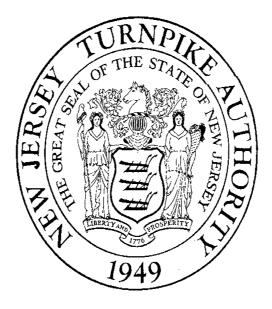

Authorization to enter into a Non-disclosure and Confidentiality Agreement between the Authority and the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey ("PANYNJ") in connection with the planning, design, and construction of the proposed Newark Bay-Hudson County Extension Program (the "Agreement")

The Authority is in the early stages of planning and design of the Newark Bay-Hudson County Extension Program which requires coordination with the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey ("PANYNJ") regarding the various engineering, design, right-of-way and construction matters that will be encountered during this multi-year Program. Prior to disclosing confidential information to the Authority, the PANYNJ requires the Authority to enter into a Non-disclosure and Confidentiality Agreement, which would protect both parties and be in their best interests. Authorization would allow the Authority to enter into this Agreement.

196-09-2021 <u>Authorization to Settle Litigation in the Matter of New Jersey Turnpike Authority v.</u> <u>JBH Paving and Excavating</u> <u>Amount to the Authority: \$1,200,000.00</u>

On November 2, 2017, a truck owned by JBH Paving and Excavating ("JBH"), travelling in an southerly direction on Middletown-Lincroft Road and trailering a Caterpillar Excavator caused damage to the underpass located at milepost 112.1 as it attempted to cross under the Garden State Parkway, causing significant damages to the overhead span and structural girders totaling \$1,426,054. The Authority commenced an action against JBH and their insurance company, and a tentative settlement was agreed to for \$1.2 million subject to Commissioner approval. Authorization is requested to settle this litigation matter at this amount.

This incident occurred as a result of the NJTA employee, who was operating a "crash truck"/impact attenuator, reversed his vehicle in the middle of an intersection into a stopped vehicle operated by plaintiff. There is no issue of liability. Outside counsel is seeking settlement authority in the amount of \$875,000. The Law Department concurs with outside counsel's recommendation.

