

Stand-by rates for trucks with plows were set at 50% of the hourly operating rate as bid. The bid also established fixed rates for supervisory and/or back-up vehicles at \$230.00 per hour (for both Regular and Stand-By hours).



In order to protect itself from a myriad of cyber risks, the Authority has maintained comprehensive cyber liability insurance, which coverage expires September 29, 2023. This insurance provides the Authority with protection from theft and ransom of its electronic data and other cyber-related risks, including the following: (1) Media Wrongful Acts; (2) Privacy and Cyber Security; (3) Privacy Regulatory Defense, Awards and Fines; (4) Data Recovery Expenses; (5) Data Breach Response and Crisis Management Costs; (6) Cyber Extortion and Ransomware; and (7) Business Interruption and Dependent Business Interruption coverage (the "Program").

Willis of New Jersey, Inc. ("Willis"), the Authority's broker of record, was requested to renew the Program as expiring, and provide alternate quotations for higher limits, if possible. A significant component of marketing the Program to underwriters this year was a presentation by the Authority's ITS department outlining the myriad upgrades to its security protocols and cyber protections during the past year, which was very favorably received by the underwriters. Willis continues to market the Program and will provide firm quotations with the incumbent primary and excess carriers and any new carriers that may provide enhanced coverage at a more favorable price than incumbent carriers.

The total premium for coverage as outlined above will not exceed \$1,700,000, including all New Jersey mandatory taxes and surcharges.

It is therefore recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to renew the Program at an amount not to exceed the amount set forth above. It is also requested that the Executive Director be authorized to execute all documents and to take all further actions to effectuate the renewal of the Program consistent with the intent of the recommendation.

Amount: \$299,000.00

This is an employment discrimination claim brought by a long-time current NJTA employee, who alleged discrimination under the New Jersey Law Against Discrimination based upon pay discrimination on the basis of gender and retaliation for opposing and reporting pay discrimination under the Diane B. Allen Equal Pay Act. As a result, plaintiff is seeking to recoup back pay, consequential and punitive damages, as well as emotional distress.

On July 27, 2023, the parties voluntarily participated in a mediation that was presided by retired Judge Mark Epstein, J.S.C. At the mediation, the parties agreed to a settlement of all claims in the matter, without any admission of wrongdoing by NJTA, for the sum \$299,000, subject to the Board of Commissioners' approval. General Counsel reviewed this matter and other similar matters that were previously adjudicated and/or settled to confirm that the proposed settlement is reasonable given the projected future costs of defense and risks of litigation. The Law Department concurs with General Counsel's recommendation.

Therefore, it is recommended that the Authority's Commissioners approve the settlement of this matter pursuant to the terms set forth above. It is also recommended that the Authority's Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any and all documents in furtherance of same.

The petitioner is represented by The Law Offices of Matarazzo & Lubcher P.C, located in Cherry Hill, NJ. The Authority is defended by Special Counsel Neil Gallagher of GluckWalrath LLP, located in Freehold, NJ. The matter is venued in the district office of Mount Holly Workers' Compensation Court before the Honorable Judge R. Louse Gallagher.

The total settlement award is \$140,370.00

The Law Department has reviewed this matter and agrees with the recommendation of the Special Counsel, the Authority's third-party workers' compensation administrator and the Authority's Senior Benefits Manager. Authorization is, therefore, requested to allow Special Counsel to settle this matter for the sum of \$140,370.00

This contract will provide for the removal and replacement of damaged, misaligned, deteriorated, and substandard height concrete median barrier along with drainage repairs, paving and other incidental work on the Parkway between Milepost 134 and 140 in Middlesex and Union Counties. All work is expected to be substantially completed by December 2028.

Four bid proposals were received on July 25, 2023 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal in the amount of \$64,507,212.00 may be compared to the second low bidder in the amount of \$69,521,000.00. The bids were significantly lower than the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$73,928,345.00 likely due to the low bidder's approach to the removal of the existing barrier. The low bidder, Crisdel Group, Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. P200.598 be awarded to the low bidder, Crisdel Group, Inc. of South Plainfield, New Jersey, in the amount of \$64,507,212.00. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this fair and open contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

Previously, on June 7, 2023, the Authority advertised bids for 2023-2026 Snow Removal and Salting Services at 46 locations on both roadways and, on June 22, 2023, received four (4) bids for only twelve (12) of the forty-six (46) locations. As a result, at the July 25, 2023 Board of Commissioners' meeting, the Authority awarded contracts to all four bidders, as the lowest responsible bidders, and re-advertised for Snow Removal and Salting Services on July 14, 2023 for the thirty-four (34) remaining locations for which no bids were received.

