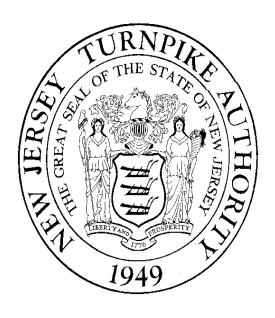

Under these contracts, multiple vendors will provide snow removal and salting services for various locations on both Roadways. The contracts will be for three (3) years with the option to extend for two (2) additional one-year terms. Contracts bid for this term consisted of (19) plow and/or spreader contracts for various locations on both roadways as well as (11) loader contracts at various toll plazas. Bidders were required to bid all-inclusive "Regular" operating hourly rates for specific equipment required for each location. Stand-by rates for trucks with plows were set at 50% of the hourly operating rate as bid. The bid also established fixed rates for supervisory and/or back-up vehicles at \$200.00 per hour (for both Regular and Stand-By hours).

Bidders could bid on any or all Areas and were required to quote unit and total prices for transportation costs for pickup and delivery (per container) at various locations within an Area (100 pickups per Area), as well as the per ton cost for the disposal and/or recycling of various materials (630 tons of materials per Area).

This extended term allows Rapid to continue servicing the Authority's revenue transportation needs while the Authority concludes the extensive procurement process for a new Services contract. The current authorized funds for this contract have been exhausted and now requires additional funds to continue these essential Services through the extended term.

RE: Request to Authorize Additional Amendments to the Authority's Regulations for

Towing and Road Service Fees set forth in N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1 and 3.2

Pursuant to the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.S.A. 27:23-5(s), the Authority's Board of Commissioners approved modest adjustments, which became effective August 1, 2022, to rules governing certain towing and road service rates under N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1 and 3.2. As a result of substantive comments received by the Authority during this recent rulemaking process, additional adjustments are: (i) warranted in these uncertain economic times, (ii) appropriate to bring routine towing and road service fees more in line with other regional toll roads, and (iii) necessary to ensure that a qualified pool of service providers remains available to perform these critical services on the Authority's toll roads, the Garden State Parkway and New Jersey Turnpike.

Additionally, concerns were raised by the insurance industry that some rate increases that became effective on August 1, 2022, exceeded New Jersey State Police ("NJSP") authorized rates. As the Authority does not desire to exceed an established State maximum, the applicable rates are proposed to be reduced to the NJSP maximum threshold.

As recommended by Authority staff, the proposed amendments to N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1 and 3.2, *inter alia*, will increase the maximum service charge for routine towing services on the Roadways for Class 1 vehicles (under 7,000 pounds Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVWR), generally "Passenger Vehicles") from \$108.00 to \$116.50 and increase the maximum per mile charge for Class 1 vehicles from \$4.00 per mile to \$4.25, up to a total 10-mile permitted maximum service and per mile charge of \$159.00.

Service charges for Class 2 Vehicles (between 7,000 and 15,000 pounds GVWR; i.e. straight truck or passenger vehicle with trailer) would increase from \$198.00 to \$214.00 and a per mile charge from \$4.50 to \$4.75 resulting in a total 10-mile permitted maximum service and per mile charge of \$261.50.

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Service charges for Class 3 vehicles (generally, over 15,000 pounds GVWR) would increase from \$375.00 to \$405.00 with the per mile charge of \$5.75 increasing to \$6.00 resulting in a total 10-mile permitted maximum service and per mile charge of \$465.00.

For the reasons set forth above, staff further recommends the following increases:

Services to Class 2 or Class 3 vehicles of \$38.00 for connecting air lines and \$38.00 for connecting lights; \$68.00 for disconnecting drive shaft on all trucks; \$60.00 per axle for removing an axle; and \$68.00 for removing an air scoop. Fees for services to Class 2 or Class 3 vehicles would increase from \$38.00 to \$41.00 for connecting air lines and from \$38.00 to \$41.00 for connecting lights; from \$68.00 to \$73.50 for disconnecting drive shaft on all trucks; from \$60.00 to \$65.00 per axle for removing an axle; and from \$68.00 to \$73.50 for removing an air scoop.

The current rates for winching and wrecking fees are \$140.00 per hour for a light wrecker, and \$228.00 per hour for a heavy wrecker. Fees for winching and wrecking would increase from \$140.00 to \$151.00 per hour for a light wrecker and from \$228.00 to \$246.00 per hour for a heavy wrecker.

Hourly rates covering equipment listed for extra heavy duty towing and recovery services, include (i) \$438.00 per hour for heavy duty wreckers, (ii) \$438.00 per hour for Landoll w/tractor, (iii) \$438.00 per hour for relief box trailer, (iv) \$788.00 per hour for 60-ton rotator, (v) \$788.00 per hour for 50-ton construction crane, (vi) \$105.00 per hour for light duty flatbed, (vii) \$105.00 per hour for light duty tow truck with wheel lift, (viii) \$525.00 per hour for relief refrigerator tractor trailer, (ix) \$350.00 per hour for tractor only, (x) \$438.00 per hour for heavy duty flatbed, (xi) \$438.00 per hour for service truck, (xii) \$438.00 per hour for front end loader (two-yard minimum bucket), (xiii) \$438.00 per hour for bob cat/skid steer, (xiv) \$438.00 per hour for fork lift (5,000 pounds minimum capacity), (xv) \$438.00 per hour for backhoe, (xvi) \$438.00 per hour for dump truck, (xvii) \$438.00 per hour for dump truck w/tractor, (xviii) \$438.00 per hour for roll off container (40-yard) + disposal fee, (xix) \$263.00 per hour for light tower (two-light minimum), (xx) \$350.00 flat fee for pallet jacks, and (xxi) \$350.00 flat fee for rollers (off load). Staff has determined that an increase is warranted for certain extra heavy-duty equipment, except where rates exceed analogous New Jersey State Police rates and are proposed herein for reduction, all for the reasons set forth above. Therefore, the current rates covering certain equipment listed for extra heavy duty towing and recovery services would increase as follows: (i) from \$438.00 to \$450.00 per hour for Landoll with tractor (ii) from \$105.00 to \$113 per hour for light duty flatbed (iii) from \$105.00 to \$113.00 per hour for light duty tow truck with wheel lift (iv) from \$438.00 to \$450.00 per hour for heavy duty flatbed and (v) from \$438.00 to \$450.00 per hour for service truck. Additionally, Supervisor (Wreck Master) would increase from \$150.00 to \$162.00 per hour, Tech Labor (Driver, Rigger) would increase from \$100.00 to \$108.00 per hour, and Manual Labor would increase from \$75.00 to \$81.00 per hour. However, the following rates for certain heavy duty equipment would be reduced as follows: (i) from \$525.00 to \$450.00 per hour for relief refrigerated tractor trailer (ii) from \$350.00 per hour to \$250.00 per hour for tractor only (iii) from \$438.00 to \$300 per hour for front end loader (two-yard minimum bucket) (iv) from \$438.00 to \$300.00 per hour for bob cat/skid steer (v) from \$438.00 to \$300.00 per hour for fork lift (5,000 pounds minimum capacity), (vi) from \$438.00 to \$300.00 per hour for backhoe (vii) from \$438.00 to \$350.00 per hour for dump truck (viii) from \$438.00 to \$350.00 per hour for dump truck w/ trailer (ix) from \$438.00 to \$350.00 per hour for roll off container (40-yard) + disposal fee (x) from \$263.00 to \$250.00 per hour for light tower (two-light minimum) (xi) from \$350.00 to \$200.00 flat fee for pallet jacks and (xii) from \$350.00 to \$200.00 flat fee for rollers (off load).

