Acting Director of Law, Ann C. Monica, requested approval of item numbers 063-03-2021 and 064-03-2021. Moved are the items as follows:

<u>063-03-2021</u>

In a memorandum dated March 15, 2021, <u>Authorization to Renew the Public Officials</u> <u>and Employment Practices Liability Insurance for one (1) Additional Year, (April 15, 2021 to</u> <u>April 15, 2022), R-163666, Budget Code: 10-822-441010, Amount: not to exceed</u> <u>\$477,881.00</u>, was approved.

The Authority maintains Public Officials and Employment Practices Liability insurance with National Union Fire Insurance Company of Pittsburgh, PA ("AIG") with a limit of \$20 million,

along with an excess policy with Ironshore Indemnity Inc. ("Ironshore") that provides an additional \$10 million aggregate and limit, both of which were extended for one month via Agenda item 030-02-2021 and will now expire on April 15, 2021.

Willis was tasked with marketing the coverage to at least three (3) underwriters, securing renewal quotations on the same terms and conditions as the current policies, and providing the Authority with a recommendation for renewal, taking price and quality of coverage into account. After years of slight increases, averaging approximately 2.7% annually over the last six (6) years, this year's premium has increased significantly, due to a general hard market and the growing trend of underwriters to decrease the limits they are willing to provide, without a commensurate decrease in premium. In this very difficult market, Willis was able to provide quotations for the full \$30 million limits as follows:

The premium amounts above, along with the mandatory New Jersey Property Liability Insurance Guaranty Association ("PLIGA") surcharge not to exceed \$ 2,851.00, results in a total premium amount of \$477,881, an increase of 32.6% from the current year's premium. It is therefore requested that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to renew the insurance policies and coverages as outlined above. It is further requested that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to take all such actions and to execute all such documents, after review by and with the recommendation of the Law Department, to effectuate the authority set forth above.

<u>064-03-2021</u>

In a memorandum dated March 3, 2021, <u>Authorization to Settle Formal Workers'</u> <u>Compensation Matter – Michael Musto v. New Jersey Turnpike Authority, Budget</u> <u>Code: 10-870-405070, Amount: \$100,000.00 via Section 20</u>, was approved.

Petitioner Michael Musto is a Parkway Division Mechanic 1, hired September 2010. This recommended settlement will resolve a formal Claim Petition filed in 2019.

The petitioner is represented by Law Offices of Nelson, Fromer, Crocco & Jordan, located in Tinton Falls, NJ. The Authority is defended by Special Counsel Chasan Lamparello Mallon & Cappuzzo, PC, located in Secaucus, NJ. The matter is venued in the district office of Toms River Workers' Compensation Court before the Honorable Judge R. Cherkos.

The total settlement award is \$100,000.00 via section 20.

The Law Department has reviewed this matter and agrees with the recommendation of the Special Counsel, the Authority's third-party workers' compensation administrator and the Authority's Senior Benefits Manager. Authorization is, therefore, requested to allow Special Counsel to settle this matter for the sum of \$100,000.00

In a document dated February 24, 2021, Recommendation to Award Contract No. P200.566, Garden State Parkway, Daidone Electric, Inc., Lighting Improvements at Interchange 102 & Interchange 105, R-163033, Budget Code: 5000042003, Amount: \$2,268,000.00, was approved.

This contract will provide for the removal of Utility owned lighting and installing new Authority owned lighting at Interchanges 102 and 105, Garden State Parkway, Tinton Falls, New Jersey. The completion date for this contract is May 2022.

Three bid proposals were received on February 23, 2021 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal, in the amount of \$2,268,000.00, may be compared to the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$2,198,612.00. The low bidder, Daidone Electric, Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. P200.566 be awarded to the low bidder, Daidone Electric, Inc. of Newark, New Jersey in the amount of \$2,268,000.00. This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

In a document dated March 2, 2021, <u>Recommendation to Award Contract No.</u> <u>T200.573, New Jersey Turnpike, Crisdel Group, Inc., Roadway Resurfacing, Milepost 83 to</u> <u>122, Section 19 and 20 (2021), R-162978, Budget Code: 0390036002, Funding Allocation:</u> <u>\$9,000,000.00 FY 2021, \$1,062,000.00 FY 2022, Amount: \$10,062,000.00</u>, was approved.

