

<u>Budget Code: 010-00-893-441030, Amount: Not to Exceed \$493,696, was approved.</u>

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the "Authority") maintains property insurance for the protection of its physical assets and loss of revenue via a pro-rata share program consisting of seven (7) primary and excess carriers. Marsh USA, Inc., the Authority's broker of record, ("Marsh") is tasked with designing, marketing and implementing the 2020 renewal program. In order to allow sufficient time to collect and analyze the information needed, much of which involves year end data, as well as to negotiate this comprehensive and complex policy, it is recommended that the Authority extend the current policy for a period of one (1) month from May 15, 2020 to June 15, 2020. The underwriters have agreed to extend the policies upon the same terms and conditions and to apply a pro rata premium of \$493,696, one twelfth of the annual premium, subject to Commissioner approval.

The total premium for the one month extension will not exceed \$493,696. After review and discussion with Law department staff, Hanover Stone Partners, LLC, the Authority's risk management consultant, and Marsh both recommend, and the Law Department agrees, that the Authority extend the coverage as set forth above.

It is therefore recommended that the Commissioners authorize extension of its property insurance program as set forth above. It is further recommended that the Executive Director, after consultation with the Authority's Law Department, be authorized to execute all documents

and to take any and all further actions to effectuate the extension of the policies consistent with the intent of the recommendation.

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PUBLIC BID-AWARD OF CONTRACTS

<u>298-12-2019</u>

In a document dated November 20, 2019, Recommendation to Award Contract No. T100.465, New Jersey Turnpike, Joseph M. Sanzari, Inc., Bridge Repairs and Resurfacing, Milepost 92 to 122 and the Newark Bay-Hudson County Extension (2020), R-154191, Budget Code: 030C10001E, Funding Allocation: \$13,000,000.00 FY 2020, \$984,948.00 FY 2021, Amount: \$13,984,948.00, was approved.

This is the first of two Turnpike bridge repair contracts to be awarded for the 2020 construction season. The contract is concentrated in the northern portion of the Turnpike and will perform work on 23 structures. The work includes deck repairs, joint repairs, replacement of existing asphalt wearing surface, bearing replacement and miscellaneous substructure repairs.

Two bid proposals were received on November 7, 2019 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal, in the amount of \$13,984,948.00, may be compared to the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$14,226,220.00. The low bidder, Joseph M. Sanzari, Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. T100.465 be awarded to the low bidder, Joseph M. Sanzari, Inc. of Hackensack, New Jersey in the amount of \$13,984,948.00 which will be allocated as follows: \$13,000,000.00 for FY 2020 and \$984,948.00 for FY 2021. This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51

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(formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

P100.472, Garden State Parkway, Joseph M. Sanzari, Inc., Bridge Repairs and Resurfacing,

Milepost 126 to 172 (2020), R-154192, Budget Code: 030C20001E, Funding Allocation:

\$10,337,000.00 FY 2020, \$ 1,000,000.00 FY 2021, Amount: \$11,337,000.00, was approved.

This is the first of two Parkway bridge repair contracts to be awarded for the 2020 construction season. The contract is concentrated in the northern portion of the Parkway and will perform work on 15 structures. The work generally includes deck repairs, joint repairs, replacement of existing asphalt wearing surface, bearing replacement and miscellaneous substructure repairs.

Three bid proposals were received on November 13, 2019 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal in the amount of \$11,337,000.00 may be compared to the second low bidder in the amount of \$11,946,649.00. The bids were significantly higher than the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$8,519,555.00. This is likely due to restrictive work hours affecting productivity in items related to asphalt pavement, abutment/pier concrete repair, shielding and bearing replacements. The low bidder, Joseph M. Sanzari, Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. P100.472 be awarded to the low bidder, Joseph M. Sanzari, Inc. of Hackensack, New Jersey in the amount of \$11,337,000.00 which will be allocated as follows: \$10,337,000.00 for FY 2020 and \$1,000,000.00 for FY 2021. This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

In a document dated November 21, 2019, Recommendation to Issue Order for Professional Services No. P3691, Garden State Parkway, Dewberry Engineers Inc., Supervision of Construction Services for Contract No. P100.472, Bridge Repairs and Resurfacing, Milepost 126 to 172 (2020), R-154204m, Budget Code: 030C20001E, Funding Allocation: \$ 1,335,000.00, FY 2020, \$300,000.00 FY 2021, Amount: \$1,635,000.00, was approved.

