

The Authority received a request from the Township of South Brunswick (the "Township") to allow access for emergency response vehicles only across Authority property, on behalf of a developer who is developing property located near Turnpike Interchange 8A the ("Emergency Access Agreement").

Pursuant to the proposed Emergency Access Agreement, the Authority will grant permission for limited use by Township emergency police and fire response vehicles to access certain property located adjacent to the Authority owned Park and Ride, revocable upon 30 days' notice to the Township. The Township will be responsible for constructing all improvements necessary for access, including guiderail, fencing, signage and a gate; will defend and indemnify for all damages and injuries in accordance with the New Jersey Tort Claims Act., N.J.S.A. 59:1-1 et seq.; and shall provide insurance as required by the Authority.

Accordingly, it is requested that the Board of Commissioners delegate to the Executive Director the authority to execute the proposed agreement with the Township of South Brunswick as outlined above, upon the recommendation of the Law and Engineering Departments. It is further recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any such other documents and take any such other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization.

RE: Request Authorizing Notice of Adoption of Amendments to Towing Regulations

at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1 and 3.2 to Increase Towing and Road Service Rates and Fees

At the January 25, 2022 public meeting of the Authority's Board of Commissioners, the Board approved Agenda Item No. 003-01-2022, authorizing amendments to the Authority's regulations at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1 and 3.2 to increase Towing and Road Service Rates and Fees on the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway. In accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 et seq (APA) and Office of Administrative Law (OAL) rulemaking procedures and regulations (the "Rulemaking Process"), the Notice of Proposed Rules was published in the March 7, 2022 edition of the *New Jersey Register*, the public was provided sixty (60) days to comment on the March 7, 2022 Proposed Rules, and the public comment period ended on May 6, 2022. The Rulemaking Process requires that the Authority consider any comments received and, if deemed appropriate, amend the Proposed Rules in its final "Notice of Adoption."

The Authority received several comments to the Proposed Rules from interested parties, including the Garden State Towing Association, several Authority towers, and New Jersey Manufacturers Insurance (NJM). For the most part, the Towing Association's comments requested additional increases to the Proposed Rules in light of "drastic increases" in annual overhead costs. The comments received from several Authority towers all focused on the need for a fuel surcharge to be included in the regulations. Finally, NJM commented that some of the Proposed Rules governing heavy duty towing would exceed the maximum New Jersey State Police (NJSP)-approved rates.

After careful consideration of the comments received, and in response to the Towing Association comments, Authority staff has recommended that additional increases to the towing rates, averaging eight per cent (8%) above the rates in the Proposed Rules, be adopted. In making this recommendation, Authority staff determined that the additional increase in rates is warranted given recent intervening events that have occurred since the Proposed Rules were

approved, namely, the rising inflation, which was earlier predicted to be short-lived, and the worsening economic outlook created in part by the recent Russian invasion of Ukraine.

As to the comments from several Authority towers related to a fuel surcharge, while Authority staff recognizes the extraordinary rise in fuel costs, it cannot recommend that a fuel surcharge be included in the Proposed Rules and passed on to Authority patrons. Rather, Authority staff is recommending that any relief to be provided to towers by way of a fuel surcharge be incorporated in the next round of contracts to be awarded via bid to qualified Authority towers, and that the Authority, rather than Authority patrons, absorb that cost.

As to NJM's comments, it was never the intent to increase any rates beyond the maximum rates set by the NJSP. Therefore, after a second review of the heavy duty towing rates in the Rule Proposal, Authority staff recommends a reduction in certain of those rates, so they do not exceed the maximum NJSP rate.

A complete summary, as well as the actual text of the rules to be adopted, subject to the Commissioner's approval, is set forth in the attached Notice of Adoption. In accordance with the Rulemaking Process, the Governor's Office has approved the Notice of Adoption for consideration by the Board of Commissioners.

Accordingly, it is requested that the Board of Commissioners approve the attached Notice of Adoption of amendments to N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1 and 3.2 for submission to the Office of Administrative Law and publication in the August 1, 2022 edition of the *New Jersey Register*. Upon publication on that date, the regulations embodied in the Notice of Adoption will become effective.

Finally, it is requested that the Executive Director be authorized to execute any documents and take any other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization.

#### **Summary of Public Comments and Responses:**

#### Jonathan Testa, Esq., on behalf of the Garden State Towing Association

1. SUMMARY OF COMMENT: As compared to many non-toll roads in this State, the majority of the Turnpike and Parkway towing rates have only seen nominal increases, if any at all, from 1995-2019, despite a significant reduction in accident clearance time. A review of the NJTA's regulations over the last 12 years makes clear that the maximum tow rates for trucks and buses twelve years ago have remained identical to the current rates. Equipment and labor rates have also remained the same for over a decade.

Towing companies saw a drastic increase in annual overhead costs beginning in 2016 due to increased costs for commercial insurance, labor, gas, and equipment. Despite increases in the number of Turnpike/Parkway drivers, toll rates, fuel costs and towing industry overhead operational costs, the NJTA has not made any real change in the rate regulations during this time. COVID-19 has only exacerbated the problem as the current average cost for diesel fuel is now \$5.50 per gallon, with further increases expected throughout this year.