Current rates establish free storage of 12 hours for all vehicles, and storage rates (i) for passenger vehicles of \$40.00 per calendar day thereafter (ii) for vehicles up to 15,000 pounds GVWR of \$75.00 per calendar day thereafter (iii) vehicles over 15,000 GVWR: (a) all except buses: first 12 hours free; \$75.00 per unit per calendar day thereafter and (b) buses: first 12 hours free; \$150.00 per calendar day thereafter. Storage rates after the first 12 hours free would increase (i) from \$40.00 to \$43.00 per calendar day for passenger vehicles, (ii) from \$75.00 to \$81.00 per calendar day for vehicles up to 15,000 pounds GVWR, and (iii) from \$75.00 to \$81.00 per unit per calendar day for all vehicles over 15,000 GVWR, except buses. No increases are proposed for storage of buses.

Road service rates governing Class 1 vehicles on the New Jersey Turnpike, set forth a service charge of \$75.00. The current rates for tire repair/replacement services for trucks and buses on the New Jersey Turnpike, set forth a maximum service charge of \$156.00, and maximum labor rate of \$94.00 per hour. The charge for an additional tire change on the New Jersey Turnpike is \$31.00 for each tire change beyond the first tire change. Road service rates governing Class 1 vehicles on the New Jersey Turnpike would increase from \$75.00 to \$81.00. The maximum service charge for tire repair/replacement services for trucks and buses on the New Jersey Turnpike would increase from \$156.00 to \$168.00, and the maximum labor rate would increase from \$94.00 per hour to \$101.00 per hour. The charge for an additional tire change on the New Jersey Turnpike would increase from \$31.00 to \$33.50 for each tire change beyond the first tire change.

Road service rates governing Class 1 vehicles on the Garden State Parkway, set forth a service charge of \$75.00, and the current rates: tire repair/replacement services for trucks and buses on the Garden State Parkway, provide for a maximum service charge of \$156.00, maximum labor rate of \$94.00 per hour, and a charge for an additional tire change on the Garden State Parkway of \$31.00 for each tire change beyond the first tire change. Road service rates governing the service charge for Class 1 vehicles on the Garden State Parkway would increase from \$75.00 to \$81.00; the maximum service charge for tire repair/replacement services for trucks and buses on the Garden State Parkway, would increase from \$156.00 to \$168.00, and the maximum labor rate would increase from \$94.00 per hour to \$101.00 per hour. The charge for an additional tire change on the Garden State Parkway would increase from \$31.00 to \$33.50 for each tire change beyond the first tire change.

Accordingly, it is requested that the Board of Commissioners, approve the attached amendments to N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1 and 3.2, as summarized above, for submission to the Office of

The Agency proposal follows:

Summary

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the "Authority") proposes to amend its rules at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1 and 3.2 in response to substantive comments received by the Authority during its recent rulemaking process that culminated in modest adjustments, effective August 1, 2022, to the fees that may be charged by service providers for towing services and road services on the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway (the "Roadways"). Pursuant to the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.S.A. 27:23-5(s), the Authority has the power to adopt regulations to "fix maximum towing and storage fees" for towing and storage services on the Roadways. Prior to the recent changes, the Authority adjusted rates five (5) years ago after rates had remained unchanged for almost 13 years.

After surveying other regional toll roads, it is apparent that the Authority's towing and road services fees remain significantly lower, even considering the recent modest increases. Further, after careful consideration of the substantive

comments received from the towing industry during the recent rulemaking process, it is apparent that additional adjustments (i) are warranted in these uncertain economic times, (ii) are appropriate to bring routine towing and road service fees more in line with other regional toll roads, and (iii) are necessary to ensure that a qualified pool of service providers remains available to perform these critical services on the Authority's Roadways.

Additionally, concerns were raised by the insurance industry that some rate increases that became effective on August 1, 2022 exceeded New Jersey State Police ("NJSP") authorized rates. As the Authority does not desire to exceed an established State maximum, the applicable rates are herein proposed to be reduced to the NJSP maximum threshold.

A 60-day comment period is provided; therefore, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 1:30-3.3(a)5, the proposal is not subject to the provisions of N.J.A.C. 1:30-3.1 and 3.2 governing rulemaking calendars.

A summary of the proposed amendments follows:

The current rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(1) provide for a maximum service charge of \$108.00 for towing services for Class 1 vehicles (under 7,000 pounds Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (G.V.W.R.), generally, "Passenger Vehicles") and a per mile charge of \$4.00, with the total maximum fee for Class 1 vehicles, including the service charge, being \$148.00. The Authority has determined that an increase to these rates is warranted for the reasons set forth above. Therefore, the maximum service charge for towing services for Class 1 vehicles shall be increased from \$108.00 to \$116.50, and the per mile charge shall be increased from \$4.00 to \$4.25, resulting in an increase in the total maximum fee for Class 1 vehicles, including the service charge, from \$148.00 to \$159.00.

The current rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(2) set forth a maximum service charge for towing services for Class 2 vehicles (7,000 pounds and over G.V.W.R.; for example, straight truck, or passenger vehicle with trailer) of \$198.00, and a permile charge of \$4.50, resulting in a total maximum fee for Class 2 vehicles, including the service charge, of \$243.00. The Authority has determined that an increase to these rates is warranted for the reasons set forth above. Therefore, the maximum service charge for towing services for Class 2 vehicles (7,000 pounds and over G.V.W.R.; for example, straight truck, or passenger vehicle with trailer) shall be

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increased from \$198.00 to \$214.00, and the per-mile charge increased from \$4.50 to \$4.75, resulting in an increase in the total maximum fee for Class 2 vehicles, including the service charge, from \$243.00 to \$261.50.