This Order for Professional Services will provide supervision of construction services for Contract No. P100.472, Bridge Repairs and Resurfacing, Milepost 126 to 172 (2020). These services include construction inspection, material testing, record keeping, preparation of payment estimates and other services required to ensure compliance with the contract documents.

This assignment is classified as a "Simple Project" based on the scope of work being clearly defined and not likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost not exceeding \$2,000,000.00. The solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and thirty-nine (39) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Codes: B156, Bridge Repair Inspection and B157, Bridge Deck Repair/Replacement Inspection. Four firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of October 18, 2019.

Subsequent to the scoring of EOIs by the Review Committee, Fee Proposals were requested from the top three technically ranked firms. The firms in the order of ranking are: 1) Dewberry Engineers Inc.; 2) Tectonic Engineering and Surveying Consultants P.C.; and 3) KS Engineers, P.C. The fee submitted by Dewberry Engineers Inc. has been reviewed and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. P3691 be issued to the firm of Dewberry Engineers Inc. of Bloomfield, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$1,635,000.00 which is allocated as follows: \$1,335,000.00 for FY 2020 and \$300,000.00 for FY 2021. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.40 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. The award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. These professional services were procured, and the recommended firm was selected, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seq., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

In a document dated November 26, 2019, Recommendation to Issue Order for Professional Services No. T3757, New Jersey Turnpike, Boswell Engineering, P.C., Supervision of Construction Services for Contract No. T100.465, Bridge Repairs and Resurfacing, Milepost 92 to 122 and the Newark Bay-Hudson County Extension (2020), R-154206, Budget Code: 030C10001E, Funding Allocation: \$1,600,000.00 FY 2020, \$360,000.00, FY 2021, Amount: \$1,960,000.00, was approved.

This Order for Professional Services will provide supervision of construction services for Contract No. T100.465, Bridge Repairs and Resurfacing, Milepost 92 to 122 and the Newark Bay-Hudson County Extension. These services include construction inspection, material testing, record keeping, preparation of payment estimates and other services required to ensure compliance with the contract documents.

This assignment is classified as a "Simple Project" based on the scope of work being clearly defined and not likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost not exceeding \$2,000,000.00. The solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and forty (40) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Codes: B156, Bridge Repair Inspection and B157, Bridge Deck Repair/ Replacement Inspection. Six firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of October 25, 2019.

Subsequent to the scoring of EOIs by the Review Committee, Fee Proposals were requested from the top three technically ranked firms. The firms in the order of ranking are: 1) Boswell Engineering, P.C.; 2) APTIM Environmental & Infrastructure, LLC; and 3) ATANE Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors, P.C. The fee submitted by Boswell Engineering, P.C. has been reviewed, negotiated and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. T3757 be issued to the firm of Boswell Engineering, P.C. of South Hackensack, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$1,960,000.00 which is allocated as follows: \$1,600,000.00 for FY 2020 and \$360,000.00 for FY 2021. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.30 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. The award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. These professional services were procured, and the recommended firm was selected, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seq., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

In a document dated November 22, 2019, Recommendation to Issue Order for Professional Services Nos. P3729 and P3730, Garden State Parkway, OPS No. P3729 – Dewberry Engineers Inc., OPS No. P3730 – Van Cleef Engineering Associates, LLC, Order for Professional Services No. P3729, Design Services for Contract No. P100.519, Bridge Repairs and Resurfacing Milepost 0 to 126 (2021), R-154208, Budget Code: 030C20001E, Funding Allocation: \$ 875,000.00 FY 2020, \$ 175,000.00 FY 2021, Amount: \$1,050,000.00, And, Order for Professional Services No. P3730, Design Services for Contract No. P100.520, Bridge Repairs and Resurfacing Milepost 126 to 172 (2021), R-154209, Budget Code: 030C20001E, Funding Allocation: \$ 950,000.00 FY 2020, \$ 204,000.00 FY 2021, Amount: \$1,154,000.00, was approved.

