

<u>Authorization to Settle Litigation in the Matter of Jenter v. NJTA, et al. (Middlesex</u> County)

This matter is a personal injury claim arising from a slip and fall in the Joyce Kilmer rest area. Plaintiff sustained a rotator cuff tear, thereby requiring surgery. An Arbitrator found the NJTA 90% liable and awarded plaintiff a net total of \$234,000. There is no issue of liability. Outside counsel is seeking settlement authority in the amount of \$200,000. The Law Department concurs with outside counsel's recommendation.

At its August 23, 2022 meeting (Agenda Item No. 167-08-2022), the Authority's Board of Commissioners authorized the award of a three month extension to Rapid Armored Corporation ("Rapid") to provide armored car services ("Services") essential to the daily collection of Authority toll and other revenue from both Roadways. Services consist of pick-up of Authority revenue at 11 toll plazas on the Garden State Parkway as well as 28 toll plazas and 12 Service Areas on the New Jersey Turnpike. The original contract had provision to extend for two (2) additional 1-year terms. The second extension (PA 2500-2) expired on July 1, 2022 and was extended through December 31, 2022. However, no surplus funding was added to the contract. Preliminary discussions indicate that the procurement process may continue until at least March 2023. Amount: \$200,000.00

This matter is a personal injury claim arising from a 54 year-old patron who slipped and fell in the Joyce Kilmer rest area at approximately 5:30 a.m. on Monday, September 24, 2018. This incident occurred due to an existing hole or defect in the parking lot area that resulted in severe injuries to the plaintiff which included a rotator cuff tear requiring surgery.

The court scheduled a non-binding arbitration held on October 26, 2022. A trial date was scheduled for December 26, 2022. At the arbitration, an award was entered in the gross amount of \$260,000.00, which included plaintiff's \$56,936.42 Worker's Compensation lien. The arbitrator found the New Jersey Turnpike Authority 90% liable and plaintiff 10% liable. As a result, the arbitrator awarded plaintiff a net total of \$234,000.00. However, the DeCotiis law firm as General Counsel upon a review of settlement values of similar matters that were previously adjudicated and/or settled has been successful to negotiate a lower settlement in the amount of \$200,000.00 pending Commissioner approval. The Law Department concurs after reviewing DeCotiis' recommendation and the facts of this litigation.

Therefore, it is recommended that the Authority's Commissioners approve the settlement of \$200,000.00 pursuant to the terms set forth above. It is also recommended that the Authority's Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any and all documents in furtherance of same.

Through this single procurement process, the Authority will select two consultants to furnish design services and prepare construction contract documents for the annual bridge deck and miscellaneous structural repair contracts for 2024 on the Parkway. These three firms were requested to submit sealed Fee Proposals, which were received and have been reviewed. A review of the Fee Proposal of the highest technically ranked firm, Van Cleef Engineering Associates, LLC, for OPS No. P3918 (their preferred OPS) was negotiated, which resulted in a reduction in the total fee. Subsequently, a review of the Fee Proposal of the second highest technically ranked firm, Stantec Consulting Services, Inc. for OPS No. P3917 was negotiated, which resulted in a reduction in the total fee. Both fees are considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

The Solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and eleven (11) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Codes: D492, Traffic Engineering Data Collection & Demand Modeling and D493, Traffic Engineering Toll Revenue & Sensitivity Analysis. Two firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of September 20, 2022.

In accordance with N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, since there were only two EOIs received, both of which were deemed complete, the Review Committee did not evaluate the EOIs and both firms received a Request for Technical and Fee Proposals. The Technical and Fee Proposals were received from both firms on November 7, 2022. Based on the Review Committee's review of the Technical Proposals, the ranking of the firms is: 1) CDM Smith, Inc. and 2) Stantec Consulting Services, Inc. The fee submitted by CDM Smith, Inc. has been reviewed and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. A4098 be issued to the firm of CDM Smith Inc. of Edison, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$5,150,000.00.

The anticipated total expenditure of funds being charged to the Engineering Department's Operating budget for Core Services is \$1,150,00 allocated as follows:

The remaining \$4,000,000.00 will be expended through separately negotiated WRAFs for additional services to be performed by the General Traffic Engineering Consultant. The funding for which will be encumbered upon the execution of each WRAF. The cumulative total for all Work Requests will be limited to \$4,000,000 over the five-year term of this OPS. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.8 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. The total fee for this OPS, including core services and WRAFs will not exceed \$5,150,000 for the five-year term.

