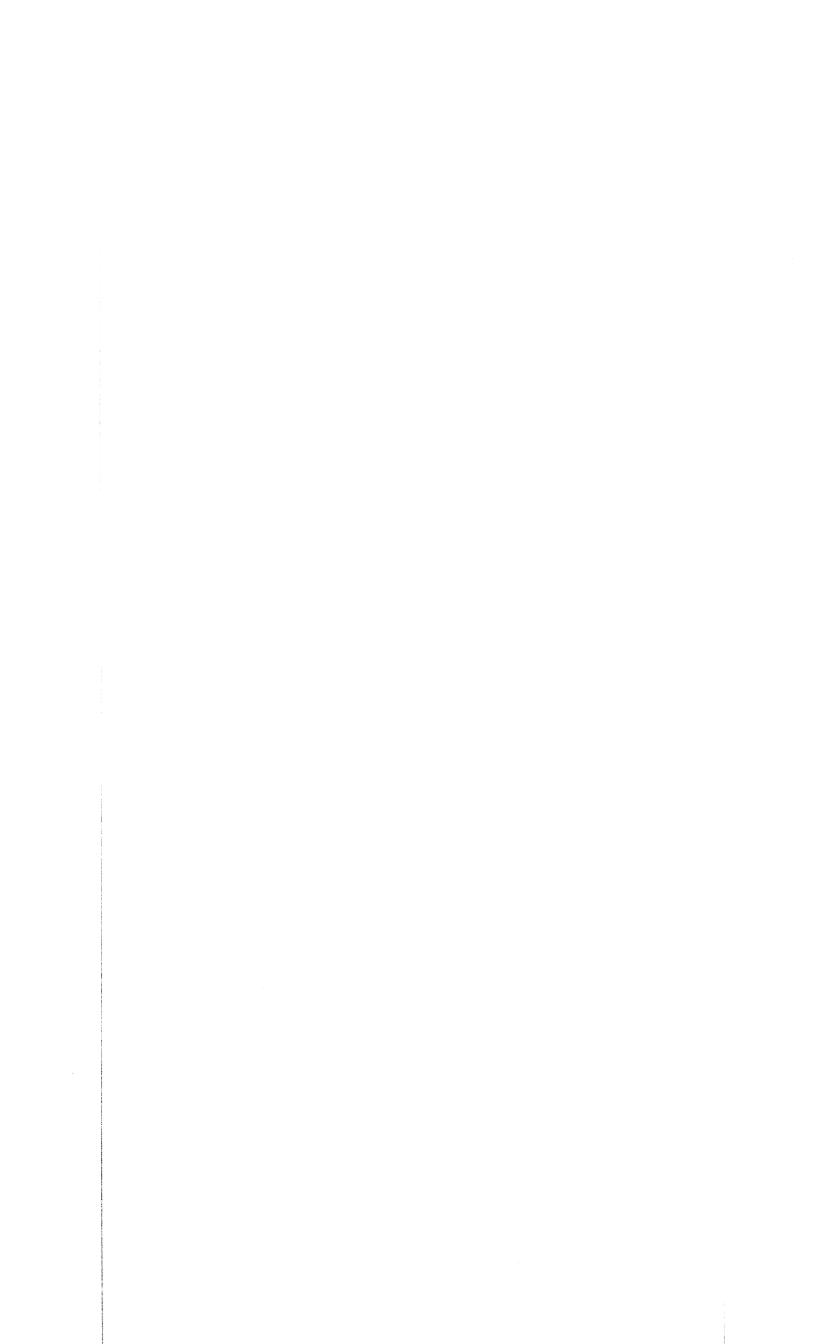

Acting Director of Law, Ann C. Monica, requested approval of item numbers 127-06-2021

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through 130-06-2021. Moved are the items as follows:

127-06-2021

In a memorandum dated June 4, 2021, <u>Authorization to enter into an Agreement with</u>

the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) to relocate fiber conduits located

on State Route 42/Ardmore Avenue to Camden County Line, Washington

Township, Gloucester County, was approved.