This contract will provide for the removal and resurfacing of asphalt concrete surface course pavement along Northbound and Southbound Turnpike Easterly Alignment roadways (Milepost E108.0 to E111.0 and E113.0 to E117.0) which includes shoulders, select interchange ramps, toll plazas, maintenance U-turns, Z-turns, and other incidental work at various locations. Work is between Milepost 83 and 122 in Middlesex, Union, Essex, Hudson and Bergen Counties. All work is expected to be substantially complete in 2021.

Four bid proposals were received on February 25, 2021 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal in the amount of \$10,062,000.00 may be compared to the second low bidder in the amount of \$11,057,719.50. The low bid is significantly lower than the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$11,884,250.00 likely due to the Contractor's continued presence on the Turnpike roadway and current workload. The low bidder, Crisdel Group, Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. T200.573 be awarded to the low bidder, Crisdel Group, Inc. of South Plainfield, New Jersey in the amount of \$10,062,000.00 which is allocated as follows: \$9,000,000.00 for FY 2021 and \$1,062,000.00 for FY 2022. This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

This contract consists of removing Utility owned lighting and installing new Authority owned lighting at Interchange 120, Garden State Parkway, Old Bridge, New Jersey. The completion date for this contract is May 2022.

Four bid proposals were received on February 25, 2021 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal in the amount of \$2,035,939.50 may be compared to the second low bidder in the amount of \$2,222,000.00. The low bid was significantly lower than the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$2,444,603.85. HBC Company, Inc. is very familiar with the Authority's processes and procedures, has knowledge of equipment needed to perform the work, and has gained valuable experience regarding installation methods due to their experience on Authority projects. The low bidder, HBC Company, Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. P200.610 be awarded to the low bidder, HBC Company, Inc. of Lodi, New Jersey in the amount of \$2,035,939.50. This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

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ORDER FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

In a document dated February 25, 2021, <u>Recommendation to Issue Order for</u> <u>Professional Services No. T3835, New Jersey Turnpike, ATANE Engineers, Architects and</u> <u>Land Surveyors, P.C., Engineering Services for the New Jersey Turnpike Authority Major</u> <u>Bridge Inspection Program, Major Bridge Group 3 (2021 – 2024), R-162979, Budget Code:</u> <u>010-850-445900, Funding Allocation: \$ 350,000.00 FY 2021, \$ 500,000.00 FY 2022, \$</u> <u>400,000.00 FY 2023, \$500,000.00 FY 2024, \$100,000.00 FY 2025, Amount: \$ 1,850,000.00</u>, was approved.

This Order for Professional Services will provide engineering services for biennial inspection of 17 major bridges on the New Jersey Turnpike, for a 4-year term from 2021 through

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2024. These 17 bridges comprising new Major Group 3 were recently reclassified from routine to major status. They are located in the northern region of the New Jersey Turnpike, with most located on the Newark Bay-Hudson County Extension (NB-HCE) and in the Northern and Southern Mixing Bowls. This OPS includes condition inspection and evaluation; report preparation; FHWA National Bridge Element (NBE) Level Inspection updates; FHWA Structure Inventory and Appraisal (SI&A) Form updates; load rating updates; and other related work as required to comply with the National Bridge Inspection Standards (NBIS). The 4-year term of this OPS will cover two consecutive biennial inspection cycles for each major bridge.

This assignment is classified as a "Simple Project" based on the scope of work is clearly defined and not likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost is less than \$2,000,000.00. The solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and thirty-four (34) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Code: D280C – Bridges, NBIS Program, Complex. Seven (7) firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of January 13, 2021.

