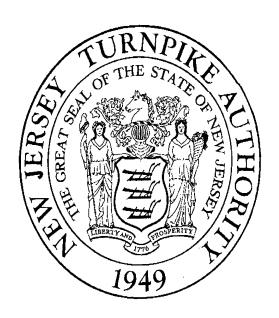

The Authority is owner of the above parcels, totaling approximately 2.41 acres, which are landlocked and without access. The Property is in the vicinity of Interchange 11 of the Turnpike and is currently encroached on by municipal park/recreational facilities. Departments within the Authority have reviewed the Property and have determined that the Property does not have present or future use to the Authority. An Administrative Determination of Value is currently being prepared. Authorization of this item will allow the Property to be transferred to Woodbridge Township pursuant to the Authority's regulations for the sale of surplus property, N.J.S.A. 19:9-2.6, and the Authority's By-Laws and be incorporated into Fords Park.

Authorization to Pay Credit Card Fees and Credit Card Equity Under Various Agreements Related to New Jersey E-ZPass Operations

Authorization is requested to allow the Authority to reimburse New Jersey E-ZPass for credit card fees, both under Conduent's agreements with Visa, Mastercard, Amex, Discover and Card-Connect, as well as for credit card equity payments to various toll road operators under the Inter-Agency Group (IAG) reciprocity agreement in an amount not to exceed \$150 million over a 3-year period, or approximately \$50 million /year. It is expected that the Authority will receive approximately \$45 million over the three-year period, or approximately \$15 million/year, from those same toll road operators as a recovery of credit card costs under the IAG reciprocity agreement. Under the Authority's contract with Conduent State and Local Solutions, Inc., Conduent is required to enter into agreements with Visa, Mastercard, Amex, Discover and Card-Connect for credit card processing services to support the New Jersey E-ZPass Customer Service Center; however Conduent is not billed for nor pays the credit card fees. These fees are the responsibility of the Authority and the other agencies that make us the New Jersey E-ZPass.

the Executive Director to Transfer the Property to Woodbridge Township New Jersey Turnpike Parcels X773A and X750Z, Section 5A, Woodbridge Township,

Middlesex County (the "Property")

The Authority is owner of the above parcels, totaling approximately 2.41 acres, which are landlocked, without access, and in the vicinity of Interchange 11 of the Turnpike (the "Property"). The Property is currently encroached on by municipal park/recreational facilities; retaining ownership of the Property presents a liability to the Authority, since the Authority has no control over the day-to-day use and operations which occur on the Property. Departments within the Authority have reviewed the Property and have determined that the Property does not have present or future use to the Authority. An Administrative Determination of Value is currently being prepared. Woodbridge Township has expressed an interest in owning the property for the purpose of incorporating it into Fords Park for public recreation purposes.

In accordance with the Authority's regulations for the sale of Surplus Property, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.6, the Law Department has circulated information regarding the Property to the Chief Engineer, the Director of Operations, the Chief Information Officer (ITS), and the Authority's Engineering Consultant, HNTB Corporation, for review. Each has reviewed the information regarding the Property, and all have certified that the Authority no longer requires the Property and does not see any future use of the Property by the Authority.

Accordingly, it is recommended that authorization be given to declare the Property surplus to the Authority's needs. It is further recommended that the Executive Director be authorized to take any steps necessary to transfer the Property to Woodbridge Township to be incorporated into Fords Park for public use, in accordance with the Authority's regulations for the sale of Surplus Property, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.6, and the Authority's By-laws. It is further recommended that the Authority's Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any such other documents and take any such other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization.

This matter is a personal injury claim arising from a motorist, who is 61 years old, that was broadsided or "T-boned" by a State Trooper as she entered Interchange 14 in Newark on May 18, 2018. The Trooper was leaving the NJSP Newark Barracks, while responding to a motorist aid call, when he hit the plaintiff's vehicle. As a result, plaintiff sustained a series of injuries, of which some were preexisting injuries. The medical records revealed that plaintiff had sustained a concussion, rotator cuff tears, hip sprain, low back disc injuries and cervical spine injuries. Plaintiff has been out of work for one (1) year.