The current rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(2)(ii) set forth a maximum service charge for towing services for Class 3 vehicles (generally, over 15,000 pounds G.V.W.R.) of \$375.00, and a per mile charge of \$5.75, resulting in a total maximum fee for Class 3 vehicles, including the service charge, of \$432.50. The Authority has determined that an increase to these rates is warranted for the reasons set forth above. Therefore, the maximum service charge for towing services for Class 3 vehicles (generally, over 15,000 pounds G.V.W.R.) shall be increased from \$375.00 to \$405.00, and the per-mile charge increased from \$5.75 to \$6.00, resulting in an increase in the total maximum fee for Class 3 vehicles, including the service charge, from \$432.50 to \$465.00.

The current rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(2)(iii) set forth fees for services to Class 2 or Class 3 vehicles of \$38.00 for connecting air lines and \$38.00 for connecting lights; \$68.00 for disconnecting drive shaft on all trucks; \$60.00 per axle for removing an axle; and \$68.00 for removing an air scoop. The Authority has determined that an increase is warranted for the reasons set forth above. Therefore, fees for services to Class 2 or Class 3 vehicles shall be increased from \$38.00 to \$41.00 for connecting air lines and from \$38.00 to \$41.00 for connecting lights; from \$68.00 to \$73.50 for disconnecting drive shaft on all trucks; from \$60.00 to \$65.00 per axle for removing an axle; and from \$68.00 to \$73.50 for removing an air scoop.

The current rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(3) set forth winching and wrecking fees of \$140.00 per hour for a light wrecker, and \$228.00 per hour for a heavy wrecker. The Authority has determined that an increase is warranted for the reasons set forth above. Therefore, fees for winching and wrecking at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(3) will be increased from \$140.00 to \$151.00 per hour for a light wrecker and from \$228.00 to \$246.00 per hour for a heavy wrecker.

The current rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(5) set forth hourly rates covering equipment listed for extra heavy duty towing and recovery services, including (i) \$438.00 per hour for heavy duty wreckers, (ii) \$438.00 per hour for Landoll w/tractor, (iii) \$438.00 per hour for relief box trailer, (iv) \$788.00 per hour for 60-

ton rotator, (v) \$788.00 per hour for 50-ton construction crane, (vi) \$105.00 per hour for light duty flatbed, (vii) \$105.00 per hour for light duty tow truck with wheel lift, (viii) \$525.00 per hour for relief refrigerator tractor trailer, (ix) \$350.00 per hour for tractor only, (x) \$438.00 per hour for heavy duty flatbed, (xi) \$438.00 per hour for service truck, (xii) \$438.00 per hour for front end loader (two-yard minimum bucket), (xiii) \$438.00 per hour for bob cat/skid steer, (xiv) \$438.00 per hour for fork lift (5,000 pounds minimum capacity), (xv) \$438.00 per hour for backhoe, (xvi) \$438.00 per hour for dump truck, (xvii) \$438.00 per hour for dump truck w/tractor, (xviii) \$438.00 per hour for roll off container (40-yard) + disposal fee, (xix) \$263.00 per hour for light tower (two-light minimum), (xx) \$350.00 flat fee for pallet jacks, and (xxi) \$350.00 flat fee for rollers (off load). The Authority has determined that an increase is warranted for certain extra heavy duty equipment, except where rates exceed analogous New Jersey State Police rates and are proposed herein for reduction, all for the reasons set forth above. Therefore, the current rates covering certain equipment listed for extra heavy duty towing and recovery services at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(a)(5) shall be increased as follows: (i) from \$438.00 to \$450.00 per hour for Landoll with tractor (ii) from \$105.00 to \$113 per hour for light duty flatbed (iii) from \$105.00 to \$113.00 per hour for light duty tow truck with wheel lift (iv) from \$438.00 to \$450.00 per hour for heavy duty flatbed and (v) from \$438.00 to \$450.00 per hour for service truck. Additionally, Supervisor (Wreck Master) shall be increased from \$150.00 to \$162.00 per hour, Tech Labor (Driver, Rigger) shall be increased from \$100.00 to \$108.00 per hour, and Manual Labor shall be increased from \$75.00 to \$81.00 per hour. The following rates for certain heavy duty equipment shall be reduced as follows: (i) from \$525.00 to \$450.00 per hour for relief refrigerated tractor trailer (ii) from \$350.00 per hour to \$250.00 per hour for tractor only (iii) from \$438.00 to \$300 per hour for front end loader (two-yard minimum bucket) (iv) from \$438.00 to \$300.00 per hour for bob cat/skid steer (v) from \$438.00 to \$300.00 per hour for fork lift (5,000 pounds minimum capacity), (vi) from \$438.00 to \$300.00 per hour for backhoe (vii) from \$438.00 to \$350.00 per hour for dump truck (viii) from \$438.00 to \$350.00 per hour for dump truck w/ trailer (ix) from \$438.00 to \$350.00 per hour for roll off container (40-yard) + disposal fee (x) from \$263.00 to \$250.00 per hour for light tower (two-light minimum) (xi) from \$350.00 to \$200.00 flat fee for pallet jacks and (xii) from \$350.00 to \$200.00 flat fee for rollers (off load).

The current rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.1(b) set forth free storage of 12 hours for all vehicles, and storage rates (i) for passenger vehicles of \$40.00 per calendar day

thereafter (ii) for vehicles up to 15,000 pounds G.V.W.R. of \$75.00 per calendar day thereafter (iii) vehicles over 15,000 G.V.W.R.: (a) all except buses: first 12 hours free; \$75.00 per unit per calendar day thereafter and (b) buses: first 12 hours free; \$150.00 per calendar day thereafter. The Authority has determined that an increase in storage rates is warranted for the reasons set forth above. Therefore, storage rates after the first 12 hours free shall be increased (i) from \$40.00 to \$43.00 per calendar day for passenger vehicles, (ii) from \$75.00 to \$81.00 per calendar day for vehicles up to 15,000 pounds G.V.W.R., and (iii) from \$75.00 to \$81.00 per unit per calendar day for all vehicles over 15,000 G.V.W.R., except buses. No increases are proposed for storage of buses.

The current rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(a)(1), road service rates governing Class 1 vehicles on the New Jersey Turnpike, set forth a service charge of \$75.00. The current rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(a)(7) for tire repair/replacement services for trucks and buses on the New Jersey Turnpike, set forth a maximum service charge of \$156.00, and maximum labor rate of \$94.00 per hour. The charge for an additional tire change on the New Jersey Turnpike is \$31.00 for each tire change beyond the first tire change. The Authority has determined that an increase to these rates is warranted for the reasons set forth above. Therefore, road service rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(a)(1) governing Class 1 vehicles on the New Jersey Turnpike will increase from \$75.00 to \$81.00. The maximum service charge at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(a)(7) for tire repair/replacement services for trucks and buses on the New Jersey Turnpike will increase from \$156.00 to \$168.00, and the maximum labor rate will increase from \$94.00 per hour to \$101.00 per hour. The charge for an additional tire change on the New Jersey Turnpike will increase from \$31.00 to \$33.50 for each tire change beyond the first tire change.