The towing industry has lost trained, experienced and highly skilled drivers to other businesses; and many companies have already been forced to abandon their Turnpike / Parkway contracts all together. The initial proposed rules are a step in the right direction to reach a reasonable solution to these problems, but more needs to be done to increase the rates so they are more in-line with current New Jersey State Police towing rates — reviewed and approved by the New Jersey Attorney General's Office and presumed fair and reasonable — to address the accelerating operational costs the towing service industry currently faces in the New Jersey market.

Further increase to the rates by NJTA will help towers keep well-trained and experienced employees on staff, allow for the re-hiring of former staff that left for better pay, and enable towers to reinvest in aging equipment to better serve the needs of the Turnpike and Parkway. Based upon the above, in order by specific regulation sub-section/sub-part, the Association respectfully submits the following suggested changes to the NJTA-proposed rates:

- 1. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(1)(i)(1), per-mile rate for class 1 vehicles should be further increased from \$4.00 per mile to \$5.00 per mile and the maximum service charge increased from \$148.00 to \$158.00;
- 2. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(2)(i)(1)(A), per-mile rate for class 2 vehicles should be further increased from \$4.50 per mile to \$6.00 per mile;
- 3. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(2)(ii)(1), base service charge for class 3 vehicles should be further increased from \$375.00 to \$438.00; the per-mile rate should be further increased from \$5.75 per mile to \$8.00 per mile; and the maximum service charge should be further increased from \$432.50 to \$518.00;
- 4. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(2)(iii)(1), fee for connecting air lines and connecting lights should be further increased from \$38.00 to \$50.00;
- 5. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(2)(iii)(2), fee for disconnecting drive shaft should be further increased from \$68.00 to \$75.00;
- 6. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(2)(iii)(3), per-axle fee for removing each axle should be further increased from \$60.00 per-axle to \$75.00 per axle;

- 7. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(2)(iii)(4), fee for removing an air scoop should be further increased from \$68.00 to \$75.00;
- 8. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(3)(ii), hourly rate for a heavy wrecker should be further increased from \$228.00 per hour to \$260.00;
- 9. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(4)(ii), per-hour rate for Rotator 60-ton capacity and up, and for 50-ton construction crane should be further increased from \$788 per hour to \$900 per hour;
- 10. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(5)(i), rates for 60-ton Rotator and 50-ton construction crane should be further increased from \$788 per hour to \$900 per hour;
- 11. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(5)(i), rates for a light duty flatbed, as well as a light duty flatbed with wheel lift, should both be further increased from \$105.00 per hour to \$140.00 per hour, respectively;
- 12. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(5)(i), hourly rate for a tractor only should be further increased from \$350 to \$438;
- 13. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(5)(i), the hourly rates for labor regarding supervisor should be increased from \$150.00 to \$200 per hour, tech labor should be increased from \$100 to \$150.00 per hour, and manual labor should be increased from \$75 to \$125.00 per hour;
- 14. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(b)(1), storage rates for passenger vehicles should be further increased from \$40 to \$45 dollars per calendar day after the initial 12-hour grace period;
- 15. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(b)(3)(i), storage rates for vehicles over 15,000 pounds should be increased from \$75.00 per mile per calendar day to \$150 per mile per calendar day after the initial 12-hour grace period, as the regulations do not consider the length of the vehicle and the space the vehicle takes up in our towers' storage yards;

16. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(b)(3)(ii), storage rates for buses over 15,000 pounds should be increased from \$150.00 per calendar day to \$200 per calendar day after the initial 12- hour grace period, as the regulations do not consider the length of the vehicle and the space the vehicle takes up in our towers' storage yards; and

17. N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(a)(1), the Road Service charge should be further increased from \$75 to \$105.00.

Without these further requested increases, we believe that many towing businesses that service the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway will not be able to survive the next five years, especially given the significant increases in inflation and overhead costs that have more than doubled since 2016.

RESPONSE: The New Jersey Turnpike Authority ("NJTA" or "Authority") operates two of the busiest toll roads in North America. The NJTA's success as a national leader in incident response, recovery and roadway clearance times is partly due to its relationship with the State of New Jersey's highway towing and recovery industry.

The proposed rates by the NJTA on March 7, 2022 were designed by applying and adjusting for current market influences such as insurance, storage, real estate taxes, fuel costs and employee competition by other industries. At the time of the design of these proposed rates, the existing 40-year high national inflation was in its early stages and the guidance given by the Federal Reserve was that this inflation was transitory. Furthermore, the volatility created by the 2022 Russian Federation invasion of Ukraine was in its infancy. Both issues appear to be more enduring than initially forecast.

The Association's comment requests an additional increase to the proposed rates for basic and specialized towing and recovery services. After careful consideration, the NJTA determines that an additional increase to the proposed rates is warranted given more recent events. Specifically, due to the foregoing national and international market forces, the NJTA has determined to adjust the March 7, 2022 Notice of Rule Proposal rates by an increase of approximately eight percent (8%) in accordance with the 2022 monthly inflation rates provided by The United States Bureau of Labor Statistics. Eight percent is the peak of the monthly 2022 inflation rates. However, as and where applicable, the 8% increase to the

proposed March 7, 2022 rates will be capped as not to exceed the analogous New-Jersey State Police statewide towing and recovery rates.

A Summary of Changes Upon Adoption follows the recitation and response to comments herein.

