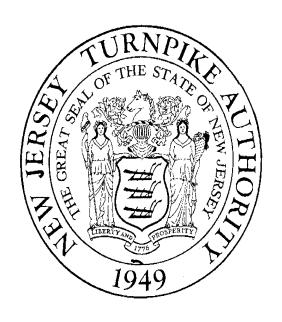

Authorization to Settle Litigation in the Matter of Cambero v. NJTA, et al. (Middlesex County)

On August 10, 2019, a NJTA toll supervisor improperly changed lanes striking the vehicle of a motorist while traveling in the direction of Exit 16W on the New Jersey Turnpike. On June 6, 2023, an Arbitrator found NJTA 90% liable and Plaintiff 10% liable, respectively. The arbitration award was \$600,000 with a net award apportioned to NJTA in the amount of \$540,000. Outside counsel is seeking settlement authority in the amount of \$325,000. The Law Department concurs with the outside counsel's recommendation.

Under these contracts, multiple vendors will provide snow removal and salting services for various locations on both Roadways. The contracts will be for three (3) years with the option to extend for two (2) additional one-year terms. Contracts bid for this term consisted of sixteen (16) plow and/or spreader contracts for various locations on both roadways as well as thirty (30) loader contracts at various Service areas, commuter lots, Toll Plazas, and Authority facilities. Bidders were required to bid all-inclusive "Regular" operating hourly rates for specific equipment required for each location. The maximum allowable hourly bid rate for loaders was capped at \$500.00 with a set Stand-By rate of \$300.00 per hour. Stand-by rates for trucks with plows were set at 50% of the hourly operating rate as bid. The bid also established fixed rates for supervisory and/or back-up vehicles at \$230 per hour (for both Regular and Stand-By hours). The bid was fully advertised, and twenty-three (23) vendors were notified of the procurement. On June 22, 2023, bids were received from four (4) contractors for twelve (12) of the forty-six (46) locations solicited. No bids were received for thirty-four (34) locations and these contracts will be readvertised and rebid. The Operations and Procurement and Materials ("PMM") Departments' staffs thoroughly reviewed all bids (including inspection of the required equipment listed with the bids).

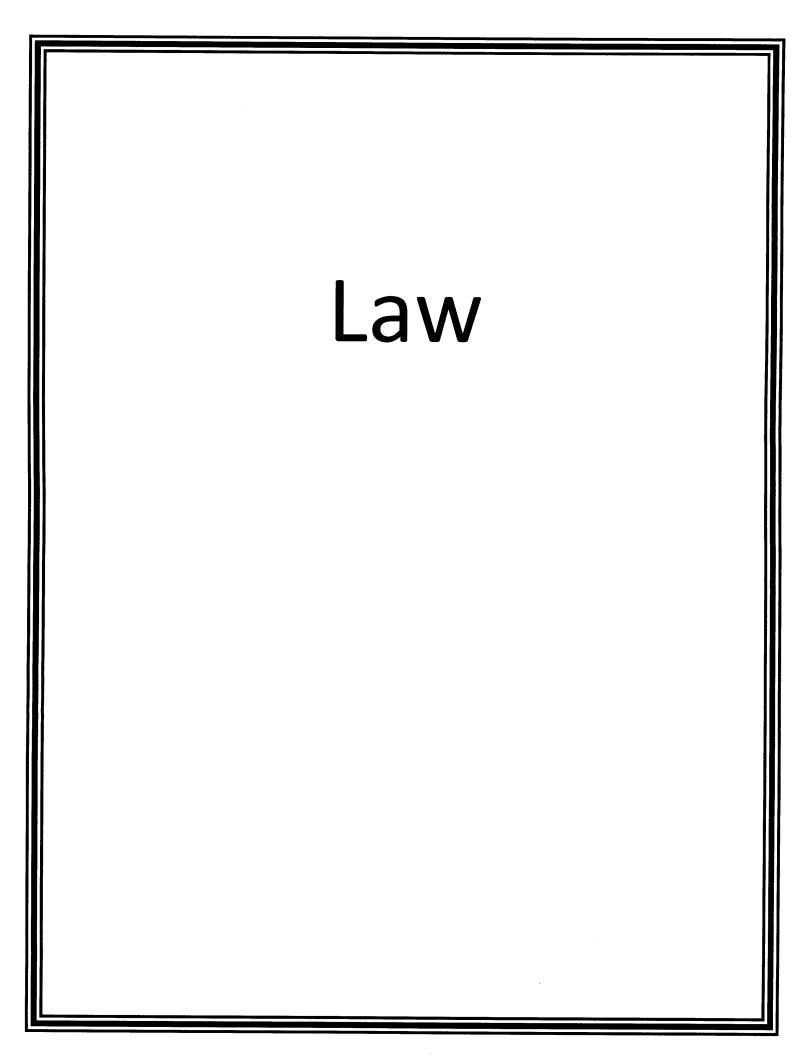

## 193-07-2023 Recommendation to Award Direct Purchase Agreement for the Authority's 2023A Turnpike Revenue Bonds to Barclays Bank

It is recommended that the Authority award a sole-source Direct Purchase Agreement to Barclay's Bank for the Authority's 2023A Turnpike Revenue Bonds. The proceeds of the 2023A Turnpike Revenue Bonds will be used to refund for savings, \$135,230,000 of the Authority's 2020C Bonds. The 2020C Bonds were issued as taxable bonds and can now be refunded on a tax-exempt basis for savings. Barclays Bank has negotiated the buy-back of the bonds from its client, and as such is the only firm that can deliver this transaction, making this a sole-source award.

