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PUBLIC COMMENT (in Person)

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Barry Kushnir, Local 194

Mr. Kushnir wished everyone a very nice Memorial Day weekend and asked that everyone take this opportunity to acknowledge the ultimate sacrifice that our service men and women have made as we celebrate the weekend. Mr. Kushnir stated he is very happy that Hudson Bay Extension project is moving forward as it will bring safe bridges, good jobs and economic growth.

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PUBLIC COMMENT (remote by tele-conference)

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Andrew Schwalm

Mr. Schwalm stated he is a resident of Jersey City and that he is strongly opposed to the expansion of the Newark Bay-Hudson County Extension project and is asking the Authority to rethink this project and look into rebuilding the infrastructure, not adding more roads. Mr. Schwalm further stated that he has concerns regarding more traffic in Jersey City because of this project. Mr. Schwalm expressed that \$10.7 Billion is an outrageous expenditure and stated the Authority should think about reallocated that investment towards a mass transit network, which would be a much more sustainable, efficient and better use of those funds. Mr. Schwalm commented that with New York pushing back in the other direction with congestion pricing, Jersey City is going to be bearing the enormous brunt of an extremely misguided project.

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Tayla Schwartz

Ms. Schwartz stated she is a resident of Jersey City and the President of Safe Streets JC and that she has two kids that she rides the bus frequently with, rides bikes with and commutes to work via the path and also has a vehicle and she expressed that she, her family and her neighbors are strongly opposed to the Turnpike Expansion project. Ms. Schwartz spoke about the Authority's clear disregard of community input from the communities that are going to be affected by this project. Ms. Schwartz voiced concerns of no public comment sessions where the Authority had to publicly respond to the concerns that the public has shared regarding this project. Ms. Schwartz stated that the Authority claims that the majority of the traffic on the expansion is getting off at Jersey City and she stated that makes no sense and drivers are clearly getting off in Jersey City to travel to the Holland Tunnel and the Lincoln Tunnel. Ms. Schwartz further stated this project will double the cars on the road and that will only make congestion worse and increase pollution and it will not improve air quality. Lastly, Ms. Schwartz finished by saying that the Authority can use this money and makes lots of new jobs for the unions by building new trains, new light rails and building bus lanes but instead are investing in this absurd Turnpike Expansion project and making everyone's lives worse in Hudson County.

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Miso Demko

Mr. Demko stated he is a resident of Bayonne and uses all forms of transportation and regularly crosses the Newark Bay Bridge and stated he is all in favor of new jobs and new infrastructure involvement in Bayonne and around the region, however, the Turnpike Expansion project is not a sustainable path towards that goal. Mr. Demko stated it would only double the traffic and in 50 years time, the same questions will resurface regarding congestion and how to grow. Mr. Demko said we need to look at our future and look at transportation alternatives to help move people more efficiently and the Turnpike Expansion project will only bring more congestion and more exhaust and emissions. Lastly, Mr. Demko finished by saying he has found it difficult to find ways to participate or even learn about the project and has asked for public input sessions.

Acting Director of Law, Ann C. Monica, requested approval of Agenda Item Nos. 2024-05-104 through 2024-05-109 and 2024-05-133. Moved are the items as follows:

2024-05-104

In a memorandum dated May 9, 2024, <u>Authorization to Renew the Authority's Property</u>

Insurance Program for Property located on the Garden State Parkway and the New Jersey

Turnpike (the "Program") for one (1) year from June 15, 2024 to June 15, 2025 upon the same

terms and conditions, R-186271, Budget Code: 010-822-441030, Amount: not to exceed

\$11,147,955, was approved.

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the "Authority") maintains a property insurance program for the protection of its physical assets and business income (the "Program"). The Program currently insures all property on both roadways with a total insurable value ("TIV") of \$28,159,745,261 via a primary quota share \$600,000,000 layer. The primary layer is supplemented by an excess layer which provides an additional \$200,000,000 layer of coverage. The Program is subject to specified sub-limits for different categories and/or exposures and is subject to a \$2 million per occurrence deductible. Standalone terrorism coverage is provided through Lloyd's of London, which provides broader coverage than insuring Terrorism through the Federal Terrorism Risk Insurance Program Reauthorization Act (TRIPRA).