The award is contingent upon the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey completing the review of all documents submitted by the selected awardee, pursuant to Public Law 2005, Chapter 51 (formerly Executive Order 134) and Executive Order 117 (Corzine 2008) and having no objection to same. These professional services were procured, and the recommended firm was selected, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seq., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

At its August 23, 2022 meeting (Agenda Item No. 167-08-2022), the Authority's Board of Commissioners authorized the award of a three month extension to Rapid Armored Corporation ("Rapid") to provide armored car services ("Services") essential to the daily collection of Authority toll and other revenue from both Roadways. 






Figure 3 - New Jersey Turnpike Injury and Property-Damage-Only Crashes by Month

After initial impact, Vehicle #2 struck the rear of Vehicle #3 and then Vehicle #3 struck the rear of Vehicle #4. The following un-audited results are for the eleven months ended November 30, 2022. Based upon these results, revenues will be sufficient to satisfy the requirements of the Authority's Bond Resolution. For the twelve months ending December 31, 2022, the Authority is budgeted to have a debt service coverage ratio of 2.09 and a total requirements coverage ratio of 1.62.

The Authority's total revenue for the eleven months ended November 30, 2022 was \$2,240,584,000, which is \$129,567,000, or 6.1%, above the 2022 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue was \$1,953,347,000, which is \$53,947,000, or 2.8%, more than the 2022 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue is greater than budget primarily due to stronger than projected commercial traffic growth on the New Jersey Turnpike. The month of August 2022 saw the most commercial traffic on the Turnpike ever recorded, as there has been an increase in tractor trailers on the roadway. Significant increases in gas prices have impacted discretionary traffic on both roadways, but mostly on the Garden State Parkway with both toll transactions and toll revenue below budget. Gas prices averaged \$0.36/gallon higher in the first eleven months of 2022 compared to the same period in 2021. When compared to October 2022, gas prices have increased an average of \$0.15/gallon. Investment income was \$36,910,000, or 671.1%, above budget due to both an increase in interest rates above the rates that were budgeted and the receipt of a \$15,400,000 upfront payment representing savings on the 2022A bond refunding which was not budgeted. E-ZPass fees were \$34,302,000, or 37.4%, above the budget due to conservative budgeting in 2022.

For the eleven months ended November 30, 2022, traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike increased 4.9% and toll revenue increased 7.3% compared to the same period in 2021. The increase in traffic is primarily due to the continued return to office, increased travel, and resumption of large-scale public events after the lifting of COVID-related restrictions in 2021. Toll revenue increased primarily due to the increase in traffic as well as due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing which went into effect on January 1, 2022. In addition, traffic and revenue also increased due to more travel during the February 2022 Presidents' Day, Easter, Memorial Day, and 4th of July holiday weekends compared to the same periods as last year. The 2022 traffic and toll revenue budgets are based on the Authority's traffic engineering consultant's (CDM Smith) updated toll revenue forecast dated September 10, 2021. The updated forecast includes both the assumed improved impact of COVID-19 on travel and the 3% annual toll rate indexing. Considering these two factors, CDM Smith projected a 2.6% increase in traffic and a 3.0% increase in revenue as compared to prior year. The actual results for the eleven months ended November 30, 2022 were above CDM's projections, despite the significant increase in gas prices in 2022 which was not projected. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 5.8% but revenue is up 35.9% for the same period. However, when comparing the month of November 2022 to November 2019, traffic has recovered to about 96.0% of pre-pandemic levels. Through November 2022, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the New Jersey Turnpike was 91.5%, an increase from 89.5% for the same period in 2021.

For the eleven months ended November 30, 2022, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway increased 2.1% and revenue increased 4.5% when compared to the same period in 2021. The increase in toll transactions is primarily due to the increase in travel as COVID-related restrictions were lifted in 2021, while toll revenue increased mainly due to the increase in toll transactions as well as the 3% annual toll rate indexing. Increased travel during the Presidents' Day, Easter, Memorial Day, and 4th of July holiday weekends as compared to last year also positively impacted results. The actual results for the eleven months ended November 30, 2022 were below the budget which was based on CDM's projection of a 2.7% increase in toll transactions and a 5.7% increase in toll revenue, due mainly to the significant increase in gas prices in 2022 which have impacted discretionary travel and was not projected. The projections include both the assumed impacts of COVID-19 and the 3% annual toll rate indexing. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 7.0% and revenue is up 20.9%. However, when comparing the month of November 2022 to November 2019, traffic has recovered to about 94.0% of pre-pandemic levels. Through November 2022, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the Garden State Parkway was 89.7%, an increase from 88.1% for the same period in 2021.