This matter is a personal injury claim arising from a motorist, who is 39 years old, that was struck by a toll supervisor operating an NJTA vehicle due to an improper lane change on the New Jersey Turnpike southbound, at or near milepost 113.40, in the Borough of East Rutherford, at approximately 2:15 a.m., on Saturday, August 10, 2019. The collision from the accident resulted in severe injuries to plaintiff. As a result, plaintiff underwent two microdiscectomies and lumbar fusion surgeries.

The court scheduled a non-binding arbitration that was held on June 6, 2023. At that time, a trial date was scheduled for July 17, 2023. At the Arbitration, an award was entered in the gross amount of \$600,000. Consequently, the Arbitrator found the NJTA 90% liable and plaintiff 10% liable, respectively. As a result, the Arbitrator awarded plaintiff a net total of \$540,000. Thereafter, on June 26, 2023, a settlement conference was held before the Honorable Bina Desai. At the settlement conference, the parties agreed to a conditional settlement of \$325,000 subject to the Board of Commissioners approval. General Counsel reviewed this matter and other similar matters that were previously adjudicated and/or settled to confirm that this proposed settlement value is reasonable given the facts of the case, in consideration of plaintiff's injury, age, and the projected future costs of defense. The Law Department concurs with General Counsel's recommendation.

Therefore, it is recommended that the Authority's Commissioners approve the settlement of this matter pursuant to the terms set forth above. It is also recommended that the Authority's Commissioners authorize the Acting Executive Director to execute any and all documents in/furtherance of same.

This contract will provide for the substructure rehabilitation of two Turnpike waterway bridges. The work includes the removal and installation of pile jacketing, cathodic protection, concrete crack and spall repairs, and placement of scour protection mattresses. All work is expected to be substantially completed by December 2025.

Six bid proposals were received on June 27, 2023 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal, in the amount of \$6,027,282.00, may be compared to the second low bidder in the amount of \$7,770,368.00. The bids were significantly lower than the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$9,950,000.00 likely due to the Contractor's knowledge and experience of similar completed work, resources, and the current competitive bidding climate. Engineering Department representatives confirmed with the low bidder that they can perform the work at the bid price and in full compliance with the bid documents, including the projected date of completion. The low bidder, Agate Construction Co., Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. T100.616 be awarded to the low bidder, Agate Construction Co., Inc. of Ocean View, New Jersey in the amount of \$6,027,282.00. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this fair and open contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

This contract will provide for pavement removal and resurfacing of asphalt surface course pavement with warm mix asphalt along Maybaum Avenue, Parkway Drive Northbound, North Clinton Street and Parkway Drive Southbound in the City of East Orange. The maintenance of these roadway surfaces is the responsibility of the Authority as per the Jurisdictional and Maintenance Agreement with the City of East Orange. All work is expected to be substantially completed by December 2023.

Four bid proposals were received on June 22, 2023 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal in the amount of \$944,572.69 may be compared to the second low bidder in the amount of \$957,395.00. The bids were significantly lower than the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$1,471,100.00 likely due to the low bidder being fully mobilized in the area and having the ability to produce the asphalt mix for the project. The low bidder, Stavola Contracting Co., Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. P200.764 be awarded to the low bidder, Stavola Contracting Co., Inc. of Tinton Falls, New Jersey in the amount of \$944,572.69. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this fair and open contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

This Order for Professional Services was approved at the April 25, 2012 Commission Meeting in the amount of \$8,250,000.00 to provide for design services and preparation of contract documents for the referenced construction contract.

Supplement A provided for additional design and post-design services to advance a new Contract, T100.381, as an interim contract while the NJDOT's Pulaski Skyway project was underway. The work included preliminary investigation for the Lane Control System and assessment of needed bridge deck repairs until Contract No. T100.184 could be awarded in January 2019.

Supplement B provided for additional design and post-design services to address the decommissioning of the Lane Control System (LCS) and placement of a Smart Work Zone (SWZ) System under Contract No. T100.184. Additional design work was necessary to address expanded bearing replacements related to the Authority's emergency response to a span collapse of Str. No. No.75, Pier W90; fracture critical girder strengthening and tie-chord redundancy repairs; and project administration support through the completion of Contract No. T100.184.

Supplement C provided for additional design services to modify the Contract No. T100.184 traffic control configurations to alleviate traffic impacts during construction, including the combination of multiple stages of work and additional design to address emerging deterioration and changed field conditions, and additional post-design services.

