or complete Authority projects that were initiated under a prior bond sale. These projects are of a typical nature that adds to or improves the capital assets of the Authority.

The \$7 billion Capital Improvement Program (\$7B CIP) was adopted by the Authority on October 10, 2008. The Authority's \$7B CIP is comprised of 35 projects on both the Garden State Parkway (Parkway) and the New Jersey Turnpike (Turnpike). These projects provide for system expansion, safety and operational improvements, and maintaining the road systems and facilities state-of-good-repair. Financing for the \$7B CIP has been provided by revenue bonds that have been issued from 2009 through 2019.

There are a number of active projects in the \$7B CIP that trace their financial origin to bond sales from 2000 to 2005; however, these funds have been spent. Currently, the entire \$7B CIP is funded with the proceeds from periodic revenue bond sales from 2009 to 2019. The final bond issuance was the Series 2019 A Turnpike Revenue Bonds that closed on February 7, 2019.

In this report, the status of each project comprising the \$7B CIP is presented in tabular form outlining the budgeted amounts, the amounts spent and committed, and the amounts necessary to complete each project. Charts are included which compare the planned and actual quarterly and cumulative expenditures for each project in the construction fund that make up the CIP.

The report chronicles Board actions that occurred during the report period which have a bearing on the progress of projects, such as awards for legal, insurance, and engineering services; property acquisitions; and construction contracts. In addition, Board actions that affect general Authority operations are reported because they may impact the delivery of the \$7B CIP. Also presented is a description of any action by external regulatory agencies such as the NJ Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP), or any other external party, which occurred during the report period that affected, in any manner, the cost or timely prosecution of any project. The content of this report is based on



information received from the Authority's Executive Office, Finance Department, Engineering Department, Operations Department, and Maintenance Department.

Where funds provided by a bond sale are insufficient to complete a specific project, or funding is needed prior to a bond sale, the Authority may use other sources such as proceeds of bond anticipation notes and reserve funds derived from revenues. Also, there are projects in the \$7B CIP in which funding participation by other agencies is expected as part of an inter-party agreement or memorandum of understanding; these projects are reported on herein also.

A. BOARD ACTIONS

The following is a summary of Board actions relating to Construction Fund 390 projects during the past quarter.

April 23, 2019

39006019 New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway, Installation of Variable Message Signs at New and Existing Locations

Authorized Contract No. A600.102G in the amount of \$17,865,277.28 to PKF-Mark III, Inc. of Newton, Pennsylvania. This contract involves the construction of Variable Message Signs (VMS) at 16 new and 13 existing locations which include constructing foundations for new sign structures, furnishing and installing VMS support structures, installing and testing of VMS, installing roadway safety features and associated electrical and ITS work. The work also includes the removal of existing VMS and structures that are no longer needed.

39006019 New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway, Supervision of Construction Services for Contract No. A600.102G, Installation of Variable Message Signs at New and Existing Locations

Authorized OPS No. A3704 in the amount not to exceed \$2,315,000.00 to M&J Engineering, P. C. of Ridgefield Park, New Jersey. This OPS will provide supervision of construction services for Contract No. A600.102G, Installation of Variable Message Signs at New and Existing Locations on the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway. These services include construction inspection, material testing, record keeping, preparation of payment estimate and other services required to ensure compliance with the contract documents.

39001011 New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway, Supervision of Construction Services for Contract No. A100.196. Construction Management/General Consulting Services for The New Jersey Turnpike Authority Security Program

Authorized Supplement A OPS No. A3435 in the amount not to exceed \$1,230,000.00 to WSP USA, Inc. of Lawrenceville, New Jersey. This Supplement A will provide for extended supervision of construction services for Contract No. A100.196. This contract provided for the development, procurement and administration of construction services performed by subcontractors associated with multiple construction work orders that were being developed under the Authority's Security Program. OPS No. A3435 was issued at the March 27, 2012 Board Meeting. Supplement A will compensate WSP USA, Inc. for unanticipated additional services associated with extending the duration of Contract No. A100.196 by approximately 21 months.