<u>Stephanie L. Sikora, Esq., on behalf of New Jersey Manufacturers Insurance Company</u>

2. SUMMARY OF COMMENT: Regarding certain heavy-duty towing rates, the New Jersey State Police (NJSP) responds to accidents that occur on the Turnpike and the Parkway and NJSP maximum rates were created in cooperation with the Garden State Towing Association, whose members provide services on the Turnpike and the Parkway. Certain heavy-duty towing rates proposed by the Authority exceed the maximum NJSP rates, and we recommend that these rates be aligned for consistency and cost-containment purposes. For example, the Authority's proposed service provider rate for refrigerated trailers is \$525 per hour, whereas NJSP limits this rate to \$450 per hour. Similarly, the Authority's proposed service provider rate for front-end loaders is \$438 per hour, whereas NJSP limits this rate to \$300 per hour.

We understand that the Authority is seeking to bring its service provider fees in line with those of other regional toll roads, as well as to address challenges currently impacting service providers. However, some of the proposed heavy-duty towing rates exceed the NJSP maximum rates by significant amounts. As NJSP maximum rates were created with input from the Garden State Towing Association, we recommend that the Authority's limits on fees charged by service providers align with NJSP maximum rates.

RESPONSE: The NJTA does not desire to adopt a rate that exceeds a previously established State maximum. After a second review, where applicable the March 7, 2022 proposed rates will be reduced to this maximum threshold.

A Summary of Changes Upon Adoption follows the recitation and response to comments herein.

### John Tumino, on behalf of Tumino's Towing Inc.; Angie Haines, on behalf of Haines Towing Inc. (combined for similarity)

3. and 4. SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: Due to the rising cost of fuel, which is currently at unprecedented highs, it is imperative for toll road towers to be able to cover the extra costs in order to continue to provide emergency towing and roadside services on the Parkway and Turnpike. We are requesting the Authority to allow its towers to charge a "fuel surcharge" in amounts that are fair and reasonable to industry standards. We believe this surcharge could be enacted immediately under the provisions established in Item 21 of Section II in the Prequalification of Contractors for Routine Towing Services on the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway, which provides for "Extraordinary Circumstances." Also, multiple items were not increased, such as storage on Class III vehicles.

RESPONSE: The NJTA will provide for fuel surcharges, under appropriate circumstances, in its contractual documents with successful towing and recovery companies through the preestablished NJTA open bidding process. The NJTA elects not to impose fuel surcharge rules through Title 19 of the New Jersey Administrative Code. Fuel surcharges will not be imposed on Authority patrons but will be a contractual obligation of the Authority.

As to the Class III vehicles storage rate, no change was initially proposed. However, given the recent national and international market forces at work, as described above, Class III vehicles storage rate will be increased by 8% increase.

A Summary of Changes Upon Adoption follows the recitation and response to comments herein.

#### Sean Cody, on behalf of B & L Towing & Recovery

5. COMMENT: The time since the last small rate increase is 5 years, and prior to that it was 13 years for a minor increase. Prior to these small increases, it was many years since the last change in towing rates, which was actually a decrease in tractor trailer towing and a slight increase in light duty rates. There has never been a comparable increase close to the costs of doing business, including the cost of living, insurance, fuel, equipment, labor and driver/operator costs.

Inflation has hit close to 8%, fuel is now at \$6.50 per gallon. These rates should be increased by 15 to 20%, from storage to all types of towing and recovery rates.

A fuel surcharge is no doubt needed for the towing companies to be able to continue servicing the Authority's needs. For reference to how important this is to the tow garages contracted to tow on the Parkway or Turnpike, on January 3rd of 2022 diesel fuel was at a competitive rate \$3.46 per gal. On May 3, 2022 diesel fuel is an outrageously high \$6.41. Please consider a fuel surcharge to be allowed to the garages, that clear your roadways everyday 24 hours 7 days per week, as well as a 15 to 20% additional rate increase to cover the outrageously high costs of doing business in New Jersey.

RESPONSE: The Authority has determined to apply an 8% increase to proposed rates, as explained in Response to Comment 1, above. Additionally, the Authority will address fuel surcharges as set forth in Response to Comments 3 and 4, above.

Summary of Changes Upon Adoption: The Authority's March 7, 2022 proposed rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(1) provided for a maximum service charge increase for towing services for Class 1 vehicles (under 7,000 pounds Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (G.V.W.R.), generally, "Passenger Vehicles") from \$72.00 to \$108.00, and an increase in the per mile charge from \$3.50 to \$4.00, with the total maximum fee for Class 1 vehicles, including the service charge, from \$107.00 to \$148.00. The Authority has determined that an additional increase to these rates, averaging eight per cent (8%), is warranted, given recent market forces. Therefore, the maximum service charge for towing services for Class 1 vehicles shall be increased from \$72.00 to \$116.50, and the per mile charge shall be increased from \$3.50 to \$4.25, resulting in an increase in the total maximum fee for Class 1 vehicles, including the service charge, from \$107.00 to \$159.00.

Additionally, as set forth in the March 7, 2022 rule proposal, N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(1)(i)(2), governing fees for tows of Class 1 vehicles to other than the service provider's NJTA-authorized garage facility at a patron's request (Alternate Destination Tow), will be deleted. Rather, the NJTA intends to include provisions in contracts awarded pursuant to N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.13 that ensure the fees for such Alternate Destination Tows are reasonable and fair to Authority patrons who request an Alternate Destination Tow.