Supplement D will provide for additional design and post-design services which were not anticipated and are outside the scope of the currently approved professional services. The additional design services include reviews of shop drawings, preparation of design revisions to accommodate changed field conditions and necessary post-design services to support construction through July 2024 to complete tie-chord redundancy work.

Under these contracts, multiple vendors will provide snow removal and salting services for various locations on both Roadways. The contracts will be for three (3) years with the option to extend for two (2) additional one-year terms. Contracts bid for this term consisted of sixteen (16) plow and/or spreader contracts for various locations on both roadways as well as thirty (30) loader contracts at various Service areas, commuter lots, Toll Plazas, and Authority facilities. Bidders were required to bid all-inclusive "Regular" operating hourly rates for specific equipment required for each location. The maximum allowable hourly bid rate for loaders was capped at \$500.00 with a set Stand-By rate of \$300.00 per hour. Stand-by rates for trucks with plows were set at 50% of the hourly operating rate as bid. The bid also established fixed rates for supervisory and/or back-up vehicles at \$230.00 per hour (for both Regular and Stand-By hours). The bid was fully advertised, and twenty-three (23) vendors were notified of the procurement. On June 22, 2023, bids were received from four (4) contractors for twelve (12) of the forty-six (46) locations solicited. No bids were received for thirty-four (34) locations and these contracts will be readvertised and rebid. The Operations and Procurement and Materials Management ("PMM") Departments' staffs thoroughly reviewed all bids (including inspection of the required equipment listed with the bids) and makes the following recommendations.

Bids for these contracts were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award these fair and open contracts to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

Accordingly, authorization is requested to award contracts to four (4) vendors for snow removal and salting services as outlined herein, for a total amount not to exceed \$5,961,000.00 for the three (3) snow seasons, subject to funding availability at the time of service. Authorization is further requested for the Executive Director to approve each of the two, one-year extensions upon satisfactory performance by the vendors. The prices for the succeeding years of the contract will be adjusted yearly based on a Consumer Price Index ("CPI") factor consisting of the average of 1) the New York/ Northern New Jersey CPI and 2) the Philadelphia/Southern New Jersey CPI. The maximum annual increase permitted however shall be five percent.

Under this contract, H.A. DeHart & Son will supply ten (10) 8-ton dual axle deck-over trailers. These trailers will be used by the Operations Department on both Roadways to transport oversized equipment as needed. They allow use of the full width of the trailer, with the benefit of the cargo being above the wheels. The trailers are replacing existing trailers that have reached their life expectancy and will be sold as surplus, if feasible. The bid was fully advertised, and the sixteen (16) vendors listed in the Authority's database for the referenced commodity were notified of the procurement. On July 10, 2023, one (1) bid was received from H.A. DeHart & Son in the amount of \$525,320.00 (\$26,266.00 each).

The bid was originally solicited for twenty (20) 7-ton dual axle-over trailers for a contract value of \$525,320.00 which was approximately 40% higher than the departmental estimate of \$320,000.00. The price difference is a result of the vendor exceeding the bid specification by offering an 8-ton trailer with a heavier duty construction. Due to the lack of supply and the increased demand for equipment, PMM and Operations staff deemed this to be an acceptable item. As a result, to stay within budget, the order quantity has been reduced to ten (10) trailers. The vendor has agreed to hold their original bid price for this order.

Bids for this contract were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this fair and open contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

Accordingly, authorization is requested to award a contract for ten (10) 8-ton dual axle deck-over trailers to H.A. DeHart & Son for a total amount not to exceed \$262,660.00.

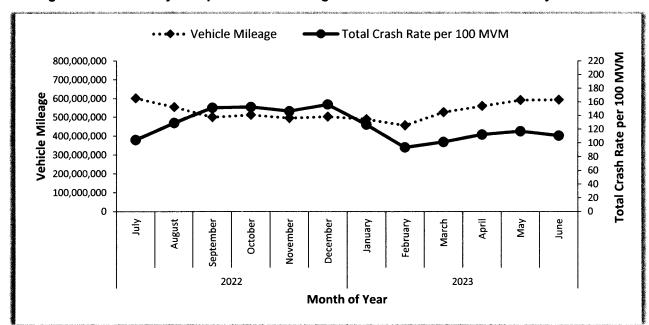
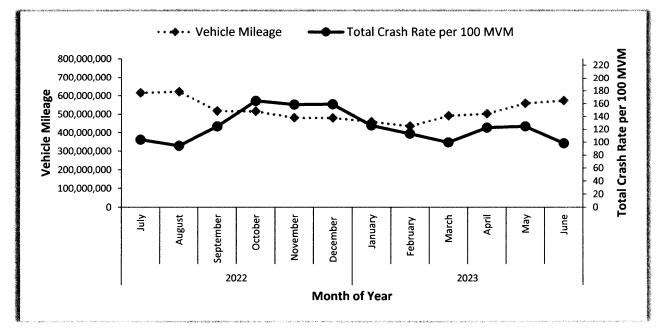


Figure 1 - New Jersey Turnpike Vehicle Mileage Traveled and Total Crash Rate by Month