39002017 Garden State Parkway, Design Service for Contract No. P200.522 Rehabilitation of Concrete Median Barrier, Milepost 129 to 140

Authorized OPS No. P3734 in the not to exceed amount of \$2,965,000.00 to Boswell Engineering of South Hackensack, New Jersey. This OPS will provide for detailed inspections, final design and the preparation of contract documents to rehabilitate concrete median barrier along the Garden State Parkway mainline from Milepost 129 to 140 in Middlesex and Union Counties. The work also includes an alternative study, cost estimates, and other related incidental work.

June 25, 2019

39013027 New Jersey Turnpike, Design Services for Interchange 14A Improvements

Authorized OPS No. T3371 Supplement C in the not to exceed amount of \$290,000.00 to Gannet Fleming, Inc. This Supplement will provide additional post design services including closure of four additional underground storage tanks identified during construction and associated soil and groundwater remediation, in addition to ongoing monitoring and regulatory reporting to the NJ Department of Environmental Protection. This Supplement also includes additional right-of-way and as-built documentation requested by the Authority to facilitate the transfer of ownership and jurisdiction to Bayonne and the NJ Department of Transportation.

Contract No. T100.184, (Schiavone Construction Co., LLC) provides for deck reconstruction, replacement of deck joints, roadway lighting and drainage improvements, tie chord redundancy retrofit, structural steel repair and retrofit, repainting of tie chords, splash zones repainting of structural steel, and the removal of the shoulder use temporary lane control system.

Design services for Contract No. T100.336, Specialized Structural Steel Repairs was halted in 2015. Design services for Contract No. T100.436, Rehabilitation of New Jersey Turnpike Passaic River Bridges Structure Nos. W107.87 and E107.88 (which started under this fund) was transferred to the Revenue Funded Construction Account Project Nos. 391R00002 (Structure No. W107.87) and 391R00003 (Structure No. E107.88) in 2017.

39013005 Turnpike Interchange 8A to Route 130 Connector Improvements

This project addressed significant traffic congestion near Interchange 8A. The project limits include a section of Route 32 between Interchange 8A and the interconnection of Route 32 with Route 130. Middlesex County requested the Authority undertake appropriate improvements on the basis that much of the traffic within the corridor was destined to or from the Turnpike.

Status - design and construction complete

39013027 Turnpike Interchange 14A Reconstruction

There were operational limitations due to constrained geometry for the existing Turnpike interchange located within the cities of Bayonne and Jersey City. The proposed redevelopment of the Military Ocean Terminal in Bayonne along with the Global Container Terminal resulted in a significant increase in traffic using the Interchange 14A toll plaza. The interchange capacity was improved and two additional toll lanes were added to the existing toll plaza to address the operational and capacity deficiencies of the interchange.

Status – design and construction ongoing

Contract No. T300.311, (Union Paving & Construction Co., Inc.) provides improvements to the Interchange 14A toll plaza and ramps to improve operations between the Turnpike and Route NJ 440, as well as local connections in Bayonne and Jersey City. The work included construction of two additional toll lanes, toll plaza rehabilitation and renovations, replacement of the existing two lane



Connector Road Bridge with a four-lane structure, and various other ramps and roadway improvements.

The project involved the construction of three additional lanes, both northbound and southbound, between Interchanges 6 and 8A, approximately 25 miles. The project also included the addition of one lane in each direction between Interchanges 8A and 9. The widening project resulted in 12 total mainline lanes being provided between Interchanges 6 and 9. In addition, the project included interchange improvements within the project limits as determined to be necessary to meet traffic demands for the design year of 2032.

Status – design and construction was completed November 2014. The ROW acquisitions for the program are 100 percent complete and closed.

The cost of acquiring rights-of-way and properties for the program was originally estimated to be \$110,500,000. Through September 2017, \$81,541,005 was spent or committed for acquiring title to 314 properties. The following tabulation indicates the right-of-way status in each of the eight sections comprising the Widening Program and the properties acquired for the purpose of environmental mitigation:

All properties required for the Program were acquired, with all condemnation cases settled and closed.

A total of 31 contracts for roadway construction, sign structure fabrication, and environmental mitigation were awarded for the Program, committing the Authority to an expenditure totaling over \$1.4 billion.

39021004 Parkway Bass River Bridge

This project provided for the design and construction of improvements to the Parkway crossing of the Bass River. The primary work included the construction of a new parallel bridge and re-decking, structural repairs and seismic retrofit on the existing bridge, Str. No. 51.9.