The Authority's March 7, 2022 proposed rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(2) provide for an increase in the maximum service charge for towing services for Class 2 vehicles (7,000 pounds and over G.V.W.R.; for example, straight truck, or passenger vehicle with trailer) from \$132.00 to \$198.00, and an increase in the per-mile charge from \$4.00 to \$4.50, resulting in an increase in the total maximum fee for Class 2 vehicles, including the service charge, from \$172.00 to \$243.00. The Authority has determined that an additional increase to these rates, averaging eight per cent (8%), is warranted, given recent market forces. Therefore, the maximum service charge for towing services for Class 2 vehicles (7,000 pounds and over G.V.W.R.; for example, straight truck, or passenger vehicle with trailer) shall be increased from \$132.00 to \$214.00, and the per-mile charge increased from \$4.00 to \$4.75, resulting in an increase in the total maximum fee for Class 2 vehicles, including the service charge, from \$172.00 to \$261.50. The amendments propose to delete N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(2)(i)(1)(B) governing Alternate Destination Tows.

The Authority's March 7, 2022 proposed rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(2)(ii) provide for an increase in the maximum service charge for towing services for Class 3 vehicles (generally, over 15,000 pounds G.V.W.R.) from \$250.00 to \$375.00, and an increase in the per mile charge from \$5.00 to \$5.75, resulting in an increase in the total maximum fee for Class 3 vehicles, including the service charge, from \$300.00 to \$432.50. The Authority has determined that an additional increase to these rates, averaging eight per cent (8%), is warranted, given recent market forces. Therefore, the maximum service charge for towing services for Class 3 vehicles (generally, over 15,000 pounds G.V.W.R.) shall be increased from \$250.00 to \$405.00, and the per-mile charge increased from \$5.00 to \$6.00, resulting in an increase in the total maximum fee for Class 3 vehicles, including the service charge, from \$300.00 to \$465.00.

The Authority's March 7, 2022 proposed rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(2)(iii) provide an increase in fees for services to Class 2 or Class 3 vehicles from \$30.00 to \$38.00 for connecting air lines and from \$30.00 to \$38.00 for connecting lights; from \$54.00 to \$68.00 for disconnecting drive shaft on all trucks; from \$48.00 to \$60.00 per axle for removing an axle; and from \$54.00 to \$68.00 for removing an air scoop. The Authority has determined that an increase of 25 percent is warranted, given recent market forces. Therefore, fees for services to Class 2 or Class 3 vehicles shall be increased from \$38.00 to \$41.00 for connecting air lines

and from \$38.00 to \$41.00 for connecting lights; from \$68.00 to \$73.50 for disconnecting drive shaft on all trucks; from \$60.00 to \$65.00 per axle for removing an axle; and from \$68.00 to \$73.50 for removing an air scoop.

The Authority's March 7, 2022 proposed rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(3) provide an increase in winching and wrecking fees from \$80.00 to \$140.00 per hour for a light wrecker, and from \$130.00 to \$228.00 per hour for a heavy wrecker. The Authority has determined that an increase of 75 percent is warranted, given recent market forces; therefore, fees for winching and wrecking at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(3) will be increased from \$140.00 to \$151.00 per hour for a light wrecker and from \$228.00 to \$246.00 per hour for a heavy wrecker.

The Authority's March 7, 2022 proposed rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(5) provide an increase in hourly rates covering equipment listed for extra heavy duty towing and recovery services, including (i) from \$250.00 to \$438.00 per hour for heavy duty wreckers, (ii) from \$250.00 to \$438.00 per hour for Landoll w/tractor, (iii) \$250.00 to \$438.00 per hour for relief box trailer, (iv) \$450.00 to \$788.00 per hour for 60-ton rotator, (v) from \$450 to \$788.00 per hour for 50-ton construction crane, (vi) from \$60.00 to \$105.00 per hour for light duty flatbed, (vii) from \$60.00 to \$105.00 per hour for light duty tow truck with wheel lift, (viii) from \$300.00 to \$525.00 per hour for relief refrigerator tractor trailer, (ix) from \$200.00 to \$350.00 per hour for tractor only, (x) from \$250.00 to \$438.00 per hour for heavy duty flatbed, (xi) from \$250.00 to \$438.00 per hour for service truck, (xii) from \$250.00 to \$438.00 per hour for front end loader (two-yard minimum bucket), (xiii) from \$250.00 to \$438.00 per hour for bob cat/skid steer, (xiv) from \$250.00 to \$438.00 per hour for fork lift (5,000 pounds minimum capacity), (xv) from \$250.00 to \$438.00 per hour for backhoe, (xvi) from \$250.00 to \$438.00 per hour for dump truck, (xvii) from \$250.00 to \$438.00 per hour for dump truck w/tractor, (xviii) from \$250.00 to \$438.00 per hour for roll off container (40-yard) + disposal fee, (xix) from \$150.00 to \$263.00 per hour for light tower (two-light minimum), (xx) from \$200.00 to \$350.00 flat fee for pallet jacks, and (xxi) from \$200.00 to \$350.00 flat fee for rollers (off load). The Authority has determined that an increase of 75 percent to the existing regulation is warranted for certain extra heavy duty equipment, given recent market forces, except where rates would exceed analogous New Jersey State Police rates. Therefore, the following March 7, 2022 proposed rates covering equipment listed for extra heavy duty towing and recovery services at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(5) shall be increased as