The parties agreed to a mediation that was presided by retired Judge Mark Epstein. Given the extent of plaintiff's injuries and a no liability defense available to the Authority, Judge Epstein successfully convinced the parties that the case should be resolved at \$225,000, subject to the Board of Commissioners' approval. Outside counsel reviewed this matter and other similar matters that were previously adjudicated and/or settled to confirm that this proposed settlement value is reasonable given the facts of the case, plaintiff's injuries, age, and the projected future costs of defense. The Law Department concurs with outside counsel's recommendation in concert with Mediator Retired Judge Epstein's tentative settlement proposal.

Therefore, it is recommended that the Authority's Commissioners approve the settlement of this matter pursuant to the terms set forth above. It is also recommended that the Authority's Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any and all documents in furtheranee of same.

Petitioner Hector Acevedo was a Parkway Division Maintenance Person 1 - Landscape, hired May 1986 and retired effective January 1, 2020, under a PERS Early Retirement. This recommended settlement will resolve a formal Claim Petition filed in 2020.

The petitioner is represented by Robert A.Bauer Law Offices, located in Wall Township, NJ. The Authority is defended by Special Counsel Andrew Piniak of GluckWalrath LLP, located in Freehold, NJ. The matter is venued in the district office of Toms River Workers' Compensation Court before the Honorable Judge Carmine Taglialatella.

The total settlement award is \$101,691.00.

The Law Department has reviewed this matter and agrees with the recommendation of the Special Counsel, the Authority's third-party workers' compensation administrator and the Authority's Senior Benefits Manager. Authorization is, therefore, requested to allow Special Counsel to settle this matter for the sum of \$101,691.00.

This contract will provide for drainage rehabilitation and sliplining 16 culverts between Milepost 110.6 to 116.4. The work includes construction of manholes, inlets, headwalls, installation of cured in place pipe or fiberglass reinforced polymer pipe lining, and jack and bore replacements at two locations. All work is expected to be substantially completed by July 2023.

Nine bid proposals were received on March 16, 2022 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal in the amount of \$9,154,559.10 may be compared to the second low bidder in the amount of \$10,981,414.50. The bids were significantly lower than the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$16,701,430.00 likely due to the large quantity of landscape items and an assumption that the plantings may not require significant maintenance. It is also likely that the large quantity of earthwork and excavation items, the availability of trenching/shoring equipment, and the ability to re-use existing fill and excavation contributed to the bid being significantly lower that the Engineer's Estimate. The low bidder, Union Paving & Construction Co., Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. P200.568 be awarded to the low bidder, Union Paving & Construction Co., Inc. of Mountainside, New Jersey in the amount of \$9,154,559.10. This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

This contract will provide for video inspection and cleaning 46,000 linear feet of drainage pipe including 10 culverts on the Garden State Parkway between Milepost 120.6 and 123.6. The video taken during this project will be utilized for future drainage repair designs. All work is expected to be substantially completed by February 2023.

Three bid proposals were received on March 23, 2022 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. Joseph M. Sanzari, Inc. (JMS) submitted the low bid of \$1,459,457.75. However, when the bids were reviewed by the Engineering Department, it was determined JMS was not prequalified in Classification 19, Cleaning Manufactured Treatment Devices, Storm Drainage Pipe and Drainage Structures. Based on review of this matter by the Authority's Chief Engineer and Acting Director of Law, it is recommended that the apparent low bid submitted by JMS be rejected and that the Authority award Contract No. P200.626 to the lowest responsible bidder, Mount Construction Co., Inc., in the amount of \$1,463,431.00. This proposal is lower than the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$2,050,960.00, which is likely due to the contractor's current involvement in the region and ability to take advantage of fully mobilized staff and other resources. Mount Construction Co., Inc. has previously performed similar work for the Authority and for other regional transportation agencies and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. P200.626 be awarded to the low bidder, Mount Construction Co., Inc. of Berlin, New Jersey in the amount of \$1,463,431.00. This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority ("Authority") issued a request for proposal ("RFP") to engage a firm to provide third party claims administration ("TPA") services for general liability, automobile liability, police professional liability and employment liability claims (the "Services"). The Services to be provided will include TPA support services for these types of claims filed against the Authority as well as expert support services to the Authority's internal claims management system.