Status - design and construction completed May 2015

39021015 Parkway Mullica River Bridge

This project provided for the design and construction of improvements to the Parkway crossing of the Mullica River. The primary work included the construction of a new parallel bridge and re-decking, structural repairs and seismic retrofit on the existing bridge, Str. No. 49.0.

Status – design and construction of the new bridge was completed in December 2012. Design and reconstruction of the existing bridge was completed in April 2014.

39021020 Parkway Bridge Substructure Repairs

This project provided for the design and construction of repairs and rehabilitation of the existing Driscoll Bridge, Str. No. 127.2, along with pier caps, columns, and substructure elements on other water crossings.

39021036 Parkway Great Egg Harbor and Drag Channel Bridges

This project provides for the design and construction of a new parallel bridge carrying the southbound Parkway over Great Egg Harbor and Drag Channel. The new bridge will be constructed west of the existing southbound structure. The new bridges include a new 3,834-foot-long bridge over Great Egg Harbor and a new 770-foot-long bridge over Drag Channel. Construction will also include approximately 4,900 linear feet of new approach roadways; demolition of the existing southbound bridge; rehabilitation of the northbound Parkway bridge; and demolition of the nearby existing Beesley's Point Bridge. Special construction features include use of high performance concrete for the



bridge decks, a ten-foot-wide multi-use pathway on the west side of the new bridges and approach roadways, and a plastic lumber fender system to protect the bridge piers.

Status – design and construction ongoing

Contract No. P100.251, (Route 52 Constructors) replaced Str. Nos. 28.0S and 28.5S with two new parallel structures to the west of the existing bridges. The roadway of these bridges will include a 10-foot wide multi-use pathway. The contract includes interim repairs to the existing northbound Great Egg Harbor and Drag Channel bridges and demolishing the NJDOT's Beesley's Point Bridge.

No. 28.0S Garden State Parkway southbound over Great Egg Harbor, and Str. No. 28.55, Garden State Parkway southbound over Drag Channel.

This project was a joint cooperative project between the Authority and the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) that provided for the design and construction of missing ramp connections between the Parkway and I-78. The project also provided improvements to the interchange's existing ramp network, toll plaza and to the I-78 mainline. The project was funded by the Federal Highway Administration, the NJDOT, and the Authority. Reported project costs contained herein only represent the Authority's share of the overall cost of the project.

39023009 Parkway Interchange 44 Improvements

Interchange 44 previously provided access to the Parkway to and from the north only. This project completed the interchange to provide two additional ramps to allow access to and from the south.

There were three traffic signals on the Parkway in Cape May County at Interchanges 9, 10 and 11. This project eliminated the traffic signals by providing three bridges to carry the Parkway over the local streets at each interchange. This project also provided for full access to the Parkway northbound and southbound at each interchange.

Contract No. P300.229, (A. Servidone, Inc. & B. Anthony Construction Corp., A Joint Venture) provides for the realignment and replacement of the two Parkway Mainline bridge structures over Chevalier Avenue and the construction of four new ramps to and from the Garden State Parkway to complete the existing interchange movements at Interchange 125. Work also includes a new toll gantry for electronic collection at the new southbound exit ramp, widening of Main Street Extension, widening and reconstruction of Chevalier Avenue, new traffic signals, utility relocation; construction of sign structures and six retaining walls, reconstruction of storm water drainage systems and guide rail installation from Milepost 125.7 to 128.1 in Sayreville.

39023030 Parkway Interchange 91 Improvements

This project was a joint cooperative project between the Authority and Ocean County that provided missing ramp movements at this partial interchange along with the reconstruction and safety improvements to the existing northbound ramp toll plaza. This project also included the construction of two extended service roads and county road improvements that eliminated the complexity of the current traffic pattern, relieved congestion on local roads, and enhanced safety.

Status – design and construction completed 2017

39028018 Parkway Widening Interchanges 63-80

This project provided for a third travel lane with full shoulders in each direction on the Parkway and Express E-ZPass/one-way southbound tolls at the Barnegat Toll Plaza. Three individual design and construction contracts were provided for mainline widening of the 17-mile section in both directions. The project also included new sign structures, 10 bridge replacements and realignment of the Parkway at the Barnegat Toll Plaza that provided for the elimination of tolls in the northbound direction, new Express E-ZPass operation in the southbound direction, and a new toll utility building.

