In a memorandum dated October 4, 2024, Authorization to Declare the following Two (2) Properties Surplus to the Authority's Needs and Authorize the Executive Director to sell the properties at public bid: (1) New Jersey Turnpike Section 3F, Parcel 303X, also known as Block 2726, Lot 4, 5715 South Broad Street, Town of Hamilton, Mercer County, New Jersey (the "Hamilton Property"); and (2) Garden State Parkway Parcel X4569D, Section 7 vacant land located at the corner of Essex Road and Asbury Avenue in the Borough of Tinton Falls, Monmouth County, New Jersey (the "Tinton Falls Property"), was approved.

New Jersey Turnpike, Ferreira Construction Co. Inc., Rehabilitation of Str. No. W107.87, Laderman

Bridge, Milepost 105 to Milepost W110, R-189612, Budget Code: 5000000015, Amount:

\$84,246,472.00, was approved.

This contract will provide for construction of a partial depth bridge deck Latex Modified Concrete (LMC) overlay, and perform fatigue steel repairs, structural steel repairs, and bearing replacements on Structure No. W107.87 (major bridge). The contract will also provide for miscellaneous deck repairs to

eight (8) routine bridges located within the work zone. All work is expected to be substantially completed by May 2028.

Five (5) bid proposals were received on October 10, 2024 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal in the amount of \$84,246,472.00 may be compared to the second lowest bid proposal in the amount of \$86,511,500.00. The bids were significantly lower than the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$120,323,461.05 due to the Contractor's knowledge of the work based on similar previous and successfully completed work and the current bidding climate. The low bidder, Ferreira Construction Co., Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. T100.646 be awarded to the low bidder, Ferreira Construction Co., Inc. of Branchburg, New Jersey in the amount of \$84,246,472.00. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this fair and open contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

This contract will eliminate the existing taper on-ramp at Turnpike Interchange 14 Ramp TSO merge with NSO Roadway from Milepost 103.6 to 104.7 and provide increased shoulder width to facilitate half-ramp closures at the entrance of Ramp TS, adjacent to the Newark State Police Facility. The improvements include upgrading roadside protection; lighting standard upgrades; regrading; shoulder widening; signage improvements; curb reconstruction; roadway reprofiling; and roadway restriping. Improvements also include fencing repairs for the New Jersey State Police facility. All work is expected to be substantially completed by August 2025.

Five (5) bid proposals were received on September 24, 2024 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The lowest bid proposal, submitted by Union Paving & Construction Co., Inc., in the amount of \$5,335,717.00, meets all the terms and conditions and may be compared to the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$5,145,359.00. Union Paving & Construction Co., Inc. has previously performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is, therefore, recommended that Contract No. T200.843 be awarded to the low bidder, Union Paving & Construction Co., Inc., of Mountainside, New Jersey in the amount of \$5,335,717.00. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this fair and open contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

This Order for Professional Services will provide for professional engineering services for the Independent Design Review of the Engineer of Record's design for the proposed staged twin, 3-span, cable-stayed bridges and flanking spans over the Newark Bay, and demolition of the existing througharch structure (Structure No. N2.01) and other related work.

This assignment is classified as a "Complex Project" since the scope of work is not clearly defined and likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost exceeds \$2,000,000.00. The Solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and twelve (12) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Code A098, Bridges: Complex. Five (5) firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of June 28, 2024.

The scoring of the EOIs by the Review Committee resulted in the following order of ranking: 1) COWI North America, Inc.; 2) AECOM Technical Services; and 3) WSP USA Inc. On September 4, 2024, Technical and sealed Fee Proposals were received from the top three firms. The Review Committee reviewed and evaluated each firm's Technical Proposal, and it was determined that oral presentations would not be required. The final scoring resulted in COWI North America, Inc. being the highest technically ranked firm. The fee submitted by COWI North America, Inc. has been reviewed, negotiated and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. T3920 be issued to the firm of COWI North America, Inc. of New York, New York, in an amount not to exceed \$8,320,000.00. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.80 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. These professional services were procured by a fair and open process, and the recommended firm was selected in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seq., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

No. W107.87, Laderman Bridge, Milepost 105 to Milepost W110, R-189594, Budget Code: 5000000015, Amount: \$12,470,000.00, was approved.