The RFP was advertised on February 4th in the Star Ledger and the Asbury Park Press and posted on the Authority's and the State's websites and distributed to thirteen (13) firms. The contract will be for a term of three (3) years, with the option to extend for two additional one-year terms at the Authority's discretion. On or before the due date of March 15, 2022, four (4) proposals were received from the following firms:

- 1) CAB Claims Administrators, Philadelphia, PA
- 2) Inservco Insurance Services, Inc., Harrisburg, PA
- 3) Qual-Lynx, Egg Harbor Township, NJ
- 4) Sedgwick Claims Management Services, Inc., Memphis, TN

The Evaluation Committee ("Committee"), which was approved by the Executive Director, consisted of three (3) voting members from the Authority's Law and Finance Departments. In addition, staff from the Law and Procurement & Materials Management Departments as well as a representative from the Authority's risk management consulting firm, Turner Surety & Insurance Brokerage, Inc., served as non-voting members of the Committee.

The Committee reviewed the written proposals based on the criteria set forth in the RFP and scored each firm individually. Based on the Committee's review of the proposals, the Committee invited representatives from the three top ranked firms, 1) Inservco Insurance Services, Inc., ("Inservco"), 2) Qual-Lynx, ('Qual-Lynx") and 3) CAB Claims Administrators ("CAB") to make an oral presentation and provide a best and final offer ("BAFO"). Based upon the written and oral presentations, the Committee prepared a report that details the evaluation process and sets forth its findings and recommendations.

The Committee found that the three firms were all highly qualified and responsive to the Authority's Scope of Services. All three firms provided a professional and comprehensive oral presentation with experienced account management teams.

The Committee concluded that Inservco, the incumbent third-party administrator, was the most qualified firm and recommended that it be awarded the contract. The Inservco team provided a well-tailored and responsive written proposal that exhibited an excellent grasp on the Authority's needs. It was the only presenting proposer to bring their entire dedicated claims staff to the oral presentation, providing the opportunity for the Committee to observe the expertise of Inservco's staff individually and collectively, and provided thorough explanation as to their longevity, experience, and capability. Inservco was the only proposer to include description of ongoing litigation in their written proposal, and they provided customized reports that specifically addressed the Authority's needs. The Committee was impressed by Inservco's comprehensive approach to claim management as well as their command over insurance practices and public entity claims. The company has competently provided these services for the Authority in the past.

Inservco quoted an initial three-year quotation of \$328,012. It was the only proposer to include quoted fees in their initial response for the extension years should the Authority exercise these. The fee quoted for years 4 and 5 is \$226,350, for a five year total of \$554,362.

This professional services procurement was conducted in accordance with *N.J.S.A.* 27:23-6.1, *N.J.A.C.* 19:9-2.1(b), Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006), and Executive Order No. 26 (Whitman 1994). This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardees pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 and Executive Order No. 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same.

Accordingly, authorization is requested to award a three-year contract to Inservco Insurance Services, Inc. for third party administration services for general liability, automobile liability, police professional liability and employment liability claims in an amount not to exceed \$328,012 for a 3-year term. Authorization is further requested for the Executive Director to approve each of two (2) optional one-year extensions upon satisfactory performance by Inservco, subject to funding availability at the time of service. It is also requested that the Executive Director be authorized to take such actions and to execute any and all documents that may be deemed necessary and appropriate to further the intent and purpose of the authorizations stated herein.

