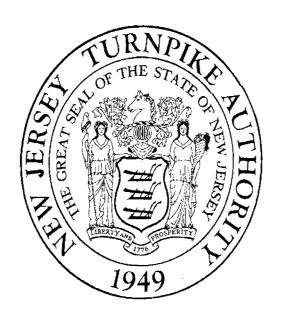

This matter is a wrongful death injury claim arising from a vehicular accident, where an off-duty State Trooper fatally injured a high school student as she was running across a roadway in the Township of Westfield on the evening of March 4, 2017. The Honorable Mark Ciarrocca, J.S.C. assisted the parties in reaching a tentative global settlement in the amount of \$1,100,000, recommending that NJTA contribute \$1,000,000. There is no issue of liability. Outside counsel is seeking approval of Judge Ciarrocca's recommendation in the amount of \$1,000,000. The Law Department concurs with the outside counsel's recommendation.

At its January 29, 2020 meeting (Agenda Item No. 019-01-2020), the Authority's Board of Commissioners authorized the award of a two-year contract to Maverick Building Services ("Maverick") to perform professional cleaning services at the Authority headquarters building in Woodbridge, NJ. Amount: \$1,000,000.00

This matter is a wrongful death claim arising from an off-duty Trooper, who was driving on Central Avenue in Westfield Township, when a high school student dashed across the roadway, and was fatally struck by the vehicle on the evening of March 4, 2017. It was reported that the roadway was very dark and poorly lit.

On November 8, 2019, the New Jersey Turnpike Authority and New Jersey State Police were dismissed from the case, where the court ruled that no liability was committed by them. Thereafter, on June 15, 2022, the parties attended a mandatory settlement conference that was presided by the Honorable Mark Ciarrocca, J.S.C. At the settlement conference, Judge Ciarrocca recommended to the parties a global settlement of \$1,100,000, with a split of \$1,000,000 from the Authority, and \$100,000 from the Westfield Board of Education. Because the Authority has a contractual responsibility to underwrite State Police Troop "D", it is therefore responsible for contributing the \$1,000,000 toward the recommended settlement. Outside counsel reviewed this matter and other similar matters that were previously adjudicated and/or settled to confirm that this proposed settlement value is reasonable given the facts of the case, in consideration of plaintiff's injury, age, and the projected future costs of defense. The Law Department concurs with outside counsel's recommendation in lieu of Judge Ciarrocca's tentative settlement proposal.

Therefore, it is recommended that the Authority's Commissioners approve the settlement of this matter pursuant to the terms set forth above. It is also recommended that the Authority's Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any and all documents in furtherance of same.

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority ("Authority") issued a request for qualifications ("RFQ") for Authority Counsel, Authority Counsel (Conflicts), and Special Counsels for six (6) practice areas (collectively "Counsels"). These Counsels will assist the Law Department in providing legal advice and advocacy for the Authority. Specialized practice areas included the following: 1) Litigation, 2) Bond/Tax Counsel, 3) Employment Practices and Labor Relations, 4) Insurance, 5) Intellectual Property, and 6) Police Protective. The terms of the contracts are for a period of two (2) years with the option to extend for two additional one-year terms at the discretion of the Authority.

The RFQ was advertised in the Star Ledger and the Asbury Park Press on April 8, 2022, the New Jersey Law Journal on April 11, 2022, and posted on the websites of the Authority and the State of New Jersey. In addition, 75 law firms listed on the Authority's vendor database were notified of the procurement. On May 4, 2022, the Authority received Qualifications from the 17 firms listed in Exhibit "A" attached hereto.

An Evaluation Committee ("Committee"), established by the Executive Director, consisted of the Deputy Executive Director, Director of Human Resources, and Director of Internal Audit. The Acting Director of Law and the Director of Procurement and Materials Management served as non-voting members of the Committee.

The RFQ stated clearly that the number of firms receiving specific awards would be determined by the Committee after the completion of its evaluation of all the Responses received. Set hourly rates for partners (\$200), associates (\$150) and legal assistants (\$90) were set forth in the RFQ.

The Committee reviewed the seventeen (17) Responses submitted. This review was extensive, incorporating the general information regarding each firm's profile and experience, as well as the qualifications and experience for

each firm in the individual practice area(s) for which they had responded. The Committee scored and ranked each Response based on the evaluation criteria set forth in the RFQ. The top ranked firms were invited for oral presentations on June 23, June 24, June 27, June 28, July 7, July 11, and July 13, 2022. Based on the written and oral presentations, the Committee then compiled a report that details the evaluation process and sets forth its findings and recommendations.

Below is the list of those firms the Committee recommends, after a thorough review of all Qualifications and oral presentations, for awards of Authority Counsel, Authority Counsel (Conflicts) and Special Counsels:

This contract will provide for the removal of substandard curve advisory signs and the installation of new curve advisory signs (both ground-mounted and bridge mounted) along approximately forty-five (45) select ramps at various northern interchanges on the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway. Electric flashing beacon signs will be installed where warranted. All work is scheduled to be substantially completed by November 2023.