The current rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(b)(1), road service rates governing Class 1 vehicles on the Garden State Parkway, set forth a service charge of \$75.00, and the current rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(b)(7), tire repair/replacement services for trucks and buses on the Garden State Parkway, provide for a maximum service charge of \$156.00, maximum labor rate of \$94.00 per hour, and a charge for an additional tire change on the Garden State Parkway of \$31.00 for each tire change beyond the first tire change. The Authority has determined that an increase to these rates is warranted for the reasons set forth above. Therefore, road service rates at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(b)(1) governing the service charge for Class 1 vehicles on the Garden State Parkway shall increase from \$75.00 to \$81.00; the maximum

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service charge for tire repair/replacement services at N.J.A.C. 19:9-3.2(b)(7), for trucks and buses on the Garden State Parkway, will increase from \$156.00 to \$168.00, and the maximum labor rate will increase from \$94.00 per hour to \$101.00 per hour. The charge for an additional tire change on the Garden State Parkway will increase from \$31.00 to \$33.50 for each tire change beyond the first tire change.

Social Impact

The proposed amendments will enhance the competitive process for procuring towing services on the Roadways by increasing the pool of qualified towers and ensuring that there are sufficient qualified service providers available to provide safe, efficient and reliable services to Authority patrons. The proposed amendments are anticipated to encourage small business operators to continue to participate in the Authority's procurement of qualified towing contractors.

Economic Impact

The Authority does not anticipate that the amendments will have a significant economic impact on the Authority patrons who may be in need of the services while on the Roadways. Many patrons may be insulated from any economic impact of the amendments as a result of insurance coverage for emergency towing or through their membership in automobile clubs from whom they may be reimbursed. Moreover, all service providers who are awarded contracts to provide towing services on the Roadways are required to honor valid AAA membership in payment of services. Further, the Authority believes that any economic impact is offset by the assurance that, should a patron be in need of assistance on an Authority Roadway, their need will be addressed by a qualified, competent service provider in a timely manner to ensure their safety and that of the traveling public. Further, the proposed amendments reduce certain heavy duty service rates, in response to insurance industry concerns, to bring them in line with New Jersey State Police rates.

Federal Standards Statement

The proposed amendments to the regulations do not contain any standards or requirements that exceed the standards or requirements imposed by federal law because no federal standards or requirements apply to the proposed amended regulations.

Jobs Impact

The Authority believes that the proposed amendments to the regulations may result in the addition of, or ability to maintain, employees at service provider businesses, particularly small businesses.

Agriculture Industry Impact

The Authority does not believe that the proposed amendments will have any impact on the agriculture industry in New Jersey.

Regulatory Flexibility Analysis

The proposed amendments impose minimal compliance requirements on small business as defined by the Regulatory Flexibility Act, N.J.S.A. 52:14B-16 et seq., to the extent that such small businesses intend to participate in future procurements for towing services on the Authority's Roadways. These proposed amendments will be applied uniformly to all segments of the business community, including small businesses, and are in no way unduly burdensome.

Housing Affordability Impact

The proposed amendments will have no impact on affordable housing in New Jersey, and there is no likelihood that the rules would evoke a change in the average costs associated with housing because the regulations proposed for amendment concern towing services on the Authority's Roadways.

Smart Growth Impact

The proposed amendments will have an insignificant impact on smart growth, if any, and there is no likelihood that the rules proposed for amendment would evoke a change in housing production in Planning Areas 1 or 2 or within designated centers under the State Development and Redevelopment Plan because the rules proposed for amendment concern routine towing services on the Authority's Roadways.

Full text of the rule proposal follows (additions indicated in boldface **thus**; deletions indicated in brackets [thus]):

- (1) \$[38.00]41.00 for connecting air lines and \$[38.00]41.00 for connecting lights;
 - (2) \$[68.00]73.50 for disconnecting drive shaft on all trucks;
 - (3) \$[60.00]65.00 per axle for removing an axle; and
 - **(4)** \$[68.00]**73.50** for removing an air scoop.
 - **3.** Winching and wrecking (all classes of vehicles):
 - $\mathbf{i.}\$ \$[140.00] **151.00** per hour for a light wrecker;
 - ii. \$[228.00]**246.00** per hour for a heavy wrecker; and
- **iii.** Winching fees set forth pursuant to this section shall only be charged for winching activities that occur when a Vehicle has left the Roadway, overturned, or become embedded, attached, or hitched to a tree, pole, guardrail, or other fixed object. Winching for purposes of this paragraph shall not include the act of pulling a Vehicle onto a tilt bed or carrier or lifting a Vehicle with a conventional tow sling.
 - 4. Specialized equipment for routine towing services:

- i. \$438.00 per hour for specialized equipment, including, but not limited to, Oshkosh box trailer with tractor; and
- **ii.** \$788.00 per hour for Rotator 60-ton capacity and up, and for 50-ton construction crane.
- 5. Extra heavy duty towing and recovery services, which shall mean when used in this section, the immediate, coordinated, professional response by authorized extra heavy duty towing and recovery service contractors to incidents that have occurred on the Roadway, causing or having the potential to cause serious and lengthy disruption to Roadway operations, specifically, the normal flow of traffic, as determined in the sole discretion of the Authority. These incidents include, but are not limited to, large overturned commercial vehicles such as trucks, buses or spillage of products that require the use of special heavy duty recovery equipment and expertise to resolve. Extra heavy duty towing and recovery service contractors must provide service under critical time restraints and work under severe pressure in an effort to return the Roadway to normal operating conditions. Recovery equipment must be operated in a team response and coordinated effort, providing the utmost safety and care in the actual operation, which will include, but not be limited to, winching, uprighting of overturned commercial vehicles, towing and expeditious removal of all Vehicles, as well as the expeditious removal of cargo and debris from the affected Roadway. The Authority-authorized extra heavy duty towing and recovery services contractor shall be solely responsible for the removal of all such Vehicles, cargo and debris.
- i. Rates for the following extra heavy duty towing and recovery services, chargeable in one-half hour increments by Authority-authorized extra heavy duty towing and recovery services contractors, shall not exceed the following amounts:

- **(b)** Storage rates charged by Authority-authorized companies shall not exceed the following rates or such rates as may be approved and amended by the Board from time to time in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 et seq., and the rules on agency rulemaking, N.J.A.C. 1:30:
- **1.** Passenger Vehicles: First 12 hours free; \$[40.00]**43.00** per calendar day thereafter.
- **2.** Vehicles up to 15,000 pounds G.V.W.R.: First 12 hours free; \$[75.00] **81.00** per calendar day thereafter.
 - 3. Vehicles over 15,000 pounds G.V.W.R.:
- i. All except buses: First 12 hours free; \$[75.00]81.00 per unit per calendar day thereafter;
 - ii. Buses: First 12 hours free; \$ 150.00 per calendar day thereafter.