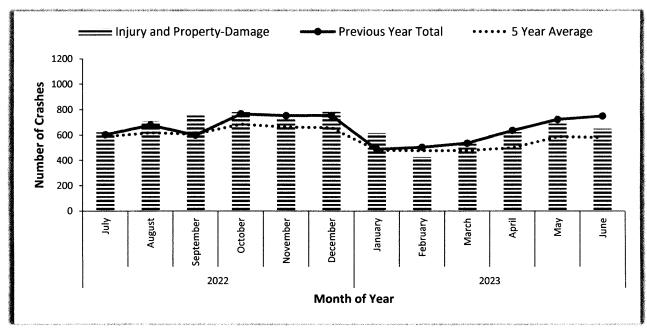
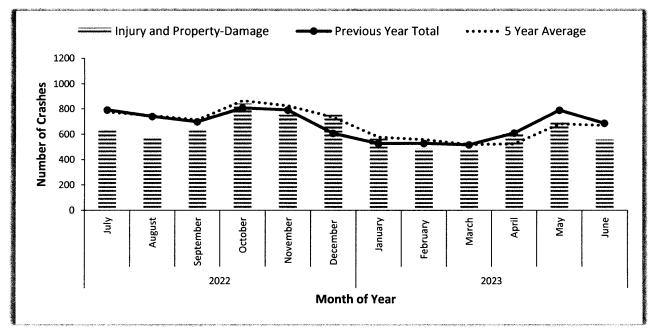


Figure 3 - New Jersey Turnpike Injury and Property-Damage-Only Crashes by Month

The following un-audited results are for the six months ended June 30, 2023.¹ Based upon these results, revenues will be sufficient to satisfy the requirements of the Authority's Bond Resolution. For the twelve months ending December 31, 2023, the Authority is projected to have a debt service coverage ratio of 2.02 and a total requirements coverage ratio of 1.53.

The Authority's total revenue for the six months ended June 30, 2023 was \$1,247,208,000, which is \$49,298,000, or 4.1%, above the 2023 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue was \$1,069,327,000, which is \$14,927,000, or 1.4%, more than the 2023 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue is greater than budget primarily due to milder than expected winter weather. Gas prices averaged \$0.65/gallon lower in 2023 compared to the same period in 2022, however, when compared to May 2023, gas prices in June were relatively the same. *E-ZPass* fees were \$13,812,000, or 21.9% above the budget due to conservative budgeting in 2023. Investment income was \$11,424,000, or 57.4%, above budget due to both an increase in interest rates above the rates that were budgeted and higher invested balances. Miscellaneous revenue was \$8,129,000 or 94.5% above budget primarily due to a myriad of one-time recovery payments. Specifically, the Authority received \$2,500,000 as an insurance recovery for the Delaware River Turnpike Bridge and \$2,300,000 from FEMA for COVID-19 Costs, Hurricane Ida, and Hurricane Sandy.

For the six months ended June 30, 2023, traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike increased 3.5% and toll revenue increased 3.6% compared to the same period in 2022. The increase in traffic is primarily due to mild winter weather, overall lower gas prices, and normal growth. Toll revenue increased primarily due to the increase in traffic as well as the 3% annual toll rate indexing which went into effect on January 1, 2023. In addition, traffic and revenue also increased due to more travel during the New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day and Memorial Day weekend holidays compared to the same periods as last year. The 2023 traffic and toll revenue budgets are based on the Authority's traffic engineering consultant's (CDM Smith) Draw Down Letter dated July 22, 2022 updating the September 21, 2018 Toll Revenue Forecast. CDM Smith projected a 1.6% increase in traffic and a 2.5% increase in revenue as compared to the prior year. The actual results for the six months ended June 30, 2023 were above CDM's projections. When compared to the same period in 2019, prepandemic, traffic is down 3.4% but revenue is up 39.0% for the same period. Traffic has recovered to 96.6% of pre-pandemic levels. Through June 2023, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the New Jersey Turnpike was 92.4%, an increase from 91.4% for the same period in 2022.

For the six months ended June 30, 2023, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway increased 5.0% and revenue increased 8.8% when compared to the same period in 2022. The increase in toll transactions is primarily due to less severe winter weather, lower gas prices compared to last year, and normal growth, while toll revenue increased mainly due to the increase in toll transactions as well as the 3% annual toll rate indexing. Increased travel during the New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Easter and Memorial Day weekend holidays as compared to last year also positively impacted results. The actual results for the six months ended June 30, 2023 were above the budget which was based on CDM Smith's projection of a 2.5% increase in toll transactions and a 6.5% increase in toll revenue. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 3.6% and revenue is up 29.7%. Traffic has recovered to 96.4% of pre-pandemic levels. Through June 2023, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the Garden State Parkway was 90.5%, an increase from 89.5% for the same period in 2022.