follows: (i) from \$438.00 to \$450.00 per hour for Landoll with tractor, (ii) from \$105.00 to \$113 per hour for light duty flatbed, (iii) from \$105.00 to \$113.00 per hour for light duty tow truck with wheel lift, (iv) from \$525.00 to \$450.00 per hour for relief refrigerated tractor trailer, (v) from \$350.00 per hour to \$250.00 per hour for tractor only, (vi) from \$438.00 to \$450.00 per hour for heavy duty flatbed, (vii) from \$438.00 to \$450.00 per hour for service truck, (viii) from \$438.00 to \$300 per hour for front end loader (two-yard minimum bucket), (ix) from \$438.00 to \$300.00 per hour for bob cat/skid steer, (x) from \$438.00 to \$300.00 per hour for fork lift (5,000 pounds minimum capacity), (xi) from \$438.00 to \$300.00 per hour for backhoe, (xii) from \$438.00 to \$350.00 per hour for dump truck, (xiii) from \$438.00 to \$350.00 per hour for dump truck w/ trailer, (xiv) from \$438.00 to \$350.00 per hour for roll off container (40-yard) + disposal fee, (xv) from \$263.00 to \$250.00 per hour for light tower (two-light minimum), (xvi) from \$350.00 to \$200.00 flat fee for pallet jacks, and (xvii) from \$350.00 to \$200.00 flat fee for rollers (off load). Additionally, Supervisor (Wreck Master) shall be increased from \$150.00 to \$162.00 per hour, Tech Labor (Driver, Rigger) shall be increased from \$100.00 to \$108.00 per hour, and Manual Labor shall be increased from \$75.00 to \$81.00 per hour.

The Authority's March 7, 2022 proposed rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(b) provide a reduction in free storage for all vehicles from 24 hours to 12 hours, and an increase in storage rates for passenger vehicles from \$25.00 to \$40.00 per calendar day. The Authority has determined that an additional increase in storage rates is warranted, given recent market forces. Therefore, storage rates shall be increased (i) from \$40.00 to \$43.00 per calendar day for passenger vehicles, (ii) from \$75.00 to \$81.00 per calendar day for vehicles up to 15,000 pounds G.V.W.R., and (iii) from \$75.00 to \$81.00 per unit per calendar day for all vehicles, except buses, over 15,000 G.V.W.R.

The Authority's March 7, 2022 proposed rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(a)(1), road service rates governing Class 1 vehicles on the New Jersey Turnpike, provide for an increase in the service charge from \$60.00 to \$75.00. The proposed rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(a)(7) for tire repair/replacement services for trucks and buses on the New Jersey Turnpike, provide for an increase in the maximum service charge from \$125.00 to \$156.00, and an increase in the maximum labor rate from \$75.00 per hour to \$94.00 per hour. The proposed charge for an additional tire change on the New Jersey Turnpike provides for an increase from \$25.00 to \$31.00 for

each tire change beyond the first tire change. The Authority has determined that an additional increase to these rates, averaging eight per cent (8%), is warranted, given recent market forces. Therefore, road service rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(a)(1) governing Class 1 vehicles on the New Jersey Turnpike will increase from \$75.00 to \$81.00. The maximum service charge at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(a)(7) for tire repair/replacement services for trucks and buses on the New Jersey Turnpike will increase from \$156.00 to \$168.00, and the maximum labor rate will increase from \$94.00 per hour to \$101.00 per hour. The charge for an additional tire change on the New Jersey Turnpike will increase from \$31.00 to \$33.50 for each tire change beyond the first tire change.

The Authority's March 7, 2022 proposed rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(b)(1), road service rates governing Class 1 vehicles on the Garden State Parkway, provide for an increase in the service charge from \$60.00 to \$75.00, and proposed rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(b)(7), tire repair/replacement services for trucks and buses on the Garden State Parkway, provide for an increase in the maximum service charge from \$125.00 to \$156.00, an increase in the maximum labor rate from \$75.00 per hour to \$94.00 per hour, and an increase in the charge for an additional tire change on the Garden State Parkway from \$25.00 to \$31.00 for each tire change beyond the first tire change. The Authority has determined that an additional increase to these rates, averaging eight per cent (8%), is warranted given recent market forces. Therefore, road service rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(b)(1) governing the service charge for Class 1 vehicles on the Garden State Parkway, shall increase from \$75.00 to \$81.00; the maximum service charge for tire repair/replacement services at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(b)(7), for trucks and buses on the Garden State Parkway, will increase from \$156.00 to \$168.00, and the maximum labor rate will increase from \$94.00 per hour to \$101.00 per hour. The charge for an additional tire change on the Garden State Parkway will increase from \$31.00 to \$33.50 for each tire change beyond the first tire change.

The above-summarized changes are non-substantial and merely reflect upward adjustments to proposed increases. The changes do not enlarge or curtail who and what will be affected by the proposed rule, or otherwise affect in any way the scope of the proposed rule.