Through this single procurement process, the Authority will select two consultants to furnish design services and prepare construction contract documents for the annual bridge deck and miscellaneous structural repair contracts for 2021, which will address the southern and northern portions on the Parkway.

The design services associated with OPS No. P3729 provides for bridge inspection, condition evaluation and preparation of contract documents for bridge deck repairs, resurfacing and miscellaneous structural repairs on the southern portion of the Parkway.

The design services associated with OPS No. P3730 provides for bridge inspection, condition evaluation and preparation of contract documents for Bridge Deck Repairs, Resurfacing and Miscellaneous Structural Repairs on the northern portion of the Parkway.

These assignments are classified as "Simple Projects" since the scopes of work are clearly defined and not likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost of each is less than \$2,000,000.00. The Solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and forty-three (43) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Codes:

A092 – Bridges: Miscellaneous Repairs and A093 – Bridges: Deck Replacement and Rehabilitation.

Seven firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of October 24, 2019.

The scoring of the EOIs by the Review Committee resulted in the following order of ranking of the top three firms: 1) Van Cleef Engineering Associates, LLC; 2) Dewberry Engineers Inc.; and 3) Stantec Consulting Services, Inc. These three firms were requested to submit sealed Fee Proposals, which were received and have been reviewed. A review of the fee proposal of the highest technically ranked firm, Van Cleef Engineering Associates, LLC, for OPS No. P3730 (their preferred OPS) resulted in acceptance of their original fee proposal. Subsequently, a review of the fee proposal of the second highest technically ranked firm, Dewberry Engineers, Inc. for OPS No. P3729 was negotiated, which resulted in a reduction in their fee proposal. Both fees are considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. P3729 be issued to the firm of Dewberry Engineers Inc., of Bloomfield, NJ, not to exceed the amount of \$1,050,000.00 allocated as follows: \$875,000.00 in FY 2020 and \$175,000.00 in FY 2021. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.68 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses.

It is further recommended that Order for Professional Services No. P3730 be issued to the firm of Van Cleef Engineering Associates, LLC of Freehold, NJ, not to exceed the amount of \$1,154,000.00 allocated as follows: \$950,000.00 in FY 2020 and \$204,000.00 in FY 2021. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.59 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses.

The issuance of these OPS' are contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardees, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. These professional services were procured, and the recommended firms were selected, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seq., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

A3776 and A3777, New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway, OPS No. A3776 – Gannett Fleming, Inc., OPS No. A3777 – Dewberry Engineers Inc., Order for Professional Services No. A3776, On-Call Engineering Services, R-154288, Budget: Various Funding Sources, Amount: \$4,000,000.00, and, Order for Professional Services No. A3777, On-Call Engineering Services, R-154289, Budget Code: Various Funding Sources, Amount: \$4,000,000.00, was approved.

Through this single procurement process, the Authority will select two consultants to provide on-call engineering services for a two-year period with the option of a one-year extension on an as needed basis to assist the Engineering Department in the review and development of engineering documents. Anticipated efforts include assistance with engineering studies, the design and preparation of contract documents for minor projects and construction oversight of utilities being installed within the Authorities right-of-way via License to Cross agreements and other engineering services that may be required.

This assignment is classified as a "Complex Project" since the scope of work is not clearly defined and likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost exceeds \$2,000,000.00. The Solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and thirteen (13) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Code(s): A061 -

Architecture: Renovations; A092 - Bridges: Miscellaneous; A093 - Bridges: Deck Replacements and Rehabilitations; A250 - Fully Controlled Access Highways; A257 - Roadside Safety Features; A300 - Roadway Lighting Systems; B151 - Construction Management; B153 - Roadway Construction Inspection; B154 - Roadway Resurfacing Inspection; B155 - Bridge Construction Inspection; B157 - Bridge Deck Repair/Replacement Inspection; D490 - Transportation Planning: Location & Alignment Studies. Seven firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of October 8, 2019.