19:9-3.2 Road services rates on the Roadway

- (a) Road service rates on the Turnpike for Class 1 Vehicles charged by Authority-authorized service companies shall conform with the following rates or such rates as may be approved and amended by the Board from time to time in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 et seq., and the rules on agency rulemaking, N.J.A.C. 1:30:
 - **1.** Road service charge: \$[75.00]**81.00**;
 - 2. through 6. No change.
- **7.** Tire repair/replacement services for trucks and buses: The service charge to be charged by a contractor shall not exceed \$[156.00]**168.00**. The maximum hourly labor rate shall not exceed \$[94.00]**101.00** per hour. The only charges that a contractor may charge a patron are: the service charge bid by the contractor; if

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applicable, the hourly labor rate bid by the contractor multiplied by the actual time spent by the contractor at the scene, beyond the initial one-half hour, in repairing/replacing tires and/or rims; if applicable, an additional tire service charge of \$[31.00]33.50 for each additional tire change beyond the first tire change; and the retail price of any supplied tires or rims and any other related equipment supplied. No other charges are permitted. The terms "contractor," "service charge," "hourly labor rate" and "additional tire service charge" are defined terms that shall have the meanings set forth in the procurement documents issued by the Authority from time to time for tire repair/replacement services for trucks and buses.

- (b) Road service rates on the Parkway for Class 1 Vehicles charged by Authority-authorized towing and emergency service providers shall conform with the following rates or such rates as may be approved and amended by the Board from time to time in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, N.J.S.A. 52:14B-1 et seq., and the rules on agency rulemaking, N.J.A.C. 1:30:
 - **1.** Road service charge: \$[75.00]**81.00**;
 - 2. through 6. No change.
- 7. Tire repair/replacement services for trucks and buses: The service charge to be charged by a contractor shall not exceed \$[156.00]168.00. The maximum hourly labor rate shall not exceed \$[94.00]101.00 per hour. The only charges that a contractor may charge a patron are: the service charge bid by the contractor; if applicable, the hourly labor rate bid by the contractor multiplied by the actual time spent by the contractor at the scene, beyond the initial one-half hour, in repairing/replacing tires and/or rims; if applicable, an additional tire service charge of \$[31.00]33.50 for each additional tire change beyond the first tire change; and the retail price of any supplied tires or rims and any other related equipment supplied. No other charges are permitted. The terms "contractor," "service charge," "hourly labor rate" and "additional tire service charge" are defined terms that shall have the meanings set forth in the procurement documents issued by the Authority from time to time for tire repair/replacement services for trucks and buses.

(September 29, 2022 - September 29, 2023) Renewal Amount: not to exceed \$1,655,500 Account No.: 010-00-822-121010

In order to protect itself from a myriad of cyber risks, the Authority has maintained comprehensive cyber liability insurance, which coverage expires September 29, 2022. This insurance, currently with a \$1,000,000 retention, provides the Authority with protection from theft and ransom of its electronic data and other cyber-related risks, including the following: (1) Media Wrongful Acts; (2) Privacy and Cyber Security; (3) Privacy Regulatory Defense, Awards and Fines; (4) Data Recovery Expenses; (5) Data Breach Response and Crisis Management Costs; (6) Cyber Extortion and Ransomware; and (7) Business Interruption and Dependent Business Interruption coverage (the "Program").

Due to numerous cyber breaches and resulting losses which the cyber market has experienced and is still experiencing, Willis of New Jersey, Inc. ("Willis"), the Authority's broker of record, advised of another extremely difficult renewal market. The Authority provided the underwriters with an update regarding the upgrades to its security protocols and cyber protections made during the past year, which were favorably received. Willis continues to market the Program and will provide firm quotations with the incumbent carriers and any new carriers that provide enhanced coverage at a more favorable price than incumbent carriers.

The total not-to-exceed premium for coverage as outlined above will not exceed \$1,655,500, including all New Jersey mandatory taxes and surcharges.

It is therefore recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to renew the Program at an amount not to exceed the amount set forth above. It is also requested that the Executive Director be authorized to execute all documents and to take all further actions to effectuate the renewal of the Program consistent with the intent of the recommendation.

Under these contracts, multiple vendors will provide snow removal and salting services for various locations on both Roadways. The contracts will be for three (3) years with the option to extend for two (2) additional one-year terms. Contracts bid for this term consisted of 19 plow and/or spreader contracts for various locations on both roadways as well as 11 loader contracts at various service areas, commuter lots, toll plazas, and Authority facilities. Bidders were required to bid all-inclusive "Regular" operating hourly rates for specific equipment required for each location. The maximum allowable hourly bid rate for loaders was capped at \$375.00 with a set Stand-By rate of \$187.50 per hour. Stand-by rates for trucks with plows were set at 50% of the hourly operating rate as bid. The bid also established fixed rates for supervisory and/or back-up vehicles at \$200.00 per hour (for both Regular and Stand-By hours). The bid was fully advertised and the 34 vendors listed in the Authority's database for the referenced services were notified of the procurement. On July 26, 2022, compliant bids were received from 8 contractors for 19 of the 30 locations solicited. No compliant bids were received for 11 locations and these contracts will be promptly re-advertised and rebid. The Operations and Procurement and Materials Management ("PMM") Departments' staffs thoroughly reviewed all bids (including inspection of the required equipment listed with the bids), and make the following recommendations:

1. Non-Compliance

- a. An additional bid was received from Seashore Asphalt Corp. ("Seashore") of Woodbine, NJ for contract LPP-20-22. This bidder, however, bid an Hourly Operating Rate of \$574.00 which is in excess of the maximum allowable Hourly Operating Rate of \$375.00 for Loader equipment, as stated in Section 2.18.1 (Operating Time) of the RFB. Thus, it is recommended that the bid submitted by Seashore be rejected.
- b. Additional bids were submitted by Canyon Trucking, Inc, Brick, NJ ("Canyon"), Central Jersey Landscaping, Inc., Chesterfield, NJ ("Central Jersey"), L & Y Enterprises, LLC., Paterson, NJ ("L&Y"), Shorty Trucking, LLC., Hazlet, NJ ("Shorty") and Suffolk Recycling Corp., South Toms River, NJ ("Suffolk"). These bidders, however, failed to provide a valid form of Bid Security at the time of bid submittal, as required in the specifications. Section 1.3 (Bidder Guidelines/Checklist), 1.3.1

of the RFB states that a "Bid Bond, Letter of Surety or Cashier's Check for 10% of the amount Bid" is a mandatory requirement, and failure to submit one will result in bid rejection. In addition, Shorty failed to include Notification of Intent to Subcontract, also a mandatory requirement as stated in 1.3.1. Thus, it is recommended that the bid submitted by Shorty Trucking, LLC. be rejected.