Operating expenses for the six months ended June 30, 2023 were approximately \$304,318,000, which is \$57,839,000, or 16.0% below the year-to-date budget. The Authority's operating expenses through June were below budget primarily due to lower than budgeted snow/severe weather costs, salaries because of existing vacancies, and health benefits costs due to Authority medical plan changes. These factors were partially offset by higher than budgeted State Police costs due to contractual increases in fringe benefit costs that exceeded budgeted increases. The Authority spent a total of \$7,343,000 for snow and severe weather costs in 2023, solely from the operating expense budget. All snow and severe weather costs are considered operating expenses and paid from the Revenue Fund, except for declared state of emergency events, which are charged to the General Reserve Fund. New Jersey had no declared state of emergency events so far in 2023.

### Financial Summary For the Six Months Ended June 30, 2023

Debt Service includes interest and principal payments on the Authority's outstanding bonds and is funded primarily through revenue and to a much lesser extent bond proceeds (capitalized interest). For the six months ended June 30, 2023, Debt Service totaled \$454,536,000 which was \$24,543,000 or 5.1% below budget as the 2023 budget assumed a \$1,000,000 new money bond issuance in January 2023 which to date has not been required. Debt service through June included \$295,098,000 in interest payments and \$159,438,000 in principal payments. Net debt service (funded from revenue, net of capitalized interest) was \$437,182,000 for the six-month period and was \$603,000 or 0.1% above budget. Net Debt Service is slightly above budget due to the 2022C bond refunding which occurred after the budget was approved and resulted in slightly higher principal payments. The 2023 annual debt service budget includes approximately \$873,200,000 of debt service funded from revenue (net debt service), and the remaining \$85,000,000 of debt service funded from bond proceeds (capitalized interest), for a total debt service budget of \$958,200,000.

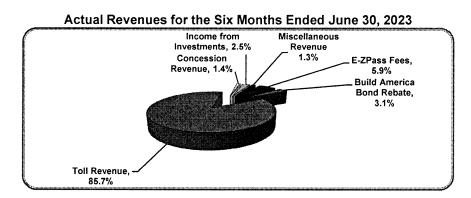
The General Reserve Fund includes all contractual payments subordinate to bondholders and expenditures for any other corporate purpose. The General Reserve Fund spending totaled \$443,333,000 for the six months ended June 30, 2023, which was \$9,506,000 or 2.1% below budget. Spending consisted primarily of \$372,987,000 for the 2021 State Public Transportation Projects Funding Agreement, \$11,000,000 for the Transportation Trust Fund, and \$10,000,000 for the 2023 State Public Transportation Projects Funding Agreement. Also included are \$37,947,000 in transfers to the Supplemental Capital program in the Construction Fund. General Reserve is below budget mainly because there was no spending on state of emergency snow/severe weather events.

The Capital Budget, which is funded by revenue, consists of the Maintenance Reserve Fund, Special Project Reserve Fund, and the Supplemental Capital Program. For the six months ended June 30, 2023, total expenditures were approximately \$115,824,000, which was 68.5% of the year-to-date spending budget. Expenditures included \$17,912,000 for Service Area Renovations, \$12,065,000 for TPK Resurfacing MP 35.5 to 48.5 NB & SB Roadways - Section 4, and \$11,989,000 for GSP Resurfacing MP 148.8 to 160.7 NB & SB Roadways - Section 14. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$314,811,000.

The Construction Fund, which is funded from bond proceeds, consists of the 2023-2027 Capital Improvement Program, 2019 Capital Improvement Program, and the 2008 \$7 Billion Capital Improvement Program. For the six months ended June 30, 2023, total expenditures were approximately \$230,390,000, which was 63.3% of the year-to-date spending budget. Total expenditures included \$34,828,000 for Service Area Renovations, \$20,373,000 for TPK Bridge Rehabilitation W107.87, E107.88, \$19,588,000 for GSP 128 AB 154.2N & TPK 90-91.37 and 84.24N&S, and \$13,671,000 for GSP Shoulder Widening Reconstruction MP 30-35. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$926,937,000.

For the six months ended June 30, 2023, total revenue was \$1,247,208,000, which was 4.1%, or \$49,298,000 above the 2023 Budget. Total revenue was above budget mainly due to toll revenue exceeding budget from unusually mild winter weather and the continued increase in travel.

Toll revenue for the period was \$1,069,327,000 which was 1.4%, or \$14,927,000 greater than the 2023 Budget amount. Toll revenue was \$9,083,000, or 1.2% higher than the 2023 Budget amount on the New Jersey Turnpike and \$5,843,000, or 2.2% higher than the 2023 Budget amount on the Garden State Parkway. Toll revenue was above budget primarily due to milder than expected winter weather and lower gas prices.

Concession revenue consists of revenues generated through the sale of food, gasoline and convenience store items at the service areas located along both roadways. Concession revenue was \$17,511,000 which was \$1,011,000 or 6.1% above the 2023 Budget. Revenue was higher due to higher food and convenience store sales, as well as an increase in fuel revenue received from the 50% share of the gross profit margin on diesel sales. On the Turnpike, food sales increased 19.4%, fuel sales decreased 4.8% and convenience store sales increased by 11.8% compared to last year. On the Garden State Parkway, food sales increased 19.7%, fuel sales decreased 9.6%, and convenience store sales increased 8.0% compared to the same period in 2022. The increase in food and convenience store sales on the Turnpike are primarily due to the re-opening of the Molly Pitcher and Woodrow Wilson Service Areas which were still closed for renovation in the first quarter of 2022, the mild winter and the rebranding of food options, while the decrease in fuel sales is mainly due to the closure of the Joyce Kilmer, Walt Whitman and James Fenimore Cooper Service Areas for renovations. On the Parkway, the increase in food and convenience store sales is due to the mild winter and increased travel, while fuel sales decreased due partly to the closure of the Vauxhall and Brookdale South Service Areas for renovations.