Marsh USA, Inc. ("Marsh"), the Authority's broker of record, was asked to seek quotations for a one (1) year renewal, based on a TIV of \$28,945,156,231 which represents an increase of approximately 2.8% from the prior year. Marsh approached the incumbent carriers and sought out new markets. Many markets declined to quote for a variety of reasons that were specific to their individual risk appetite. Markets that did quote were evaluated by Marsh and Turner Surety and Insurance Brokerage, Inc., ("TSIB"), the Authority's insurance and risk management consultant, for price and quality of coverage.

With respect to All Risk primary layer of \$600,000,000, after review of all quotations, Marsh and TSIB recommend, and the Law Department concurs, with renewal of the program for one (1) year as follows:

The above amount does not include a mandatory surcharge of \$26,029. In addition, a Boiler and Machinery Policy, including all Inspection and Certification Fees of \$54,421 is required.

With respect to the excess layer, Marsh secured renewal quotations from Swiss Re and Chubb Bermuda and Lloyds syndicates, with Swiss Re providing 50% of the capacity, Chubb Bermuda providing 42.5% and Lloyds syndicates providing 7.5% of the \$200,000,000 capacity at premiums of \$237,232, \$228,466 and \$36,815, respectively, plus a tax surcharge of \$3,558. Based on the recommendation of Marsh and TSIB, it is recommended that this layer be renewed for an estimated \$506,072. Marsh also secured standalone terrorism coverage with a \$800,000,000 limit, with Hiscox for an estimated \$241,875,

and an excess terrorism layer of \$200,000,000 with Lloyds/Lancashire for an estimated premium of \$42,000. Marsh continues to negotiate with the market to secure the most advantageous quotation for these layers of coverage.

The total premium for placement of the insurance as set forth above for the one (1) year renewal is currently estimated to be \$11,147,955 and represents an approximate 19.42% increase in premium rate. Marsh will continue to negotiate with the underwriters for an improved premium for all layers of coverage up to June 15, 2024, the date that the renewal will become effective.

It is therefore recommended that the Commissioners authorize renewal and placement of the Authority's Bridge and Non-Bridge property insurance program as set forth above, for a total premium as indicated above. It is further recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to substitute or add insurance companies to those indicated above and approve other changes to the structure recommended above, after consultation with the Authority's Law Department, should he deem it is in the best interest of the Authority. It is further recommended that the Executive Director, after consultation with the Authority's Law Department, be authorized to execute all documents and to take any and all further actions to effectuate the renewal of the Program as indicated herein.

<u>2024-05-105</u>

In a memorandum dated May 6, 2024, <u>Authorization for the Executive Director to Renew the Authority's Excess Liability Insurance – Self-Insured General Liability and Automobile Liability Insurance Program (June 15, 2024 to June 15, 2025), R-186327, Budget Code: 10-822-441010, <u>Amount: not to exceed: \$4,016,583</u>, was approved.</u>

The Authority maintains Excess Liability insurance, including General Liability, Automobile Liability, Employers' Liability and Police Professional Liability insurance which was due to expire on April 15, 2024. Authorization to extend this program by sixty (60) days was provided by the Commissioners via agenda item 056-03-2024 to allow Willis of New Jersey, ("Willis") Authority's broker of record for the Program, additional time to seek the best terms and conditions for renewal.

The Program provides \$100 million of Excess Liability Insurance above its \$5 million self-insured retention ("SIR") for General Liability, Automobile Liability, Employers' Liability and Police Protective Liability claims. The current lead carrier, Lexington, who had been providing the lead \$5 million layer of insurance for this line for many years, advised that due to market conditions and not the Authority's claims history, that it could no longer provide the primary layer coverage. Willis was tasked with marketing the primary layer and all remaining layers of the Program, upon the same terms and conditions, for the full \$100 million limit. After review of all submissions, and upon the recommendation of Willis and Turner Surety and Insurance Brokerage, Inc. ("TSIB"), it is recommended that the Program be renewed as follows:

The renewal is proposed at a cost not to exceed \$4,016,583 which includes all mandatory New Jersey Property Liability Insurance Guarantee Association ("PLIGA") surcharges and other applicable taxes.

It is therefore requested that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to renew the Excess Liability Insurance coverage, upon the terms and conditions as outlined above, including Terrorism Risk Insurance Act coverage, at a total premium, including all applicable state taxes and surcharges including New Jersey PLIGA and New Jersey Excess & Surplus line taxes for a total amount not to exceed \$4,016,583. It is further requested that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to take all such actions and to execute all such documents to effectuate the authority set forth above.