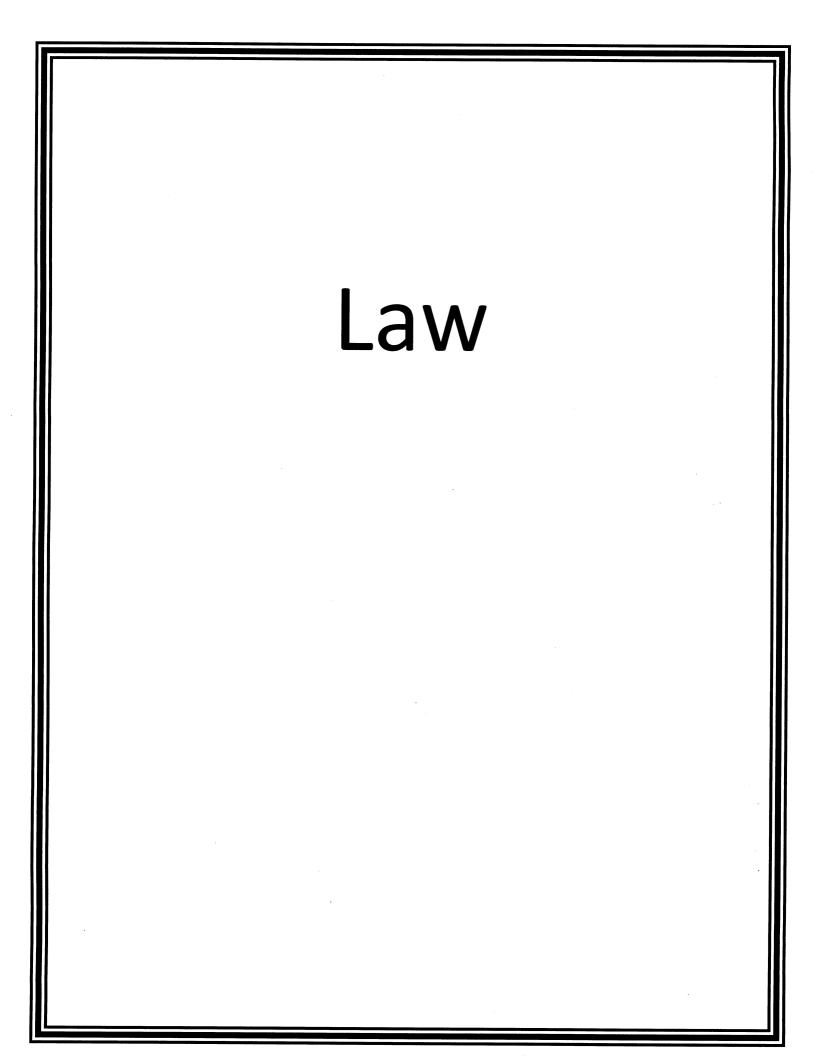

The Authority is in the early stages of planning and design of the Newark Bay Hudson County Extension Program (the "Program") which requires coordination with the Port Authority of New York and New Jersey ("PANYNJ") regarding the various engineering, design, right-ofway and construction matters that will be encountered during this multi-year Program. Prior to disclosing confidential information to the Authority and its consultants, the PANYNJ requires the Authority to enter into a Non-disclosure and Confidentiality Agreement, which would protect both parties and be in their best interests.

Authority and PANYNJ staff have agreed upon a form of Non-disclosure and Confidentiality Agreement to set forth the respective rights and responsibilities of the Authority and PANYNJ. The proposed Agreement will allow PANYNJ to share confidential and proprietary information with the Authority and its consultants in furtherance of the Program and will require the parties to treat such information, documents, plans, work product and recommendations as confidential and handle, protect and process such confidential information in accordance with agreed-upon procedures and safeguards.

Accordingly, it is requested that Board of Commissioners delegate to the Executive Director the authority to execute a non-disclosure and confidentiality agreement with PANYNJ substantially as described above. It is further recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any such other documents and take any such other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization.

RE: Authorization to Settle Litigation in the Matter of New Jersey Turnpike Authority v. JBH Paving & Excavating Amount to the Authority: \$1,200,000.00

On November 2, 2017, a truck owned by JBH Paving and Excavating ("JBH"), travelling in an southerly direction on Middletown-Lincroft Road and trailering a Caterpillar Excavator caused damage to the underpass located at milepost 112.1 as the truck attempted to cross under the Garden State Parkway, causing significant damages to the overhead span and structural girders totaling \$1,426,054. The Authority commenced an action against JBH and their insurance company, and a settlement conference was held, with Jason Orlando, with Murphy Orlando, the Authority's Special Counsel for Collections attending on behalf of the Authority, and counsel for the insurance carrier on behalf of the defendant, JBH. Negotiations ensued and a settlement amount of \$1,200,000, representing 84% of total costs, was tentatively agreed to, subject to Commissioner approval.

Considering the various issues related to bringing this matter to trial, including the anticipated legal costs and fees to bring this matter to trial and appeal; the risks of a jury trial; the potential imprecision of some soft costs associated with the repairs; and the time and expense of further negotiation, outside counsel recommends and the Law Department concurs, that settlement of this matter at this amount, would be in the best interests of the Authority.

Therefore, it is recommended that the Authority's Commissioners approve the settlement of this matter pursuant to the terms set forth above. It is also recommended that the Authority's Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any and all documents in furtherance of the authority.

This matter is a personal injury claim arising from an automobile accident that occurred on the Garden State Parkway at or near the "Parkway Circle" in Clark, New Jersey on January 26, 2016 involving a NJTA Maintenance employee and Plaintiff. This incident occurred as a result of the NJTA employee who, while operating a "crash truck"/impact attenuator, reversed his vehicle in the middle of an intersection and backed into a stopped vehicle operated by plaintiff. There is no issue of liability. As a result of the accident, Plaintiff suffered cervical spine injuries that resulted in the need for a two-level cervical fusion, lumbar spine injuries that resulted in the need for a one-level lumbar fusion, and right knee meniscal tears resulting in the need for arthroscopic surgery. Plaintiff's spouse also filed a *per quod claim* (or loss of consortium) for loss of services and companionship of the injured spouse.