On August 1, 2023, the Authority received eight (8) bids for twelve (12) of the thirty-four (34) locations solicited. Contracts covered by the bid consisted of five (5) plow and/or spreader contracts for various locations on both roadways as well as twenty-nine (29) loader contracts at various service areas, commuter lots, toll plazas, and Authority facilities. Bidders were required to bid all-inclusive "Regular" operating hourly rates for specific equipment required for each location. The maximum allowable hourly bid rate for loaders was capped at \$500 with a set Stand-By rate of \$300 per hour. Stand-by rates for trucks with plows were set at 50% of the hourly operating rate as bid. The bid also established fixed rates for supervisory and/or back-up vehicles at \$230 per hour (for both Regular and Stand-By hours).

After review by the Operations and Procurement and Materials Management ("PMM") Departments (collectively, the "Departments"), one (1) of the eight (8) bids received was deemed non-compliant, and one (1) bid was higher than the lowest responsible bid received for the same location. Based on the Departments' review, which included inspection of the compliant bidders' equipment, the Departments make the following recommendations:

1. That contracts for 2023-2026 Snow Removal and Salting Services be awarded to the six (6) lowest responsible bidders, whose names are highlighted in bold on the attached bid results (Attachment A), for the twelve (12) contracts listed thereon. The contracts will be for three (3) years with the option to extend for two (2) additional

one-year terms. Bids for these contracts were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award these fair and open contracts to the lowest responsible bidders, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

2. That the bid received from Garme Energy Solutions, Inc. ("Garme") of Hackensack, NJ for contracts PPN-6B-23, PPN-6G-23 and SPS-FL2-23 be rejected for Garme's failure to submit the mandatory required Bid Bond, Letter of Surety, or Cashier's Check, which is a material, non-curable deficiency.

Further, since no bids were received on two (2) occasions for the locations listed on Attachment B hereto, pursuant to the Authority's enabling statute *N.J.S.A.* 27:23-6.1(a), staff has commenced negotiations with responsible contractors for the twenty-two (22) outstanding contracts required, upon terms, conditions, restrictions and specifications substantially similar to those that were the subject of competitive bidding on two (2) occasions. Given the need to secure these essential services on a timely basis, authorization is requested for delegated authority to the Executive Director to award such contracts upon completion of successful negotiations with responsible contractors, subject to ratification by the Board.

In accordance with the foregoing, authorization is requested to award contracts to the six (6) vendors on Attachment A, as outlined herein, for a total amount not to exceed \$828,400 for the next three (3) snow seasons, subject to funding availability at the time of service. Authorization is further requested for the Executive Director to exercise, within his discretion, the options for two (2) one-year extensions upon satisfactory performance by the vendors. The prices for the succeeding years of the contract will be adjusted yearly based on a Consumer Price Index ("CPI") factor consisting of the average of 1) the New York/ Northern New Jersey CPI and 2) the Philadelphia/Southern New Jersey CPI. The maximum annual increase permitted, however, shall be five (5) percent.

Finally, it is respectfully requested that the Executive Director be given delegated authority, subject to subsequent ratification of the Board, to award all successfully negotiated contracts as described herein.

The Committee reviewed the written proposals based on the criteria set forth in the RFP and scored each firm individually. Based on the Committee's review of the proposals, the Committee invited representatives from all three firms to make oral presentations and provide best and final offers ("BAFOs"). Based upon the written and oral presentations, the Committee prepared a report that detailed the evaluation process and set forth its findings and recommendation.

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Based on their review of the proposals, the Committee found that all three (3) proposers demonstrated sufficient experience and were generally responsive to the RFP Scope of Services. As such, the Committee requested each of the three (3) proposers to make oral presentations. All firms provided professional and comprehensive oral presentations that met or exceeded the requirements for the project team and for servicing public sector clients. The Committee, however, concluded that the proposal submitted by Aon demonstrated the most benefit to the Authority, and thus received the highest combined score. Aon presented extensive information indicating a cohesive team with significant expertise in the professional liability brokerage field. Additionally, the proposed team had multi-faceted experience with brokering Owners Protective Professional Insurance ("OPPI"). Aon's demonstrated understanding of OPPI programs and the risk profile of the Authority was clear in their responses to the Scope of Services portion of the RFP as well as their oral presentation. Aon described to the Committee the various aspects of the services they would provide, including enrollment, reporting, auditing, and benchmarking, all of which was favorably received by the Committee.

Aon submitted a final fee proposal of \$231,250 for the three (3) year term and proposed fees of \$80,938 for the fourth year and \$85,100 for the fifth year if the Authority opts to extend the contract and clarified the fact that some services were included within the flat fee proposed in their BAFO.

The Committee found that Aon scored the highest on the qualitative criteria and proposed reasonable annual fees, making Aon the recommended broker for the underlying brokerage services.