The NJDOT is currently in the design stages of a Federally funded construction project for the rehabilitation and replacement of State Route 42/Ardmore Avenue to the Camden County line, which will require the coordination and relocation of Authority owned fiber conduits located on NJDOT property.

In connection with this project, the NJDOT has requested the Authority to execute a Utility Engineering and Construction Agreement, and a Utility Engineering and Construction Agreement Amendment to set forth the rights and responsibilities of the parties. As design progresses, the Authority will also be required to execute a Utility Agreement Modification Construction Authorization, which will memorialize the estimates, schedules, plans and other construction details, all of which are required by the FHWA in order for the NJDOT and the Authority to be reimbursed for their work on this project. It is proposed that various contractors, including Penta, will perform the relocation work.

Based on the foregoing, it is requested that the Authority's Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to negotiate and enter into agreements substantially as set forth above. It is further recommended that the Executive Director be authorized to take any other actions necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization upon review and approval of such actions by the Law Department.

In a memorandum dated June 4, 2021, <u>Authorization to enter into a Permanent Utility</u>

<u>Easement and Temporary Construction Easement Agreement with PSEG Power LLC to realign an existing water main and construct a new gas main in connection with the improvements recently constructed at the Vince Lombardi Service Area Ridgefield

<u>Township, Bergen County, Permanent Utility Easement - Parcel UE636A, +/- 0.654 acres,</u>

<u>Temporary Construction Easement - Parcel C636A, +/- 0.143 acres, R-165343, Budget</u>

<u>Code: 00-850-156555, Amount not to exceed \$150,000, was approved.</u></u>

The Vince Lombardi Service Area on the New Jersey Turnpike (Milepost 116.0) is one of the most utilized Service Areas owned by the Authority. During the recent rebuild of this Service Area as part of the Service Area Improvement Program, the condition of the existing utility services to this Service Area was evaluated. It was decided to replace a portion of the existing

water main due to maintenance issues and to modernize and upgrade essential gas service from propane gas service to a new natural gas service. Construction of these improvements would require two easements the parameters of which are still currently being finalized: a permanent easement for utilities, and a temporary construction easement, together valued at no greater than \$150,000. The property was appraised by a New Jersey licensed appraiser and fair market value was determined. These easements would allow the Authority to perform its construction activities and install and maintain a realigned water main as well as allow Public Service Electric and Gas to install and maintain a new natural gas main on behalf of the Authority to service the Service Area.

Based on the foregoing, it is requested that the Authority's Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to enter into easement agreements substantially as set forth above. It is further recommended that the Executive Director be authorized to take any other actions necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization upon review and approval of such actions by the Law Department.

In a memorandum dated May 25, 2021, <u>Authorization to Settle Formal Workers'</u>

<u>Compensation Matter – Thomas Ventriglia v. New Jersey Turnpike Authority, Budget</u>

<u>Code: 10-870-405070, Amount: \$108,225.00 via Section 20</u>, was approved.

Petitioner Thomas Ventriglia is a Parkway Division Technology Device Technician, hired December 1996. This recommended settlement will resolve a formal Claim Petition filed in 2019.

The petitioner is represented by Law Offices of Krueger & Krueger, located in Linden, NJ. The Authority is defended by Special Counsel Caitlin Harney of GluckWalrath LLP located in Freehold, NJ. The matter is venued in the district office of Lebanon Workers' Compensation Court before the Honorable Judge G. Kaplan.

The total settlement award is \$108,225.00

The Law Department has reviewed this matter and agrees with the recommendation of the Special Counsel, the Authority's third-party workers' compensation administrator and the Authority's Senior Benefits Manager. Authorization is, therefore, requested to allow Special Counsel to settle this matter for the sum of \$108,225.00. This settlement will be payable under Account No. 10-870-405070.

<u>Compensation Matter – Edward Merritt v. New Jersey Turnpike Authority, Budget</u>

Code: 10-870-405070, Amount: \$194,070.00 via Section 20, was approved.

Petitioner Edward Merritt is a Parkway Division Technology Device Technician, hired June 1999. This recommended settlement will resolve a formal Claim Petition filed in 2019.

