

Authorization to Settle UM/IM Coverage in the Matter of Isac Chaves v. New Jersey **Turnpike Authority**

Amount: \$190,000.00

This matter stems from an underinsured motorist claim brought by NJSP Trooper Isac Chaves for injuries suffered during a police pursuit in February 2024 on the NJ Turnpike. The incident involved a high-speed pursuit that originated in Delaware and continued into New Jersey. A commercial truck was reported to be traveling at erratic speed and switching lanes recklessly. When Trooper Chaves was authorized to attempt a box-in maneuver, the truck abruptly rammed the rear of Trooper Chaves' vehicle. As a result of the impact, Trooper Chaves sustained serious injuries to his neck and shoulder requiring cervical disc replacement and shoulder surgery. As an amicable resolution and to avoid further litigation, a settlement in the amount of \$190,000.00 to fully resolve Plaintiff's claims and avoid the costs and uncertainties of continued litigation.

Amount: \$190,000.00

This matter stems from an underinsured motorist claim brought by New Jersey State Trooper Isac Chaves against the Authority for injuries suffered during a police pursuit in February 2024 on the NJ Turnpike. The incident involved a high-speed pursuit that originated in Delaware and continued into New Jersey. A commercial truck was reported to be traveling at erratic speed and switching lanes recklessly. When Trooper Chaves was authorized to attempt a box-in maneuver, the truck abruptly rammed the rear of Trooper Chaves' vehicle. As a result of the impact, Trooper Chaves sustained serious injuries to his neck and shoulder requiring cervical disc replacement and shoulder surgery.

Settlement of this matter is advisable given the severity of the Trooper's injuries, the surgery already undertaken, and the likelihood of continued medical care. The current demand reflects a reasonable balance between the extent of the harm sustained and the financial exposure the Authority could face if litigation proceeds. Following additional discussions, the parties have reached an agreement in principle and Authority Counsel recommends settlement in the amount of \$190,000.00, subject to approval by the Board of Commissioners.

The Law Department has reviewed the matter and concurs with Authority Counsel's recommendation. As such, the Law Department requests the Board of Commissioners approve this settlement pursuant to the terms set forth above and authorize the Executive Director to execute any and all documents and take all necessary steps to fulfill the intent and purpose of this settlement.

Hudson Yards Concrete Casing - Section 3

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 27:23-5.8(b), the New Jersey Turnpike Authority ("Authority") is authorized to enter into contracts with the State providing for the payment by the Authority to the State or the Transportation Trust Fund Authority of revenues of the Authority in the amount or amounts that may be set forth in or determined in accordance with such contracts, which amounts are to be used for the development of State transportation projects, including public transportation projects and services.

The Gateway Development Commission ("GDC") is responsible for the planning, designing, financing, development and management of the Gateway Program, and was created by the Gateway Development Commission Act ("GDC Act"), bi-state legislation passed by the States of New York (2019 N.Y. Sess. Laws ch. 108) and New Jersey (N.J.S.A. 32:36-1, et seq.). The Hudson Tunnel Project ("HTP") is part of the larger Gateway Program.

One of the various projects that make up the Gateway Program is construction of concrete casing at Hudson Yards in Manhattan. Construction of the Hudson Yards concrete casing ("HYCC") is critical to the HTP, as Hudson Yards is the only clear alignment that would allow the Hudson River tunnel to fully connect to New York Penn Station. Construction of the HYCC has been divided into three (3) segments: HYCC-1, HYCC-2, and HYCC-3. The State of New Jersey entered into an agreement with GDC as of August 22, 2023, providing for funding of the State's share of the HYCC-3 project (the "HYCC Agreement"). The HYCC Agreement provides for two payments by the State to GDC, one in 2024 and one on or about July 1, 2025, or as otherwise agreed to by the State and the GDC CEO, each of which is in the amount of \$34,635,000. To ensure advancement of the HTP, the Authority and the State now desire to enter into an Agreement, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 27:23-5.8(b), whereby the Authority will provide a one-time lump sum payment of its legally-available revenues in the General Reserve Fund in the amount of \$10,000,000 to the State which, subject to appropriation by the State Legislature, will be used for payment to GDC of a portion of the State's share of the costs of the HYCC-3 project.

In view of the foregoing, the Board is respectfully requested to authorize and direct the Executive Director (i) to execute a Funding Agreement by and among the Authority and the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey in a form substantially in accord with the above terms, and (ii) to take any other actions as may be necessary to implement the Funding Agreement. A copy of the Funding Agreement, when executed, will be provided to the Board.