#### **Federal Standards Statement**

The adopted amendments to the regulations, as proposed and as changed herein, do not contain any standards or requirements that exceed the standards or requirements imposed by federal law because no federal standards or requirements apply to the adopted amended regulations.

- i. Class 2 Vehicles (for the purpose of towing rates only, straight truck (up to **15,000** pounds G.V.W.R.), **Passenger Vehicle** with trailer, or trailer without Passenger Vehicle):
  - (1) Service charge of \$\*[198.00]\* \*214.00\* plus:
- (A) \$\*[4.50]\*4.75\* per mile on the Roadway, up to a maximum, including the service charge, of \$\*[243.00]\*\*261.50\*; or

- **ii.** Class 3 Vehicles (for the purpose of towing rates only, tractor trailer, bus (over 15,000 pounds G.V.W.R.), or any Vehicle requiring the use of a Landoll tractor trailer:
- (1) Service charge of \$\*[375.00]\*\*405.00\* plus \$\*[5.75]\*\*6.00\* per mile on the Roadway, up to a maximum, including the service charge, of \$\*[432.50]\*\*465.00\*.
- iii. Where applicable, the following additional fees may be charged for services to Class 2 or Class 3 [v]Vehicles:
- (1) \$\*[38.00]\*\*41.00\* for connecting air lines and \$\*[38.00]\*\*41.00\* for connecting lights;
  - (2) \$\*[68.00]\*\*73.50\* for disconnecting drive shaft on all trucks;
  - (3) \$\*[60.00]\*\*65.00\* per axle for removing an axle; and
  - (4) \$\*[68.00]\*\*73.50\* for removing an air scoop.
  - 3. Winching and wrecking (all classes of vehicles):
  - i. \$\*[140.00]\*\*151.00\* per hour for a light wrecker;
  - ii. \$\*[228.00]\*\*246.00 per hour for a heavy wrecker; and
- iii. Winching fees set forth [under] \*pursuant to\* this section shall only be charged for winching activities that occur when a Vehicle has left the Roadway, overturned, or become embedded, attached, or hitched to a tree, pole, guardrail, or other fixed object. Winching for purposes of this paragraph shall not include the act of pulling a Vehicle onto a tilt bed or carrier or lifting a Vehicle with a conventional tow sling.
  - **4.** Specialized equipment for routine towing services:
- i. \$438.00 per hour for specialized equipment, including, but not limited to, Oshkosh box trailer with tractor; and
- ii. \$788.00 per hour for Rotator 60-ton capacity and up, and for 50-ton construction crane.

- 5. Extra heavy duty towing and recovery services, which shall mean when used in this section, the immediate, coordinated, professional response by authorized extra heavy duty towing and recovery service contractors to incidents that have occurred on the Roadway, causing or having the potential to cause serious and lengthy disruption to Roadway operations, specifically, the normal flow of traffic, as determined in the sole discretion of the Authority. These incidents include, but are not limited to, large overturned commercial vehicles such as trucks, buses or spillage of products that require the use of special heavy duty recovery equipment and expertise to resolve. Extra heavy duty towing and recovery service contractors must provide service under critical time restraints and work under severe pressure in an effort to return the Roadway to normal operating conditions. Recovery equipment must be operated in a team response and coordinated effort, providing the utmost safety and care in the actual operation, which will include, but not be limited to, winching, uprighting of overturned commercial vehicles, towing and expeditious removal of all Vehicles, as well as the expeditious removal of cargo and debris from the affected Roadway. The Authority-authorized extra heavy duty towing and recovery services contractor shall be solely responsible for the removal of all such Vehicles, cargo and debris.
- i. Rates for the following extra heavy duty towing and recovery services, chargeable in one-half hour increments by Authority-authorized extra heavy duty towing and recovery services contractors, shall not exceed the following amounts:

The low bidder, D'Annunzio & Sons, Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. P200.578 be awarded to the low bidder, D'Annunzio & Sons, Inc. of South Plainfield, New Jersey in the amount of \$27,997,000.00. This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

This Order for Professional Services will provide supervision of construction services for site work at Service Areas on the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway, Phases 4 and 5. These services include construction inspection, material testing, record keeping, preparation of payment estimates, and other services required to ensure compliance with the contract documents.

This assignment is classified as a "Simple Project" based on the scope of work being clearly defined and not likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost not exceeding \$2,000,000.00. The solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and thirty-nine (39) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Codes: B151, Construction Management and B159, Building Construction & Renovations Inspection. One firm submitted an EOI by the closing date of May 2, 2022.

In accordance with the current procurement regulations, if fewer than three (3) EOI's are deemed complete, the EOI solicitation may be rewritten and/or re-solicited, or the procurement may continue with fewer than three firms, as determined by the Executive Director, in consultation with the Director." Authorization was granted to continue with the evaluation of the EOI received.

Subsequent to evaluating for completeness and scoring of the Expression of Interest, a Fee Proposal was requested from Gannett Fleming, Inc. The Fee Proposal has been reviewed, negotiated and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. A4037 be issued to the firm of Gannett Fleming, Inc. of Piscataway, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$1,960,000.00. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.35 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. The award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. These professional services were procured, and the recommended firm was selected, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seq., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).