39028031 Parkway Widening Interchanges 35-63

This project provides for the construction of a third travel lane with full shoulders in each direction on the Parkway. The contract includes bridge widening and/or replacement, culvert lengthening and/or replacement, new overhead sign structures, drainage improvements, stormwater management facilities, signing and striping, lighting and other miscellaneous work necessary to complete the contract.

At the July 28, 2015 Board Meeting, the Authority entered into Agreement No. 119-15 with the South Jersey Transportation Authority (SJTA), which operates the Atlantic City Expressway (ACE). The ACE crosses over the Garden State Parkway at Interchange 38. The SJTA requested the Authority construct a full deck replacement of ACE's Bridge No. 20EB, and a widening and full deck replacement of ACE's Bridge No. 20WB. Under the terms of the agreement, the SJTA is responsible for the design, permitting and utility work necessary, and the Authority is responsible for the cost of construction, construction supervision and project management. The work is being performed as a Change Order to Contract No. P300.253 in an amount not to exceed \$10,000,000.

E. STATUS OF CONSTRUCTION FUNDS

Construction funds are derived from the sale of revenue bonds. At its October 10, 2008 meeting, the Board authorized the \$7B CIP to fund major improvements on the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway. A summary of the \$7B CIP bond issuance is described and presented in the table below. The total value of the bonds issued under the \$7B CIP exceeds the \$7B project costs, in part, due to proceeds applied to capitalized interest, deposits to the debt reserve fund, and related issuance costs.

In April 2009, the Authority issued its \$375,000,000 Turnpike Revenue Bonds, Series 2009 E and \$1,375,000,000 Turnpike Revenue Bonds, Series 2009 F (Federally Taxable - Issuer Subsidy - Build America Bonds) (respectively, the "Series 2009 E Bonds" and the "Series 2009 F Bonds" and collectively, the "Series 2009 E and F Bonds") under the Resolution to initially fund the costs of the \$7B CIP. In December 2010, the Authority issued its \$1,850,000,000 Turnpike Revenue Bonds, Series 2010 A (Federally Taxable - Issuer Subsidy - Build America Bonds) (the "Series 2010 A Bonds", together with the Series 2009 F Bonds, the "Build America Bonds") under the Resolution to further fund costs of the \$7B CIP. In addition, the Authority has also issued its \$1,400,000,000 Turnpike Revenue Bonds, Series 2013 A (the "Series 2013 A Bonds"), its \$1,000,000,000 Turnpike Revenue Bonds, Series 2014 A (the "Series 2014 A Bonds") and its \$750,000,000 Turnpike Revenue Bonds, Series 2015 E (the "Series 2015 E Bonds") to further fund costs of the \$7B CIP. In January 2017, the Authority issued its \$600,000,000 Turnpike Revenue Bonds, Series 2017 A (the "Series 2017 A Bonds") to further fund costs of the Capital Improvement Program. The Authority issued its final Series of Non-Refunding Bonds (Series 2019 A Bonds) under the Resolution in January 2019 which closed on February 7, 2019. The final bond issue was in an aggregate principal amount of \$449,110,000, in order to provide the final funding for the \$7B CIP, and to fund deposits to the Debt Reserve Fund, capitalized interest on such Non-Refunding Bonds and costs of issuance required in connection with the issuance of such Non-Refunding Bonds.

The following two tabulations, current as of the last day in the report quarter, indicate the current budget for each project. The first tabulation indicates the status of funds supplied by bond sales. The second tabulation presents a comparison between the planned expenditures and the actual expenditures, quarterly and cumulatively, for the 35 projects comprising the \$7B CIP. The "Budget" column indicates funds to be supplied by the construction fund only. Certain projects in the tabulation are also expected to receive funds from reserve funds or other sources which are derived from revenues. "Committed" indicates the amount of funds obligated through existing agreements and the unexpended portion of ongoing contracts. All amounts appearing in the tabulations were obtained from the Authority's Finance Department.

In terms of costs expended, the \$7B CIP is 92 percent complete as of the close of the quarter. In terms of elapsed time, the program commenced in January 2009 and has been active for 10-years and 6-months.