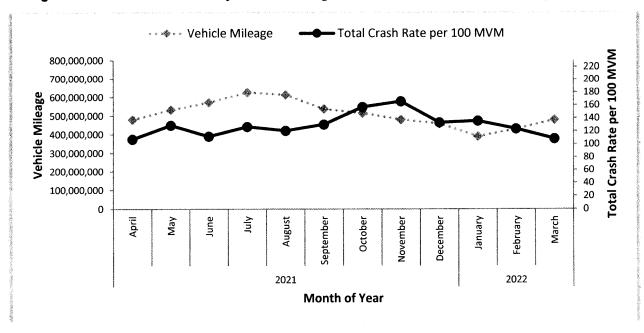

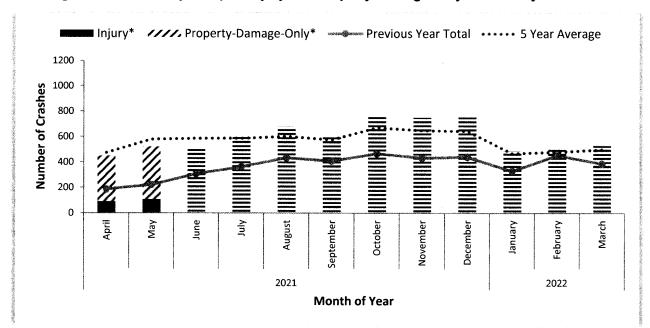
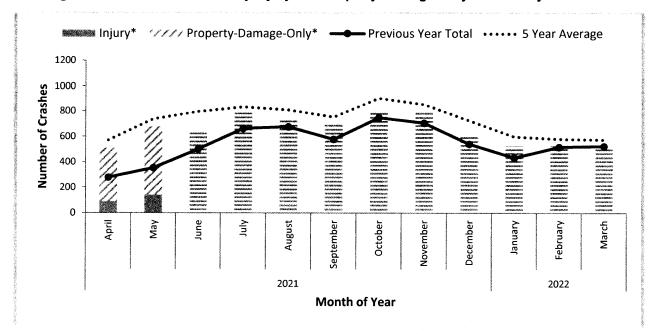


Figure 3 - New Jersey Turnpike Injury and Property-Damage-Only Crashes by Month

The following un-audited results are for the three months ended March 31, 2022. Based upon these results, revenues will be sufficient to satisfy the requirements of the Authority's Bond Resolution. For the twelve months ending December 31, 2022, the Authority is projected to have a debt service coverage ratio of 1.80 and a total requirements coverage ratio of 1.41.

The Authority's total revenue for the three months ended March 31, 2022 was \$529,897,000, which is \$25,826,000, or 5.1%, above the 2022 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue was \$465,292,000, which is \$18,992,000, or 4.3%, more than the 2022 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue is greater than budget primarily due to stronger than projected commercial traffic growth on the New Jersey Turnpike. However, the impacts of severe winter weather in the month of January 2022 accounted for an approximate \$8 million revenue loss and the winter weather at the end of March 2022 which accounted for an approximate \$2 million in additional revenue loss, for a total of a \$10 million loss. January 2022 was the 9<sup>th</sup> snowiest January since 1895, with an average snowfall of 18.1" across the entire State. E-ZPass fees were \$6,351,000, or 25.5%, above the budget due to conservative budgeting in 2022.