Two bid proposals were received on June 14, 2022 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal, in the amount of \$5,245,075.00, may be compared to the second low bidder in the amount of \$7,450,954.04. The bids were significantly lower than the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$8,423,125.00, which is likely due to the low bidder's proximity to the project and current workload. The low bidder, J. Fletcher Creamer & Son, Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. A100.614 be awarded to the low bidder, J. Fletcher Creamer & Son, Inc. of Hackensack, New Jersey in the amount of \$5,245,075.00. This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

Frequently the Authority must expedite emergency repair work caused by accident or deterioration. These percentages represent a weighted average mark-up on the Contractor's time and materials cost of performing the work. Mount Construction Co., Inc. has performed work for the Authority on similar on-call Contracts and is considered competent to complete this Contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. A900.640 be awarded to the low bidder, Mount Construction Co., Inc. of Berlin, New Jersey in the amount of \$4,000,000.00. This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

This Order for Professional Services will provide design services for Contract No. T200.617, Roadway Lighting Improvements on the New Jersey Turnpike at the Northern and Southern Mixing Bowls. The work shall include the construction of multiple lighting systems with LED lighting at each location. Design services shall include development of construction plans and specifications for lighting systems, including design of remote monitoring and controls of the system, electrical power, utility coordination, utility orders, removal of existing facilities, and post design services.

This assignment is classified as a "Complex Project" since the scope of work is not clearly defined and likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost exceeds \$2,000,000.00. The Solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and thirty-six (36) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Code A300, Roadway Lighting Systems. Three firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of March 11, 2022.

In accordance with the regulations, for Complex Projects, "If only three or four EOIs have been deemed complete by the Authority, these firms shall receive the RFP and the Review Committee will not conduct an evaluation of the EOIs..." [19:9-2.8.3]. The Review Committee recommended that we proceed directly to the RFP phase of the procurement and solicit Technical and Fee Proposals from the three firms which submitted complete EOIs: Michael Baker International, Inc.; Stantec Consulting Services, Inc., and Arora and Associates, P.C. The Review Committee reviewed and evaluated each firm's Technical Proposal and it was determined that oral presentations would not be required. Final scoring resulted in Michael Baker International, Inc. being the highest technically ranked firm. The fee submitted by Michael Baker International, Inc. has been reviewed and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. T3875 be issued to the firm of Michael Baker International, Inc. of Newark, New Jersey in an amount not to exceed \$2,500,000.00. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.73 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. The award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same. This Order for Professional Services was approved at the December 2018 Commission Meeting in the amount of \$1,028,000.00 to provide for bridge inspection, condition evaluation and preparation of contract documents for Bridge Deck Repairs, Resurfacing and Miscellaneous Structural Repairs on the southern portion of the Parkway.

Supplement A provided for accelerated design services for bridge inspection, condition evaluation, development of construction documents and post-design construction support services for Contract No. P100.590, Parkway Bridge Superstructure Replacement, Milepost 106.3 to 106.5.

Supplement B will provide for unanticipated design services beyond the current authorized scope of work. The additional work requested by the Authority includes design and post-design services of a temporary roadway crossover from the GSP Southbound Outer Roadway (SBO) to the Southbound Inner Roadway (SBI) which will be issued as a Change of Plan (COP) to Contract No. P100.590. This crossover will provide an alternate route for SBO traffic exiting at Interchange 105 during the closure of the SBO exit ramp, which is necessary for the superstructure replacement. Also included in this supplement are additional design services and COPs for various repairs to Bridge No. 106.4SO located within the work zone.

It is, therefore, recommended that Supplement B to Order for Professional Services No. P3672 be issued to Stantec Consulting Services Inc. not to exceed the amount of \$400,000.00 with compensation on the same basis as the original Order for Professional Services. The addition of this amount increases the total authorized fee from \$2,528,000.00 to \$2,928,000.00. The original contract was procured pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seq., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

At its January 29, 2020 meeting (Agenda Item No. 019-01-2020), the Authority's Board of Commissioners authorized the award of a two-year contract to Maverick Building Services ("Maverick") to perform professional cleaning services at the Authority headquarters building in Woodbridge, NJ. The New Jersey Turnpike Authority ("Authority") issued a request for proposals ("RFP") to engage the services of a firm to provide deferred compensation program administration services related to the Authority's deferred compensation 457b plan ("Plan"). Specifically, the successful administrator will provide the Authority with high quality recordkeeping and administrative services as well as employee communications and education for the plan.

The RFP was advertised on June 1, 2022 in the Star Ledger and the Asbury Park Press and posted on the Authority's and State of New Jersey websites. In addition, the 7 firms listed in the Authority's database for the referenced services were notified of the procurement. On June 29, 2022, proposals were received from the following seven firms:

- 1. AIG Retirement Services ("AIG") Houston, TX
- 2. Empower Retirement LLC ("Empower") Greenwood Village, CO
- Equitable Financial Life Insurance Company ("Equitable") New York, NY
- 4. Lincoln Financial Group ("Lincoln") Fort Wayne, IN
- 5. MissionSquare Washington, DC
- 6. Nationwide Retirement Services ("Nationwide") Columbus, OH
- 7. Voya Retirement Insurance and Annuity Company ("Voya") Windsor, CT

An Evaluation Committee (the "Committee"), established by the Executive Director, consisted of personnel from the Authority's Internal Audit, Patron Services, and Finance Departments. In addition, staff from the Human Resources and Procurement and Materials Management Departments served as non-voting members of the Committee. MMA Securities-Centurion ("MMA"), the Authority's deferred compensation consultant, served as a non-voting member of the Committee to assist and advise the Authority throughout the procurement process.