The petitioner is represented by Law Offices of Petro Cohen Matarazzo, located in Hamilton Township, NJ. The Authority is defended by Special Counsel Caitlin Harney of GluckWalrath LLP located in Freehold, NJ. The matter is venued in the district office of Atlantic City's Workers' Compensation Court before the Honorable Judge A. Kernan. The total settlement award is \$194,070.00.

The Law Department has reviewed this matter and agrees with the recommendation of the Special Counsel, the Authority's third-party workers' compensation administrator and the Authority's Senior Benefits Manager. Authorization is, therefore, requested to allow Special Counsel to settle this matter for the sum of \$194,070.00. This settlement will be payable under Account No. 10-870-405070.

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ORDER FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES (OPS)

<u>131-06-2021</u>

In a document dated May 28, 2021, Recommendation to Issue Order for Professional Services No. A3872, New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway, Van Cleef Engineering Associates, LLC, Design Services for Contract No. A100.614, Curve Advisory Sign Installation, New Jersey Turnpike Milepost 90.9 to 119.1 and Milepost N7.7 to N7.9, and Garden State Parkway Milepost 130.0 to 160.2, R-164835, Budget Code: 5000052000, Amount: \$1,600,000.00, was approved.

This Order for Professional Services (OPS) will provide final design services for the installation of site-specific curve advisory signs on forty-four (44) ramp bridges and associated approaches of the New Jersey Turnpike Milepost 90.9 to 119.1 and Milepost N7.7 to N7.9, and the Garden State Parkway from Milepost 130.0 to 160.2. The work includes the evaluation of existing conditions, location recommendations for curve advisory sign installation, development of bridge mounted sign structural details and other related work. One construction contract will be prepared through this OPS to provide for the installation of the advisory signs for both roadways.

This assignment is classified as a "Simple Project" based on the scope of work being clearly defined and not likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost not exceeding \$2,000,000.00. The solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and forty-two (42) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Codes: A091 Bridges: Widenings and Modifications, and A250: Fully Controlled Access Highways. Six firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of April 30, 2021.

Subsequent to the scoring of EOIs by the Review Committee, Fee Proposals were requested from the top three technically ranked firms. The firms in the order of ranking are: 1) Van Cleef Engineering Associates, LLC; 2) Stantec Consulting Services, Inc.; and 3) Gannett Fleming, Inc. The fee submitted by Van Cleef Engineering Associates, LLC has been reviewed, negotiated and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. A3872 be issued to the firm of Van Cleef Engineering Associates, LLC of Freehold, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$1,600,000.00. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.58 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. The award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. These professional services were procured, and the recommended firm was selected, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seq., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

In a document dated June 3, 2021, Removal and Disposal of Liquid Hazardous & Non-Hazardous Waste Material (Re-Bid), ACV Environmental Services, Inc., RM-164115 (Engineering), Budget Code: Various, Amount: \$ 380,150.00, was approved.

Authorization is requested to award a contract for the removal and disposal of liquid hazardous and non-hazardous waste materials. Bidders were required to bid a price per gallon for two classifications of liquid waste, which included ground water extraction of approximately 85,000 gallons each of gasoline/water mixtures (waste flammable liquid), as well as oil/diesel and water mixtures (Class D recyclable material). Bidders were also required to bid an hourly rate for labor charges for both regular and emergency services. The bid was fully advertised and the twelve (12) vendors listed in the Authority's database for this service were notified of the procurement. Bids were procured, and authorization is being sought to award this contract in accordance with *N.J.S.A.* 27:23-1 *et seq.*, the Authority's enabling legislation, *N.J.A.C.* 19:9-2.2, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006). This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 and Executive Order No. 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same.

Accordingly, authorization is requested to award a contract to ACV Environmental Services, Inc. for the removal of liquid waste materials for a total amount not to exceed \$380,150.00, subject to funding availability at the time of ordering. Division systems supports the software, which is compatible with current body cameras in use and all video will be transferred to the Division via current servers installed at each State Police Station on the Authority's roadway. These in-car camera systems are available from NJ State Contract No. 17-FLEET-00738 expiring 05/14/2023.