For the three months ended March 31, 2022, traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike increased 14.1% and toll revenue increased 17.7% compared to the same period in 2021. The increase in traffic is primarily due to the continued return to office, increased travel, and resumption of large-scale public events after the lifting of COVID-related restrictions in 2021. Toll revenue also increased due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing which went into effect on January 1, 2022. In addition, traffic and revenue also increased due to more travel during the February 2022 Presidents' Day holiday weekend compared to the same period as last year. The 2022 traffic and toll revenue budgets are based on the Authority's traffic engineering consultant's (CDM Smith) updated toll revenue forecast dated September 10, 2021. The updated forecast includes both the assumed improved impact of COVID-19 on travel and the 3% annual toll rate indexing. Considering these two factors, CDM Smith projected a 9.7% increase in traffic and a 10.8% increase in revenue as compared to prior year. The actual results for the three months ended March 31, 2022 were above CDM's projections, despite the severe winter weather in January and March which were not projected and accounted for an approximate \$7 million revenue loss. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 8.6% but revenue is up 32.4% for the same period. However, when comparing the month of March 2022 to March 2019, traffic has recovered to about 96% of pre-pandemic levels. Through March 2022, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the New Jersey Turnpike was 91.5%, an increase from 89.2% for the same period in 2021.

For the three months ended March 31, 2022, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway increased 9.3% and revenue increased 12.6% when compared to the same period in 2021. The increase in traffic is primarily due to the increase in travel as COVID-related restrictions continue to be lifted, while toll revenue increased mainly due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing. Increased travel during the Presidents' Day holiday weekend as compared to last year also positively impacted results. The actual results for the three months ended March 31, 2022 were below the budget which was based on CDM's projection of a 9.3% increase in toll transactions and a 14.1% increase in toll revenue, due to the severe winter weather in January and March which were not projected and accounted for an approximate \$3 million revenue loss. The projections include both the assumed impacts of COVID-19 and the 3% annual toll rate indexing. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 10.1% and revenue is up 17.3%. However, when comparing the month of March 2022 to 2019, traffic has recovered to about 94% of pre-pandemic levels. Through March 2022, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the Garden State Parkway was 89.5%, an increase from 87.2% for the same period in 2021.

Operating expenses for the three months ended March 31, 2022 were approximately \$152,329,000, which is \$20,750,000, or 12.0%, below the year-to-date budget. The Authority's operating expenses through March were below budget primarily due to lower than budgeted snow/severe weather costs, lower salaries because of existing vacancies, and lower than budgeted health benefit costs, which were partially offset by higher than budgeted transponder costs. The Authority spent a total of \$28,909,000 for snow and severe weather costs in 2022, with \$14,485,000 spent from the operating expense budget and an additional \$14,424,000 spent from the General Reserve Fund. All snow and severe weather costs are considered operating expenses and paid from the Revenue Fund, except for declared state of emergency events, which are charged to the General Reserve Fund. The Authority still has about \$34,535,000 in total available in its 2022 operating expense and general reserve budgets for snow and severe weather costs.

### Financial Summary For the Three Months Ended March 31, 2022

Debt Service includes interest and principal payments on the Authority's outstanding bonds. For the three months ended March 31, 2022, Debt Service totaled \$214,574,000, which was \$6,451,000 or 2.9% below budget and included \$141,811,000 in interest payments and \$72,763,000 in principal payments. Debt Service is below budget partly because the budget assumed a \$500,000,000 new money bond issuance in the beginning of 2022 but has not been issued as of March 2022.

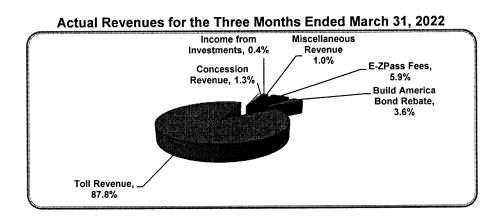
The General Reserve Fund includes all contractual payments subordinate to bondholders and expenditures for any other corporate purpose. The General Reserve Fund spending totaled \$125,369,000 for the three months ended March 31, 2022. Spending consisted primarily of \$87,483,000 for the new State Transportation Agreement, \$14,424,000 for Extraordinary Events (state of emergency weather events), and \$5,500,000 for the Transportation Trust Fund. Also included are \$12,500,000 in transfers to the Supplemental Capital program in the Construction Fund.