The Committee reviewed the written proposals based on the criteria set forth in the RFP and scored each firm individually. Based on the Committee's review of the proposals, the Committee invited representatives from the four (4) top-ranked firms, namely Empower, Mission Square, Nationwide, and Voya, to make oral presentations and provide best and final offers ("BAFOs"). Based upon the written and oral presentations, the Committee prepared a report that detailed the evaluation process and set forth its findings and recommendation.

AGENDA ITEM NO.: 151-07-2022

The Committee found that all four firms were highly qualified and responsive to the Authority's Scope of Services. All four firms provided a professional and comprehensive oral presentation with experienced account management teams.

The Evaluation Committee recommends that the contract be awarded to MissionSquare. MissionSquare is a not-for-profit firm dedicated to governmental plan recordkeeping. Several aspects of their proposal stood out. For example, they proposed a non-proprietary stable value product, specifically the MassMutual Stable Value Diversified Fund. The Authority's credited interest rate would be established approximately one month prior to the transfer of assets. MissionSquare's proposed credited interest rate is higher than that offered by other proposers. In addition, MissionSquare recognized that an additional field representative would be needed to serve the Authority's participants and proposed hiring an additional representative in consultation with the Authority. Also, to assist with retirement planning, MissionSquare offers salaried Certified Financial Planners (CFP) to provide monthly webinars on financial planning topics for all employees and would make available to Authority plan participants with account balances of \$100,000 or more one-on-one CFP services including a full financial plan. MissionSquare proposed an education and communications campaign to insure a seamless transition for plan participants. Finally, MissionSquare proposed a participant charge of 2.5 basis points supplemented by a 20 basis point charge on the stable value diversified funds assets, for the lowest overall proposed pricing and stable value features.

This professional services procurement was conducted in accordance with *N.J.S.A.* 27:23-6.1, *N.J.A.C.* 19:9-2.1(b), Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006), and Executive Order No. 26 (Whitman 1994). This award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardees pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 and Executive Order No. 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same.

Accordingly, authorization is requested for Executive Director to enter into a five-year contract with MissionSquare for administration and investment services for the Plan on behalf of Plan participants. It is further requested that the Executive Director be delegated the discretion to exercise each of the two (2) optional one-year extensions upon satisfactory performance, subject to funding availability at the time of service. It is also requested that the Executive Director be authorized to take such actions and to execute any and all documents as deemed necessary and appropriate to further the intent and purpose of the authorization requested herein.

Figure 1 - New Jersey Turnpike Vehicle Mileage Traveled and Total Crash Rate by Month

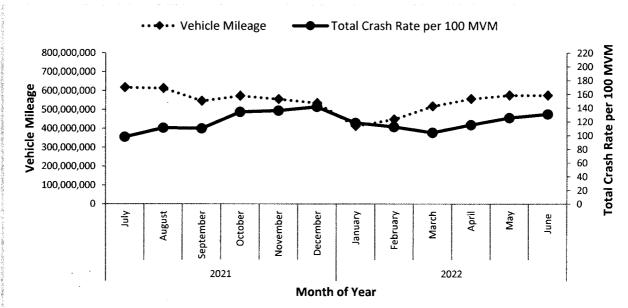
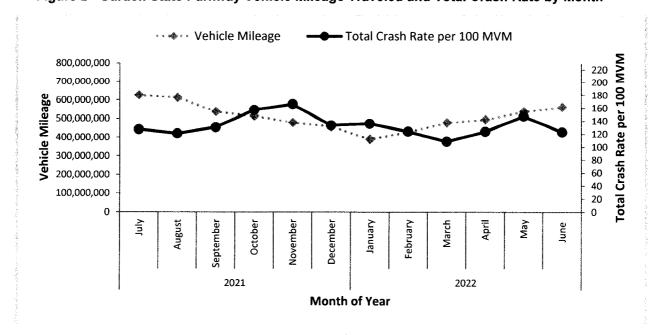


Figure 2 - Garden State Parkway Vehicle Mileage Traveled and Total Crash Rate by Month

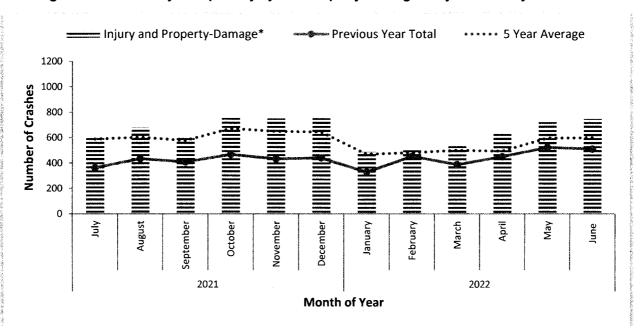
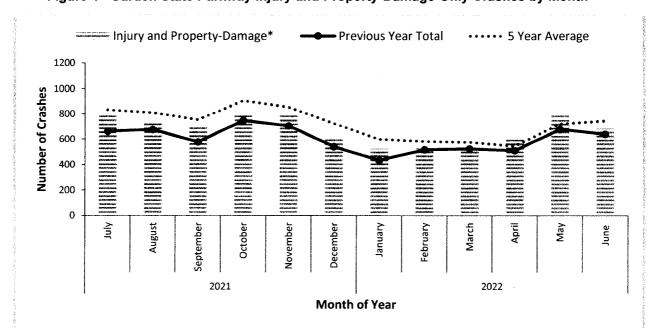