This contract will provide for winter operation system standardization of 23 magnesium chloride tanks and appurtenances at various maintenance yards along the New Jersey Turnpike and Garden State Parkway. All work is expected to be substantially completed by October 2026.

Two bid proposals were received on July 16, 2025 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal, in the amount of \$4,373,829.00, may be compared to the second low bid proposal in the amount of \$4,559,000.00. Both bid proposals were higher than the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$3,858,183.00, which is likely due to the unique nature of the project. The low bidder, ACP Contracting Inc. has performed work for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.

It is therefore recommended that Contract No. A900.806-1 be awarded to the low bidder, ACP Contracting Inc. of Fairfield, New Jersey in the amount of \$4,373,829.00. Bids for this work were procured, and the authorization being sought is to award this fair and open contract to the lowest responsible bidder, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 27:23-6.1, N.J.A.C. 19:9-2.2, and Executive Order No. 37 (Corzine 2006).

The General Consultant, HNTB Corporation, concurs with this recommendation.

This contract will provide for the removal of existing substandard curve advisory signs and installation of new curve advisory signs (both ground-mounted and bridge-mounted) along sixty-four (64) select ramps at various northern Turnpike and Parkway Interchanges. All work is expected to be substantially completed by November 2026.

One bid proposal was received on July 15, 2025 for the above publicly advertised contract, as shown on the attached bid summary sheet. The low bid proposal, in the amount of \$5,474,740.00, is significantly lower than the Engineer's Estimate in the amount of \$9,223,000.00, which is likely due to the contractor's continuous presence in the region and their familiarity of performing this type of work. Engineering Department representatives confirmed with the low bidder that they can perform the work at the bid prices. The low bidder, J. Fletcher Creamer & Son, Inc., has previously performed work of this type for the Authority and is considered competent to complete this contract.







Figure 3 - New Jersey Turnpike Injury and Property-Damage-Only Crashes by Month

The following un-audited results are for the seven months ended July 31, 2025. Based upon these results, revenues will be sufficient to satisfy the requirements of the Authority's Bond Resolution. For the twelve months ending December 31, 2025, the Authority is projected to have a debt service coverage ratio of 2.02 and a total requirements coverage ratio of 1.53.

The Authority's total revenue for the seven months ended July 31, 2025, was \$1,584,658,000, which is \$47,575,000, or 3.1% above the 2025 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue was \$1,341,374,000, which is \$1,274,000, or 0.1%, above the 2025 year-to-date budget. Toll revenue was slightly above budget, driven by a higher-than-expected increase in commercial transactions on the Turnpike. July 2025 marked the highest monthly total for commercial transactions on the Turnpike this year, surpassing the previous peak in May 2025. However, despite this positive performance, toll revenue was negatively impacted by adverse weather conditions throughout the year. These included two State of Emergency days in January due to heavy snowfall, three additional snow days in February, and the impact of the leap year, with February 2025 having 28 days compared to 29 in 2024. Fuel prices have remained relatively consistent through July 2025, with gas prices \$0.41 per gallon lower than the same period in 2024, and unchanged from June to July 2025. Investment income was \$28,381,000, or 81.6%, above budget due to higher than budgeted interest rates. Fees were \$13,573,000, or 16% above the budget due to conservative budgeting in 2025. Miscellaneous revenue was \$2,191,000 or 19.9% above budget due to approximately \$2.8M in 2024 PNC variable rent from the Arts Center, which was offset by lower fiber lease revenue and fiber optics.

For the seven months ended July 31, 2025, toll transactions on the New Jersey Turnpike decreased 0.1% and toll revenue increased 3.3% compared to the same period in 2024. The decrease in toll transactions is driven by a reduction in passenger traffic due to severe winter weather. However, commercial traffic has remained strong throughout the year. Toll revenue increased primarily due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing which went into effect on January 1, 2025. The 2025 traffic and toll revenue budgets are based on the Authority's traffic engineering consultant's (CDM Smith) New Jersey Turnpike System 2024 Traffic and Toll Revenue Forecast Study dated August 6, 2024. CDM Smith projected a 0.4% increase in traffic and a 3.3% increase in revenue as compared to the prior year. The actual results for the seven months ended July 31, 2025, were below CDM Smith's traffic projections, and toll revenue increased the same as projected. Through July 2025, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the New Jersey Turnpike was 93.3%, an increase from 92.8% for the same period in 2024.