In a memorandum dated May 6, 2024, <u>Authorization to Declare Property Surplus to the Authority's Needs and Authorize the Executive Director to Transfer the Property to the Town of Secaucus New Jersey Turnpike Section 7, Parcels R128, R128X and a portion of Parcel W57, Louis and Moller Streets (adjacent to the Alexander Hamilton Service Area) Town of Secaucus, Hudson County (the "Property"), was approved.</u>

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the "Authority") owns Parcels R128, R128X, and a portion of Parcel W57, located at the southwest quadrant of the intersection of Louis and Moller Street and northeast of the park and ride area of the Alexander Hamilton Service Area, Town of Secaucus, Hudson County, consisting of ±0.24 acres of vacant land that are adjacent to Block 35 Lot 8 and the municipal right-of-way.

The Town of Secaucus contacted the Authority seeking to purchase the Property for use as a public park. In accordance with the Authority's regulations for the sale of surplus property, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.6, the Law Department has circulated information regarding the Property to the Chief Engineer, the

Director of Operations, the Chief Information Officer (ITS), and the Authority's Engineering Consultant, HNTB Corporation, for review. Each has reviewed information regarding the Property, and all have certified that the Authority no longer requires the Property and does not see any future use of the Property by the Authority. The Property has been certified by the various departments as surplus to the Authority's needs and will be disposed of pursuant to the Authority's Regulations for the Sale of Surplus Property, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.6, and the Authority's By-Laws.

Accordingly, it is recommended that authorization be given to declare the Property surplus to the Authority's needs. It is further recommended that the Executive Director be authorized to take any steps necessary to transfer Parcels R128, R128X, and a portion of Parcel W57, in accordance with the Authority's regulations for the sale of Surplus Property, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.6, and the Authority's By-Laws. It is further recommended that the Authority's Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any such other documents and take any such other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization.

In a memorandum dated May 6, 2024, <u>Authorization to Deem Certain Properties Necessary</u> and to Take Steps Necessary for the Implementation of the New Jersey Turnpike Grade Separated <u>U-turns Project and to Acquire the Necessary Property Interests</u>, <u>Lawnside Borough</u>, <u>Camden County</u>, <u>Woolwich Township</u>, <u>Gloucester County</u>, <u>West Deptford Township</u>, <u>Gloucester County</u>, <u>Springfield Township</u>, <u>Burlington County</u>, <u>Westampton Township</u>, <u>Burlington County</u>, <u>Oldmans Township</u>, <u>Salem County</u>, <u>Budget Code</u>: <u>5000028003</u>, was approved.

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the "Authority") is proceeding with its plans to replace the at grade U-turns along the Turnpike Mainline with grade-separated U-turns near Mileposts 6.4, 13.4, 19.0, 29.1, 43.0 and 46.1 (the "Project") located within the municipalities indicated above, as safety enhancements.

Based on the plans and design to date, the Project will require the acquisition of twenty (20) property interests from various public and private entities for direct use in the Project. The acquisitions are more fully described on the chart attached hereto as Exhibit A. This list is based on the current design and may be subject to change as the Project progresses. To that end, the Law Department will need to obtain both title work and an appraisal in order to begin the acquisition process.

The majority of the proposed acquisitions do not involve property designated as "Preserved Farmland" pursuant to and as required by the Agriculture Development and Retention Act, N.J.S.A. 4:1C-11, et seq. (the "ADA"), and State Agricultural Development Committee Rules, N.J.A.C. 2:76-1.1, the ADA's implementing regulations, nor have the above-referenced properties been designated or encumbered as Green Acres Properties pursuant to N.J.S.A. 13:1D-53, et seq. Four (4) of the proposed acquisitions do involve property designated by the ADA, but the ADA has been deemed not applicable due to the minor nature of the proposed Project improvements.