Figure 3 - New Jersey Turnpike Injury and Property-Damage-Only Crashes by Month

The following un-audited results are for the six months ended June 30, 2022. Based upon these results, revenues will be sufficient to satisfy the requirements of the Authority's Bond Resolution. For the twelve months ending December 31, 2022, the Authority is budgeted to have a debt service coverage ratio of 1.80 and a total requirements coverage ratio of 1.41.

The Authority's total revenue for the six months ended June 30, 2022 was \$1,152,654,000, which is \$51,215,000, or 4.6%, above the 2022 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue was \$1,019,227,000, which is \$33,627,000, or 3.4%, more than the 2022 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue is greater than budget primarily due to stronger than projected commercial traffic growth on the New Jersey Turnpike. The month of June 2022 saw the most commercial traffic on the Turnpike ever recorded, as there has been an increase in tractor trailers on the roadway. However, the impacts of severe winter weather in the month of January 2022 accounted for an approximate \$8 million revenue loss and the winter weather at the end of March 2022 which accounted for an approximate \$2 million in additional revenue loss, for a total of a \$10 million loss. January 2022 was the 9th snowiest January since 1895, with an average snowfall of 18.1" across the entire State. E-ZPass fees were \$13,197,000, or 26.4%, above the budget due to conservative budgeting in 2022.

For the six months ended June 30, 2022, traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike increased 9.7% and toll revenue increased 12.4% compared to the same period in 2021. The increase in traffic is primarily due to the continued return to office, increased travel, and resumption of large-scale public events after the lifting of COVID-related restrictions in 2021. Toll revenue increased primarily due to the increase in traffic as well as due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing which went into effect on January 1, 2022. In addition, traffic and revenue also increased due to more travel during the February 2022 Presidents' Day, Easter and Memorial Day holiday weekends compared to the same periods as last year. The 2022 traffic and toll revenue budgets are based on the Authority's traffic engineering consultant's (CDM Smith) updated toll revenue forecast dated September 10, 2021. The updated forecast includes both the assumed improved impact of COVID-19 on travel and the 3% annual toll rate indexing. Considering these two factors, CDM Smith projected a 6.0% increase in traffic and a 7.0% increase in revenue as compared to prior year. The actual results for the six months ended June 30, 2022 were above CDM's projections, despite the severe winter weather in January and March which were not projected and accounted for an approximate \$7 million revenue loss. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 6.6% but revenue is up 34.8% for the same period. However, when comparing the month of June 2022 to June 2019, traffic has recovered to about 97% of pre-pandemic levels. Through June 2022, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the New Jersey Turnpike was 91.4%, an increase from 89.1% for the same period in 2021.

For the six months ended June 30, 2022, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway increased 4.4% and revenue increased 6.8% when compared to the same period in 2021. The increase in toll transactions is primarily due to the increase in travel as COVID-related restrictions were lifted in 2021, while toll revenue increased mainly due to the increase in toll transactions and also to the 3% annual toll rate indexing. Increased travel during the Presidents' Day, Easter and Memorial Day holiday weekends as compared to last year also positively impacted results. The actual results for the six months ended June 30, 2022 were below the budget which was based on CDM's projection of a 5.2% increase in toll transactions and an 8.5% increase in toll revenue, due to the severe winter weather in January and March which were not projected and accounted for an approximate \$3 million revenue loss. The projections include both the assumed impacts of COVID-19 and the 3% annual toll rate indexing. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 8.2% and revenue is up 19.2%. However, when comparing the month of June 2022 to 2019, traffic has recovered to about 95% of prepandemic levels. Through June 2022, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the Garden State Parkway was 89.5%, an increase from 87.6% for the same period in 2021.

Operating expenses for the six months ended June 30, 2022 were approximately \$297,614,000, which is \$30,263,000, or 9.2%, below the year-to-date budget. The Authority's operating expenses through June were below budget primarily due to lower than budgeted snow/severe weather costs, lower salaries because of existing vacancies, and lower than budgeted prescription benefit costs, which were partially offset by higher than budgeted transponder costs and credit card transaction processing fees. The Authority spent a total of \$29,851,000 for snow and severe weather costs in 2022, with \$15,427,000 charged to operating expenses and an additional \$14,424,000 charged to extraordinary events in the General Reserve Fund. All snow and severe weather costs are considered operating expenses and paid from the Revenue Fund, except for declared state of emergency events, which are charged to the General Reserve Fund. The Authority still has about \$33,593,000 in total available in its 2022 operating expense and general reserve budgets for snow and severe weather costs.

Debt Service includes interest and principal payments on the Authority's outstanding bonds. For the six months ended June 30, 2022, Debt Service totaled \$429,089,000, which was \$12,961,000 or 2.9% below budget and included \$283,564,000 in interest payments and \$145,525,000 in principal payments. Debt Service is below budget partly because the budget assumed a \$500,000,000 new money bond issuance in January 2022 which has not been issued as of June 2022.