Financial Summary For the Eleven Months Ended November 30, 2022

Operating expenses for the eleven months ended November 30, 2022 were approximately \$547,633,000, which is \$49,829,000, or 8.3%, below the year-to-date budget. The Authority's operating expenses through November were below budget primarily due to lower than budgeted snow/severe weather costs, lower salaries because of existing vacancies, and lower than budgeted prescription benefit costs, which were partially offset by higher than budgeted transponder costs, credit card transaction processing fees, violation processing costs, and insurance costs. The Authority spent a total of \$30,928,000 for snow and severe weather costs in 2022, with \$16,504,000 charged to operating expenses and an additional \$14,424,000 charged to extraordinary events in the General Reserve Fund. All snow and severe weather costs are considered operating expenses and paid from the Revenue Fund, except for declared state of emergency events, which are charged to the General Reserve Fund. The Authority still has about \$32,516,000 in total available in its 2022 operating expense and general reserve budgets for snow and severe weather costs.

Debt Service includes interest and principal payments on the Authority's outstanding bonds. For the eleven months ended November 30, 2022, Debt Service totaled \$789,207,000, which was \$36,842,000 or 4.5% below budget and included \$522,411,000 in interest payments and \$266,796,000 in principal payments. Debt Service is below budget partly because the budget assumed a \$500,000,000 new money bond issuance in January 2022 and a \$750,000,000 new money bond issuance in July 2022 but only \$700 million was issued in November 2022.

The General Reserve Fund includes all contractual payments subordinate to bondholders and expenditures for any other corporate purpose. The General Reserve Fund spending totaled \$567,084,000 for the eleven months ended November 30, 2022. Spending consisted primarily of \$460,833,000 for the new State Transportation Agreement, \$20,167,000 for the Transportation Trust Fund, and \$14,424,000 for Extraordinary Events (state of emergency weather events). Also included are \$55,656,000 in transfers to the Supplemental Capital program in the Construction Fund.

The Capital Budget, which is funded by revenue, consists of the Maintenance Reserve Fund, Special Project Reserve Fund, and the Supplemental Capital Program. For the eleven months ended November 30, 2022, total expenditures were approximately \$169,093,000, which was 46.4% of the year-to-date spending budget. Expenditures included \$20,897,000 for GSP Milepost 80.8-91.5 N&S Resurfacing, \$14,307,000 for TPK Milepost 24.5-35.5 N&S Resurfacing, and \$14,266,000 for TPK Milepost 92-122 & NHBCE Bridge Repairs and Resurfacing. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$161,389,000.

The Construction Fund, which is funded from bond proceeds, consists of the 2022-2026 Capital Improvement Program, 2019 Capital Improvement Program, and the 2008 \$7 Billion Capital Improvement Program. For the eleven months ended November 30, 2022, total expenditures were approximately \$421,453,000, which was 80.2% of the year-to-date spending budget. Total expenditures included \$49,218,000 for TPK Bridge Rehabilitation W107.87, E107.88 and 84.24N&S, \$26,985,000 for Passaic River Bridge Rehabilitation, \$25,927,000 for TPK Install of New Hybrid CMS, and \$23,748,000 for Service Area Renovations. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$907,652,000.

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the "Authority") has been working with its Health Benefits Consultant, Buck Global, LLC ("Buck"), to solicit proposals for Stop Loss Insurance. Stop Loss coverage is insurance that protects the Authority's self-insured medical benefits program from individual claimants with aggregate medical and prescription drug claims above a specific threshold. The Authority's threshold, or self-insured retention, is a \$350,000 deductible per claimant, plus an additional \$250,000 known as an aggregate deductible (combined threshold of \$600,000).

On behalf of the Authority, Buck requested proposals from fifteen (15) vendors, including the incumbent Union Labor Life Insurance Company ("ULLICO"), for rates offering stop loss insurance effective January 1, 2023. Vendors were asked to propose a contract that matched the current contract provisions. Thirteen (13) vendors were uncompetitive. Two proposals (2) were received from the following vendors were deemed to be responsive and competitive:

- 1) Union Labor Life Insurance Company ("ULLICO")
- 2) Sun Life Assurance ("Sunlife")

In its Evaluation Report dated December 2022, Buck thoroughly documented its evaluation process, the proposals, options to consider and its recommendation. Critical factors considered in the analysis were the proposer's ability to match the current contractual provisions, no lasering (claimant(s) who are made subject to a higher deductible than the rest of the participants in the same contract due to high medical claims) of large claims for 2023, as well as the total financial exposure to the Authority. After reviewing the proposals, ULLICO had the most competitive proposal while maintaining all the provisions of the current Stop Loss contract. Although ULLICO's Stop Loss proposal does include lasering one claimant that would expose the Authority up to an additional \$550,000 for 2023, Sun Life's Stop Loss proposal included lasering two claimants with an exposure of up to \$850,000 to the Authority.

The Authority's direct financial exposure is the annual premium paid, plus the aggregating specific deductible, \$250,000 (that must be met before any reimbursement is received from the stop loss contract), plus the estimated amount of the lasered claims above the specific stop loss deductible. Based on this analysis, ULLICO provided the most competitive quote.