Figure 1 - New Jersey Turnpike Vehicle Mileage Traveled and Total Crash Rate by Month





Figure 2 - Garden State Parkway Vehicle Mileage Traveled and Total Crash Rate by Month





Figure 3 - New Jersey Turnpike Injury and Property-Damage-Only Crashes by Month





## NEW JERSEY TURNPIKE FATAL CRASH SYNOPSIS 01/01/2022 - 05/31/2022

Description	Vehicle #1, a truck, was parked on the right shoulder of the Thomas Edison Service Area (10S) NOSA Ramp in a "No Stopping or Standing" zone. Vehicle #2 was traveling southbound on the NOSA Ramp. Subsequently, Vehicle #2 struck the rear of Vehicle #1. As a result of this crash, Driver #2 sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased 7:33 p.m. (Driver #2, male, age 55, killed)	Vehicle #1, an unregistered motorcycle, was traveling northbound on the Outer Roadway of the New Jersey Turnpike near Milepost 104.7. Subsequently, Vehicle #1 overturned and struck the underside of the guiderail to the right. Driver #1 was pronounced deceased. (Driver #1, male, age 22, killed)	Vehicle #1, Vehicle #2, Vehicle #3, and Vehicle #4 were entering the New Jersey Turnpike Interchange 14 Outside Entry Toll Plaza near Lane #1. The following un-audited results are for the five months ended May 31, 2022. Based upon these results, revenues will be sufficient to satisfy the requirements of the Authority's Bond Resolution. For the twelve months ending December 31, 2022, the Authority is budgeted to have a debt service coverage ratio of 1.80 and a total requirements coverage ratio of 1.41.

The Authority's total revenue for the five months ended May 31, 2022 was \$939,140,000, which is \$44,157,000, or 4.9%, above the 2022 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue was \$828,914,000, which is \$30,614,000, or 3.8%, more than the 2022 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue is greater than budget primarily due to stronger than projected commercial traffic growth on the New Jersey Turnpike. The month of May 2022 saw the most commercial traffic on the Turnpike than any other month since October 2018, as there has been an increase in tractor trailers on the roadway. However, the impacts of severe winter weather in the month of January 2022 accounted for an approximate \$8 million revenue loss and the winter weather at the end of March 2022 which accounted for an approximate \$2 million in additional revenue loss, for a total of a \$10 million loss. January 2022 was the 9th snowiest January since 1895, with an average snowfall of 18.1" across the entire State. E-ZPass fees were \$11,438,000, or 27.4%, above the budget due to conservative budgeting in 2022.

For the five months ended May 31, 2022, traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike increased 11.5% and toll revenue increased 14.2% compared to the same period in 2021. The increase in traffic is primarily due to the continued return to office, increased travel, and resumption of large-scale public events after the lifting of COVID-related restrictions in 2021. Toll revenue increased primarily due to the increase in traffic as well as due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing which went into effect on January 1, 2022. In addition, traffic and revenue also increased due to more travel during the February 2022 Presidents' Day, Easter and Memorial Day holiday weekends compared to the same periods as last year. Also, the month of May 2022 had one extra weekday compared to May 2021, which positively impacted results. The 2022 traffic and toll revenue budgets are based on the Authority's traffic engineering consultant's (CDM Smith) updated toll revenue forecast dated September 10, 2021. The updated forecast includes both the assumed improved impact of COVID-19 on travel and the 3% annual toll rate indexing. Considering these two factors, CDM Smith projected an 7.3% increase in traffic and an 8.1% increase in revenue as compared to prior year. The actual results for the five months ended May 31, 2022 were above CDM's projections, despite the severe winter weather in January and March which were not projected and accounted for an approximate \$7 million revenue loss. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 7.3% but revenue is up 33.7% for the same period. However, when comparing the month of May 2022 to May 2019, traffic has recovered to about 94% of pre-pandemic levels. Through April 2022, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the New Jersey Turnpike was 91.4%, an increase from 89.1% for the same period in 2021.

For the five months ended May 31, 2022, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway increased 6.1% and revenue increased 8.8% when compared to the same period in 2021. The increase in toll transactions is primarily due to the increase in travel as COVID-related restrictions were lifted in 2021, while toll revenue increased mainly due to the increase in toll transactions and also due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing. Increased travel during the Presidents' Day, Easter and Memorial Day holiday weekends as compared to last year also positively impacted results. The actual results for the five months ended May 31, 2022 were below the budget which was based on CDM's projection of an 6.8% increase in toll transactions and an 10.1% increase in toll revenue, due to the severe winter weather in January and March which were not projected and accounted for an approximate \$3 million revenue loss. The projections include both the assumed impacts of COVID-19 and the 3% annual toll rate indexing. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 8.8% and revenue is up 18.5%. However, when comparing the month of May 2022 to 2019, traffic has recovered to about 92% of pre-pandemic levels. Through April 2022, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the Garden State Parkway was 89.5%, an increase from 87.5% for the same period in 2021.

Operating expenses for the five months ended May 31, 2022 were approximately \$248,772,000, which is \$22,729,000, or 8.4%, below the year-to-date budget. The Authority's operating expenses through May were below budget primarily due to lower than budgeted snow/severe weather costs, lower salaries because of existing vacancies, and lower than budgeted health benefit costs, which were partially offset by higher than budgeted state police costs and transponder costs. The Authority spent a total of \$29,795,000 for snow and severe weather costs in 2022, with \$15,371,000 charged to operating expenses and an additional \$14,424,000 charged to extraordinary events in the General Reserve Fund. All snow and severe weather costs are considered operating expenses and paid from the Revenue Fund, except for declared state of emergency events, which are charged to the General Reserve Fund. The Authority still has about \$33,649,000 in total available in its 2022 operating expense and general reserve budgets for snow and severe weather costs.