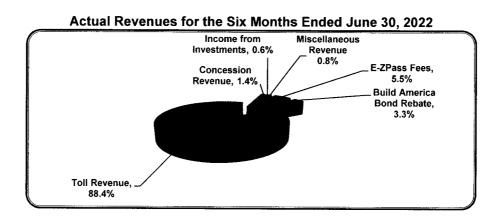
The General Reserve Fund includes all contractual payments subordinate to bondholders and expenditures for any other corporate purpose. The General Reserve Fund spending totaled \$239,632,000 for the six months ended June 30, 2022. Spending consisted primarily of \$175,000,000 for the new State Transportation Agreement, \$14,424,000 for Extraordinary Events (state of emergency weather events), and \$11,000,000 for the Transportation Trust Fund. Also included are \$25,000,000 in transfers to the Supplemental Capital program in the Construction Fund.

The Capital Budget, which is funded by revenue, consists of the Maintenance Reserve Fund, Special Project Reserve Fund, and the Supplemental Capital Program. For the six months ended June 30, 2022, total expenditures were approximately \$81,148,000, which was 39.1% of the year-to-date spending budget. Expenditures included \$8,873,000 for GSP Milepost 0-7 N&S Resurfacing, \$8,712,000 for GSP Milepost 80.8-91.5 N&S Resurfacing, and \$6,594,000 for TPK Milepost 3-12.1 NB Resurfacing. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$208,454,000.

The Construction Fund, which is funded from bond proceeds, consists of the 2022-2026 Capital Improvement Program, 2019 Capital Improvement Program, and the 2008 \$7 Billion Capital Improvement Program. For the six months ended June 30, 2022, total expenditures were approximately \$214,091,000, which was 75.8% of the year-to-date spending budget. Total expenditures included \$17,123,000 for Passaic River Bridge Rehabilitation, \$13,922,000 for TPK Bridge Rehabilitation W107.87, E107.88 and 84.24N&S, \$12,396,000 for GSP Shoulder Widening from MP 30 to 35, and \$11,684,000 TPK Install New Hybrid CMS. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$1,100,156,000.

For the six months ended June 30, 2022, total revenue was \$1,152,654,000, which was 4.6%, or \$51,215,000 above the 2022 Budget. Total revenue was above budget mainly due to the continued increase in travel and return to office since the lifting of COVID-19 restrictions in 2021.

Toll revenue for the period was \$1,019,227,000 which was 3.4%, or \$33,627,000 greater than the 2022 Budget amount. Toll revenue was \$37,653,000, or 5.1% higher than the 2022 Budget amount on the New Jersey Turnpike and \$4,026,000, or 1.6% lower than the 2022 Budget amount on the Garden State Parkway. Toll revenue was above budget primarily due to stronger than projected commercial vehicle traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike.

Concession revenue consists of revenues generated through the sale of food, gasoline and convenience store items at the service areas located along both roadways. Concession revenue was \$15,991,000 which was \$291,000 or 1.9% above the 2022 Budget. Revenue was slightly higher due to an increase in fuel revenue received from the 50% share of the gross profit margin on diesel sales. The increase in fuel revenue received was partially offset by declines in food sales on the Parkway the closure of the two McDonald's locations on the Parkway. On the Turnpike, food sales increased 21.6%, fuel sales decreased 15.9% and convenience store sales increased by 9.5% compared to last year. On the Garden State Parkway, food sales decreased 21.8%, fuel sales decreased 9.9%, and convenience store sales increased 10.3% compared to the same period in 2021. The increase in food and convenience store sales on the Turnpike are primarily due to the continued recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic, while the decrease in fuel sales is mainly due to the closure of the Woodrow Wilson and Molly Pitcher Service Areas for renovations, as well as the overall rise in gas prices. On the Parkway, the increase in Convenience Store sales is due to the continued recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic, while food sales decreased mainly due to the closure of the two McDonald's locations and fuel sales decreased due partly to the rise in gas prices.

Investment earnings consist of income from invested operating revenues and reserve funds. Investment income was \$6,998,000, which was \$3,998,000 or 133.3% higher than the 2022 Budget. Income from investments was above budget due to conservative budgeting in 2022. The budget did not project an increase in short-term interest rates, however, rates have increased due to the federal reserve increasing the fed funds rate in response to inflation.

Miscellaneous revenue includes fees for cell tower rentals, towing, fiber optic leases, park & ride commissions, property rentals, the Arts Center, and other items. Revenue for the period was \$8,732,000 which was \$93,000, or 1.1% higher than the 2022 Budget. Miscellaneous revenue was above the 2022 Budget levels due to approximately \$396,000 in FEMA recoveries for COVID-19 (Ongoing) and Hurricane Ida (2021), partially offset by cell tower and fiber revenue which are below budget as the budget included revenue for lease cancellations not known at the time the budget was developed.

The Build America Bond Subsidy is a direct payment from the U.S. Treasury to the Authority equaling about 35% of the interest payable on the Series 2009F and the Series 2010A Bonds for Federal Fiscal Year 2022 which began in October 2021. The subsidy due was \$38,509,000, which at the 2022 Budget amount.