Accordingly, it is requested that the Authority's Commissioners deem the property interests set forth on the attached Exhibit A necessary for the construction of the Project. In addition, authorization by the Authority's Commissioners is requested to permit the Executive Director, with the assistance of the Law Department, Engineering Department, outside General Counsel and other Authority consultants, to take all steps necessary to prepare for the acquisition of all property interests required for the Project, including those property interests listed on Exhibit A attached hereto, and any other property interests deemed necessary for acquisition during the final design process. This includes but is not limited to entering into negotiations to acquire the property interests and when such negotiations have reached an impasse, authorization for the Executive Director to commence eminent domain proceedings, including but not limited to, depositing the appraised value into court and filing a Declaration of Taking. The final purchase price will be submitted for approval to the Authority's Commissioners in a separate agenda item.

It is further recommended that the Authority's Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any such other documents and take any such other actions as are deemed necessary to effectuate the intent of this authorization, and ratify all actions taken in furtherance of same.

In a memorandum dated May 21, 2024, <u>Authorization to Settle Litigation in the Matter of Julijana Coleska v. NJTA, et al., R-186353, Budget Code: 10-822-441043, Amount: \$187,500.00, was approved.</u>

This matter is a consolidated personal injury claim arising from an accident on the Garden State Parkway near milepost 154.50 in the City of Clifton on November 13, 2017. A New Jersey Turnpike Authority Maintenance Division employee, while driving an Authority attenuator-mounted dump truck, collided with Coleska's vehicle by crossing into the lane that the Plaintiff was driving in. The impact of the accident resulted in the plaintiff alleging that she suffered a disk bulge, disk herniation, torn labrum (shoulder), and loss of consciousness. The court consolidated this litigation pursuant to Rule 4:38-1 with a separate unrelated accident in June 2018 involving the Plaintiff in Hudson Township, New Jersey.

The parties attended a court-ordered mediation on May 7, 2024. At the mediation, the parties agreed to a global settlement of \$375,000 of all claims in both litigations, to be split equally between the Authority and the co-defendant, without any admission of wrongdoing by the Authority. The Authority's equal share would be \$187,500, subject to the Board of Commissioners' approval. General Counsel reviewed this matter and other similar matters that were previously adjudicated and/or settled to confirm that this proposed settlement value is reasonable given the facts of the case, in consideration of plaintiff's injury, age, and the projected future costs of defense. The Law Department concurs with General Counsel's recommendation.

Therefore, it is recommended that the Board of Commissioners approve the settlement of this matter pursuant to the terms set forth above. It is also recommended that the Board of Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any and all documents in furtherance of same.

In a memorandum dated May 6, 2024, <u>Authorization to amend the New Jersey Turnpike</u>

<u>Authority Employees' Deferred Compensation Plan (the "Plan") to comply with SECURE Act</u>

<u>and SECURE 2.0 Act and to authorize the Executive Director to evaluate and incorporate into</u>

<u>the Plan additional provisions of SECURE and SECURE 2.0</u>, was approved.

The Authority maintains a tax deferred savings plan in accordance with applicable provisions of the Internal Revenue Code Section 457(b), known as the New Jersey Turnpike Authority Employees' Deferred Compensation Plan (the "Plan"). Two (2) other agencies participate in the Plan, namely, the Burlington County Bridge Commission and the South Jersey Transportation Agency. Authorization is requested to amend the Plan, which was last amended and restated in 2017, so that it complies with the SECURE Act and SECURE Act 2.0 (the "Acts") provisions, including, among other things, increasing the age for required minimum distributions (RMDs); decreasing the penalty for RMDs which are not taken in a timely manner; and allowing catch up contributions to be made via a Roth account.

Numerous other optional amendments have been authorized under the Acts, which will require additional review and consultation with the Authority's Deferred Compensation Committee, Authority consultants, and outside counsel. These include various options which may allow participants in the Plan flexibility as to their funds, among other options, for which the Authority may need to await further guidance from the IRS regarding implementation and coordination with Mission Square the Plan provider.

Therefore, authorization is requested to amend the Plan as indicated above, and to authorize the Executive Director to make further amendments permitted by the Acts that he deems to be in the best interest of the participants of the Plan after consultation with the Deferred Compensation Committee. Authorization is further requested to take all further actions necessary to effectuate the authorizations granted herein.

In a memorandum dated May 17, 2024, <u>Authorization to Settle Litigation in the Matter of DePalma, et al. v. New Jersey Turnpike Authority, R-187025, Budget Code: 10-822-441043, Amount: \$1,000,000.00, was approved.</u>

<u>DePalma et al. v. New Jersey Turnpike Authority et al.</u> is a lawsuit filed by three former New Jersey Turnpike Authority staff attorneys, Nicholas DePalma, Paul Macchia, and Maulik Sanghavi, who were terminated as part of a reduction in force. The plaintiffs filed a suit for wrongful discharge.