2. Staff recommends that contracts for snow removal and salting services be awarded to the lowest responsible bidders (highlighted in bold in the attached bid results).

Bids were procured, and authorization is being sought to award these contracts in accordance with *N.J.S.A.* 27:23-1 *et seq.*, the Authority's enabling legislation, *N.J.A.C.* 19:9-2.2, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006). These awards are contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 and Executive Order No. 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same.

Accordingly, authorization is requested to award contracts to 8 vendors for snow removal and salting services as outlined herein, for a total amount not to exceed \$7,902,600.00 for the three (3) snow seasons, subject to funding availability at the time of service. Authorization is further requested for the Executive Director to approve each of the two, one-year extensions upon satisfactory performance by the vendors. The prices for the succeeding years of the contract will be adjusted yearly based on a Consumer Price Index ("CPI") factor consisting of the average of 1) the New York/ Northern New Jersey CPI and 2) the Philadelphia/Southern New Jersey CPI. The maximum annual increase permitted however shall be five percent.

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority ("Authority") issued a request for proposal ("RFP") to engage the services of a firm to provide health benefits consulting services for the Authority's self-funded health and welfare benefits program. Specifically, the selected proposer will provide the Authority with, but not limited to, annual rate setting, claims processing analysis, actuarial and legislative analysis, stop loss placement and other health related tasks.

The RFP was publicly advertised on June 8, 2022, posted on the Authority's and State of New Jersey websites and distributed to twelve (12) firms. On July 7, 2022, proposals were received from the following seven (7) firms:

- 7. Willis Towers Watson Northeast, Inc. New York, NY

An Evaluation Committee (the "Committee"), established by the Executive Director, consisted of personnel from the Authority's Human Resources and Internal Audit Departments. In addition, staff from the Internal Audit and Procurement and Materials Management Departments served as non-voting members of the Committee. The Committee reviewed the written proposals based on the criteria set forth in the RFP and scored each firm

individually. Based on the Committee's review of the proposals, the Committee invited representatives from the following five top ranked firms to make oral presentations and provide best and final offers ("BAFO"s):

- 1. Buck Global LLC
- 2. Conner Strong & Buckelew Companies, LLC
- 3. Gallagher Benefit Services, Inc.
- 4. Lockton Company
- 5. Segal Company

All five firms provided a professional and comprehensive proposal and oral presentation. The Committee's findings were presented in an Evaluation Report. The Committee scored the firms based on the written proposals, oral presentations, responses to questions and BAFOs.

Buck Global LLC ("Buck") received the highest overall score. Buck's written proposal was fully responsive to the Scope of Services in the RFP and the firm presented a professional and comprehensive oral presentation by their senior management. Buck's proposed project team has extensive experience in benefits consulting, claims audit, actuarial services, Employer Group Waiver Plan ("EGWP") analysis and labor negotiations, and is recognized as one of the leading benefits consulting companies in the industry. Buck's proposal considers all the Authority's needs. They also included a performance guarantee of 50% of its fees for core services, as well as a \$25,000 one-time credit towards core services in year 3. Buck's oral presentation was impressive and showed a clear understanding of the challenges facing the Authority, including timeline and negotiations for Stop Loss marketing, as well as numerous and complex employee and retiree health plans.

Buck proposed annual fees of \$192,500 for year 1, \$200,000 for year 2, \$208,000 for year 3, a one-time charge of \$20,000 for an EGWP analysis, a one-time charge of \$30,000 for a Compliance Audit, and after applying the \$25,000 credit the initial three-year contract fee would not exceed \$625,500. Buck also quoted fees for the extension years 4 and 5 should the Authority exercise these options. The proposed fees for year 4 are \$214,000 and \$220,000 for year 5.

The procurement process for this professional services contract was conducted in accordance with *N.J.S.A.* 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, *N.J.A.C.* 19:9-2.1(b) promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006). The New Jersey Turnpike Authority ("Authority") issued a Request for Proposals ("RFP") to secure the services of a qualified healthcare firm or firms to administer the Authority's self-funded vision health benefits program. The scope of services included but was not limited to the accurate processing and payment of the Authority's health claims. The successful proposers will also provide: 1) their own provider networks; 2) account management and administrative services; 3) performance guarantees; and 4) accurate and auditable claims reporting and invoicing.

On May 19, 2022, the RFP was advertised and posted on the websites of the Authority and the State of New Jersey. The RFP was also distributed to 14 firms. On June 7, 2022, a pre-proposal meeting was held. On or before the closing date of June 23, 2022, the Authority received proposals from the following three (3) firms:

- 1. EyeMed Vision Care, LLC Mason, OH
- 2. National Vision Administrators, LLC Clifton NJ
- Vision Benefits of America Carnegie, PA

The Evaluation Committee ("Committee"), which was approved by the Executive Director, consisted of voting members from the Authority's Human Resources, Internal Audit and Finance Departments. Nonvoting members from the Authority's Internal Audit and Procurement and Materials Management ("PMM") Departments. In addition, the Segal Company ("Segal"), the Authority's health benefits consultant, served as a non-voting member of the Committee to assist and advise the Authority throughout the procurement process.

The Committee ranked all proposals numerically based upon technical and cost criteria and determined that further consideration be given to all three firms. The three firms were invited for oral presentations,

and each firm was given the opportunity to submit a best and final offer ("BAFO") regarding its fee proposal. After oral presentations and receipt of BAFOs, the Committee recommends that the Authority award a contract for Vision Benefits Administration Services to EyeMed. EyeMed presented the most favorable proposal for the Authority employees and offered the lowest administration cost at \$0.30 per employee per month ("PEPM").

This professional services procurement was conducted in accordance with *N.J.S.A.* 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, *N.J.A.C.* 19:9-2.1(b) promulgated pursuant thereto, Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006), and Executive Order No. 26 (Whitman 1994). These awards are contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardees pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 and Executive Order No. 117 (Corzine 2008), and having no objection to same.

Accordingly, authorization is requested to award a contract for a term commencing on January 1, 2023 and terminating on December 31, 2024 to EyeMed Vision Care, LLC for Self-Funded Vision Health Benefits Administration Services in an amount not to exceed \$19,800.00, subject to funding availability at the time of service.