A two-day mediation took place on June 8 and July 9, 2021, before Retired Judge Raymond Reddin, J.S.C., who served as mediator. Accordingly, Judge Reddin successfully consummated a settlement between the parties in the amount of \$875,000. This amount is inclusive of plaintiff's spouse *per quod claim*.

Prior to mediation, outside counsel reviewed this matter and other similar matters that were previously adjudicated and confirmed that this settlement value is reasonable given the facts of the case, Plaintiff's injuries, venue of the suit, and the predicted future cost of defense. The Law Department concurs with outside counsel's recommendation.

Therefore, it is recommended that the Authority's Commissioners approve the settlement of this matter pursuant to the terms set forth above. It is also recommended that the Authority's Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any and all documents in furtherance of same.

This Agreement will provide for the purchase of riparian mitigation credits to mitigate for up to 0.35 acres of riparian zone impacted by improvements proposed for Construction Contract No. P200.545, Culvert Repairs Milepost 112 to 113. The Flood Hazard Area Permits issued for the project require compensation in the form of creation, enhancement, restoration, preservation, riparian credit purchase from an approved mitigation bank, or combination thereof. The purchase of riparian credits was found to be the most cost-effective method of riparian zone mitigation for the project. The Marsh Bog Brook I or II Mitigation Bank owned and operated by Evergreen Environmental, LLC was verified by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection to be the only bank within the project's watershed that offers riparian credits. Procurement will be a sole source, pursuant to the Authority's regulations.

It is, therefore, recommended that the Executive Director be authorized to execute Agreement No. 177-21 with Evergreen Environmental, LLC to purchase riparian mitigation credits at a cost not to exceed \$250,000.00, pursuant to the terms outlined above. It is further recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any such other documents and take any such other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization.

This Agreement was procured under the sole source procurement authorization of N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2(d)1, promulgated under N.J.S.A. 27:23-1 et seq., the Authority's enabling legislation. A resolution, as required by N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2(d)1, is attached hereto.

RESOLUTION FOR SOLE SOURCE PROCUREMENT

RIPARIAN ZONE MITIGATION CREDITS

WHEREAS, Construction Contract No. P200.545 – Culvert Repairs Milepost 112 to 113 ("Project") will impact vegetated riparian zone in Watershed Management Area 12 and;

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection (NJDEP) Flood Hazard Area Individual Permits (NJDEP Permit No. 1331-20-0014.1LUP200001 and NJDEP No. 1331-21-0012.1LUP210001) issued for the Improvements will require construction of a mitigation site, site preservation, or the purchase of mitigation credits from a riparian zone mitigation bank within the local watershed to mitigate impacts to the vegetated riparian zone by the Project and;

WHEREAS, such aforementioned Permits will allow the Authority to purchase riparian zone mitigation credits from Marsh Bog Brook I or II Mitigation Bank;

WHEREAS, as of July 2, 2021, the Marsh Bog Brook I or II Mitigation Bank operated by Evergreen Environmental LLC located in Howell Township, Monmouth County is the only riparian zone mitigation bank with available riparian mitigation credits approved by the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection servicing Watershed Management Area 12; and

WHEREAS, the Engineering Department has determined that the purchasing of mitigation credits is found to be the most cost effective method of mitigation and will allow for the Project to proceed on schedule; and

WHEREAS, the Authority's regulations, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2(d)1 promulgated under N.J.S.A. 27:23-1, permit sole source procurement when only one source for the required product exists.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Authority's Commissioners hereby authorize and approve the award to Evergreen Environmental LLC for riparian zone mitigation credits in an amount not to exceed \$250,000, as a sole source exception to procurement by public advertisement permitted by N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2(d)1 promulgated under the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.S.A. 27:23-1.