E-ZPass fees consist of monthly membership fees, transponder sales, return check fees, administrative fees, interest on prepaid accounts and monthly statement fees. Revenue of \$63,197,000 was above budget due primarily to an increase in administrative fees, as well as an increase in monthly membership fees as accounts have increased and the increases were not budgeted

For the month of June 2022, traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike increased 2.4% and toll revenue increased 5.4% when compared to the same period in 2021. These results are ahead of CDM's projections of an increase of 0.5% for traffic and an increase of 2.1% for toll revenue for the month of June 2022 mainly due to stronger than projected commercial traffic. The 3,333,000 commercial vehicle transactions in June 2022 were the most monthly commercial transactions ever recorded. The increase in toll revenue compared to last year is partly due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing effective on January 1, 2022.

For the six months ended June 30, 2022, traffic increased 9.7% and toll revenue increased 12.4% when compared to the same period in 2021. Results were above the 2022 Budget which was based on CDM Smith's projections of a 6.0% increase in traffic and a 7.0% increase in revenue, as commercial vehicle traffic has continued to be stronger than projected due to improved economic conditions. Toll revenue has exceeded projections as traffic has exceeded projections. Traffic and revenue also increased due to increased travel and continued return to office after the lifting of COVID-related restrictions in 2021, as well as more travel during the February 2022 Presidents' Day, Easter and Memorial Day holiday weekends as compared to last year. Electronic toll collection remains popular and overall usage rates continue to be strong. For the six months ended June 30, 2022, the *E-ZPass* usage rate for passenger cars was 90.5%, and 96.5% for commercial vehicles. This resulted in an overall *E-ZPass* usage rate of 91.4%. The *E-ZPass* usage rate remains one of the highest in the region reflecting acceptance among commuters and frequent travelers of the *E-ZPass* brand and the convenience provided to the users throughout the Northeast.

For the month of June 2022, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway decreased by 2.4% and toll revenue decreased by 1.0% when compared to June 2021. The overall decrease in toll transactions can be partially attributed to the rising gas prices which impact discretionary travel, and the hybrid work schedules of commuters. The slight decrease in toll revenue is attributed to the decrease in transactions, as the toll revenue decline would have been larger if not for the 3% annual toll rate indexing effective January 1, 2022. The results were below CDM's projections of a 0.7% decrease in traffic and a 2.1% increase in toll revenue for June 2022 as the projections did not anticipate the significant increase in gas prices

For the six months ended June 30, 2022, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway increased 4.4% and toll revenue increased 6.8% when compared to the same period in 2021. Toll transactions increased due to the increase in travel after the lifting of COVID-19 related restrictions in 2021. However, toll revenue increased due not only to the increase in toll transactions, but also due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing effective January 1, 2022. Results fell below the 2022 Budget which was based on CDM Smith's projections of a 5.2% increase in toll transactions and an 8.5% increase in toll revenue, due in part to the severe winter weather in January and March which were not projected and accounted for an approximate \$3 million revenue loss and to the significant rise in gas prices which was also not projected. *E-ZPass* remains popular on the Garden State Parkway as electronic toll collection continues to increase. For the six months ended June 30, 2022, the total *E-ZPass* usage rate was 89.5%. The E-ZPass usage rate for passenger cars was 89.4%, and 95.0% for commercial vehicles.

For the six months ended June 30, 2022, operating expenses were approximately \$297,614,000, which was 44.3% of the annual budget. Operating expenses through June 2022 were under budget primarily due to lower than budgeted snow/severe weather costs of approximately \$13,000,000, salaries of approximately \$10,000,000 due to existing vacancies, and health benefits costs (primarily prescription costs) of about \$3,000,000. These under budget expenses were partially offset by higher than budgeted transponder costs of about \$2,000,000 and credit card transaction processing fees of approximately \$1,000,000

Debt Service

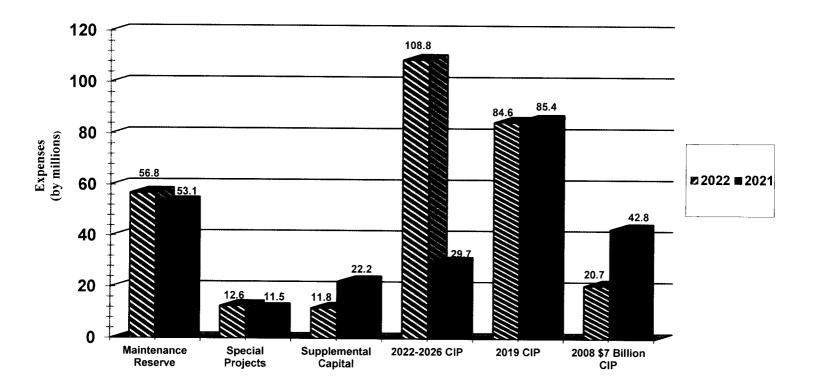
Debt Service includes interest and principal payments on the Authority's outstanding bonds. For the six months ended June 30, 2022, Debt Service totaled \$429,089,000 and included \$283,564,000 in interest payments and \$145,525,000 in principal payments. Debt Service is currently \$12,961,000 or 2.9% below budget partly because the budget assumed a \$500,000,000 new money bond issuance in the beginning of 2022 but has not been issued as of June 2022.