Subsequent to the scoring of EOIs by the Review Committee, Fee Proposals were requested from the top three technically ranked firms. The firms in the order of ranking are: 1) ATANE Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors, P.C., 2) Arora and Associates, P.C. and 3) WSP USA, Inc. The fee submitted by ATANE Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors, P.C. has been reviewed, negotiated and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. T3835 be issued to the firm of ATANE Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors, P.C. of Iselin, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$1,850,000.00 which is allocated as follows: \$350,000.00 for FY 2021; \$500,000.00 for FY 2022; \$400,000.00 for FY 2023; \$500,000.00 for FY 2024; and \$100,000.00 for FY 2025. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.77 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. The award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. These professional services were procured, and the recommended firm was selected, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seq., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

<u>069-03-2021</u>

In a document dated March 4, 2021, <u>Recommendation to Issue Order for Professional</u> <u>Services No. T3839, New Jersey Turnpike, AECOM, Program Manager and Environmental</u>

Services for New Jersey Turnpike Interchange 1 to 4 Widening Program, R-162977, Budget Code: 5000056003, Amount: \$47,875,000.00, was approved.

This Order for Professional Services will provide for program management, preparation of preliminary design documents and comprehensive environmental services for the one lane widening in each direction of the existing four-lane New Jersey Turnpike from the southern terminus of Interchange 1 (Route 49) to just north of Interchange 4, connecting to the existing six-lane roadway. Additionally, geometric and operational needs for all interchanges, ramps, toll plazas and service areas within the Program limits will be considered. The proposed Turnpike mainline widening is approximately 36.5 miles through 16 municipalities, in four (4) counties within southern New Jersey. Environmental studies and environmental permit applications will be prepared and submitted to obtain required agency approvals.

This assignment is classified as a "Complex Project" since the scope of work is not clearly defined and likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost exceeds \$2,000,000.00. Due to the unique scope of work there are no specific prequalification codes for this assignment. Accordingly, a Request for Letters of Qualification (LOQ) was posted on the Authority's website on November 24, 2020.

By the closing date of December 10, 2020, LOQs were received from four firms. Upon review of the LOQs, all four firms, AECOM, HNTB Corporation, Atkins North America, Inc. and Urban Engineers, Inc., met the qualifications stipulated and were requested to submit Technical and Fee Proposals. The Review Committee reviewed and evaluated each firm's Technical Proposal and then an Oral Presentation was held virtually with each firm due to the COVID-19 pandemic situation. Subsequent to these activities the final scoring resulted in AECOM being the highest technically ranked firm. The fee submitted by AECOM has been reviewed, negotiated and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. T3839 be issued to the firm of AECOM of Piscataway, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$47,875,000.00. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.55 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. The award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. These professional services were procured, and the recommended firm was selected, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seq., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

In a document dated March 5, 2021, <u>Authorization to Purchase Riparian Mitigation</u> <u>Credits – Agreement No. 174-21, Garden State Parkway, Evergreen Environmental, LLC,</u> <u>Purchase Riparian Mitigation Credits for Contract No. P200.546, Culvert Repairs Milepost</u> <u>115 to 116, R-163401, Budget Code: 5000010003, Amount: \$150,000.00</u>, was approved.

This Agreement will provide for the purchase of riparian mitigation credits to mitigate for 0.164 acres of riparian zone impacted by improvements proposed as part Construction Contract No. P200.546. The Flood Hazard Area Permit issued for the project requires compensation in the form of creation, enhancement, restoration, preservation, riparian credit purchase from an approved mitigation bank, or combination thereof. The purchase of riparian credits was found to be the most cost-effective method of riparian zone mitigation for this project. The Marsh Bog Brook I or II Mitigation Bank owned and operated by Evergreen Environmental, LLC was verified by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to be the only bank within the project's watershed that offers riparian credits.

It is, therefore, recommended that the Executive Director be authorized to execute Agreement No. 174-21 with Evergreen Environmental, LLC to purchase riparian mitigation credits at a cost not to exceed \$150,000.00, pursuant to the terms outlined above. It is further recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any such other documents and take any such other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization.