Under this contract, Seashore Asphalt Corp. will provide front-end loaders for snow removal at one (1) location on the Garden State Parkway. Contracts rebid for this term consisted of 12 toll plaza locations on both Roadways that did not receive compliant bids in a previous solicitation. The contract will be for three (3) years with the option to extend for two (2) additional one-year terms. Bidders were required to bid all-inclusive "Regular" operating hourly rates for specific equipment required for each location. The maximum annual increase permitted, however, shall be five percent. Furthermore, authorization is requested to permit direct negotiations with available snow removal vendors for the eleven (11) outstanding contracts listed, in accordance with *N.J.S.A.* 27:23-6.1(a), and to delegate authority to the Executive Director to award the negotiated contracts which will be ratified at the proceeding Commission Meeting.

Figure 1 - New Jersey Turnpike Vehicle Mileage Traveled and Total Crash Rate by Month

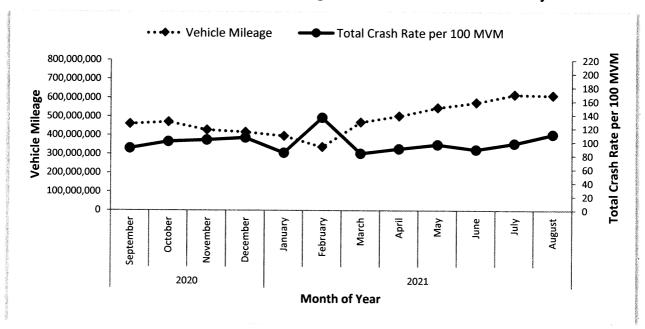
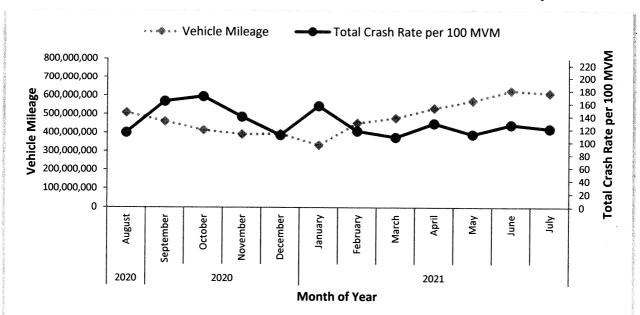


Figure 2 - Garden State Parkway Vehicle Mileage Traveled and Total Crash Rate by Month

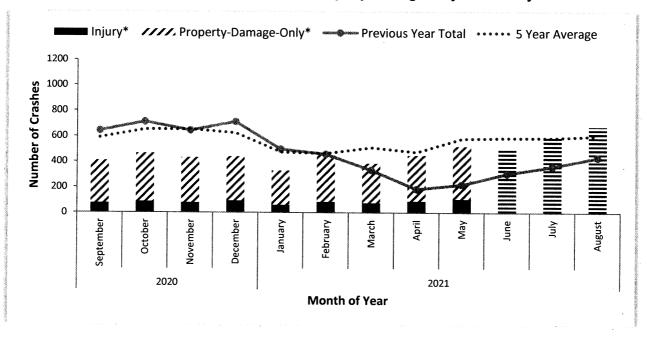
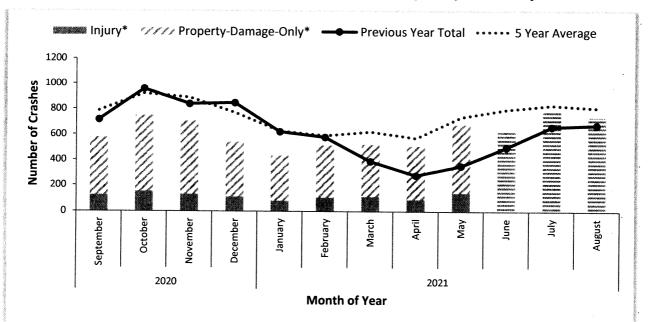


Figure 3 - New Jersey Turnpike Injury and Property-Damage-Only Crashes by Month

The following un-audited results are for the eight months ended August 31, 2021.¹ Based upon these results, revenues will be sufficient to satisfy the requirements of the Authority's Bond Resolution. For the twelve months ending December 31, 2021, the Authority is projected to have a debt service coverage ratio of 1.66 and a total requirements coverage ratio of 1.35.