Authorization is further requested for the Executive Director to approve each of two, optional one-year extensions upon satisfactory performance (and upon recommendation of the Human Resources Department), subject to funding availability at the time of service. 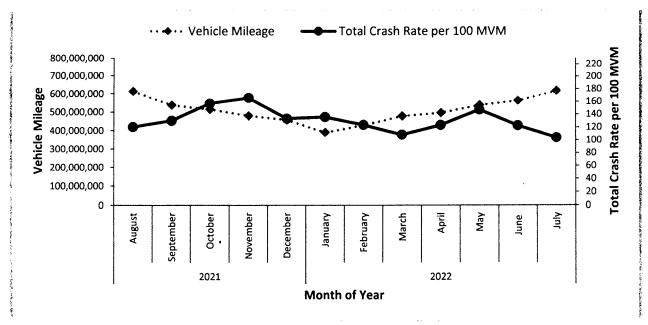

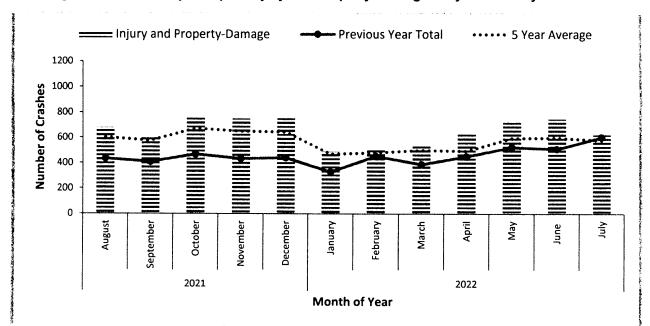
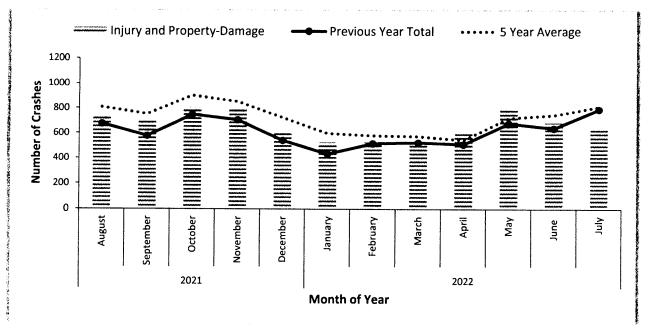


Figure 3 - New Jersey Turnpike Injury and Property-Damage-Only Crashes by Month

Description	Vehicle #1 and Vehicle #2 were traveling southbound on the New Jersey Turnpike approaching the Inside-Exit of the Toll Plaza at Interchange 1 at Milepost 2.3. Subsequently, Vehicle #2 struck the rear of Vehicle #1 as both vehicles were approaching Lane #14 of the Toll Plaza resulting in Vehicle #2 overturning onto its right side and slid laterally into Toll Lanes #11 through #14. Upon overturning, Vehicle #2 struck the booths and structure of the Toll Plaza. During the impact, Driver #2, whom was not wearing a seatbelt, was ejected from the vehicle and sustained serious injuries. Passenger #1 of Vehicle #2 sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased at 5:39 a.m. (Passenger #1, female, age 23, killed)	Vehicle #1 was traveling northbound on the Outer Roadway of the New Jersey Turnpike near Milepost 63.4. Subsequently, Vehicle #1 entered the left shoulder and struck the guiderail on the left side before overturning and impacting a concrete bridge support. Driver #1 sustained fatal injuries and was pronounced deceased at 5:19 a.m. (Driver #1, male, age 36, killed)	Vehicle #1 and Vehicle #2 were traveling northbound on the Outer Roadway of the Western Spur of the New Jersey Turnpike near Milepost 105.9. The following un-audited results are for the seven months ended July 31, 2022. Based upon these results, revenues will be sufficient to satisfy the requirements of the Authority's Bond Resolution. For the twelve months ending December 31, 2022, the Authority is budgeted to have a debt service coverage ratio of 1.80 and a total requirements coverage ratio of 1.41.

The Authority's total revenue for the seven months ended July 31, 2022 was \$1,373,774,000, which is \$60,079,000, or 4.6%, above the 2022 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue was \$1,215,283,000, which is \$36,583,000, or 3.1%, more than the 2022 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue is greater than budget primarily due to stronger than projected commercial traffic growth on the New Jersey Turnpike. The month of June 2022 saw the most commercial traffic on the Turnpike ever recorded, as there has been an increase in tractor trailers on the roadway. Significant increases in gas prices have impacted discretionary traffic on both roadways, but mostly on the Garden State Parkway with both toll transactions and toll revenue below budget. Gas prices averaged \$1.35/gallon higher in the first seven months of 2022 compared to the same period in 2021. However, when compared to June 2022, gas prices have decreased \$0.30/gallon. E-ZPass fees were \$15,325,000, or 26.3%, above the budget due to conservative budgeting in 2022 and interest income was \$6,146,000, or 175.6%, above budget due to the increase in interest rates above budgeted levels.

For the seven months ended July 31, 2022, traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike increased 8.0% and toll revenue increased 11.0% compared to the same period in 2021. The increase in traffic is primarily due to the continued return to office, increased travel, and resumption of large-scale public events after the lifting of COVID-related restrictions in 2021. Toll revenue increased primarily due to the increase in traffic as well as due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing which went into effect on January 1, 2022. In addition, traffic and revenue also increased due to more travel during the February 2022 Presidents' Day, Easter, Memorial Day and 4th of July holiday weekends compared to the same periods as last year. The 2022 traffic and toll revenue budgets are based on the Authority's traffic engineering consultant's (CDM Smith) updated toll revenue forecast dated September 10, 2021. The updated forecast includes both the assumed improved impact of COVID-19 on travel and the 3% annual toll rate indexing. Considering these two factors, CDM Smith projected a 4.9% increase in traffic and a 5.8% increase in revenue as compared to prior year. The actual results for the seven months ended July 31, 2022 were above CDM's projections, despite the significant increase in gas prices in 2022 which was not projected. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 6.6% but revenue is up 35.3% for the same period. However, when comparing the month of July 2022 to July 2019, traffic has recovered to about 94% of pre-pandemic levels. Through July 2022, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the New Jersey Turnpike was 91.3%, an increase from 89.1% for the same period in 2021.

For the seven months ended July 31, 2022, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway increased 3.4% and revenue increased 5.6% when compared to the same period in 2021. The increase in toll transactions is primarily due to the increase in travel as COVID-related restrictions were lifted in 2021, while toll revenue increased mainly due to the increase in toll transactions as well as the 3% annual toll rate indexing. Increased travel during the Presidents' Day, Easter, Memorial Day and 4th of July holiday weekends as compared to last year also positively impacted results. The actual results for the seven months ended July 31, 2022 were below the budget which was based on CDM's projection of a 4.5% increase in toll transactions and an 7.7% increase in toll revenue, due mainly to the significant increase in gas prices in 2022 which have impacted discretionary travel and was not projected. The projections include both the assumed impacts of COVID-19 and the 3% annual toll rate indexing. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 7.8% and revenue is up 19.5%. However, when comparing the month of July 2022 to July 2019, traffic has recovered to about 95% of pre-pandemic levels. Through July 2022, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the Garden State Parkway was 89.5%, an increase from 87.7% for the same period in 2021.