This professional services procurement was conducted in accordance with *N.J.S.A.* 27:23-6.1, *N.J.A.C.* 19:9-2.1(b), Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006), and Executive Order No. 26 (Whitman 1994).

Accordingly, authorization is requested to award a contract to Aon Risk Services Northeast, Inc. to provide professional liability insurance brokerage services for the 3-year term in an amount not to exceed \$231,250. Authorization is further requested for the Executive Director to approve each of the two (2) optional one-year extensions upon satisfactory performance by the firm in the amounts not to exceed \$80,938 for the first extension year and \$85,100 for the second extension year, all subject to funding availability at the time of service. It is also requested that the Executive Director be authorized to take such actions and to execute any-and-all documents that may be deemed necessary and appropriate to further the intent and purpose of the authorizations stated herein.

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## General Business

### **Operations - Synopses of Volumes and Crashes**

### August 2022 to July 2023





Figure 2 - Garden State Parkway Vehicle Mileage Traveled and Total Crash Rate by Month

Illustrated below in Figures 1 and 2 are trend lines for monthly vehicle mileage traveled and total crash rate per 100 Million Vehicle Miles (MVM) for the most recent 12 months of available data.

Figure 1 - New Jersey Turnpike Vehicle Mileage Traveled and Total Crash Rate by Month





Figure 3 - New Jersey Turnpike Injury and Property-Damage-Only Crashes by Month

The following un-audited results are for the seven months ended July 31, 2023. Based upon these results, revenues will be sufficient to satisfy the requirements of the Authority's Bond Resolution. For the twelve months ending December 31, 2023, the Authority is projected to have a debt service coverage ratio of 2.02 and a total requirements coverage ratio of 1.53.

The Authority's total revenue for the seven months ended July 31, 2023, was \$1,482,686,000, which is \$59,466,000, or 4.2%, above the 2023 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue was \$1,267,953,000, which is \$12,153,000, or 1.0%, more than the 2023 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue is greater than budget primarily due to milder than expected winter weather. Gas prices averaged \$0.70/gallon lower in 2023 compared to the same period in 2022, however, when compared to June 2023, gas prices in July increased \$0.06/gallon. Investment income was \$21,555,000, or 92.5%, above budget due to both an increase in interest rates above the rates that were budgeted and higher invested balances. *E-ZPass* fees were \$15,373,000, or 22.0% above the budget due to conservative budgeting in 2023. Miscellaneous revenue was \$8,421,000 or 84.2% above budget primarily due to a myriad of one-time recovery payments. Specifically, the Authority received \$2,800,000 in insurance recoveries for the Delaware River Turnpike Bridge and damage to the Exit 7 bridge overpass, as well as \$2,300,000 from FEMA for COVID-19 Costs, Hurricane Ida, and Hurricane Sandy.

For the seven months ended July 31, 2023, traffic on the New Jersey Turnpike increased 3.2% and toll revenue increased 3.1% compared to the same period in 2022. The increase in traffic is primarily due to mild winter weather, overall lower gas prices, and normal growth. Toll revenue increased primarily due to the increase in traffic as well as the 3% annual toll rate indexing which went into effect on January 1, 2023. In addition, traffic and revenue also increased due to more travel during the New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day and Memorial Day weekend holidays compared to the same periods as last year. The 2023 traffic and toll revenue budgets are based on the Authority's traffic engineering consultant's (CDM Smith) Draw Down Letter dated July 22, 2022, updating the September 21, 2018, Toll Revenue Forecast. CDM Smith projected a 1.7% increase in traffic and a 2.3% increase in revenue as compared to the prior year. The actual results for the seven months ended July 31, 2023, were above CDM's projections. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 3.5% but revenue is up 38.9% for the same period. Traffic has recovered to 96.5% of pre-pandemic levels. Through July 2023, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the New Jersey Turnpike was 92.3%, an increase from 91.3% for the same period in 2022.

For the seven months ended July 31, 2023, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway increased 4.4% and revenue increased 8.2% when compared to the same period in 2022. The increase in toll transactions is primarily due to less severe winter weather, lower gas prices compared to last year, and normal growth, while toll revenue increased mainly due to the increase in toll transactions as well as the 3% annual toll rate indexing. Increased travel during the New Year's Day, Martin Luther King Day, Easter and Memorial Day weekend holidays as compared to last year also positively impacted results. The actual results for the seven months ended July 31, 2023, were above the budget which was based on CDM Smith's projection of a 2.3% increase in toll transactions and a 6.5% increase in toll revenue. When compared to the same period in 2019, pre-pandemic, traffic is down 3.7% and revenue is up 29.3%. Traffic has recovered to 96.3% of pre-pandemic levels. Through July 2023, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the Garden State Parkway was 90.5%, an increase from 89.5% for the same period in 2022.