Investment earnings consist of income from invested operating revenues and reserve funds. Investment income was \$31,324,000, which was \$11,424,000 or 57.4% higher than the 2023 Budget. Income from investments was above budget due to an increase in interest rates over the budgeted rates and higher invested balances. While the budget projected an increase in short-term interest rates, the projection was for a lessor increase compared to the actual increase in rates. The federal reserve continues raising the fed funds rate in response to inflation.

Miscellaneous revenue includes fees for cell tower rentals, towing, fiber optic leases, park & ride commissions, property rentals, the Arts Center, and other items. Revenue for the period was \$16,729,000 which was \$8,129,000, or 94.5% higher than the 2023 Budget. Miscellaneous revenue was above the 2023 Budget levels due to a \$2,500,000 insurance recovery for the Delaware River Turnpike Bridge and approximately \$2,300,000 in FEMA recoveries for COVID-19 (Ongoing), Hurricane Ida (2021) and Hurricane Sandy (2012), \$2,000,000 in Arts Center rent for 2022 PNC variable rent payment, \$500,000 in surplus property sales, and additional cell tower billings for prior years.

The Build America Bond Subsidy is a direct payment from the U.S. Treasury to the Authority equaling about 35% of the interest payable on the Series 2009F and the Series 2010A Bonds for Federal Fiscal Year 2023 which began in October 2022. The subsidy due was \$38,505,000, which is \$5,000 above the 2023 Budget amount due to rounding.

*E-ZPass* fees consist of monthly membership fees, transponder sales, return check fees, administrative fees, interest on prepaid accounts and monthly statement fees. Revenue of \$73,812,000 was above budget due primarily to an increase in administrative fees, as well as an increase in monthly membership fees as accounts have increased, with all increases exceeding the increases that were budgeted.

For the month of June 2023, traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike increased 1.2% and toll revenue increased 0.9% when compared to the same period in 2022. The increase in toll transactions compared to last year is due in part to overall greater passenger car travel on the weekends and normal growth, while toll revenue only slightly increased compared to last year mainly due to the decrease in commercial traffic. The decline in commercial traffic and toll revenue was due in part to the closure of I-95 in Philadelphia beginning June 11, 2023. Commercial vehicles were encouraged, if possible, to exit at I-80 on the Turnpike Extension rather than entering the tolled portion of the New Jersey Turnpike and continuing south to Interchange 6. These results are in line with CDM's projection of an increase of a 1.2% in traffic but below the projection of an increase of 2.5% in toll revenue for the month of June 2023, mainly due to the greater impact of the recent decline in commercial traffic due in part to the closure of I-95 in Philadelphia.

For the six months ended June 30, 2023, traffic increased 3.5% and toll revenue increased 3.6% when compared to the same period in 2022. Toll revenue has exceeded projections as traffic has exceeded projections. Traffic and revenue also increased due to more travel during the January 2023 New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day and Memorial Day weekend holidays compared to the same periods as last year. Electronic toll collection remains popular and overall usage rates continue to be strong. Results were above the 2023 Budget which was based on CDM Smith's projections of a 1.6% increase in traffic and a 2.5% increase in revenue, as passenger vehicle traffic has continued to be stronger than projected. For the six months ended June 30, 2023, the *E-ZPass* usage rate for passenger cars was 91.6%, and 97.2% for commercial vehicles. This resulted in an overall *E-ZPass* usage rate of 92.4%. The *E-ZPass* usage rate remains one of the highest in the region reflecting acceptance among commuters and frequent travelers of the *E-ZPass* brand and the convenience provided to the users throughout the Northeast.

For the month of June 2023, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway increased by 2.3% and toll revenue increased by 7.1% when compared to June 2022. The overall increase in toll transactions can be partially attributed to overall higher weekend travel compared to last year. The increase in toll revenue is attributed to the increase in transactions, as well as the 3% annual toll rate indexing effective January 1, 2023. The results were in line with CDM's projections of a 2.3% increase in traffic and a 7.0% increase in toll revenue for June 2023.

For the six months ended June 30, 2023, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway increased 5.0% and toll revenue increased 8.8% when compared to the same period in 2022. Toll transactions increased due to the mild winter weather, as well as increased travel during the New Year's Day, Martin Luther King, Easter, and Memorial Day weekend holidays as compared to last year. However, toll revenue increased due not only to the increase in toll transactions, but also due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing effective January 1, 2023. Results exceeded the 2023 Budget which was based on CDM Smith's projections of a 2.5% increase in toll transactions and a 6.5% increase in toll revenue, due in part to the overall decrease in gas prices in 2023 which has positively affected discretionary travel. *E-ZPass* remains popular on the Garden State Parkway as electronic toll collection continues to increase. For the six months ended June 30, 2023, the total *E-ZPass* usage rate was 90.5%. The *E-ZPass* usage rate for passenger cars was 90.4%, and 95.7% for commercial vehicles.