For the seven months ended July 31, 2025, toll transactions on the Garden State Parkway decreased 0.6% and revenue increased 4.0% when compared to the same period in 2024. The decrease in toll transactions is attributed to severe winter weather. In contrast, toll revenue increased primarily due to the 3% annual toll rate indexing. CDM Smith projected a 0.5% increase in traffic and a 3.8% increase in revenue as compared to the prior year. The actual results for the seven months ended July 31, 2025, did not meet CDM Smith's traffic projections, however toll revenue exceeded projections. Through July 2025, the *E-ZPass* usage rate on the Garden State Parkway was 91.9%, an increase from 91.1% for the same period in 2024.

Operating expenses for the seven months ended July 31, 2025, were approximately \$414,480,000, which is \$32,151,000 or 7.2% below the year-to-date budget. The Authority's operating expenses through July were below budget primarily due to lower salaries due to existing vacancies and pension expenses due to vacancies and prior period adjustments. This was partially offset by higher-than-budgeted health benefit costs, driven by increased workers' compensation claims and a reduced starting budget, higher Direct Access plan utilization and more than anticipated workers' compensation claims. The Authority spent a total of \$25,440,000 on snow and severe weather costs in 2025, with \$20,206,000 spent from the operating expense budget and an additional \$5,234,000 spent from the General Reserve Fund. All snow and severe weather costs are considered operating expenses and paid from the Revenue Fund, except for declared state of emergency events, which are charged to the General Reserve Fund. New Jersey had two declared state of emergency events in January 2025, and two more in July 2025. When excluding snow/severe weather costs and its budget, operating expenses for the seven months are 8.0% below budget for 2025.

Debt Service includes interest and principal payments on the Authority's outstanding bonds and is funded primarily through revenue and to a much lesser extent bond proceeds (capitalized interest). For the seven months ended July 31, 2025, Debt Service totaled \$594,818,000, which was \$11,821,000 or 1.9% below the year-to-date budget as the 2025 Budget assumed a \$1.0 Billion bond issuance in January 2025, while the actual issuance was \$750 million in new debt along with several refundings and was completed in June. Total Debt Service through July included \$348,471,000 in interest payments and \$246,347,000 in principal payments. Net Debt Service (funded from revenue, net of capitalized interest) was \$555,053,000 for the seven months and is slightly above budget due to increased interest from the bond refundings. While the Authority is paying more in the short term in interest, there are greater savings on future principal payments. The 2025 annual debt service budget includes approximately \$936,600,000 of debt service funded from revenue (net debt service), and the remaining \$109,600,000 of debt service funded from bond proceeds (capitalized interest), for a total debt service budget of \$1,046,200,000.

The General Reserve Fund includes all contractual payments subordinate to bondholders and expenditures for any other corporate purpose. The General Reserve Fund spending totaled \$369,827,000 for the seven months ended July 31, 2025, which was \$25,555,000, or 6.5% below the year-to-date budget. Spending consisted primarily of \$281,250,000 for the 2021 State Public Transportation Projects Funding Agreement, \$12,833,000 for the Transportation Trust Fund, and \$11,667,000 for the 2023 State Transportation Agreement. Also included are \$41,408,000 in transfers to the Supplemental Capital program as well as other funds within the Construction Fund.

The Capital Budget, which is funded by revenue, consists of the Maintenance Reserve Fund, Special Project Reserve Fund, and the Supplemental Capital Program. For the seven months ended July 31, 2025, total expenditures were approximately \$147,534,000, which was 61.7% of the 2025 year-to-date spending budget. Expenditures included \$9,727,000 for TPK Bridge Repairs along Mileposts 92-122/NBHC (2025), \$8,958,000 for TPK Pavement Resurfacing along Mileposts 60-63, and \$7,479,000 for TPK Bridge Repairs along Mileposts 92-122/NBHC (2024). In addition to these expenditures, there are open commitments totaling approximately \$372,622,000.

The Construction Fund, which is funded from bond proceeds, consists of the 2025-2029 Capital Improvement Program, the 2019 Capital Improvement Program, and the 2008 \$7 Billion Capital Improvement Program. For the seven months ended July 31, 2025, total expenditures were approximately \$287,437,000, which was 50.8% of the 2025 year-to-date spending budget. Total expenditures included \$32,667,000 for TPK Bridge Rehabilitation W 107 E107 84N&S, \$20,296,000 for TPK Bridges W 110 111 112, and 19,858,000 for Passaic River Bridge Rehabilitation. In addition to these expenditures, there are open commitments totaling approximately \$1,622,441,000.