General Reserve Fund

The General Reserve Fund includes all contractual payments subordinate to bondholders and expenditures for any other corporate purpose. The General Reserve Fund spending totaled \$239,632,000 and consisted primarily of \$175,000,000 for the new State Transportation Agreement, \$14,424,000 for Extraordinary Events (state of emergency weather events), and \$11,000,000 for the Transportation Trust Fund. Also included are \$25,000,000 in transfers to the Supplemental Capital program in the Construction Fund.

The Capital Budget currently includes the Maintenance Reserve Fund, the Special Project Reserve Fund, and the Supplemental Capital Program. Current or accumulated revenues are used to support these funds. The Maintenance Reserve Fund covers the routine upkeep of the Authority's roadways with projects that are directly related to the Turnpike System. These projects consist of major resurfacing, structural repairs, major bridge repairs, and painting. The Special Project Reserve Fund covers non-routine maintenance of the roadways and facilities. These projects consist of, but are not limited to, improving the Authority's facilities, fleet and technology platform. The Supplemental Capital Program generally covers roadway and facilities improvements, as well as major technology initiatives. For the six months ended June 30, 2022, total expenditures from the Capital Budget were approximately \$81,148,000, which was 39.1% of the year-to-date spending budget. Expenditures included \$8,873,000 for GSP Milepost 0-7 N&S Resurfacing, \$8,712,000 for GSP Milepost 80.8-91.5 N&S Resurfacing, and \$6,594,000 for TPK Milepost 3-12.1 NB Resurfacing. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$208,454,000.

The Construction Fund, which is funded by bond proceeds, consists of the 2021-2025 Capital Improvement Program, 2019 Capital Improvement Program, and the 2008 \$7 Billion Capital Improvement Program. For the six months ended June 30, 2022, total expenditures were approximately \$214,091,000, which was 75.8% of the year-to-date spending budget. Expenditures included \$17,123,000 for Passaic River Bridge Rehabilitation, \$13,922,000 for TPK Bridge Rehabilitation W107.87, E107.88 and 84.24N&S, \$12,396,000 for GSP Shoulder Widening from MP 30 to 35, and \$11,684,000 TPK Install New Hybrid CMS. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$1,100,156,000.

Authorization to Enter into Memorandum of Understanding With the Department of Law and Public Safety, Division of

New Jersey State Police for Use of Certain Authority Property

The New Jersey Department of Law and Public Safety, Division of New Jersey State Police (NJSP), has requested the use of a portion of property owned by the Authority that is located at 14 Port Street in Newark (the "Property") for certain law enforcement purposes. Specifically, NJSP has requested the use of the second floor of the facility located on the Property, which is not used or needed by the Authority.

The Authority has a longstanding cooperative relationship with the NJSP, who provide law enforcement services for the Authority, including patrolling the Garden State Parkway and the New Jersey Turnpike. In the spirit of continuing cooperation with the NJSP and, as authorized by N.J.S.A 5214-1, it is hereby requested that the Executive Director be authorized to enter into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), substantially in the form attached hereto, to permit the NJSP to occupy the second floor of the facility on the Property pursuant to the terms and conditions contained in the MOU, and to take any other action deemed necessary to effectuate the authorization herein.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

BETWEEN THE

NEW JERSEY TURNPIKE AUTHORITY

AND

THE DEPARTMENT OF LAW AND PUBLIC SAFETY, DIVISION OF NEW JERSEY STATE POLICE

FOR

USE OF CERTAIN OFFICE SPACE

THIS AGREEMENT is between the New Jersey Turnpike Authority, (the Authority) a body corporate and politic, established pursuant N.J.S.A. 27:23-1, et seq., and the Department of Law and Public Safety, Division of New Jersey State Police (NJSP); and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Turnpike Authority owns certain property located at 14 Port Street, Newark, New Jersey (the Facility); and

WHEREAS, the NJSP has expressed interest in utilizing the 2nd floor of the Facility for certain law enforcement purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Authority wishes to assist the NJSP in its ongoing efforts to protect and serve the citizens of the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Authority is willing and able to permit the NJSP to use and occupy the 2nd floor of the Facility, which is not needed for Authority use; and

WHEREAS, the Parties are authorized to enter this cooperative agreement pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14-1, et seq. and N.J.S.A. 53:2-1, et seq.; and

WHEREAS, this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is intended to memorialize the relationship and the responsibilities of the Parties,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties agree as follows:

1. **Term.** Subject to the rights of termination set forth below, the term of this MOU commences upon the date that it is executed by both Parties, and shall continue in full force and effect for a term of fifteen (15) years.

2. **Termination.** This MOU may be terminated by either Party for any reason upon ninety (90) days written notice.