ULLICO proposed a premium rate that is 19.5% above current premium costs, for an estimated annual premium not to exceed \$3.0 Million. The total exposure with the specific aggregating deductible

(\$250,000), plus the estimated lasered claims above the specific stop loss, \$550,000, is \$3.8 Million, or an increase of 37.7% above the current exposure. The insurance financial strength of Union Labor Life Insurance Company has an A.M. Best rating of A-.

Sun Life, on the other hand, proposed a premium rate that is 46.1% above current premium costs, for an estimated annual premium of \$3.7 Million. The total exposure with the specific aggregating deductible (\$250,000), plus their estimated lasered claims above the specific stop loss, \$850,000, is \$4.77 Million, or an increase of 72.7% above the current exposure. The insurance financial strength of Sun Life Insurance Company has an A.M. Best rating of A+.

Buck Consultants recommends, and staff concurs, with placing the stop loss coverage with ULLICO. ULLICO has not only offered the most competitive proposal regarding cost and exposure but has also proposed a more favorable insured agreement for the Authority.

Therefore, authorization is requested to award a contract for insured Stop Loss coverage to Union Labor Life Insurance Company of Silver Spring, Maryland with an Individual Specific Stop Loss threshold of \$350,000 including the aggregating specific deductible of \$250,000, for the policy period of January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023, for premium amounts not to exceed \$3,000,000, which precise premium shall be subject to fluctuation based on enrollment, as the premium is computed on a per participant per month basis. It is further recommended that the Executive Director be authorized to take any actions and execute any documents that are necessary to effectuate the purpose of the above authorizations.

the State of New Jersey to Provide Funding to Advance the Hudson Tunnel

Project

In accordance with Agenda Item No. 318-12-2021 adopted by the Board of Commissioners on December 21, 2021, authorization was granted to negotiate an agreement with the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey to provide funding to advance the Hudson Tunnel Project (HTP), which is part of the larger Gateway Program that will expand and renovate the Northeast Corridor (NEC) - the busiest passenger rail line in the country - between Penn Station, Newark, New Jersey and Penn Station, New York, New York. Given the integrated nature of the State's transportation network, increasing the efficiency and capacity of public transportation – here, passenger rail service along the NEC – inures to the benefit of the Authority by mitigating motor vehicle traffic and reducing roadway congestion.

The Gateway Development Commission (GDC), created pursuant to the Gateway Development Commission Act, N.J.S.A. 32:36-1 et seq., is responsible for the planning, designing, financing, development and management of the HTP. The costs of the HTP will be shared by Port Authority of New York and New Jersey, the United States Department of Transportation, and the States of New York and New Jersey. In accordance with the Authority's statutory authority, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 27:23-5.8(b), to provide payments to the State for advancement of such transportation projects, the Authority and State Treasurer have concluded negotiations of an agreement to fund the State's share of costs of the HTP. Thus,

authorization is requested to execute an agreement with the State Treasurer on behalf of the State, substantially in accord with the following material terms:

- 1. Subject to the rights and security interests of its bondholders, the Authority agrees to make payments to the State on a quarterly basis (March 31, June 30, September 30 and December 31) in an amount not to exceed \$124 million annually,¹ to be utilized for payment of the State's share of the costs of the HTP. Payments will commence upon completion of construction of the HTP, anticipated in or about 2033. The Authority's obligation to make these payments shall terminate the earlier of (i) satisfaction of the State's share of costs of the HTP or (ii) assumption by another entity of the State's share.
- 2. Additionally, and subject to the rights and security interests of its bondholders, the Authority agrees to make payments to the State in an amount not to exceed \$1,666,667 monthly commencing on or about January 1, 2023 for GDC operations, which shall terminate the earlier of (i) completion of construction of the HTP or (ii) abandonment of construction of the HTP.
- 3. All future years' payments shall be subject to Board approval as part of the Authority's corresponding year's annual budget. However, if, in any year, tolls are not automatically adjusted in accordance with the annual indexing authorized by the Board's May 27, 2020 Resolution adjusting tolls, notice shall be provided to the State Treasurer regarding the amount of the shortfall.
- 4. The Authority's obligation to make the payments outlined above are subject to annual appropriation to NJ Transit of amounts received by the State from the Authority pursuant to the agreement. NJ Transit, in turn, shall transfer the funds to GDC solely for the purposes outlined in paragraphs 1 and 2, above.

In view of the foregoing, the Board is respectfully requested to authorize the Executive Director to execute an agreement with the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey, substantially in accord with the above terms, and to authorize and direct the Executive Director to take any other actions as may be necessary to implement the agreement, and it is further requested that all actions heretofore taken with respect to the agreement be authorized and ratified. A copy of the agreement, when executed, will be provided to the Board.