Operating expenses for the seven months ended July 31, 2022 were approximately \$346,271,000, which is \$36,614,000, or 9.6%, below the year-to-date budget. The Authority's operating expenses through July were below budget primarily due to lower than budgeted snow/severe weather costs, lower salaries because of existing vacancies, and lower than budgeted prescription benefit costs, which were partially offset by higher than budgeted transponder costs, credit card transaction processing fees, and state police costs. The Authority spent a total of \$29,855,000 for snow and severe weather costs in 2022, with \$15,431,000 charged to operating expenses and an additional \$14,424,000 charged to extraordinary events in the General Reserve Fund. All snow and severe weather costs are considered operating expenses and paid from the Revenue Fund, except for declared state of emergency events, which are charged to the General Reserve Fund. The Authority still has about \$33,589,000 in total available in its 2022 operating expense and general reserve budgets for snow and severe weather costs.

Debt Service includes interest and principal payments on the Authority's outstanding bonds. For the seven months ended July 31, 2022, Debt Service totaled \$500,594,000, which was \$18,255,000 or 3.5% below budget and included \$330,815,000 in interest payments and \$169,779,000 in principal payments. Debt Service is below budget partly because the budget assumed a \$500,000,000 new money bond issuance in January 2022 which has not been issued as of July 2022.

The General Reserve Fund includes all contractual payments subordinate to bondholders and expenditures for any other corporate purpose. The General Reserve Fund spending totaled \$285,151,000 for the seven months ended July 31, 2022. Spending consisted primarily of \$212,167,000 for the new State Transportation Agreement, \$14,424,000 for Extraordinary Events (state of emergency weather events), and \$12,833,000 for the Transportation Trust Fund. Also included are \$29,167,000 in transfers to the Supplemental Capital program in the Construction Fund.

The Capital Budget, which is funded by revenue, consists of the Maintenance Reserve Fund, Special Project Reserve Fund, and the Supplemental Capital Program. For the seven months ended July 31, 2022, total expenditures were approximately \$99,680,000, which was 40.2% of the year-to-date spending budget. Expenditures included \$11,572,000 for GSP Milepost 80.8-91.5 N&S Resurfacing, \$9,083,000 for GSP Milepost 0-7 N&S Resurfacing, and \$8,342,000 for TPK Milepost 3-12.1 NB Resurfacing. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$198,276,000.

The Construction Fund, which is funded from bond proceeds, consists of the 2022-2026 Capital Improvement Program, 2019 Capital Improvement Program, and the 2008 \$7 Billion Capital Improvement Program. For the seven months ended July 31, 2022, total expenditures were approximately \$248,842,000, which was 76.5% of the year-to-date spending budget. Total expenditures included \$23,005,000 for TPK Bridge Rehabilitation W107.87, E107.88 and 84.24N&S, \$20,561,000 for Passaic River Bridge Rehabilitation, \$15,453,000 TPK Install New Hybrid CMS, and \$14,209,000 for GSP Shoulder Widening from MP 30 to 35. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$1,044,561,000.

Executive Orders 122 (McGreevey 2004) and 37 (Corzine 2006) require, among other things, an annual audit of the financial statements of the New Jersey Turnpike Authority ("Authority") by an independent auditor. For purposes of these Executive Orders, the audit is an examination of the Authority's financial statements by a certified public accounting firm in compliance with generally accepted government auditing standards ("GAGAS"), issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, and in accordance with all applicable rules, regulations, and circulars. The Executive Orders require the audit to be accompanied by a written certification from both the Executive Director and the Chief Financial Officer that the financial information provided to the auditor in connection with the audit is, to the best of their knowledge, accurate and that such information fairly represents, in all material respects, the financial condition and operational results of the Authority for the year. Executive Order 37 (Corzine 2006) also requires a comprehensive annual report concerning the Authority's operations to be completed each year. This annual report is to include, among other things, the audited financial statements. Finally, the Executive Orders require the annual report and audited financial statements to be submitted to the Board of Commissioners for its review and, if accepted, approval.

The Authority's 2021 Annual Report and the audited financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2021 are respectfully submitted to the Board of Commissioners for its approval. An Annual Report is a thorough and detailed presentation of the Authority's financial condition. It reports the Authority's activities and balances for each fiscal year. The Annual Report complies with the accounting requirements promulgated by the Government Accounting Standards Board (GASB).

The Annual Report is presented in three (3) sections:

- Introductory Section includes transmittal letter;
- (2) Financial Section includes the independent auditor's report and contains management's discussion and analysis, Authority financial statements, fund financial statements, notes to the financial statements, required supplementary information, and schedules; and
- (3) Statistical Section includes additional financial, economic, and demographic information.

The Authority's external auditor, KPMG LLP has completed its examination of the Authority's financial statements for the year ended December 31, 2021 in compliance with the requirements of the Executive Orders. In addition, the required Bond Resolution statements, included as supplementary schedules to the financial statements and prepared in accordance with the U.S. generally accepted accounting principles, have been audited in relation to the basic financial statements. KPMG LLP, as required by the Authority's Bond Resolution, has also issued a report which indicates that the Authority has complied with the contractual provisions of its Bond Resolution.

The Authority received The Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting for its 2020 Annual Report. The Authority will submit its 2021 Annual Report to the GFOA and staff is confident that the 2021 Annual Report meets the requirements of the GFOA program.

Areas

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority ("Authority") is party to a Gasoline Operator Agreement, dated September 12, 2017, by and between the Authority and Sunoco Retail, LLC ("Sunoco"), to provide fuel services at Authority Service Areas along the Garden State Parkway and the New Jersey Turnpike (the "Agreement").

The Authority and Sunoco desire to amend the Agreement to (1) update the list of off-roadway gas stations that are surveyed by Sunoco to determine the price to be charged for gasoline at the Authority-owned Service Areas; (2) to establish a process for pricing of Plus, Ultra and Ultra 94 grade gasoline; (3) to establish a pilot test of limiting truck self-service diesel island staffing to one employee; (4) to amend the types of motor fuels to be offered by Sunoco; and (5) to increase the Road Service Charge that Sunoco is entitled to charge patrons in need of assistance from \$60 to \$80 (collectively, the "First Amendment to Agreement").

The proposed First Amendment to Agreement is necessary to address changing circumstances (closure of multiple off-roadway gas stations utilized for pricing surveys, development of new gasoline grades, increased costs experienced by the operator for roadway assistance services), and the mutual desire of the parties to conduct a limited test of self-service at certain truck service islands.

Thus, Authority staff and outside Authority Counsel recommend that the proposed First Amendment to the Agreement with Sunoco be approved. Authorization is respectfully requested