This Order for Professional Services will provide supervision of construction services for Contract No. T100.646, Rehabilitation of Str. No. W107.87, Laderman Bridge, Milepost 105 to Milepost W110. These services include construction inspection, bridge repair inspection, material testing, record keeping, preparation of payment estimates, and other services required to ensure compliance with the contract documents.

This assignment is classified as a "Complex Project" since the scope of work is not clearly defined and likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost exceeds \$2,000,000.00. The Solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and fifty-four (54) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Code(s): B155, Bridge Construction Inspection and B156, Bridge Repair Inspection. Eight (8) firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of August 20, 2024.

The scoring of the EOIs by the Review Committee resulted in the following order of ranking: 1) M&J Engineering, P.C.; 2) APTIM Environmental & Infrastructure, LLC; and 3) Jacobs Engineering Group Inc. On September 20, 2024, Technical and sealed Fee Proposals were received from the top three firms. The Review Committee reviewed and evaluated each firm's Technical Proposal and determined that oral presentations would not be required. The final scoring resulted in M&J Engineering, P.C. being the highest technically ranked firm. The fee submitted by M&J Engineering, P.C. has been reviewed and negotiated and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. T3969 be issued to the firm of M&J Engineering, P.C. of Ridgefield Park, New Jersey, in an amount not to exceed \$12,470,000.00. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.35 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses. These professional services were procured by a fair and open process, and the recommended firm was selected in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:34-9.1, et seq., N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1 of the Authority's enabling legislation, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.8, promulgated pursuant thereto, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

(OPS No. T4069), Michael Baker International, Inc. (OPS No. T4070), Order for Professional Services No. T4069, Design Services for Contract No. T100.740, Bridge Repairs and Resurfacing, Milepost 92 to 122 and the Newark Bay-Hudson County Extension (2026), R-189623, Budget Code: 0390000009, Amount: \$1,995,000.00 and Order for Professional Services No. T4070, Design Services for Contract No. T100.744, Bridge Repairs and Resurfacing, Milepost 0 to 92 and the Pearl Harbor Memorial Turnpike Extension (2026), R-189625, Budget Code: 0390000010, Amount: \$1,925,000.00, was approved.

Through this single procurement process the Authority will select two consultants to furnish design services and prepare construction contract documents for the annual bridge deck and miscellaneous structural repair contracts for 2026, which will address the northern and southern portions of the Turnpike.

The design services associated with OPS No. T4069 provides for bridge inspection, condition evaluation, and preparation of contract documents for bridge deck repairs, resurfacing, and miscellaneous structural repairs on the northern portion of the Turnpike. The design services associated

with OPS No. T4070 provides for bridge inspection, condition evaluation, and preparation of contract documents for bridge deck repairs, resurfacing, and miscellaneous structural repairs on the southern portion of the Turnpike.

These assignments are classified as "Simple Projects" since the scopes of work are clearly defined and not likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost of each is less than \$2,000,000.00. The Solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and fifty-six (56) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Codes: A092, Bridges: Miscellaneous Repairs, and A093, Bridges: Deck Replacements and Rehabilitations. Four (4) firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of September 10, 2024.

The scoring of the EOIs by the Review Committee resulted in the following order of ranking of the top three firms: 1) Greenman-Pedersen, Inc.; 2) Michael Baker International, Inc.; and 3) Dewberry Engineers Inc. These three firms were requested to submit sealed Fee Proposals, which were received and have been reviewed. The Fee Proposal of the highest technically ranked firm, Greenman-Pedersen, Inc., for OPS No. T4069 (in accordance with the Solicitation for EOIs), was reviewed and negotiated. Subsequently, a review of the Fee Proposal of the second highest technically ranked firm, Michael Baker International, Inc. for OPS No. T4070 (in accordance with the Solicitation for EOIs) was reviewed and negotiated. Both fees are considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. T4069 be issued to the firm of Greenman-Pedersen, Inc., of Bridgewater, NJ, not to exceed the amount of \$1,995,000.00. This amount includes reimbursement of direct salaries times a maximum multiplier of 2.80 to cover the cost of fringe benefits, overhead and profit, plus authorized direct non-salary expenses.