The Capital Budget, which is funded by revenue, consists of the Maintenance Reserve Fund, Special Project Reserve Fund, and the Supplemental Capital Program. For the three months ended March 31, 2022, total expenditures were approximately \$18,170,000, which was 18.5% of the year-to-date spending budget. Expenditures included \$1,888,000 for Network Refresh, \$1,369,000 for TMC Communication Upgrades, and \$1,037,000 for TPK Milepost 92-122 & NBHCE. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$251,422,000.

The Construction Fund, which is funded from bond proceeds, consists of the 2022-2026 Capital Improvement Program, 2019 Capital Improvement Program, and the 2008 \$7 Billion Capital Improvement Program. For the three months ended March 31, 2022, total expenditures were approximately \$87,569,000, which was 55.2% of the year-to-date spending budget. Total expenditures included \$6,781,000 for GSP Shoulder Widening from MP 30 to 35, \$6,498,000 for Passaic River Bridge Rehabilitation, \$5,593,000 for TPK Install New Hybrid CMS, and \$5,504,000 for NBHCE Bridge Re-decking. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$1,045,485,000.

For the three months ended March 31, 2022, total revenue was \$529,712,000, which was 5.1%, or \$25,641,000 above the 2022 Budget. Total revenue was above budget mainly due to increased travel and the continued return to office after the lifting of COVID-19 restrictions.

Toll revenue for the period was \$465,292,000 which was 4.3%, or \$18,992,000 greater than the 2022 Budget amount. Toll revenue was \$20,559,000, or 6.2% higher than the 2022 Budget amount on the New Jersey Turnpike and \$1,568,000, or 1.4% lower than the 2022 Budget amount on the Garden State Parkway. Toll revenue was above budget primarily due to stronger than projected commercial vehicle traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike.

Concession revenue consists of revenues generated through the sale of food, gasoline and convenience store items at the service areas located along both roadways. Concession revenue was \$6,787,000 which was \$1,013,000 or 13.0% below the 2022 Budget. Revenue was lower due to severe winter weather in January and March 2022, the impact of the COVID-19 Omicron variant, and the closure of the two McDonald's locations on the Parkway. On the Turnpike, food sales increased 26.1%, fuel sales decreased 11.1% and convenience store sales increased by 11.3% compared to last year. On the Garden State Parkway, food sales decreased 29.0%, fuel sales decreased 3.5%, and convenience store sales increased 13.1% compared to the same period in 2021. The increase in food and convenience store sales on the Turnpike are primarily due to the less severe impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, while the decrease in fuel sales is mainly due to the closure of the Woodrow Wilson and Molly Pitcher Service Areas for renovations, as well as the overall rise in gas prices. On the Parkway, the increase in Convenience Store sales is due to the less severe impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, while food sales decreased mainly due to the closure of the two McDonald's locations and fuel sales decreased due partly to the rise in gas prices.

Investment earnings consist of income from invested operating revenues and reserve funds. Investment income was \$2,093,000, which was \$593,000 or 39.5% higher than the 2022 Budget. Income from investments was above budget due to conservative budgeting in 2022. The budget did not project an increase in short-term interest rates, however, rates have slightly increased due to the less severe impacts of COVID-19 on the economy and on interest rates.

Miscellaneous revenue includes fees for cell tower rentals, towing, fiber optic leases, park & ride commissions, property rentals, the Arts Center, and other items. Revenue for the period was \$5,221,000 which was \$850,000, or 19.4% higher than the 2022 Budget. Miscellaneous revenue was above the 2022 Budget levels due to approximately \$250,000 in additional fiber billing for prior year, \$243,000 for cell tower back rent for prior years and \$387,000 in FEMA recoveries for COVID-19 (Ongoing) and Hurricane Ida (2021).