For the six months ended June 30, 2023, operating expenses were approximately \$304,318,000, which was 42.3% of the annual budget and 84.0% of the year-to-date budget. Operating expenses through June 2023 were under budget primarily due to lower than budgeted snow/severe weather costs of approximately \$31,000,000, salaries of approximately \$9,000,000 due to existing vacancies and health benefits costs of about \$6,000,000. These under budget expenses were partially offset by higher than budgeted State Police costs of about \$4,000,000. When excluding the actual and budgeted snow and severe weather costs, the remaining operating expenses are about 92% of their year-to-date budget.

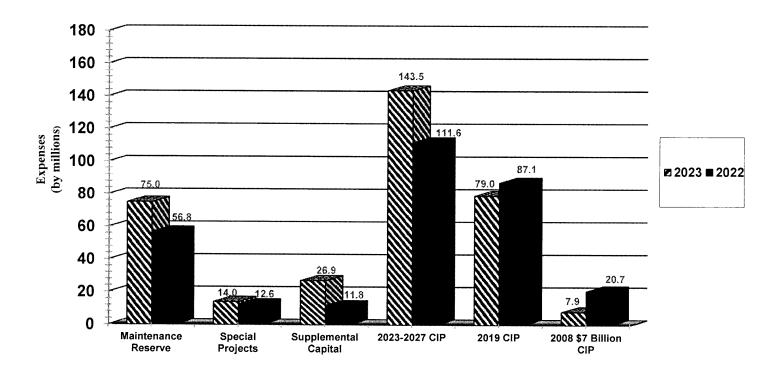

Net Debt Service is slightly above budget due to the 2022C bond refunding which occurred after the budget was approved and resulted in slightly higher principal payments.

#### General Reserve Fund

The General Reserve Fund includes all contractual payments subordinate to bondholders and expenditures for any other corporate purpose. Attached is the Series 2023 Turnpike Revenue Bond Resolution (Series 2023 Resolution). This resolution authorizes the issuance of up to \$1,000,000,000 of Series 2023 Turnpike Revenue Bonds. The Series 2023 Resolution authorizes the issuance of new money Turnpike Revenue Bonds to provide funds to pay the construction costs related to the projects approved as part of the Authority's Capital Improvement Programs, primarily the projects identified in the 2020 Long-Range Capital Plan. In addition to providing funds to pay construction costs, proceeds of the Series 2023 Turnpike Revenue Bonds can be used to make a deposit into the debt reserve fund, pay capitalized interest and the costs of issuance on the bonds.

The Series 2023 Resolution also authorizes the bonds to be issued as tax-exempt bonds in single or multiple series, as variable or fixed rate bonds, with a maximum maturity of 30 years. If variable rate bonds are issued, the 2023 Resolution authorizes the Authority to enter into interest-rate swap agreements up to the par value of the variable rate bonds. The underwriting syndicate for the bonds will be selected from the Authority's senior manager pool and co-manager pool.

Based upon current spending forecasts it is anticipated that the bonds authorized under the 2023 Resolution will be in issued in increments over the next twelve months, dependent upon market conditions. The first issuance is expected in the third quarter of 2023.

It is recommended that the Board of Commissioners adopt the Series 2023 Turnpike Revenue Bond Resolution in substantially the form attached hereto and authorize the Acting Executive Director to execute any and all documents necessary to finalize this document, and others as may be necessary to complete the transactions described therein. The Authority has received the required pre-approval letters from the Governor and State Treasurer.

Attached is the Series 2023 Turnpike Revenue Refunding Bond Resolution (Series 2023 Refunding Resolution). This resolution authorizes the issuance of up to \$2,000,000,000 of Series 2023 Refunding Bonds to potentially refund for debt service savings the fixed rate Series 2012A, 2013F, 2014A, 2014C, 2015E, 2016A, 2017A, 2017B, 2017E, 2017F, 2017G, 2020B, 2020C, and 2021B Bonds. These bonds, or a portion of these bonds, can be refunded on either a taxable or tax-exempt basis. In addition to providing funds to repay the principal of the outstanding bonds, the proceeds of the Series 2023 Refunding Bonds can be used to make a deposit into the debt reserve fund and the costs of issuance on the bonds.

These bonds, or a portion of the bonds, will be refunded based on market conditions if they can produce debt service savings above the Authority's target of 3%. The Series 2023 Refunding Resolution also authorizes the bonds to be issued in single or multiple series, as variable or fixed rate bonds, with a maximum maturity of 30 years. Normally, the maturity of the refunding bonds will match the maturity of the refunded bonds. If the bonds are issued as variable rate bonds, the Series 2023 Refunding Resolution authorizes the Authority to enter into interest-rate swap agreements up to the par value of the variable rate bonds. The underwriting syndicate for the bonds will be selected from the Authority's senior manager pool and co-manager pool.