This Agreement was procured under the sole source procurement authorization of N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2(d)1, promulgated under N.J.S.A. 27:23-1 et seq., the Authority's enabling legislation. A resolution, as required by N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2(d)1, is attached hereto.

WHEREAS, Construction Contract No. P200.546 – Culvert Repairs Milepost 115 to 116 ("Project") will impact vegetated riparian zone in Watershed Management Area 12 and;

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection Flood Hazard Area Individual Permit (NJDEP Permit #1318-20-0008.1 LUP200001) issued for the Improvements will require construction of a mitigation site, site preservation, or the purchase of mitigation credits from a riparian zone mitigation bank within the local watershed to mitigate impacts to the vegetated riparian zone by the Project and;

In a document dated March 19, 2021, <u>Financial Advisory Services, NW Financial</u> <u>Services, LLP, RM-159267 (Finance), Budget Code: Various, \$ 762,000.00 Base Services</u> (3-Year Contract), \$ 900,000.00 Bond Issue Services, Investment Bidding, and Swap <u>Transaction Services, Amount: \$1,662,000.00</u>, was approved.

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority ("Authority") issued a Request for Proposal ("RFP") to secure the services of a firm ("Financial Advisor") to provide financial advisory services. Specifically, the Financial Advisor will provide general financial advisory services ("Services") in connection with the Authority's outstanding bonds, investments and swaps ("Base Services"). In addition, the Financial Advisor will provide advice on specific bond issuance(s) that may occur during the term of the contract, as well as advice on investment agreements and swap agreements ("Transaction Services"). The Financial Advisor is expected to review, analyze, and recommend appropriate strategies that meet the Authority's financial goals, budgetary objectives and debt management standards. The term of the contract is for a period of three (3) years with an option to extend the contract under the same terms and conditions, for two (2) additional one-year terms at the discretion of the Authority and concurrence of the Financial Advisor. On February 17, 2021, the Authority received proposals from the following six (6) firms:

The Executive Director established an evaluation committee (the "Committee") comprised of the Authority's Deputy Executive Director; Chief Financial Officer and Director of Internal Audit as voting members. The Director of Procurement and Materials Management, and Judy Verrone, Partner of DeCotiis, FitzPatrick, Cole & Giblin, LLP served as non-voting members. The Committee reviewed the proposals and invited all four (4) firms for oral presentations. The presentations were conducted on March 15th and March 16th and each of the firms was invited to submit a best and final offer ("BAFO").

The Committee documented their findings in an Evaluation Report. The Committee recommends NW Financial Group, LLC ("NW") be awarded the contract for Financial Advisory Services as outlined in the RFP. The Committee found NW's response to be fully responsive to the scope of services and felt they conducted a very thorough oral presentation. NW's fees were also very competitive for all services.

NW has been in the financial advisory business for over 25 years, serving numerous governmental and transportation agencies. NW has served as the Authority's financial advisor in the past for over 10 years and is also a NJ Certified Small business. NW proposed a strong project team with 200 years combined experience. NW submitted their proposal with Blue Rose Securities, a firm that specializes is swaps, derivatives and investment products. The Committee felt that NW exhibited a strong understanding of the current municipal markets and the short and long- term financial challenges facing the Authority.

The RFP also required the Financial Advisor to be qualified as: (1) an independent registered municipal advisor ("IRMA") registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission and Municipal Securities Rulemaking Board; and (2) a qualified independent representative ("QIR") pursuant to Title VI Section 731 of the Dodd-Frank Wall Street reform, and Consumer Protection Act.

This professional services procurement was conducted in accordance with *N.J.S.A.* 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, *N.J.A.C.* 19:9-2.1(b) promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006). The award is also contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 and Executive Order No. 117 (Corzine 2006), and having no objection to same.

Accordingly, authorization is requested to issue a three-year professional services contract to NW Financial Group, LLC as the Financial Advisor and designated IRMA and QIR. The total authorized amount of \$762,000 (\$254,000/year) will include the Base Services as outlined in the RFP, including the fee for the Hedgestar Platform for swap valuations and one new money bond issuance per year, at a fixed fee payable monthly.