## Financial Summary For the Five Months Ended May 31, 2022

Debt Service includes interest and principal payments on the Authority's outstanding bonds. For the five months ended May 31, 2022, Debt Service totaled \$357,608,000, which was \$10,767,000 or 2.9% below budget and included \$236,337,000 in interest payments and \$121,271,000 in principal payments. Debt Service is below budget partly because the budget assumed a \$500,000,000 new money bond issuance in January 2022 which has not been issued as of May 2022.

The General Reserve Fund includes all contractual payments subordinate to bondholders and expenditures for any other corporate purpose. The General Reserve Fund spending totaled \$200,836,000 for the five months ended May 31, 2022. Spending consisted primarily of \$145,816,000 for the new State Transportation Agreement, \$14,424,000 for Extraordinary Events (state of emergency weather events), and \$9,167,000 for the Transportation Trust Fund. Also included are \$20,833,000 in transfers to the Supplemental Capital program in the Construction Fund.

The Capital Budget, which is funded by revenue, consists of the Maintenance Reserve Fund, Special Project Reserve Fund, and the Supplemental Capital Program. For the five months ended May 31, 2022, total expenditures were approximately \$62,898,000, which was 37.1% of the year-to-date spending budget. Expenditures included \$7,568,000 for GSP Milepost 0-7 N&S Resurfacing, \$5,975,000 for GSP Milepost 80.8-91.5 N&S Resurfacing, and \$3,444,000 for TPK Milepost 3-12.1 NB Resurfacing. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$224,956,000.

The Construction Fund, which is funded from bond proceeds, consists of the 2022-2026 Capital Improvement Program, 2019 Capital Improvement Program, and the 2008 \$7 Billion Capital Improvement Program. For the five months ended May 31, 2022, total expenditures were approximately \$172,493,000, which was 73.0% of the year-to-date spending budget. Total expenditures included \$15,404,000 for Passaic River Bridge Rehabilitation, \$11,510,000 for TPK Install New Hybrid CMS, \$10,336,000 for TPK MP 35.3-37.9 & 74.3-74.4, and \$10,335,000 for GSP Shoulder Widening from MP 30 to 35. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$1,074,668,000.

University for E-ZPass Advertising and Safety Messaging

Date: June 20, 2022

This agenda item is a request to enter into three separate agreements for E-ZPass advertising and Safety Messaging at NY Jets, LLC, New Jersey Devils and Rutgers University sporting events for the 2022 and 2023 seasons. This initiative will advertise and promote the NJ E-ZPass concept as an easier and more efficient means of travel throughout the New Jersey area including various messages promoting safe travel.

The professional football event advertising package will consist of outside and inside stadium advertising for all 2022 pre-season and regular season home games. Specifically, advertising messages around the perimeter of the stadium, on over 2000 video monitors in and around the inside of the facility and radio spots throughout each event. Additionally, an E-ZPass Promotional Day will be scheduled to include on site interaction with patrons to further explain and promote the advantages of the E-ZPass concept. The cost for this advertising package is \$120,000.

The Rutgers University advertising package will consist of promotions for the 2022 football season and the 2022-2023 Rutgers wrestling and men's and woman's basketball seasons. Specifically, advertising will consist of video board exposure, radio initiatives and social media promotions. Additionally, an E-ZPass Promotional Day will be scheduled to further endorse the E-ZPass concept. The total cost for this project is \$120,000.

The New Jersey Devils agreement will include advertising promotions at all Devils home games and other major Prudential Center events. Specifically, exterior LED messaging, digital concourse messaging, concourse E-ZPass activations, in-game features and fan interaction and radio initiatives. The total cost for this project is \$120,000.

Accordingly, approval of these agreements is respectfully requested in the total amount of \$360,000. It is further recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute all documents relative thereto.

Authorization to Approve a Two Percent (2%) across the board increase

for certain non-aligned employees effective July 1, 2022

DATE:

The Authority is seeking authorization to approve salary increases for certain non-aligned NJTA employees effective July 1, 2022. In September 2021, the NJTA Board of Commissioners authorized a 2% salary increase for non-aligned employees which, at the time, excluded thirteen (13) Directors. Prior to this Board action, the last salary adjustment for these Directors was approved and implemented in 2018. At this time, a 2% salary increase is requested effective July 1, 2022, retroactive to January 1, 2022 at a total cost of approximately \$72,400.

Additionally, twenty-one (21) remaining non-aligned employees who received a 2% increase effective July 1, 2021, would also qualify for an increase effective July 1, 2022. The cost for these employees is approximately \$48,500 for an overall total cost of \$120,900. These salary increases have been budgeted in the 2022 NJTA Operating Budget. It is recommended all future increases for non-aligned personnel follow the authorized compensation for AFSCME Local 3914.

Therefore, authorization is requested to approve a two percent (2%) across the board salary increase effective July 1, 2022 to certain non-aligned employees as outlined above.