The Build America Bond Subsidy is a direct payment from the U.S. Treasury to the Authority equaling about 35% of the interest payable on the Series 2009F and the Series 2010A Bonds for Federal Fiscal Year 2022 which began in October 2021. The subsidy due was \$19,253,000, which was at the 2022 Budget amount.

*E-ZPass* fees consist of monthly membership fees, transponder sales, return check fees, administrative fees, interest on prepaid accounts and monthly statement fees. Revenue of \$31,251,000 was above budget due primarily to an increase in administrative fees, as well as an increase in monthly membership fees as accounts have increased.

For the month of March 2022, traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike increased 10.7% and toll revenue increased 12.8% when compared to the same period in 2021. These results are ahead of CDM's projections of an increase of 2.1% for traffic and an increase of 3.8% for toll revenue for the month of March 2022 mainly due to stronger than projected commercial traffic. The increase in toll revenue is partly due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing effective on January 1, 2022.

For the three months ended March 31, 2022, traffic increased 14.1% and toll revenue increased 17.7% when compared to the same period in 2021. Results were above the 2022 Budget which was based on CDM Smith's projections of a 9.7% increase in traffic and a 10.8% increase in revenue, as commercial vehicle traffic has continued to be stronger than projected due to improved economic conditions. Toll revenue has exceeded projections partly due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing effective January 1, 2022. Traffic and revenue also increased due to increased travel and continued return to office after the lifting of COVID-related restrictions in 2021, as well as more travel during the February 2022 Presidents' Day Weekend as compared to last year. Electronic toll collection remains popular and overall usage rates continue to be strong. For the three months ended March 31, 2022, the *E-ZPass* usage rate for passenger cars was 90.5%, and 96.4% for commercial vehicles. This resulted in an overall *E-ZPass* usage rate of 91.5%. The *E-ZPass* usage rate remains one of the highest in the region reflecting acceptance among commuters and frequent travelers of the *E-ZPass* brand and the convenience provided to the users throughout the Northeast.

For the month of March 2022, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway increased by 6.2% and toll revenue increased by 9.1% when compared to March 2021. The overall increase in toll transactions can be attributed to the easing of COVID-19 restrictions, allowing for increased travel and the continued return to office. The increase in toll revenue is attributed to the 3% annual toll rate indexing effective January 1, 2022. The results were above CDM's projections of a 2.3% increase in traffic and a 5.3% increase in toll revenue for March 2022.

YTD Toll Revenue

For the three months ended March 31, 2022, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway increased 9.3% and toll revenue increased 12.6% when compared to the same period in 2021. Toll transactions increased due to the increase in travel as COVID-19 related restrictions continue to be lifted. However, toll revenue increased due not only to the increase in toll transactions, but also due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing effective January 1, 2022. Results fell below the 2022 Budget which was based on CDM Smith's projections of a 10.5% increase in toll transactions and a 14.1% increase in toll revenue, due in part to the severe winter weather in January and March which were not projected and accounted for an approximate \$3 million revenue loss. *E-ZPass* remains popular on the Garden State Parkway as electronic toll collection continues to increase. For the three months ended March 31, 2022, the total *E-ZPass* usage rate was 89.5%. The E-ZPass usage rate for passenger cars was 89.4%, and 95.5% for commercial vehicles.

For the three months ended March 31, 2022, operating expenses were approximately \$152,329,000, which was 22.7% of the annual budget. Operating expenses through March 2022 were under budget primarily due to lower than budgeted snow/severe weather costs of approximately \$12,000,000, salaries of approximately \$4,000,000 due to existing vacancies, and health benefits costs of about \$2,000,000. These under budget expenses were partially offset by higher than budgeted transponder costs of about \$1,000,000.