The Authority's total revenue for the eight months ended August 31, 2021 was 1,474,557,000, which is 49,291,000, or 3.5%, above the 2021 year-todate budget. Toll revenue was 1,298,434,000, which is 24,892,000, or 2.0%, more than the 2021 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue is greater than budget due to increased travel and gradual return to office since New Jersey lifted the State of Emergency on June 4, 2021. The impacts of Winter Storm Orlena, which occurred from January 31^{st} – February 3^{rd} and Hurricane Henri, which occurred from August 22^{nd} – 23^{rd} , accounted for an approximate 13.5million revenue loss. February 2021 was the 7^{th} snowiest February since 1895. However, since February 2021, traffic has increased each month compared to the prior year. The increase in toll revenue is due to both the toll rate increase effective on September 13, 2020 and the significant increase in traffic since March 2021 as compared to the same months in 2020. Lower than expected interest income, which was 4,660,000, or 65.0%, under budget due to lower than budgeted short-term interest rates, was offset by higher E-ZPass fees, which were 29,324,000, or 53.0%, above the budget due to conservative budgeting in 2021.

For the eight months ended August 31, 2021, traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike increased 21.9% and toll revenue increased 63.2% compared to the same period in 2020. The increase in traffic is primarily due to the continued re-opening of the State in the first eight months of 2021, as compared to the same period in 2020, which was the peak of the pandemic. Toll revenue also increased due to the increase in traffic as well as the toll rate increase on September 13, 2020. Of note, traffic and revenue also increased due to more travel during the 2021 Easter and Memorial Day holiday weekends as compared to the same periods last year. Also, the month of August 2021 had one extra weekday compared to August 2020, which positively impacted results. The 2021 traffic and toll revenue budgets are based on the Authority's traffic engineering consultant's (CDM Smith) updated toll revenue forecast dated October 6, 2020. The updated forecast includes both the assumed continuing impacts of COVID-19 and the toll rate increase. Considering these two factors, CDM Smith projected a 19.4% increase in traffic and a 58.3% increase in revenue as compared to prior year. The actual results for the eight months ended August 31, 2021 were above CDM's projections, despite Winter Storm Orlena and Hurricane Henri which were not projected and combined for an approximate \$10 million revenue loss. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 12.6% but revenue is up 22.9% for the eight-month period. However, when comparing the month of August 2021 to August 2021, August 2021 compared to August 2021. The updated to 30.0% of the pre-pandemic level. Commercial traffic continues to remain strong and increased by about 9.0% in August 2021 compared to August 2021. Through August 2021, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the New Jersey Turnpike was 89.2%, a slight decrease from 89.5% for the same period in 2020.

For the eight months ended August 31, 2021, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway increased 15.7% and revenue increased 49.0% when compared to the same period in 2020. While the increase in traffic is primarily due to more travel since the easing of COVID-19 restrictions; toll revenue increased due to both the increased toll transactions and the toll rate increase on September 13, 2020. Increased travel during the Easter and Memorial Day holiday weekends as compared to last year also positively impacted results. The actual results for the eight months ended August 31, 2021 were slightly below the budget which was based on CDM's projection of a 18.1% increase in toll transactions and a 50.7% increase in toll revenue, as the phased re-openings and increased travel assumed in the projections took longer to occur and primarily impacted passenger car travel. In addition, the impacts of Winter Storm Orlena and Hurricane Henri were not projected and combined for an approximate \$3.5 million revenue loss. The projections 10.3% and revenue is up 13.9%. However, when comparing the month of August 2021 to August 2019, August 2021 total traffic recovered to about 92.0% of the pre-pandemic level. Through August 2021, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the Garden State Parkway was 87.9%, an increase from 87.6% for the same period in 2020.