At this time, one refunding transaction is in process, which is the refunding for savings of the \$135,230,000 Series 2020 C Bonds, which is expected to be completed in the second quarter of 2023. In addition, there are several other potential refundings that could occur in the third quarter of 2023 that are being monitored by the Authority's Financial Advisor.

It is recommended that the Board of Commissioners adopt the Series 2023 Turnpike Revenue Refunding Bond Resolution in substantially the form attached hereto and authorize the Acting Executive Director to execute any and all documents necessary to finalize this document, and others as may be necessary to complete the transactions described therein. The Authority has received the required pre-approval letters from the Governor and State Treasurer.

Authorization is requested to award a Direct Purchase Agreement to Barclays Capital Inc. (Barclays) for the direct purchase of up to \$135,230,000 Series 2023A Bonds. Barclays has approached the New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the Authority) with an opportunity to repurchase and refund for debt service savings \$135,230,000 of its taxable Series 2020C Turnpike Revenue Bonds (Series 2020C Bonds) through the issuance, on a direct purchase basis, of Series 2023A Turnpike Revenue Bonds. A client of Barclays is willing to sell the Series 2020C Bonds it owns to Barclays, and Barclays proposes to provide, under a Direct Purchase Agreement with the Authority, the Series 2023A Bonds, proceeds of which will be used for an option it has negotiated to purchase the Series 2020C Bonds from its client. In other words, the proceeds of the Series 2023A Bonds will be used to refund the Series 2020C Bonds.

It is now possible to use a tax-exempt financing to refund the taxable bonds for savings. This is generally because the escrow required when the Series 2020A Bonds were issued has been fully spent and expired. The Series 2023A Bonds, of which Barclay's will be the initial bondholder, will have a par value that will not exceed \$135,230,000 and will mature on 1/1/35, which is also the maturity date of the Series 2020C Bonds. The transaction is subject to market conditions, but based on current markets, it is expected to generate approximately \$10.0 million in net present value debt service savings, or about 7.5% of the refunded par. This level of savings exceeds the minimum 3% of the refunded par required by the Authority's Debt Management Policy. Barclays will receive a fee on the transaction, like an underwriter's discount, not to exceed \$1,352,300, or 1% of the par value of the Series 2023A Bonds. This fee is equivalent to underwriter's discount of \$1.00/thousand bonds, which is a reasonable rate under current market conditions.

Barclays is the only firm which has an option to buy the Series 2020C Bonds from the current holder. As the only firm to have this option, a direct purchase of the Series 2023A Bonds by Barclays is the only opportunity for the Authority to secure the estimated \$10.0 million in net present value debt service savings. Thus, no other firm can provide the debt service savings achieved through this transaction. Securing debt service savings through a bond refunding is prudent financial management.

Thus, it is recommended that this award be made without public advertisement under the sole source procurement authorization of *N.J.A.C.* 19:9-2.2(d)1 as promulgated under *N.J.S.A.* 27:23-6.1 and consistent with Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006). A resolution, as required by *N.J.A.C.* 19:9-2.2(d)1, is attached hereto. It is also recommended that the Board of Commissioners authorize the award of a Direct Purchase Agreement for the Authority's Series 2023A Turnpike Revenue Bonds to Barclays. Finally, it is requested that Acting Executive Director be authorized to execute any and all documents necessary to finalize this award, and others as may be necessary to complete the transactions described therein.

Your approval of this recommendation is respectfully requested.

#### RESOLUTION FOR SOLE SOURCE PROCUREMENT

Direct Purchase of Series 2023A Turnpike Revenue Bonds

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Turnpike Authority's Finance Department has requested the award of a sole source contract, or Direct Purchase Agreement, to Barclays Capital Inc. (Barclays) to provide for the direct purchase of the Authority's Series 2023A Turnpike Revenue Bonds (Series 2023A Bonds), proceeds of which will be used to partially refund the Series 2020A Turnpike Revenue Bonds (Series 2020A Bonds); and

WHEREAS, Barclays has a customer that owns a portion of the Series 2020A Bonds, and is the only firm with an option to buy the bonds from the current holder; and

WHEREAS, a direct purchase of the Series 2023A Bonds through Barclays is the only opportunity to secure debt service savings and refund the Series 2020A Bonds with tax-exempt debt; and

**WHEREAS,** N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2(d)1 of the New Jersey Turnpike Authority's regulations, promulgated under N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, permits sole source procurement when only one source of the required goods or service exists;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT** the Authority's Board of Commissioners hereby authorizes and approves the award of a contract, or Direct Purchase Agreement, to Barclays Capital Inc. to provide the Series 2023A Bonds, with a fee paid to Barclays in an amount not to exceed \$1,352,300, which is 1% of the maximum par value of the Series 2023A Bonds, as a sole source exception to procurement by public advertisement permitted by *N.J.A.C.* 19:9-2.2(d)1 promulgated under the Authority's enabling legislation, *N.J.S.A.* 27:23-6.1.