The parties reached a conditional agreement subject to the Authority's Board of Commissioners approval, at mediation on May 3, 2024, before Superior Court Judge Mark Epstein, J.S.C. (ret.). In

principle, the total settlement is \$1 million allocated as follows: \$289,895 (Nicholas DePalma); \$140,695 (Paul Macchia); and \$140,495 (Maulik Sanghavi). The remaining gross proceeds of \$428,915 would be remitted to plaintiffs' counsel for incurred counsel fees as required by the Civil Rights Act. The Authority's insurance carrier, AIG, will reimburse the Authority \$700,000 of the gross settlement amount and approximately \$90,000 in incurred defense costs. The Authority's out-of-pocket share of the settlement is \$300,000, representing 30% of the gross settlement amount. AIG conceptually agrees to this allocation predicated on the exclusionary language set forth in the Authority's Employment Practices Liability policy.

The Authority's General Counsel and Law Department have reviewed the settlement and recommend the Board of Commissioners' approval pursuant to the terms set forth herein. It is further recommended that the Board of Commissioners authorize the Executive Director to execute any and all documents and take such further steps as necessary to fulfill the intent and purpose of this recommendation.

In a memorandum dated May 17, 2024, <u>Authorization to Enter into Agreements with the New York Jets, New Jersey Devils and Rutgers University for E-ZPass and Safety Messaging Advertising,</u> was approved.

This agenda item is a request to enter into three separate agreements for E-ZPass advertising and Safety Messaging at NY Jets, LLC, New Jersey Devils and Rutgers University sporting events for the 2024 and 2025 seasons. This initiative will advertise and promote the NJ E-ZPass concept as an easier and more efficient means of travel throughout the New Jersey area including various messages promoting safe travel.

The NY Jets football event advertising package will consist of outside and inside stadium advertising for all 2024 pre-season and regular season home games. Specifically, advertising messages around the perimeter of the stadium, on over 2000 video monitors in and around the inside of the facility and radio spots throughout each event. Additionally, E-ZPass Promotional Days will be scheduled to include on site interaction with patrons to further explain, and promote advantages of the E-ZPass concept. The cost for this advertising package is \$180,000.

The Rutgers University advertising package will consist of promotions for the 2024 football season and the 2024-2025 Rutgers wrestling and men's and woman's basketball seasons. Specifically, advertising will consist of video board exposure, radio initiatives and social media promotions. Additionally, E-ZPass Promotional Days will be scheduled to further endorse the E-ZPass concept. The total cost for this project is \$180,000.

The New Jersey Devils agreement will include advertising promotions at all Devils home games and other major Prudential Center events. Specifically, exterior LED messaging, digital concourse messaging, concourse E-ZPass activations, in-game features and fan interaction and radio initiatives. The total cost for this project is \$180,000.

Accordingly, approval of these agreements is respectfully requested in the total annual amount of \$540,000. It is further recommended that the Commissioners authorize the Executive Director or his designee to execute all documents relative thereto. Authorization is also requested to authorize the Executive Director or his designee to enter into agreements for the two (2) one-year renewals at the same terms and conditions.

Memorandum of Agreement between the New Jersey Turnpike Authority and AFSCME, Local 3914 for a 2023-2027 Collective Bargaining Agreement

The New Jersey Turnpike Authority (the Authority) and AFSCME Local 3914 (Local 3914), having engaged in negotiations for an agreement to succeed the parties' 2019-2023 collective bargaining agreement (CBA), which expired on June 30, 2023, agree to the following amendments to the 2019-2023 CBA:

- 1. The terms of the Joint Issues Memorandum of Agreement dated November 15, 2023, attached as Schedule A, shall be incorporated into the parties' 2023-2027 CBA.
- 2. Schedule B, attached to this MOA, shall be incorporated into the parties 2023-2027 CBA and shall be substituted for Article 14, Health Benefits, in the 2019-2023 CBA.