3. Use of Facility.

- a. NJSP is authorized to have unrestricted access to and use of the Facility, including exclusive use of the 2nd floor of the Facility. NJSP shall take good and reasonable care in using the Facility, consistent with its intended use.
- b. The Authority will provide parking for the NJSP as coordinated through the Authority.
- c. The Authority shall be responsible to maintain the Facility in good repair at no cost to NJSP, including but not limited to: payment of utilities, janitorial services, trash removal, recycling, pest management, grounds maintenance, and snow removal.
- d. NJSP shall immediately notify the Authority of any damage or malfunction, or need to repair any portion of the Facility occupied by NJSP.
- 4. **Liability.** The Authority acknowledges that any agreement signed on behalf of the NJSP by a State official shall be subject to all of the provisions of the New Jersey Tort Claims Act, N.J.S.A. 59:1-1 et. seq. (TCA), the New Jersey Contractual Liability Act, N.J.S.A. 59:13-1 et seq., and the availability of appropriations. The NJSP cannot agree to indemnify any third party for acts of negligence and is not providing any indemnification to any grantee, contractor or other Party. The State of New Jersey does not carry general liability insurance, but the liability of the State and the obligation of the State to be responsible for tort claims against it are covered under the terms and provisions of the TCA. The TCA also creates a fund into which the Legislature appropriates funds from time to time, and from which final tort claims are paid in accordance with its provisions. See N.J.S.A. 59:12-1.

- 5. Electronic Communication. The Parties agree that electronic communication via email is the preferred method for the exchange of notices under this MOU.
- 6. Assignment. The Parties may not assign their rights, duties or obligations under this MOU, either in whole or in part, without receiving the prior written consent of the other Party. Any assignment made without consent of the other Party shall be void and the nonassigning Party shall not recognize any such assignment.
- 7. Effect on Other Authorities. Nothing in this MOU is intended to restrict the authority of either Party to act as permitted by law, or to restrict either Party from administering or enforcing any law. This MOU should not be construed as limiting or impeding the basic spirit of cooperation that exists between the Parties.
- 8. Severability. Nothing in this MOU is intended to conflict with applicable State or federal laws or regulations or the directives of Attorney General of New Jersey, or either Party. If a provision of this MOU is inconsistent with such authority, that term shall be invalid, but the remaining terms and conditions of this MOU shall remain in full force and effect. The Parties may renegotiate the terms affected by the severance.

- 9. **No Private Rights Created.** This MOU does not create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable in law or in equity, against the State of New Jersey, or any state, against any department, agency, officer, employee of the State of New Jersey, or any state, against any entity, or any other person.
- 10. **Non-Waiver**. The failure by either Party to insist on performance of any term or condition or to exercise any right or privilege included in this MOU shall not constitute a waiver of same unless explicitly denominated in writing as a waiver and shall not in the future waive any such term or condition or any right or privilege. No waiver by a Party of any breach of any term of this MOU shall constitute a waiver of any subsequent breach or breaches of such term.
- 11. **Enforceability**. The Parties agree that this MOU shall not be enforceable as a matter of law or equity in any court or dispute resolution forum. Additionally, the Parties agree that the conditions of this MOU are not binding, and the sole remedy for non-performance under this MOU shall be termination, with no damages or penalty available to any Party.
- 12. **Amendments.** This MOU shall not be amended or modified without the express written consent of both Parties.
- 13. **Entire Agreement.** This MOU represents the entire agreement between the Parties and supersedes any written or oral understandings.
- 14. **Counterparts**. This MOU may be executed simultaneously in two or more counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.
- 15. **Electronic Signature.** The Parties agree that the execution of this Agreement by electronic signature and/or by exchanging PDF signatures will have the same legal force and effect as the exchange of original signatures.

RE: Authorization to Adjust Employee Health Benefit

Contributions as a Result of the Sunsetting of Chapter 78

DATE: July 25, 2022

Under P.L. 2011, c.78 ("Chapter 78"), public employees, including Authority employees, were required to make contributions toward the costs of health care benefits based on a sliding percentage of the cost of coverage. Lower compensated employees paid a smaller percentage of their annual salary and more highly compensated employees paid a higher percentage. The costs of an individual's health care benefits varied depending on the employee's choice of plan and type of coverage (e.g., employee only, employee and spouse, employee and child or and employee and family). The contributions were to be phased in immediately for non-union employees over a four-year period. For union employees, contributions did not commence until the collective bargaining agreements in effect when Chapter 78 was enacted had expired. Thereafter, the four-year phase-in requirement is complete, and Chapter 78 has sunset in accordance with its terms.

As a result of the sunsetting of Chapter 78, the Authority will commence negotiations with the unions representing the various classifications of Authority employees to adjust the contribution levels that were previously mandated by Chapter 78. Accordingly, authorization is requested to permit the Executive Director and/or Deputy Executive Director to negotiate new health benefits contribution rates for all Authority employees, union and non-union, which will be based on an employee's annual salary and health care costs. In this regard it is anticipated that an employee earning \$75,000 annually will be required to contribute at least 2.5% of annual earnings towards their health care costs.

As a whole, an adjustment in health benefit contributions by aligned and non-aligned employees will have a de minimis effect on the Authority's finances taking into account the health plans offered, employee usage and claims experience.

Accordingly, it is requested that the Board of Commissioners authorize the Executive Director and/or Deputy Executive Director to undertake all necessary actions to provide an adjustment in employee health benefit contributions for both aligned and non-aligned Authority employees in light of the sunsetting of Chapter 78. It is further requested that the Executive Director and/or Deputy Executive Director be authorized to execute all documents and take any other actions as deemed necessary to effectuate the intent hereof.