The scoring of the EOIs by the Review Committee resulted in the following order of ranking: 1) Gannett Fleming, Inc.; 2) Dewberry Engineers Inc.; and 3) Stantec Consulting Services, Inc. On November 7, 2019, Technical and Fee Proposals were received from the three firms. The Review Committee reviewed and evaluated each firm's Technical Proposals and it was determined that oral presentations would not be required. The final scoring resulted in Gannett Fleming, Inc. and Dewberry Engineers Inc. being the highest technically ranked firms. The Fee Proposal, consisting of firm overhead rates and staff salary rates, submitted by Gannett Fleming, Inc. was determined to be fair and reasonable. The revised Fee Proposal, which added the construction inspection overhead rate, submitted by Dewberry Engineers Inc. was determined to be fair and reasonable. The maximum fee for each Work Request Authorization is \$500,000.00. The fee for each task will be negotiated independently in conjunction with the Work Request Authorization process.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. A3776 be issued to the firm of Gannett Fleming, Inc., of Piscataway, New Jersey, not to exceed the amount of \$4,000,000.00. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.80 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses.

It is further recommended that Order for Professional Services No. A3777 be issued to the firm of Dewberry Engineers Inc. of Bloomfield, New Jersey, not to exceed the amount of \$4,000,000.00. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.68 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses.

The term of each OPS will be two years and the Authority will have the option of extending the term of each OPS for one additional year.

Through this single procurement process, the Authority will select two consultants to furnish preliminary and final design engineering and permitting services for the structural rehabilitation and repair of culverts located at select locations on the Parkway between Milepost 112 to 113, and Milepost 115 to 116.

The design services associated with OPS No. P3782 provides for the structural rehabilitation of the culvert located at Parkway Milepost 112.42N, and repairs of the culverts located at Parkway Milepost 112.17 and 112.51S. These services also include post design services and non-NBIS culvert inspections, and other related work defined in the RFEOI's Scope of Services.

The design services associated with OPS No. P3783 provides for the structural rehabilitation of the culvert located at Parkway Milepost 115.13S, and repairs of the culverts located at Parkway Milepost 115.80 and 115.81. These services also include post design services and non-NBIS culvert inspections, and other related work defined in the RFEOI's Scope of Services.

These assignments are classified as "Simple Projects" since the scopes of work are clearly defined and not likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost of each is less than \$2,000,000.00. The Solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and thirty-five (35) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Codes: A250: Fully Controlled Access Highways, and A265: Roadway Storm Water Collection Systems. Eight firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of October 22, 2019.

The scoring of the EOIs by the Review Committee resulted in the following order of ranking of the top three firms: 1) McCormick Taylor; 2) Boswell Engineering; and 3) T.Y. Lin International. These three firms were requested to submit sealed Fee Proposals, which were received and have been reviewed. A review of the fee proposal of the highest technically ranked firm, McCormick Taylor for OPS No. P3783 (their preferred OPS) was negotiated, which resulted in a reduction in their fee proposal. Subsequently, a review of the fee proposal of the second

highest technically ranked firm, Boswell Engineering for OPS No. P3782 was negotiated, which resulted in a reduction in their fee proposal. Both fees are considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. P3782 be issued to the firm of Boswell Engineering of South Hackensack, NJ, not to exceed the amount of \$1,100,000.00 allocated as follows: \$990,000.00 in FY 2020 and \$110,000.00 in FY 2021. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.68 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses.

It is further recommended that Order for Professional Services No. P3783 be issued to the firm of McCormick Taylor of Mount Laurel, NJ, not to exceed the amount of \$1,300,000.00 allocated as follows: \$1,150,000.00 in FY 2020 and \$150,000.00 in FY 2021. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.80 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses.