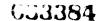
<u>Consent to Assignment of Operating Agreement for New Jersey Turnpike and Garden</u>

<u>State Parkway Restaurants, and (ii) Enter into Agreement Assigning All Rights and Obligations of HMS Host Tollroads, Inc. under the Operating Agreement to Iris Buyer, LLC, was approved.</u>

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the "Authority") and Host Tollroads, Inc. ("Host") entered into (i) an Operating Agreement for New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway Restaurants, dated September 12, 2017 (the "Operating Agreement"), pursuant to which Host operates and manages Authority-owned Service Area Restaurants and (ii) a Memorandum of Agreement, dated April 16, 2020, subsequently amended (the "MOU"), addressing construction funding for certain Authority Service Areas (the Operating Agreement and MOU, collectively, are referred to herein as the "Agreement").

Host recently advised the Authority that it is contemplating a sale of its holdings, including the Agreement, to an entity known as Iris Buyer, LLC ("Iris"), which is scheduled to close on or about June 30, 2021 (the "Contemplated Transaction"). Iris is presently comprised of a consortium of Applegreen Ltd. and Blackstone Infrastructure Partners. Pursuant to the Agreement, Host is required to obtain the Authority's consent to the Contemplated Transaction before consummating same (the "Consent"). The Authority has discussed the Contemplated Transaction with Host and has concluded that a Consent would be within the Authority's interest, subject to the following contingencies:

1. Host shall pay to the Authority a Transfer Fee in the amount of \$500,000 as required pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Agreement. The Transfer Fee shall be paid prior to the closing on the Contemplated Transaction. In the event that the Contemplated Transaction does not close, the Transfer Fee shall be retained by the Authority and applied first to reimburse the Authority for its actual expenses related to the negotiation and preparation of the



Consent and Assignment, and the remainder shall be applied toward satisfaction of any outstanding financial obligations then due from Host under the Agreement.

- 2. The Authority shall be paid at closing all amounts due and owing to the Authority, pursuant to the Agreement, through the date of the closing. A full accounting of all amounts then due and owing to the Authority will be included as an exhibit to the Consent. Iris will provide the Authority with a new parent guaranty, guarantying Iris's performance under the Agreement.
- 3. Iris and the Authority shall enter into an Assignment and Amendment Agreement that will assign the Agreement to Iris and amend the Agreement to reflect the inclusion of (a) a new parent guaranty; (b) an updated and modified construction schedule to address adjustment to interim construction completion dates for certain Service Areas, except that the final construction completion dates shall not change; and (c) a confirmation that Iris is amenable to negotiating with the Authority to include Vauxhall and Brookdale South as part of the Service Areas to be operated by Iris pursuant to the Agreement.
- 4. Iris will commit to working cooperatively with the Authority's Service Area Gasoline Operator, Sunoco Retail, LLC., and maintain an amicable working relationship among the Authority, Iris and Sunoco.
- 5. HMSHost Corporation, the current parent guarantor under the Agreement, shall provide the Authority with written confirmation of its commitment to guaranty Host's performance under the Agreement from now through closing of the Contemplated Transaction and, in the event that the closing does not occur, then for as long as the Agreement with Host continues.
- 6. The Consent will be delivered to Host, in escrow, pending satisfaction of all the above conditions at closing of the Contemplated Transaction.

In view of the foregoing, it is recommended that authorization be delegated to the Executive Director to provide written Consent, subject to the contingencies set forth above, to HMS Host Tollroads, Inc. to assign the Agreement to Iris Buyer, LLC, a consortium of Applegreen Ltd. and Blackstone Infrastructure Partners, and to execute an Assignment and Amendment Agreement, assigning all rights and liabilities of Host to Iris, and amending the Agreement as assigned accordingly. Additionally, it is recommended that authorization be provided to the Executive Director to undertake any such other actions and execute such other documents as may be necessary to implement the foregoing.

On motion by Treasurer DuPont and seconded by Vice Chair Diaz the Board unanimously approved item number 125-05-2021; and authorized or ratified, as presented, the recommendations contained therein; and received and filed the memoranda.

Deputy Executive Director Carone confirmed the Authority for all intents and purposes will be made whole.