3. Salary increases:

- A. All Local 3914 unit members, including unit members at the TOR/maximum of their salary grade, shall receive 3.5% increases to their base salaries effective July 1, 2023, July 1, 2024, July 1, 2025 and July 1, 2026.
- B. The minimums and maximums of all salary grades (grades 13, 14, 14A and 15) shall be increased by the above-referenced across-the-board increases.
- C. Effective July 1, 2024, the maximum salary of each grade shall be increased by 2.0% for those who have been at TOR for 12 months. The 2.0% increase to the maximum salary shall be calculated based on the maximum salary after the application of the July 1, 2024 3.5% ATB.

The PIP (aka annual increment) shall be paid as follows:

i. Effective July 1, 2024, and each following July 1, Local 3914 unit members not at TOR will receive a PIP ("Annual Increment") to base salary in the following amounts, based upon the following years of service:

0-5 Years	\$1,000.00 (increased by \$500)
6-10 Years	\$1,250.00 (increased by \$250)
11-15 Years	\$1,750.00 (increased by \$250)
16-20 Years	\$2,000.00 (no change)
21-25 Years	\$2,500.00 (no change)
26+	\$3,000.00 (no change)

ii. Local 3914 unit members at TOR/maximum of their salary grade will receive the above PIPs as off base payments.

4. Duty Book

A. For Maintenance and Operations Local 3914 unit members the language in Article 26 of the CBA will be modified as follows:

Maintenance and Operations Department

When the Authority deems necessary, it may assign members of the Association, who are assigned to the **Operations** Department, which includes the Traffic and Maintenance Divisions, and occupy a pay grade XIII or XIV job title, to Stand-By Duty. If the Authority exercises its discretion to assign a member of the Association who is assigned to the **Operations** Department and occupies a pay grade XIII or XIV job title, to Stand-By Duty, the following process shall be employed:

Stand-By Duty in the <u>Operations</u> Department will be assigned to employees on a rotating basis. The Maintenance Department may have more than one (1) group of employees on Stand-By Duty. For example, it may have employees in the Trades group rotating on one stand-by list and it may have another group of employees on a separate, rotating stand-by duty list.

Maintenance employees assigned to Stand-By Duty shall be assigned one week of Stand-By Duty from 7:00 AM Monday through 7:00 AM Monday. Traffic employees assigned Stand-By Duty shall be assigned one week of Stand-By Duty from 9:00 AM Monday through 9:00 AM Monday. The hour which Stand-By Duty begins may be adjusted by management. Employees on Stand-By/Duty must be available for emergency call-outs and must:

- 1. carry an Authority supplied cell phone or other electronic communication device; and
- 2. remain within reasonable commuting distance to their normal work location while on Stand-By Duty.

Members of the Association who are assigned to weekly Stand-By Duty shall be paid for each week of Stand-By Duty a sum equal to <u>six (6)</u> hours of pay at the straight time rate.

Employees on Stand-By Duty and are required to do work from home will be not be paid for hours worked, unless the cumulative hours worked from home exceed the guaranteed <u>six (6)</u> hours of straight time. For example, if an employee, who is on Stand-by Duty, works ten (10)

hours from home during his week of Stand-By Duty, he will be paid the <u>six (6)</u> hours of guaranteed straight time, plus <u>four (4)</u> hours of straight time.

Employees on Stand-By Duty who cannot resolve an issue from home and must travel to Authority premises to resolve the issue **shall be paid for all hours worked at the straight time rate**, and shall receive a minimum of two (2) hours of pay at the straight time rate.

Employees who are not on Stand-By Duty and are required to work from home shall be paid <u>all</u> hours worked at the 'straight time rate. Employees who are not on Stand-By Duty and cannot resolve an issue from home and must travel to Authority premises to resolve the issue <u>shall be paid</u> for all hours worked at the straight time rate and shall receive a minimum of four (4) hours of pay at the straight time rate.

Mileage will not be paid to employees who utilize Authority assigned vehicles when responding to a call-out.

In addition, four (4) hours of pay at the straight time rate shall be paid to employees who are on Stand-by Duty on any of the paid holidays in the Article 15 of the CNA.

Employees cannot reassign their Stand-By Duty to another employee without the written approval, which includes electronic mail, of the Authority.

B. The ITS and Safety Sections of Article 26 shall not be changed.

5. Hours and Lunch

- 1. Change hours of work for Turnpike Maintenance, Central Shops & Divisions, and for Maintenance (HQ Woodbridge) employees to an eight (8) hour day.
- 2. Hours of work: 7:00am to 3:00pm or 8:00am to 4:00pm).