Supplement A will provide for unanticipated design and post-design services which are beyond the current authorized scope of work. The additional work requested by the Authority

The Authority's threshold, or self-insured retention, is a \$350,000 deductible per claimant, plus an additional \$250,000 known as an aggregate deductible (combined threshold of \$600,000).

On behalf of the Authority, Segal requested proposals from eighteen (18) vendors for rates offering stop loss insurance effective January 1, 2020. Vendors were asked to provide proposals that matched the current contract provisions. Fourteen (14) vendors declined to quote. Four proposals (4) were received from the following vendors:

- 1) TMS Re Stop Loss, Inc. ("TMS Re")
- 2) Union Labor Life Insurance Company ("ULLICO")
- 3) Vista Underwriting Solution ("Vista")
- 4) Berkley Accident and Health Insurance Company ("Berkley")

In its Evaluation Report dated December 2019, Segal thoroughly documented its evaluation process, the proposals, and its recommendation. After reviewing the proposals, Segal requested Best and Final offers from the top three (3) vendors; TMS Re, ULLICO, and Vista. Berkley's proposal was deemed excessive as its proposed annual premium was 80% above the current rate. Critical factors considered in the best and final analysis were the total financial exposure to the Authority for the duration of the contract, which includes the offering of a rate cap at renewal, the family deductible provision, and the option to laser new claimants at renewal.

The Authority's financial exposure is the annual premium paid plus the aggregating specific deductible, \$250,000, that must be met before any reimbursement is received from the stop loss contract. In addition, the renewal rate cap is incorporated in the cost analysis to identify the maximum liability to the Authority for the next two years should it wish to renew with the respective carrier. Based on this analysis, ULLICO and Vista Underwriting provided the two most competitive quotes. TMS Re, the incumbent, proposed the highest premium rate, for a 46% increase above the current rate, and did NOT offer a renewal rate cap.

ULLICO proposed a one-year rate, for an increase of 40% above current premium costs, for an estimated annual premium of \$1.678 million. The total exposure with the specific aggregating deductible (\$250,000) is \$1.928 million, or an increase of 33.1% above the current rates. ULLICO differentiated its proposal by offering the lowest renewal rate cap of 40%, expanding their family combined deductible to include both Spouse and Children of the participant as one claimant, as well as offering a dividend on a portion of any surplus after the second year of the contract. The insurance financial strength of Union Labor Life Insurance Company has an A.M. Best rating of A-.

Although Vista provided a more competitive premium rate than ULLICO, Vista could not match the Family Combined Deductible that is included in the current contract. The current

contract has a combined family deductible that treats all children of a participant as one claimant for deductible purposes, whereas Vista could not accommodate this provision. Therefore, it was deemed that Vista did not meet the provisions of the existing contract and should not be considered.

Segal recommends, and staff concurs with placing the stop loss coverage with ULLICO.

ULLICO has not only offered the most competitive proposal regarding cost and exposure, but has also proposed a more favorable insured agreement for the Authority.

Therefore, authorization is requested to award a contract for insured Stop Loss coverage to Union Labor Life Insurance Company of Silver Spring, Maryland with an Individual Specific Stop Loss threshold of \$350,000 including the aggregating specific deductible of \$250,000, for the policy period of January 1, 2020 through December 31, 2020, for premium amounts not to exceed \$1,571,000, which precise premium shall be subject to fluctuation based on enrollment, as the premium is computed on a per participant per month basis. It is further recommended that the Executive Director be authorized to take any actions and execute any documents that are necessary to effectuate the purpose of the above authorizations. Authorization is further requested to authorize the Executive Director to negotiate with Union Labor Life Insurance Company for one subsequent one-year renewal not to exceed a 40% maximum increase in the annual fee. In the event that the Executive Director cannot negotiate renewal of this coverage with Union Labor Life Insurance Company, the Authority will, once again, engage all available resources to evaluate market conditions, solicit competitive rates and seek authorization from the Board for any subsequent awards.

On motion by Treasurer DuPont and seconded by Commissioner Pocino the Board unanimously approved item number 318-12-2019; and authorized or ratified, as presented, the recommendations contained therein; and received and filed the memoranda.