Operating expenses for the eight months ended August 31, 2021 were approximately \$390,200,000, which was 95.1% of the year-to-date budget. Despite being higher than the same period last year, the Authority's operating expenses through August were slightly below budget primarily due to lower than budgeted salaries because of vacancies, along with lower than budgeted health benefit costs, credit card transaction processing fees, liability insurance and legal costs. These were partially offset by higher than budgeted state police costs, violation processing fees, and transponder costs. The Authority spent a total of \$43,425,000 for snow and severe weather costs in 2021, with \$24,898,000 spent from the operating expense budget and an additional \$18,527,000 spent from the General Reserve Fund. All snow and severe weather costs are charged to the operating expense budget except for declared state of emergency events, which are charged to the General Reserve Fund. The Authority has about \$13,204,000 remaining in its annual 2021 Operating Expense Budget for snow and severe weather costs.

Financial Summary For the Eight Months Ended August 31, 2021

Debt Service includes interest and principal payments on the Authority's outstanding bonds. For the eight months ended August 31, 2021, Debt Service totaled \$531,077,000, which was \$82,759,000 or 13.5% below budget and included \$384,554,000 in interest payments and \$146,523,000 in principal payments. Debt Service is below budget partly because the Series 2021B refunding in February 2021 resulted in interest and principal savings which were not budgeted. In addition, the budget assumed a \$500,000,000 new money bond issuance in November 2020 and another \$500,000,000 in January 2021, while only one has been required.

The General Reserve Fund includes all contractual payments subordinate to bondholders and expenditures for any other corporate purpose. The General Reserve Fund spending totaled \$176,418,000 for the eight months ended August 31, 2021. Spending consisted primarily of \$64,500,000 for the State Transportation Projects Funding Agreement, \$58,333,000 for the new State Transportation Agreement, and \$18,527,000 for Extraordinary Events (state of emergency weather events - Orlena). Also included are \$17,901,000 in net transfers to the revenue funded programs in the Construction Fund.

The Capital Budget, which is funded by revenue, consists of the Maintenance Reserve Fund, Special Project Reserve Fund, and the Supplemental Capital Program. For the eight months ended August 31, 2021, total expenditures were approximately \$114,298,000. Expenditures included \$8,876,000 for Roadway Lighting Repairs, \$8,838,000 for GSP Bridge Repairs, and \$8,288,000 for GSP Milepost 0-126 Resurfacing.

The Construction Fund, which is funded from bond proceeds, consists of the 2021-2025 Capital Improvement Program, 2019 Capital Improvement Program, and the 2008 \$7 Billion Capital Improvement Program. For the eight months ended August 31, 2021, total expenditures were approximately \$208,922,000, which was 69.6% of the year-to-date spending budget. Total expenditures from the 2021-2025 Capital Improvement Program for the eight months ended August 31, 2021 were approximately \$46,379,000. Spending included \$6,775,000 for TPK NBHCE Capacity Enhancements, \$4,686,000 for GSP & TPK Bridge Rehabilitation/Replacement Program, and \$4,346,000 for TPK Hybrid CMS Installation. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$304,235,000. Total expenditures from the 2019 CIP for the eight months ended August 31, 2021 were approximately \$109,293,000. Spending included \$20,385,000 for GSP Shoulder Widening from MP 30 to 35, \$13,312,000 for TPK Install of New Hybrid CMS, and \$10,372,000 for GSP Bridge Deck Reconstruction 160.6 to 161.9. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$293,093,000. Total expenditures from the 2008 \$7 Billion Capital Improvement Program (CIP) for the eight months ended August 31, 2021 were approximately \$23,250,000. Spending included \$30,429,000 for NBHCE Bridge Re-decking, \$12,016,000 for Interchange Improvements, and \$2,950,000 for Phase II of Sign Replacements. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$135,387,000.