6. Snow Overtime

Extend Snow Overtime Pilot Program through April 15, 2024. The Union shall be entitled to a contract reopener for the specific purpose of negotiating the Snow Overtime Pilot Program, upon giving notice to the Authority prior to the expiration of the Pilot Program. The Authority shall provide reasonable notice (at least 60 days prior to October 15, 2024) of a change or discontinuation of the Pilot Program, and an opportunity to negotiate upon request. The status quo during any such reopener from

which the parties may negotiate shall be that the Pilot Program is no longer in effect upon expiration.

7. Minimum Amount of Time to Get Paid if Asked to Stay Over

All unit employees who perform approved overtime on scheduled days before or after their scheduled work shift, shall be paid for all overtime hours worked at straight time rates, provided a minimum of 30 minutes are worked.

8. Holiday Premium

If a Tolls area manager works or is called into work on any holiday recognized in Article 15 (Holidays) of this Agreement, such area manager shall receive an additional \$150.

9. Terminal Leave

Any employee shall be permitted to use Terminal Leave, regardless of whether they were hired into full-time employment before July 1, 2015.

10. Telework

- 1. The Telework Pilot Program is extended through June 30, 2024. The Authority shall provide reasonable notice (at least 30 days) of a change or discontinuation of the Telework Pilot Program, and an opportunity to negotiate upon request. The status quo from which the parties may negotiate shall be that which existed prior to the Pilot Program.
- 1. The 4-Day Work Week Pilot Program is Extended through June 30, 2024. The Authority shall provide reasonable notice (at least 30 days) of a change or discontinuation of the 4-Day Work Week Pilot Program, and an opportunity to negotiate upon request. The status quo from which the parties may negotiate shall be that which existed prior to the Pilot Program.

11. Vacation Accrual

Increase maximum number of vacation days that can be earned by employees hired into fulltime service on or after July 1, 2015 to 30 days.

12. Transfer and Temporary Openings

1. If the Turnpike reassigns an employee to another toll plaza or other work location that is more than 20 miles away from their existing work location, then, for the duration of the reassignment the employee shall be entitled to reimbursement for mileage, unless they are driving a Turnpike vehicle.

13. Shift Differential

If a shift outside of regular working hours is established for any unit employee, the Union shall have the ability to negotiate terms for such shift.

13. Group Life Insurance

Restore Group Life Insurance for employees who were hired into full-time employment on or after July 1, 2015 to the same benefit received by employees who were hired into full-time employment prior to July 1, 2015.

14. TDI and Workers Compensation

Side Letter of Agreement on TDI and Workers Compensation Benefits between the Turnpike Authority and IFPTE Local 200

- Local 3914 and the Turnpike agree to continue negotiating over TDI and Workers
 Compensation benefits following ratification of this MOA, with the objective of
 increasing benefits available to Local 3914 unit members by looking to the higher
 levels of benefits received by Turnpike employees represented by other local
 unions for guidance.
- 2. Within sixty (60) days following ratification of this MOA, the Turnpike shall present to Local 3914 its proposed changes to its Workers Compensation and TDI policies, which shall include modernizing and making more efficient the implementation of its policies and which shall also include its proposals for increasing TDI and Workers Compensation.
- 3. Within 15 days of receipt of the Turnpike's proposals with respect to Workers Compensation and TDI policies, the Turnpike will convene a table at which Local 3914 shall review the proposed policies and the parties shall negotiate over the subjects in the policies that are negotiable. The Turnpike may invite other union locals to participate in the table to provide input into the proposed policies. The objective of the Turnpike and Local 3914 will be to reach agreement on all negotiable aspects of the proposed policies and on benefit increases within 60 days following receipt of the proposed policies by Local 3914.
- 4. The Turnpike agrees that it will negotiate in good faith with Local 3914 and will not refuse to enter into a final agreement with Local 3914 even if the Turnpike is unable to reach agreement with other local unions representing Turnpike employees.
- 15. The term of the parties' 2023-2027 CBA shall be July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2027.

- 16. Any terms of the parties' 2019-2023 CBA that are not expressly modified by this MOA shall remain in full force and effect and shall be incorporated into the parties' 2023-2027 CBA.
- 17. This MOA and the attachments are subject to ratification by the membership of Local 3914.