Operating expenses for the seven months ended July 31, 2023, were approximately \$353,718,000, which is \$65,142,000, or 15.6% below the year-to-date budget. The Authority's operating expenses through July were below budget primarily due to lower than budgeted snow/severe weather costs, salaries because of existing vacancies, and health benefits costs due to Authority medical plan changes. These factors were partially offset by higher than budgeted State Police costs due to contractual increases in fringe benefit costs that exceeded budgeted increases. The Authority spent a total of \$7,399,000 for snow and severe weather costs in 2023, solely from the operating expense budget. All snow and severe weather costs are considered operating expenses and paid from the Revenue Fund, except for declared state of emergency events, which are charged to the General Reserve Fund. New Jersey had no declared state of emergency snow events so far in 2023.

Debt Service includes interest and principal payments on the Authority's outstanding bonds and is funded primarily through revenue and to a much lesser extent bond proceeds (capitalized interest). For the seven months ended July 31, 2023, Debt Service totaled \$530,269,000 which was \$28,657,000 or 5.1% below budget as the 2023 budget assumed a \$1.0 billion new money bond issuance in January 2023 which to date has not been required. Debt service through July included \$344,258,000 in interest payments and \$186,011,000 in principal payments. Net debt service (funded from revenue, net of capitalized interest) was \$510,022,000 for the sevenmenth period and was \$679,000 or 0.1% above budget. Net Debt Service is slightly above budget due to the 2022C bond refunding which occurred after the budget was approved and resulted in slightly higher principal payments. The 2023 annual debt service budget includes approximately \$873,200,000 of debt service funded from revenue (net debt service), and the remaining \$85,000,000 of debt service funded from bond proceeds (capitalized interest), for a total debt service budget of \$958,200,000.

The General Reserve Fund includes all contractual payments subordinate to bondholders and expenditures for any other corporate purpose. The General Reserve Fund spending totaled \$492,637,000 for the seven months ended July 31, 2023, which was \$9,432,000 or 1.9% below budget. Spending consisted primarily of \$411,737,000 for the 2021 State Public Transportation Projects Funding Agreement, \$12,833,000 for the Transportation Trust Fund, and \$11,667,000 for the 2023 State Public Transportation Projects Funding Agreement. Also included are \$42,740,000 in transfers to the Supplemental Capital program in the Construction Fund. General Reserve is below budget mainly because there was no spending on state of emergency snow/severe weather events.

The Capital Budget, which is funded by revenue, consists of the Maintenance Reserve Fund, Special Project Reserve Fund, and the Supplemental Capital Program. For the seven months ended July 31, 2023, total expenditures were approximately \$155,173,000, which was 73.7% of the year-to-date spending budget. Expenditures included \$24,131,000 for Service Area Renovations, \$15,857,000 for TPK Resurfacing MP 35.5 to 48.5 NB & SB Roadways - Section 4, and \$13,892,000 for GSP Resurfacing MP 148.8 to 160.7 NB & SB Roadways - Section 14. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$277,040,000.

The Construction Fund, which is funded from bond proceeds, consists of the 2023-2027 Capital Improvement Program, 2019 Capital Improvement Program, and the 2008 \$7 Billion Capital Improvement Program. For the seven months ended July 31, 2023, total expenditures were approximately \$279,202,000, which was 66.0% of the year-to-date spending budget. Total expenditures included \$39,506,000 for Service Area Renovations, \$24,340,000 for TPK Bridge Rehabilitation W107.87, E107.88, \$23,686,000 for GSP 128 AB 154.2N & TPK 90-91.37and 84.24N&S, and \$18,497,000 for GSP Shoulder Widening Reconstruction MP 30-35. In addition to these expenditures, there are open contracts and commitments totaling approximately \$891,128,000.

Authorization for the Executive Director to Execute a Partial Assignment of Operating Agreement for the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway

Restaurants, dated September 2017 (as Amended)

At the April 2023 meeting of the Board of Commissioners, the Board authorized a Second Amendment to Applegreen NJ Welcome Centres, LLC's ("Applegreen") existing Operating Agreement with the Authority requiring Applegreen to design, permit, install, own and operate universal, high speed Electric Vehicle (EV) charging stations and related infrastructure at the Service Areas (collectively, "EV Charging Services").

Applegreen is now requesting the Authority's approval to assign its rights and obligations to undertake the EV Charging Services to Applegreen Electric NJ LLC ("Applegreen Electric"), which is a subsidiary of Applegreen specializing in EV Charging Services.

Pursuant to Section 25 of the Operating Agreement, the Authority is required to first approve any assignment before it can be effected by Applegreen.

In view of the foregoing, authorization is being requested for the Executive Director to execute a partial assignment of the existing Applegreen Operating Agreement, as it relates solely to EV Charging Services and to take all other actions necessary to effectuate the intent herein.