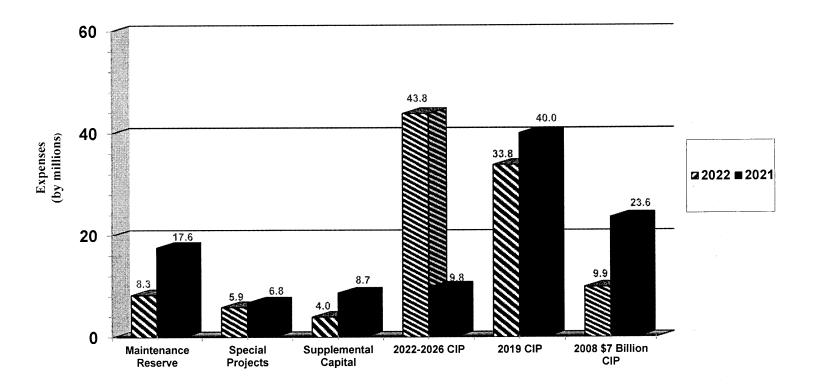

The New Jersey E-ZPass Customer Service Center (NJ E-ZPass CSC) operates on behalf of the Authority and other agencies that are part of the New Jersey E-ZPass Group. The NJ E-ZPass CSC is currently operated by Conduent State and Local Solutions, Inc. (Conduent), formerly known as Xerox State and Local Solutions, Inc. At its January 26, 2017 Board of Commissioners meeting, Addendum 2 to the agreement with Conduent was approved, which authorized, among other things, Conduent to contract with Visa, Mastercard, American Express, Discover and a credit card processor (currently Card Connect and Fiserv) to offer credit card payment options in connection with the operation of the NJ E-ZPass CSC. These payment options include to a large part the ability to automatically replenish E-ZPass accounts, but also one-time account payments and payments of tolls and administrative fees.

Under Conduent's agreements with the various credit card companies, and as is customary in the industry, the credit card companies deduct their fees upfront, and only remit the net amount to the NJ E-ZPass bank accounts. Conduent does not mark-up the credit card fees and costs assessed by the credit card companies and processors. The Authority, along with the other members of the New Jersey E-ZPass Group, must reimburse the NJ E-ZPass bank accounts for these credit card fees. The Authority's share of these fees approximates \$35,000,000 per year.

In addition, since February 20, 1998, the Authority has been a member of the E-ZPass Group (formerly known as the Interagency Group (IAG)). The E-ZPass Group is a collection of multistate toll operators who have agreed to accept E-ZPass at their facilities. In April of 1999, under the E-ZPass IAG Operating Agreement, the E-ZPass Group adopted a policy known as Credit Card Equity. This policy obligates the Authority to make payments, known as credit card equity payments, to other E-ZPass Group members based upon their customers use of the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway. On a quarterly basis, the Authority must pay each E-ZPass Group member on an agreed upon formula (away agency customer toll payments to the Authority

times the blended credit card rate). These credit card equity payments to the other E-ZPass Group members approximates \$15,000,000 per year.

Under the same E-ZPass Group Credit Card Equity policy, the Authority also receives payments from the other E-ZPass Group members for the credit card fees incurred by the NJ E-ZPass CSC for its customers use of other toll facilities. These credit card equity receipts from other E-ZPass group members approximates \$14,000,000 per year.

When considering the total amounts paid by the Authority for credit card fees and credit card equity payments of approximately \$50,000,000 per year, net of the credit card equity receipts of \$14,000,000 per year, the net cost credit card cost to the Authority is about \$36,000,000 per year. Acceptance of credit cards as a payment method is a required component of electronic toll collection. Accordingly, based upon this and pursuant to the various agreements mentioned above, authorization is requested to pay credit card fees of up to \$150,000,000 over the three-year period ending on February 28, 2025. Of this amount, up to \$105,000,000 is authorized for payment in total of fees to Visa, Mastercard, Amex, Discover, Card Connect and Fiserv. The remaining \$45,000,000 is authorized to be paid to various E-ZPass Group members. It is expected that the Authority will receive approximately \$42,000,000 over the three-year period from E-ZPass Group members which will partially offset credit card costs.