It is further recommended that Order for Professional Services No. T4070 be issued to the firm of Michael Baker International, Inc. of Hamilton, New Jersey, not to exceed the amount of \$1,925,000.00. Through this single procurement process the Authority will select three consultants to furnish engineering services for bridge inspections on the Turnpike.

The engineering services associated with OPS No. T4085 will include biennial inspection of 130 bridges located in the southern region of the Turnpike; OPS No. T4086 will include biennial inspection of 117 bridges located in the central/northern region of the Turnpike; and OPS No. T4232 will include biennial inspection of 119 bridges located in the northern region of the Turnpike. The OPSs include FHWA Structure Inventory and Appraisal (SI&A) Form updates, FHWA National Bridge Element (NBE) Level Inspection updates, FHWA Element Level Inspection, data collection and preparation of bridge inspection reports.

These assignments are classified as "Simple Projects" since the scopes of work are clearly defined and not likely to change during the course of the project, and the cost of each is less than \$2,000,000.00. The Solicitation for Expressions of Interest (EOIs) was posted on the Authority's website and thirty-five (35) engineering firms were prequalified and eligible under Profile Code: D280C, Bridges – NBIS Program, Complex. Nine (9) firms submitted EOIs by the closing date of September 10, 2024.

The scoring of the EOIs by the Review Committee resulted in the following order of ranking of the top four firms: 1) ATANE Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors, P.C.; 2) Michael Baker International, Inc.; 3) Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson, Inc.; and 4) WSP USA Inc.

These four firms were requested to submit sealed Fee Proposals, which were received and have been reviewed. A review of the Fee Proposal of the highest technically ranked firm, ATANE Engineers, Architects and Land Surveyors, P.C., for OPS No. T4232 (in accordance with the Solicitation for EOIs), was reviewed and negotiated, which resulted in acceptance of their original Fee Proposal amount. Subsequently, a review of the Fee Proposals of the second highest technically ranked firm, Michael Baker International, Inc., for OPS No. T4086 and the third highest technically ranked firm, Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson, Inc., for OPS No. T4085 (in accordance with the Solicitation for EOIs), were reviewed and negotiated, which resulted in acceptance of their original Fee Proposal amounts. All three fees are considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

It is, therefore, recommended that Order for Professional Services No. T4085 be issued to the firm of Johnson, Mirmiran & Thompson, Inc., of Trenton, New Jersey, not to exceed the amount of \$1,180,000.00 which is allocated as follows: \$950,000.00 for FY 2025 and \$230,000.00 for FY 2026.

The scoring of the EOIs by the Review Committee resulted in the following order of ranking 1)

Michael Baker International, Inc. 2) Stantec Consulting Services, Inc., and 3) Jacobs Engineering Group

Inc. On September 3, 2024, Technical and sealed Fee Proposals were received from the top three firms.

The Review Committee reviewed and evaluated each firm's Technical Proposals, and it was determined

that oral presentations would not be required. The final scoring resulted in Michael Baker International, Inc. being the highest technically ranked firm. The fee submitted by Michael Baker International, Inc. has been reviewed, negotiated and is considered to be fair and reasonable for the services to be provided.

This Order for Professional Services was issued at the September 26, 2017 Commission Meeting in the amount of \$745,000.00 to provide for remedial activities at Chromate Sites 20, 21 and 192 including completion of pre-design investigations, preparation of construction contract documents and remediation oversight in accordance with current New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection regulations. The original term of this OPS was for a four (4) year period commencing November 29, 2017, with an expiration date of November 29, 2021.

Supplement A provided for a one (1) year time extension which extended the contract to November 29, 2022 with no cost increase.