Deputy Executive Director James Carone requested approval of item number 319-12-2019. Moved is the item as follows:

In a memorandum dated December 17, 2019, <u>Authorization to Enter into Amendment</u>

No. 1 to Operator Agreement Between HMS Host Tollroads, Inc. and New Jersey Turnpike

<u>Authority</u>, was approved.

On September 17, 2017, the New Jersey Turnpike Authority ("NJTA" or the "Authority") and HMS Host Tollroads, Inc. ("HMS Host"), successor to Host Marriott Corporation, entered into a renewed and restated agreement (the "2017 Agreement") for operation of restaurants and facilities at service areas on the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway. Since that time, it has been determined that certain amendments to the 2017 Agreement are necessary and desirable. Over the course of several months, NJTA administration have negotiated, and recommend an amendment to the 2017 Agreement with HMS Host, incorporating the following terms and conditions:

- 1- Cost Sharing of Temporary Facilities The amendment will allow the NJTA and HMS Host to enter into a cost sharing arrangement for temporary facilities at the Vince Lombardi Service Area. These temporary facilities will allow the Service Area to remain open as an additional convenience to our patrons during renovations. The amendment will provide for the NJTA and HMS Host to share costs equally.
- 2- **Price Changes** Currently, any price changes proposed by HMS Host for products or services offered at a Service Area must include a survey of similar concepts in proximity to the affected Service Area. The amendment will include Corporate Pricing as another alternative to any proposed price change. In addition, the amendment will permit HMS Host to implement a requested price change within 60-days after all documentation concerning the required survey is submitted to the NJTA for approval.
- 3- Fee and Payment The Fee and Payment Section will be amended to adjust the Minimum Annual Guarantee to become the higher of: (i) a fixed amount or (ii) 88% of the previous year's paid rent. The Percentage of Gross Sales remains the same as agreed to in the 2017 Agreement. This change would afford the NJTA the potential for a higher Minimum Annual Guarantee in conjunction with increases in annual sales. The amendment will also include a reopener clause that will allow the NJTA to reevaluate this Fee and Payment concept at a later date.
- 4- Capital Improvement Definition The Capital Improvement definition in the 2017 Agreement will be amended to include costs associated with architectural design fees, permitting, and furniture and fixtures.
- 5- Curb Line Scope of Work The amendment will expand the definition of curb line scope of work in the 2017 Agreement to include design, construction and payment provisions. It will also incorporate the terms of the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the parties regarding reimbursement for work performed by HMS Host that is otherwise the responsibility of the NJTA, which MOU was previously approved by the Commissioners.
- 6- Catch Basin Maintenance The amendment will memorialize HMS Host's responsibility for the cleanout, maintenance, repair, and replacement of all stormwater catch basins, underground chambers, vaults and grease traps located in or at the Service Areas, as

defined in the 2017 Agreement, including but not limited to, the catch basins located at the Thomas Edison Service Area.

7- Cafeteria Operation – The amendment will provide for HMS Host to continue operating the NJTA headquarters cafeteria pending a procurement for a new operator. HMS Host began providing this service to the NJTA on an emergent basis when the prior cafeteria operator declared bankruptcy. The amendment will formally recognize this arrangement and establish the level of service / operation that HMS Host has and will continue to provide as the NJTA's cafeteria operator.

NJTA administration recommends that the foregoing terms and conditions be incorporated into a First Amendment to the 2017 Agreement. Thus, it is respectfully requested that the Executive Director be delegated authorization to enter into and execute a First Amendment to the 2017 Agreement incorporating the foregoing terms and conditions, in a form acceptable to the Director of Law and/or General Counsel. The First Amendment to the 2017 Agreement will become effective upon execution by the parties. It is further recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any other documents and take any other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization.

On motion by Treasurer DuPont and seconded by Commissioner Diaz the Board unanimously approved item number 319-12-2019; and authorized or ratified, as presented, the recommendations contained therein; and received and filed the memoranda.
